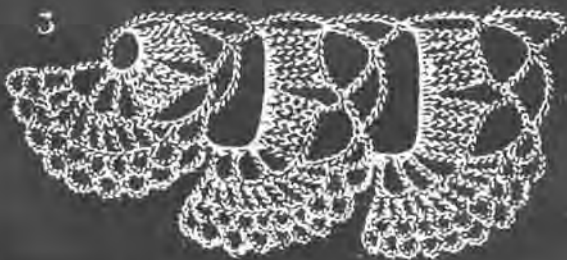
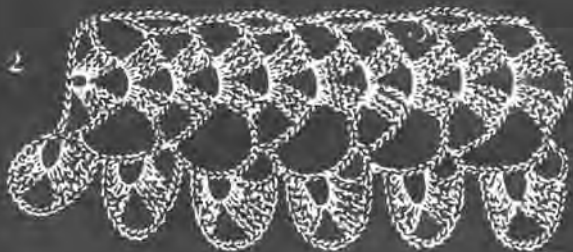
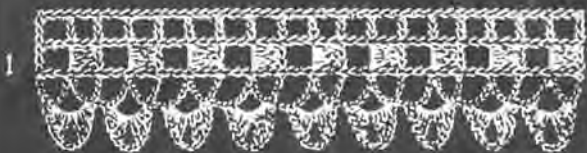
How pleasing to reflect that such work will remain as an object of remembrance to another generation, but how important when a good pattern is chosen that it is made of a good material.

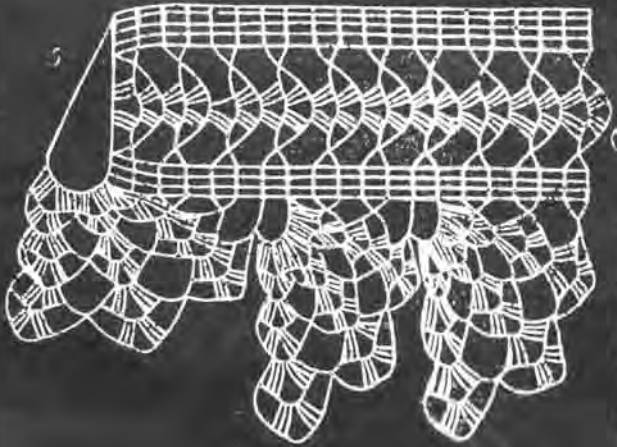
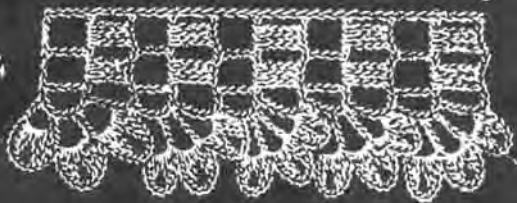

ROYAL CROCHET WORKER,

Pattern No. 1.—For Edging.

Jonas Brook and Brothers, Goat's Head Crochet  
Thread, No. 16, and Walker's Penelope Crochet  
Hook, No. 3.

 MAKE a chain of 14 loops, miss 3 from  
the hook, work 1 treble, chain 2, miss  
2, work 1 treble, chain 2, miss 2, work 1  
treble, then turn back.

*2nd Row.*—Chain 6, miss the first treble  
of last row, work 1 treble at the top of the  
second treble, work 2 treble in the same two  
chains; work 1 treble at the top of the treble,  
chain 5, work 1 treble in the same loop as  
before, chain 5, plain 1 in the centre of the  
eight chains of last row, turn back, and the

*3rd Row.*—Work 3 treble in the centre  
of the first five chains of last row, chain 5,  
work 3 treble in the same loop as before,

plain 1 at the top of the one treble of last row, chain 8, work 1 treble at the top of the next treble, chain 2, miss 2, work 1 treble, chain 2, miss 2, work 1 treble, and repeat from 2nd row for the length required.

Pattern No. 2.—For Edging.

Jones Brook and Brothers Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 20, and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hook, No. 4.

**M**AKE a chain of 18 loops, miss 8 loops from the hook, work 3 treble in the one loop, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same loop as before, chain 2, miss 2, then plain 1, chain 5, and plain 1 in the next loop, chain 5, plain 1 in the next loop, turn back, and the

*2nd Row.*—Work 3 treble in the first five chains of last row, chain 5, work 3 treble in the same five chains as before, plain 1 in the centre of the next five chains, chain 8, work

3 treble in the centre of the three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same three chains as before, chain 2, work 1 treble at the top of the one treble of last row, turn back, and the

*3rd Row.*—Chain 4, work 1 treble in the centre of the two chains of last row, work 3 treble in the centre of the three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same loop as before, chain 2, plain 1 in the centre of the eight chains of last row, chain 5, plain 1 in the same eight chains as before, chain 5, plain 1 in the same eight chains as before, turn back, and repeat from the second row for the length required.

