



MATERIALS: J. & P. COATS TATTING-CROCHET, Size 70, 2 balls.

Steel Crochet Hook No. 14.

A rolled edge or hemstitched handkerchief.

**E-194** Starting at one short end, ch 8. 1st row: In 6th ch from hook make 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. Ch 7, turn. 2nd row: In ch-2 sp make 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. Ch 7, turn. Repeat 2nd row until piece measures slightly longer than outer edges of handkerchief.

**HEADING** . . . Attach thread to first ch-7 loop, \* ch 7, sc in next loop, ch 3, dc in next loop, ch 3, tr in next loop, ch 3, dc in next loop, ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 7, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Join and break off.

Whip edging to handkerchief edge, easing in corners to keep work flat.

**E-191** EDGING... 1st row: Starting at one narrow edge, ch 6, dc in 6th ch from hook. Ch 10, turn. 2nd row: Holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make 2 tr in next dc, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made). Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: Dc in tip of next cluster. Ch 10, turn.

Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows alternately until piece measures slightly longer than outer edges of handkerchief (allowing for corners). Break off. Now work around handkerchief as follows: 1st rnd: Attach thread to any corner, 3 sc in same corner, make sc all around outer edges (12 sc to 1 inch), having 3 sc in each corner, sl st in first sc. 2nd rnd: Sc in next sc, ch 3, sl st in a ch-5 loop on Edging, ch 3, sc in same sc on handkerchief as last sc was made (corner), \* ch 3, sl st in next ch-5 loop, ch 3, skip 4 sc on handkerchief, sc in next sc. Repeat from \* around, working over corners as before.

**E-189** 1st rnd: Attach thread to one corner of handkerchief, 3 sc in same place, make sc all around outer edges (12 sc to 1 inch), having 3 sc in each corner. Sl st in first sc. 2nd rnd: Sl st in next sc, ch 8, dc in same place as sl st, \* ch 5, skip 3 sc, sc in next sc, ch 3, skip 1 sc sc in next sc, ch 5, skip 3 sc, in next sc make dc, ch 3 and dc. Repeat from \* around, making dc, ch 5 and dc in center sc of each corner. Join with sl st to 3rd ch of ch-8. 3rd

rnd: SI st in next sp, ch 9, dc in 6th ch from hook, (dc in same sp, ch 5, dc in top of last dc made) 4 times; dc in same sp, \* ch 5, skip next sp, sc in next loop, ch 5, skip next sp, in next sp make (dc, ch 5, dc in top of last dc made) 3 times and dc. Repeat from \* to corner, in corner sp make (dc, ch 5, dc in top of last dc made) 5 times and dc. Work other 3 sides to correspond. Join and break off.

E-190 1st rnd: Attach thread to any corner, 3 sc in same corner, make sc all around (12 sc to 1 inch), having 3 sc in each corner. Sl st in first sc. 2nd rnd: Sl st in next sc, ch 4, tr in same place, ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make 2 tr in same place as last tr was made, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made); \* ch 5, skip 3 sc, cluster in next sc. Repeat from \* around, making cluster, ch 5 and cluster in center sc of each corner. Join last ch-5 with sl st to first tr. The number of sps along each side (excluding corner sps) should be divisible by 3 plus 2. 3rd rnd: Sc in same place as sl st, \* 3 sc in next sp, ch 3, sl st in last sc made, 3 sc in same sp, sc in tip of next cluster, ch 5, in tip of next cluster make cluster, ch 5 and cluster; ch 5, sc in tip of next cluster. Repeat from \* around. Join and break off.



MATERIALS: J. & P. COATS TATTING-CROCHET, Size 70, 2 balls.

Steel Crochet Hook No. 14.

**E-192** EDGING . . . Starting at one narrow end ch 7. 1st row: Dc in 4th ch from hook and in next 3 ch. Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: Skip first dc, dc in next 3 dc and in top of turning chain (one motif completed). Ch 7, turn. Repeat 1st and 2nd rows alternately until piece measures slightly longer than outer edges of handkerchief.