Pattern No. 3.—For Edging.

Jonas Brook and Brothers Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 16, and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hook, No. 3.



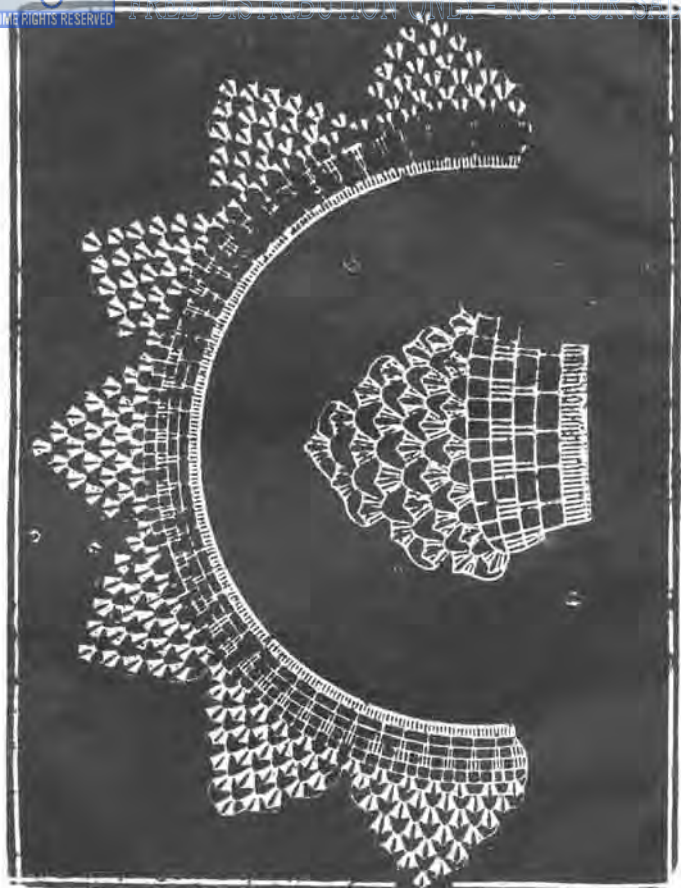
MAKE a chain of 10 loops and join it round to form a foundation for the edge.

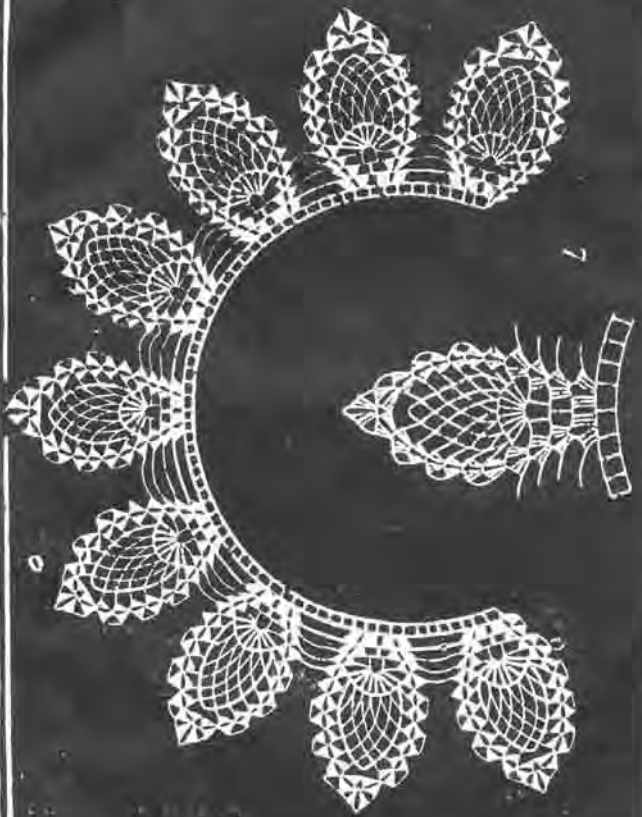
*1st Row.*—Chain 3, work 5 treble in the ten chains, chain 3, work 5 treble in the same ten chains as before, then chain 3 and work 1 treble in the same ten chains as before for three times, turn back.