Now work around outer edges of handkerchief as follows: 1st rnd: Attach thread to any corner, 3 sc in same corner, make sc all around outer edges (12 sc to 1 inch), having 3 sc in each corner. Sl st in first sc. 2nd rnd: Sc in next sc, ch 3, sl st in free point of first motif, ch 3, sc in same sc on handkerchief as last sc was made (corner), \* ch 3, sl st in free point of next motif, ch 3, skip 4 sc on handkerchief, sc in next sc. Repeat from \* around, working over corners as before. Join and break off.

E-193 1st rnd: Attach thread to one corner, 3 sc in same corner, make sc all around outer edges (12 sc to 1 inch), having 3 sc in each corner. SI st in first sc. 2nd rnd: SI st in next sc, ch 8, dc in same place as last sc, \* ch 3, skip 1 sc, tr in next sc, ch 3, skip next sc, d tr in next sc, ch 3, skip next sc, tr tr in next sc, ch 3, skip next sc, d tr in next sc, ch 3, skip next sc, tr in next sc, ch 3, skip next sc, dc in next sc, ch 3, skip next sc, dc in next sc. Repeat from \* across side, ending with tr in 2nd sc preceding center corner sc, ch 3, in corner sc make dc, ch 5 and dc; ch 3, skip next sc, tr in next sc, ch 3, skip next sc, d tr in next sc and continue thus around, making dc, ch 5 and dc in center sc of each corner. Join last ch-3 to 3rd ch of ch-8. 3rd rnd: Ch 6, sc in 3rd ch from hook (picot made), \* ch 3, sc in next sp, ch 3, dc in next dc, ch 3, sl st in last dc made (another picot made); (ch 3, skip next ch-3, dc in next st, picot) 6 times. Repeat from \* around. Join and break off.

**E-195** FIRST MOTIF... Starting at center, ch 10. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 4, tr in ring, ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make 2 tr in ring, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made); (ch 5, cluster in ring) 6 times; ch 5. Join to top of starting chain. Break off.

SECOND MOTIF . . . Starting at center, ch 10. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 4, tr in ring, ch 5, cluster in ring, ch 2, sl st in any loop on First Motif, ch 2, cluster in ring on Second Motif. Complete rnd, no more joinings. Make necessary number of motifs to measure same as side of handkerchief, joining them as Second Motif was joined to First Motif, leaving 3 loops free between joinings. Now work another motif (this is corner motif) and join to previous motif as before. To form corner make another motif as before and join to corner motif, leaving 5 loops free on outer edge of corner motif. Work in this manner all around, forming corners as

INNER CORNER MOTIF... Work as for other motifs, joining this last motif to motif preceding and to motif following corner motif, leaving 1 loop free between joinings on each motif.

FILL-IN-LACE . . . Attach thread to the free loop between joinings on Inner Corner Motif, ch 4, tr in same loop, make a 2-tr cluster in each free loop around, sl st in first tr. Break off.

scalloped edge... Attach thread to any joining between motifs, \* 5 sc in next loop, ch 3, sc in 3rd ch from hook (picot made), (5 sc in next loop, picot) twice; sc in each of next 2 joined loops. Repeat from \* around, making (5 sc in next loop, picot) 5 times on outer corner motif. Join and break off.

HEADING . . . Attach thread to center free loop of any motif on inner side of edging, sc in same place,


\* ch 7, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make tr in next loop and in first free loop on next motif, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (joint tr made), ch 7, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across to corner, ending with a joint tr, ch 3, sc in same loop as last joining on inner corner motif, (5 sc in next loop, picot) 4 times; 5 sc in next loop, sc in next loop, ch 3, joint tr in next 2 free loops and continue thus around. Join and break off. Sew neatly around handkerchief