*2nd Row.*—Chain 2, then chain 1 and work 1 treble for three times in each of the three chains of last row, chain 5, and plain 1 in the centre of the next three chains, chain 5 and plain 1 at the end (at the top of the three chains), turn back.

*3rd Row.*—Chain 5, plain 1 in the first five chains of last row, chain 5, and plain 1 in the next five chains of last row, then chain 3 and plain 1 in each one chain of last row, chain 3, and plain 1 in the end three chains, turn back, and the


*4th Row.*—Chain 3 and plain 1 in the centre of each of the three chains of last row, chain 10 and plain 1 in the centre of the five chains (which is at the end), turn back, and repeat from first row for the length required.





**Pattern No. 5.—For Edging.**

Jonas Brook and Brothers Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. varying according to the width required, and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hook, size according to the Crochet Thread.

 **MA**KE a chain of 40 loops and join it round to form a foundation for the edge to be worked upon.

*1st Row.*—Chain 3, work 4 treble, chain 3, work 3 treble in the centre of the three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same three chains as before, chain 3, work 4 treble, then chain 3, and work 3 treble for six times in the centre of the twelve chains of last row, turn back, and the

*2nd Row.*—Work 3 treble in the first three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same three chains as before, chain 2, plain 1 in the centre of the next three chains of last row, chain 2, work 3 treble in the next three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same three chains as

before, chain 2, plain 1 in the next three chains of last row, chain 2, work 3 treble in the next three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same loop as before, chain 2, plain 1 in the next three chains of last row, chain 2, work 4 treble at the top of the four treble of last row, chain 2, plain 1 in the centre of the three chains of last row, chain 2, work 3 treble in the centre of the three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same loop as before, chain 2, plain 1 in the centre of the next three chains, chain 2, work 4 treble at the top of the four treble of last row, turn back, and the