E-188 Starting at narrow edge ch 12. 1st row: Dc in 4th ch from hook, and in next 2 ch (bl made), (ch 2, skip 2 ch, dc in next ch) twice (2 sps made); ch 5, turn. 2nd row: Dc in next dc (sp made over sp), 2 dc in next sp, dc in next st (bl made over sp), ch 2, skip 2 dc, dc in top of turning chain (sp made over bl) Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: Make 3 sps. Ch. ), turn. Repeat chart from A to B until piece measures 113/4 inches, ending with 2nd row of chart. To form corner, working along the long side where the plain sps appear (this is inner edge), make 1 bl, 2 sps, 5 bls. Ch 3, turn. Follow chart to end. Continue in this manner, working all corners as before. Break off.

SCALLOPED EDGE . . . Attach thread to first sp on outer edge, sc in same sp, \* ch 3, sc in next sp, ch 10, sc in next sp. Repeat from \* around, making three ch-10 loops at corners. Join and break off.

Whip edging to handkerchief.

**E-182** Starting at narrow edge, ch 6. **1st row:** Dc in 6th ch from hook. Ch 3, turn. **2nd row:** 7 dc in sp. Ch 4, turn. **3rd row:** Skip first dc, (dc in next dc, ch 1) 6 times; dc in top of turning chain. Ch 5, turn. **4th row:** Dc in first dc. Ch 5, turn. **5th row:** Dc in next dc. Ch 3, turn. Repeat 2nd to 5th rows incl for length desired, ending with 3rd row.

**HEADING...** Attach thread to first free ch-5 loop, sc in same loop, \* ch 10, sc in next ch-5 loop. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

SCALLOPED EDGE . . . Attach thread to first ch-1 sp, \* ch 3, sc in same sp, (in next sp make sc, ch 3 and sc) 6 times; ch 8, sc in first ch-1 sp in next scallop. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

**E-183** FIRST MOTIF... Starting at center, ch 10. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 5, (dc in ring, ch 2) 11 times. Join with sl st to 3rd ch of ch-5. 2nd rnd: \* In next sp make sc, 3 dc and sc (scallop). Repeat from \* around. Join and break off.

SECOND MOTIF... Work as for First Motif until 1st rnd is completed. 2nd rnd: Sc in next sp, 2 dc in same sp, sl st in center dc of any scallop on First Motif, dc in same sp on Second Motif, sc in same sp, in next sp make sc, 2 dc, sl st in corresponding dc on First Motif, dc in same sp on Second Motif, sc in same sp. Complete rnd as for First Motif.

Make necessary number of motifs, joining 2 scallops of each motif to 2 scallops of previous motif, leaving 4 free scallops on each side of joining on each motif.

thread to 3rd free scallop preceding center of next scallop, \* ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, make tr in center of next 2 free scallops, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (a joint tr), ch 5, dc in center of next scallop, ch 2, dc in center of next scallop. Repeat from \* across, ending with dc, ch 2 and dc. Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: Skip first dc, dc in next dc, \* ch 2, dc in next sp, ch 2, dc in next joint tr, ch 2, dc in next sp, (ch 2, dc in next dc) twice. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

E-184 Starting at narrow edge, ch 7. 1st row: In 7th ch from hook make tr, ch 2 and tr. Ch 6, turn. 2nd row: In next ch-2 sp make tr, ch 2 and

tr. Ch 6, turn. Repeat 2nd row for length desired. Break off.

HEADING... Attach thread to first loop, ch 3, dc in same loop, \* ch 3, in next loop make dc, ch 3 and dc. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

Attach thread to first loop (on opposite side of Heading), sc in same loop, \* ch 3, in next loop make (dc, ch 1) 4 times and dc; ch 3, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across, ending with sc. Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: \* (Dc in next dc, ch 3) 4 times; dc in next dc, ch 3, sc in next sc, ch 3. Repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: \* (Dc in next dc, ch 5, sc in 3rd ch from hook—picot—ch 2) 4 times; dc in next dc, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