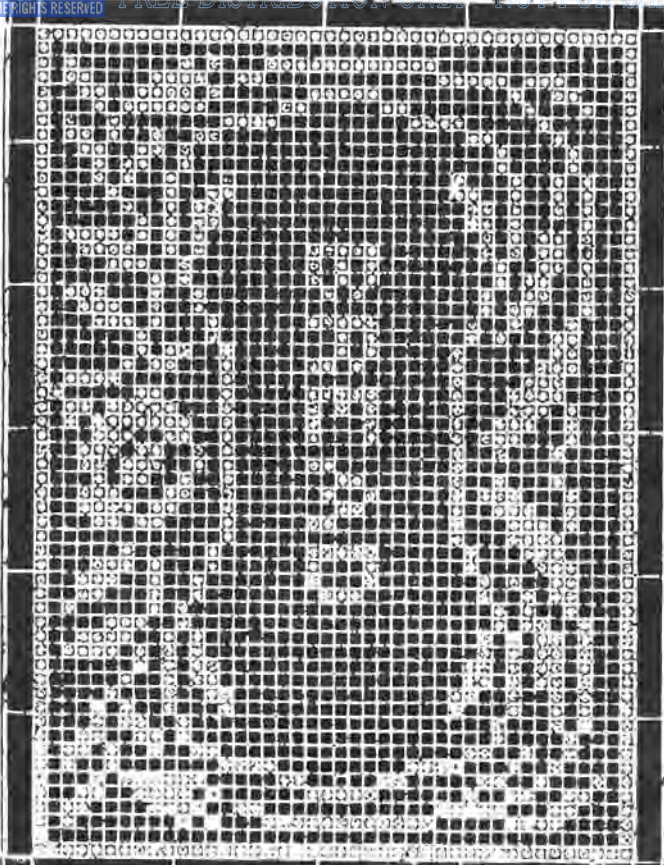

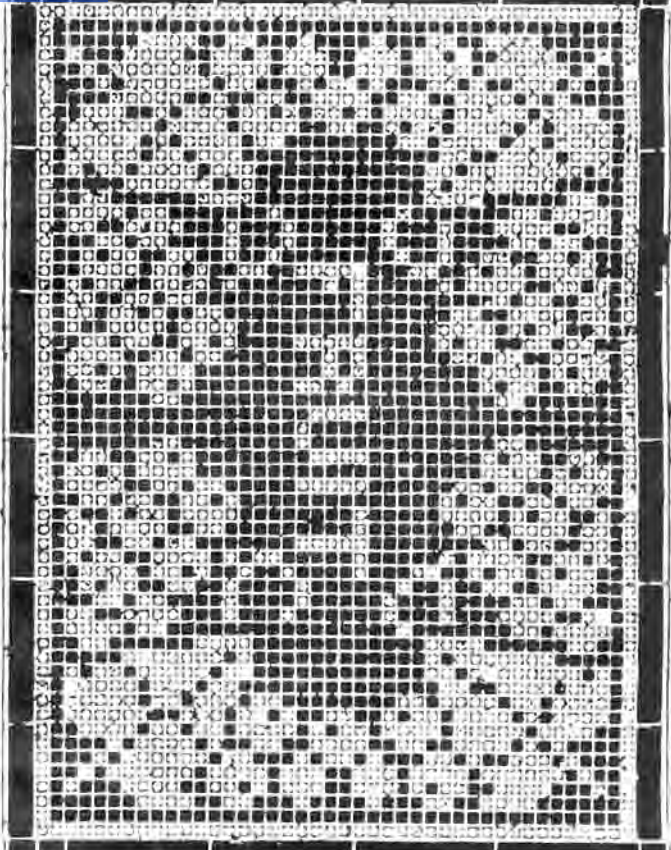

3 treble in the next three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same loop as before, chain 3, plain 1 in the centre of the four chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the next three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the centre of the same three chains of last row as before, chain 3, plain 1 in the next four chains of last row, chain 12, work 4 treble at the top of the four treble of last row, chain 2, plain 1 in the centre of the three chains of last row, chain 2, work 3 treble in the centre of the three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the centre of the same three chains as before, chain 2, plain 1 in the centre of the three chains of last row, chain 2, work 4 treble at the top of the four treble of last row, turn back, and repeat from first row for the length required.



**Pattern No. 4.—For Edging.**

Jonas Brook and Brothers Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 18, and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hook, No. 4.


 **MAKE** a chain of 12 loops, turn, miss 5, work 1 treble, chain 2, miss 2, work 1 treble, chain 2, miss 2, work 1 treble in the end loop, turn back, and the

*2nd Row.*—Chain 2, work 3 treble in the first two chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the next two chains of last row, then chain 3 and work 1 treble for 4 times in the five chains of last row, turn back, and the

*3rd Row.*—Work as follows in each of the first three three chains of last row, 2 treble chain 3, work 2 treble and plain 1 at the top of the first treble, after working the three three chains of last row, chain 5, work 1 treble in the next three chains of last row, then chain 2, and work 1 treble in each of the next two two chains of last row, turn back, and repeat from 2nd row for the length required.

**Pattern No. 6.—For a Collar.**

Jonas Brook and Brothers Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 14, and Walker's Peacock Crochet Hook, No. 3.

 **MAKE** a chain of 42 loops, turn back, miss 4, work 1 treble, then chain 2, miss 2, and work 1 treble, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

*2nd Row.*—Work as follows in the centre of the two chains of last row, 2 treble, chain 3, work 2 treble in the centre of the same two chains as before, chain 5, miss the next two chains of last row, repeat to the end, and you will have seven lots of the treble, turn back, and the

*3rd Row.*—Work as follows in each of the five chains of last row, chain 5, work 3 treble in the centre of the first five chains of last row, work 3 treble in the centre of same loop as before, repeat to the end, and you will have six lots of the treble, turn back.

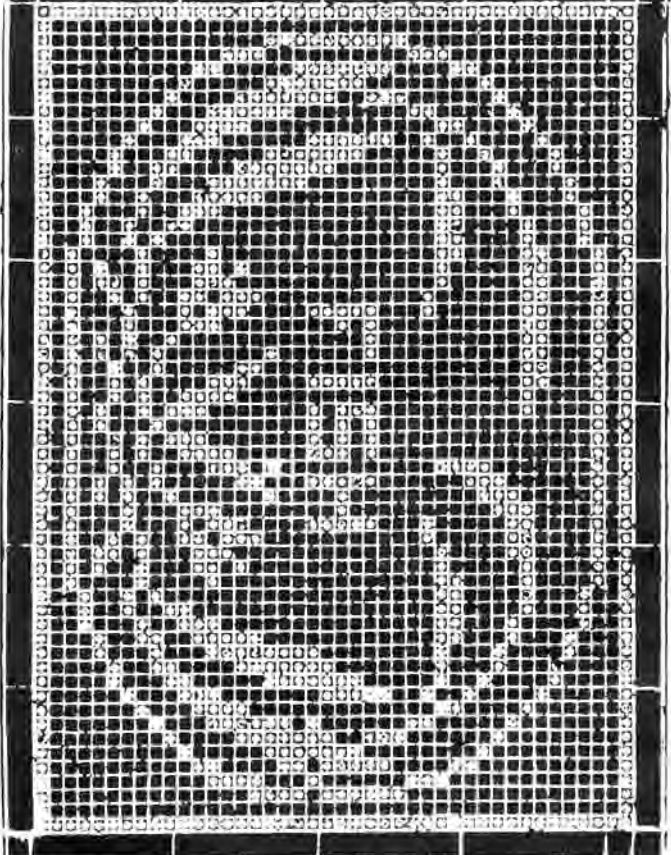
*4th Row.*—chain 5, work 3 treble in the centre of the five chains of last row, chain 3,