**E-185** Starting at narrow edge, ch 6. 1st row: Dc in 6th ch from hook. Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: Dc in next dc. Ch 5, turn. Repeat 2nd row for length desired. Break off.

thread to first free loop on long side, ch 4, tr in same loop, \* ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, make 2 tr in next loop, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster). Repeat from \* across. Ch 8, turn. 2nd row: Skip first cluster, \* dc in tip of next cluster, ch 5. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

SCALLOPED EDGE . . . 1st row: Attach thread to first free loop (on opposite side of Heading), sc in same place, \* ch 3, in next loop make (dc, ch 1) 4 times and dc; ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across, ending with ch 3, sc in last loop. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: Sc in first sc, \* 3 sc in next loop, sc in next dc, (ch 4, sc in next dc) 4 times; 3 sc in next loop, sc in next sc, ch 8, sc in next sc. Repeat from \* across. Turn. 3rd row: SI st in next 3 sc and in next loop, ch 4, tr in same loop, \* (ch 5, make a 2-tr cluster in next loop) 3 times; ch 5, sc in next loop, ch 5, cluster in next loop. Repeat from \* across, ending with cluster in last loop. Turn. 4th row: SI st in next loop, 3 sc in same loop, \* (ch 7, 3 sc in next loop) twice; ch 7, sc in next loop, sc in next sc, sc in next loop, ch 7, 3 sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

**E-186** HEADING . . . Starting at narrow edge, ch 5, tr in 5th ch from hook, ch 4, turn; tr in previous

tr, tr at base of same tr, \* ch 4, turn; tr in previous tr, tr at base of next tr. Repeat from \* for length desired. Turn.

SCALLOPED EDGE . . . 1st row: Sc in first side tr, \* ch 4, sc in tip of next tr along side, ch 7, sc in tip of next tr. Repeat from \* across, being sure to have an uneven number of ch-7 loops, and ending with ch 4, sc in base of last tr on side. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: Sc in first loop, \* ch 3, 10 dc in next loop, ch 3, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Ch 1, turn. 3rd row: Sc in first loop, \* ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, make tr in first 3 dc of next 10-dc group, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster), ch 5, dc in next 4 dc, ch 5, cluster over next 3 dc, ch 5, skip 4 dc, sc in next 2 dc. Repeat from \* across, ending with ch 5, sc in last loop. Turn. 4th row: SI st to center of next loop, sc in same loop, \* ch 5, sc in next loop, ch 7, make a 4-tr cluster over next 4 dc, ch 7, sc in next loop, ch 5, 2 sc in next loop, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

E-187 Starting at narrow edge, ch 6. 1st row: In 6th ch from hook make dc, ch 1 and dc. Ch 5, turn. 2nd to 9th rows incl: In next ch-1 sp make dc, ch 1 and dc. Ch 5, turn. 10th row: In next ch-1 sp make dc, ch 1 and dc; ch 5, dc in next 5 loops along side, ch 1, turn; sl st in 3rd ch of ch-5, ch 2. 11th row: In next ch-1 sp make dc, ch 1 and dc. Ch 5, turn. Repeat 3rd to 11th rows incl for length desired, ending with 11th row.

HEADING . . . 1st row: \* Holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, make 3 tr in center of next dc group, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster); (ch 5, sc in next loop) 3 times; ch 5. Repeat from \* across, ending with (ch 5, sc in next loop) 3 times. Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: \* (Dc in next sp, ch 5) twice; cluster in next 2 sps, ch 5. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

Attach thread to sp in center of first dc group (on opposite side of Heading), sc in same sp, \* (ch 8, cluster in next free loop) 3 times; ch 8, sc in next sp in center of dc group. Repeat from \* across, ending with (ch 8, cluster in next free loop) 3 times. Ch 8, turn. 2nd row: Sc in first sp, ch 12, sc in next sp, \* ch 12, 4 sc in next sp, sc in next sc, 4 sc in next sp, (ch 12, sc in next sp) twice. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

# Right on the Nose

Ornamental edgings to add to your collection

**MATERIALS:** J. & P. Coats or Clark's O.N.T. Mercerized Sewing Thread, Size 50.

Steel Crochet Hook No. 14.

A rolled edge or hemstitched handkerchief.

**E-172** 1st rnd: Attach thread to any corner, 3 sc in same corner, sc closely around, making 3 sc in each corner. SI st in first sc. 2nd rnd: In next sc make sc, ch 10 and sc; \* ch 10, skip 5 sc, sc in next sc. Repeat from \* around, making sc, ch 10 and sc in center sc of each corner. Join and break off.

FIRST MOTIF... Starting at center, ch 10. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 3, dc in ring, ch 4, sc in 4th ch from hook (picot), (2 dc in ring, picot) 6 times; sl st in top of ch-3. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, dc in next dc, ch 5, sl st in a ch-10 loop on handker-chief, ch 5, dc in next 2 dc on motif, ch 5, sl st in next ch-10 loop on handker-chief, ch 5, dc in next 2 dc on motif, (ch 10, dc in next 2 dc) 4 times; ch 10, sl st in top of ch-3. Break off.

SECOND MOTIF...1st rnd: Work as for 1st rnd of First Motif. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, dc in next dc, ch 5, sl st in first free ch-10 loop on previous motif, ch 5, dc in next 2 dc on Second Motif, ch 5, skip next ch-10 loop on handkerchief, sl st in next ch-10 loop, ch 5, dc in next 2 dc on motif, ch 5, sl st in next ch-10 loop on handkerchief, ch 5, dc in next 2 dc on motif and complete motif as before.

Make necessary number of motifs, joining each motif to previous motif and to 2 loops on handkerchief as before. To keep work flat at corners, do not skip a ch-10 loop (between motifs) on handkerchief. Join last motifs to corresponding loops of both adjacent motifs.

**E-169** 1st rnd: Attach thread to any corner, 3 sc in same corner, sc closely around, making 3 sc in each corner, sl st in first sc. 2nd rnd: Sl st in next sc, ch 8, dc in same place as last sc, \* ch 5, skip 4 sc, dc in next sc. Repeat from \* around, making dc, ch 5 and dc in center sc of each corner. Join last ch 5 with sl st to 3rd ch of ch-8. 3rd rnd: Sl st in next 2 ch, sc in same sp, \* in next sp make 3 dc, ch 3 and 3 dc; sc in next sp. Repeat from \* around. Join and break off.

E-168 1st rnd: Attach thread to any corner, 3 sc in same corner, sc closely all around, making 3 sc in each corner, sl st in first sc. 2nd rnd: In next sc make sc, ch 5 and sc; \* ch 5, skip 3 sc, dc in next sc, ch 5, dc in last dc (picot), dc in same sc as the dc preceding the picot was made, ch 5, skip 3 sc, sc in next sc, ch 5, skip 2 sc, sc in next sc. Repeat from \* around. making sc, ch 5 and sc in center sc of each corner and ending with ch 5, sl st in first sc. 3rd rnd: SI st in next 2 ch, sc in same loop, \* ch 5, dc in next dc, (ch 5, dc in last dc) 3 times (3 picots made) · skip next picot, dc in next dc, ch 5, skip next ch-5, sc in next ch-5 loop. Repeat from \* around. Join and break off.

E-171 1st rnd: Attach thread to any corner, 3 sc in same corner, sc closely around, making 3 sc in each corner. SI st in first sc. 2nd rnd: In next sc make sc, ch 5 and sc; \* ch 5, skip 3 sc, in next sc make sc, ch 7 and sc; (ch 5, skip 3 sc, sc in next sc) twice. Repeat from \* around, making sc, ch 5 and sc in center sc of each corner (this ch-5 loop is the center loop of the three ch-5 loops). Join last ch-5 to first sc made. 3rd rnd: Sl st in next 2 ch, sc in same loop, \* ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make 2 tr in next ch-7 loop, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster), (ch 5, make a 2-tr cluster in same loop) twice; ch 5, skip next loop, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join 18st ch 5 with sl st to first sc. 4th rnd: \* 5 sc in next sp, (in next sp make 2 sc, ch 5 and 2 sc)

twice; 5 sc in next sp. Repeat from \* around. Join and break off.