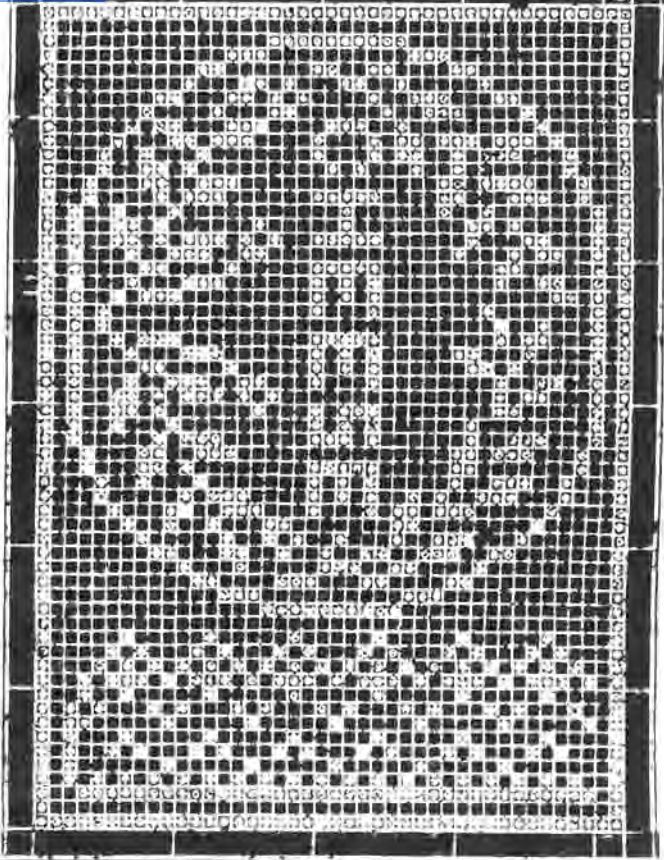
work 3 treble in the same loop as before, repeat to the end, and you will find five lots of the treble, leaving the end five chains in each row to form the edge, repeat this row to you come to only one lot of treble and fasten off; make seven or more portions, as you may require, for the length of the collar; then make a foundation to go round the neck, commencing in the two chains, as follows: work 1 treble at the top of the first treble of the foundation row, chain 2, miss 2, work 1 treble at the top of the next one treble of the foundation row, work 2 treble in the next two chains of the foundation row, repeat to the end, work all the portions into one length, turn back.

*2nd Row.*—Work 2 treble in the centre of the four treble of last row, chain 3, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

*3rd Row.*—Work 1 treble in the centre of the two treble of last row, chain 3, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

*4th Row.*—One treble in each loop to the end and fasten off, which completes the collar.








Pattern No. 7.—For a Collar.

Jonas Brook and Brothers Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 14, and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hook, No. 3.

 MAKE a chain of 100 loops, then turn back, and the

*1st Row.*—Chain 2, miss 2, work 1 treble, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

*2nd Row.*—Work 3 treble in the first two chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same two chains as before, repeat the same in the next two chains, chain 3, miss 4 lots of the two chains of last row, and repeat to the end, making both ends alike, turn back.

*3rd Row.*—Work 3 treble in the first three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same loop as before, chain 2, work 1 treble in the centre of the six treble of last row, chain 2, work 3 treble in the next three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same three chains as before,

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chain 6, and repeat to the end, making both ends correspond, turn back, and the

*4th Row.*—Work 3 treble in the first three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same three chains as before, chain 2, work 1 treble in the two chains of last row, chain 2, work 1 treble in the next two chains of last row, chain 2, work 3 treble in the next three chains of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same three chains as before, chain 4, and repeat to the end, making both ends correspond, turn back, and the

*5th Row.*—Work 3 treble in the first three chains of last row, chain 3, work three treble in the same three chains as before, miss the first two chains of last row, then work as follows in the next two chains of last row, chain 2, and work 1 treble eight times in the one two chains, chain 2, work 3 treble in the next three chains, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same three chains as before, chain 2, and repeat to the end, making both ends correspond, turn back, and the

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