**E-170** 1st rnd: Attach thread to a corner, 3 sc in same corner, sc closely around, making 3 sc in each corner. 2nd rnd: Sl st in next sc, ch 9, dc in same place as last sl st, \* ch 6, skip 5 sc, dc in next sc. Repeat from around, making dc, ch 6 and dc in center sc of each corner. Join last ch 6 with sl st to 3rd ch of ch-9. 3rd rnd: \* 5 sc in next sp, ch 5. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 5, sl st in first sc. 4th rnd: Sl st in next sc, sc in next sc, \* ch 5, sc in 5th ch from hook (picot), make 4 more picots, sc in center sc of next 5-sc group, ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 3, sc in center sc of next 5-sc group. Repeat from \* around. Join and break off.

E-174 1st rnd: Attach thread to any corner, 3 sc in same corner, sc closely around, making 3 sc in each corner. Sl st in first sc. 2nd rnd: In same place as sl st make sc and half dc, 3 dc in next sc, make half dc and sc in next sc, sc in next 7 sc, \* half dc in next sc, dc in next 3 sc, half dc in next sc (scallop), sc in next 8 sc. Repeat from \* around, making sc and half dc in the first sc of each 3-sc group at corners, 3 dc in the center sc and half dc and sc in the 3rd sc of each 3-sc group at corners. Join with sl st to first sc. 3rd rnd: SI st in next half dc, ch 8, dc in 5th ch from hook, \* (dc in next dc on scallop, ch 5, dc in last dc) 3 times; dc in next half dc of scallop, dc in next half dc of next scallop, ch 5, dc in last dc. Repeat from \* around. Join and break off.

## How to Make Hairpin Lace

Step 1—Make a loop at end of ball thread (Fig. 1).

Step 2—Insert hook in loop and wind ball thread around right prong of staple (Eig. 1).

Step 3—Thread over hook and draw through loop, keeping loop at center (Fig. 1).

Step 4—Raise hook to a vertical position and turn staple to the left (Fig. 2).


Step 5—Thread over hook and draw through loop on hook (Fig. 3).


Step 6—Insert hook in loop of left prong (Fig. 4).


Step 7—Thread over hook and draw loop through (2 loops on hook), thread over and draw through 2 loops.

Step 8—Repeat Steps 4 to 7 incl until staple is filled.

Step 9—Remove all but the last 4 loops from staple and continue as before for length desired.







# E-181 (CROCHET)


MATERIALS: J. & P. COATS TATTING-CROCHET, Size 70, 2 balls . . . Steel Crochet Hook No. 14.

A hemstitched linen handkerchief.

BUTTERFLY . . . Starting at center of Body, ch 13. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 1, 29 sc in ring. Join. Now work in rows as follows: 1st row: Ch 5, (skip 1 sc, dc in next sc, ch 2) 9 times; skip 1 sc, dc in next sc. Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: 2 dc in first sp, \* ch 2, 2 dc in next sp. Repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: In each sp across make 3 dc, ch 3 and 3 dc (9 shells made). Ch 5, turn. 4th row: In sp of next shell make 3 dc, ch 3 and 3 dc (shell made over shell), \* ch 3, shell over next shell. Repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. 5th row: Shell over shell, \* ch 3, in sp of next shell make (tr, ch 1) 10 times and tr; ch 3, shell over next shell. Repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. 6th row: Shell over shell, \* (ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp) 10 times; ch 3, shell over next shell. Repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. 7th row: Shell over shell, \* ch 3, skip next sp, (sc in next loop, ch 3) 9 times; in sp of next shell make (3 dc, ch 3) twice; and 3 dc. Repeat from \* across, ending with shell in sp of last shell. Ch 5, turn.

Now work pineapples individually as follows:

FIRST PINEAPPLE . . . 1st row: Shell over shell, ch 3, skip next sp, Continued on page 15

Turn. 2nd row: Sl st to center of first loop, sc in same loop, \* ch 6, sc in 3rd ch from hook (picot), ch 3, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Break off. Whip edging in place, joining short ends.

Two Colors—White and Dark Lavender

**E-177** With White, make hairpin lace slightly longer than the outer edges of handkerchief. Break off.

**HEADING** . . . Keeping all loops straight, attach Dark Lavender to first loop, make 3 sc in each loop across. Break off.

all loops straight, make an sc in first 2 loops, \* ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, make 2 tr in next 2 loops, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster); (ch 5, dc in tip of cluster, make a cluster in same place as last cluster was made) twice; ch 5, sc in next 2 loops. Repeat from \* across, ending with an sc. Break off. Whip edging in place, joining narrow ends.

Two Colors—White and Salmon Pink


**E-176** With White, make hairpin lace slightly longer than outer edges of handkerchief. Break off.

HEADING . . . 1st row: Keeping the twist in all loops, attach Salmon Pink to first loop, \* ch 1, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Ch 4, turn. 2nd row: Skip first sc, \* dc in next sc, ch 1. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

Keeping the twist in loops, attach Salmon Pink to first 3 loops (on opposite side of Heading), sc in same place, \* keeping next loop straight, make 7 dc in loop, keeping the twist in loops make an sc in next 3 loops, ch 5, keeping the twist in loops make an sc in next 3 loops. Repeat from \* across. Break off. 2nd row: Attach White to first dc of scallop, sc in same place, \* (ch 3, sc in next dc) 6 times; ch 5, sc in next dc. Repeat from \* across. Break off. Whip edging in place, joining short ends.

Cobweb... Sheer and delicate, lacy edgings for every taste

MATERIALS: J. & P. COATS TATTING-CROCHET, Size 70. Steel Crochet Hook No. 14.



Two Colors-White and Blue

**E-196** With White, make hairpin lace for length desired. Break off.

HEADING . . . 1st row: Keeping all loops straight, attach Blue to first loop, \* ch 1, st in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Break off. 2nd row: Attach White to first sp, make 2 sc in each sp across. Break off.

Work as for 1st row of Heading. 2nd row: Attach White to first sp, ch 4, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, make 2 tr in same sp, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster), \* ch 7, skip next sp, make a 3-tr cluster in next sp. Repeat from \* across. Turn. 3rd row: Sl st to center of next sp, \* ch 7, sc in 3rd ch from hook (picot), ch 4, sc in next sp. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

**E-158** Make hairpin lace for length desired. Break off.

HEADING . . . 1st row: Keeping the twist in all loops, attach thread to first loop, sc in next loop, \* ch 2, sc in each of next 2 loops. Repeat from \* across, ending with 2 sc. Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: Skip first sc, dc in next sc, \* ch 2, dc in next 2 sc. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

SCALLOPED EDGE . . . 1st row: Keeping the twist in all loops, attach thread to first loop, sc in same loop, \* (ch 5, dc in 5th ch from hook) 3 times; sc in last sc made, sc in next 6 loops. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

**E-159** Make hairpin lace for length desired. Break off.

**HEADING . . .** Keeping all loops straight, attach thread to first loop, ch 4, \* dc in next loop, ch 1. Repeat from \* across, ending with dc. Ch 4, turn. 2nd row: Skip first dc, \* dc in next dc, ch 1. Repeat from \* across, ending with dc. Break off.

Keeping all loops straight, attach thread to first loop (on opposite side of Heading), sc in next 4 loops, \* ch 5, sc in next 5 loops. Repeat from \* across. Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: \* 3 dc in next ch-5 loop, ch 5, dc in top of last dc made, 3 dc in same loop as last 3 dc were made, ch 5. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

Steel Crochet Hook No. 14.
A rolled edge or hemstitched handkerchief.



Two Colors—1 ball of White and 2 balls of Dark Yellow

**E-178** With White, make hairpin lace slightly longer than outer edges of handkerchief. Break off.

HEADING . . . 1st row: Keeping all loops straight, attach Yellow to first loop, ch 3, dc in next loop, \* ch 3, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make dc in each of next 2 loops, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster). Repeat from \* across. Ch 6, turn. 2nd row: Skip first cluster, \* dc in tip of next cluster, ch 3. Repeat from \* across, ending with dc. Break off.

Work as for 1st row of Heading. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: Sc in tip of first cluster, \* ch 10, sc in tip of next cluster, 3 sc in next sp, sc in tip of next cluster. Repeat from \* across, ending with ch 10, sc in tip of cluster. Ch 1, turn. 3rd row: 3 sc in first loop, \* (ch 3, 3 sc in same loop) 3 times; skip 2 sc, sc in next sc, 3 sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Break off. Whip edging in place, joining short ends.

Two Colors-White and Blue

**E-179** With White, make hairpin lace slightly tonger than outer edges of handkerchief. Break off.

**HEADING** . . . Keeping loops straight, attach White to first 3 loops, sc in same place, \*\* ch 3, make an sc in next 3 loops. Repeat from \*\* across. Break off.


SCALLOPED EDGE . . . Keeping loops straight, attach Blue to first 2 loops on opposite side of Heading, sc in same place, \* ch 5, dc in last sc, make an sc in next 2 loops. Repeat from \* across, ending with sc. Break off. Whip edging in place, joining short ends.

Two Colors-White and Dusty Pink

**E-180** With White, make hairpin lace slightly longer than outer edges of handkerchief. Break off.

**HEADING** . . . Keeping all loops straight, with White make 2 sc in each loop across. Break off.

SCALLOPED EDGE ... 

Break off. 3rd row: Attach Green and repeat 2nd row. Break off.

Two Colors-White and Rose

**E-163** With White, make hairpin lace for length desired. Break off.

**HEADING . . .** Keeping all loops straight, attach Rose to first 2 loops, ch 6, dc in same place, \* in next 2 loops make dc, ch 3 and dc. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

Work as for Heading along opposite side. Break off. 2nd row: Attach White to first sp, sc in same sp, \* (ch 6, dc in 6th ch from hook) 3 times; tr in sc last made, sc in next sp, (ch 3, sc in next sp) twice. Repeat from \* across, ending with tr in sc, sc in next sp. Turn. 3rd row: Sl st to center of first ch-6 loop, sc in same loop, \* ch 5, in next loop make sc, ch 7 and sc; ch 5, sc in next loop, ch 3, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Break off. Repeat from \* across, ending with ch 1, make an sc in next 2 loops. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: \* Sc in next ch-1 sp, 3 sc in next loop, (ch 3, sc in same loop) 5 times; 2 sc in same loop. Break off. 2nd row: Attach White to first sp, \* ch 3, make sc in next sp, sc in tip of next cluster and in next sp, ch 5, make sc in next sp, sc in tip of next cluster and in next sp. Repeat from \* across, ending with ch 3, sc in next sp. Turn. 3rd row: Sl st to center of first loop, sc in same loop, \* 10 dc in next loop, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Break off. 4th row: Attach Beauty Pink to first dc on previous row, sc in next dc, \* (in next dc make sc, ch 3 and sc) 6 times; sc in next 4 dc. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

**E-173** 1st rnd: Attach thread to any corner, 3 sc in same corner, sc closely around, making 3 sc in each corner. SECOND PINEAPPLE ... 1st row: Attach thread to next sp on last complete row, ch 5, shell in same sp, ch 3, skip next sp, (sc in next sp, ch 3) 8 times; skip next sp, shell in next sp. Ch 5, turn. Complete as for First Pineapple. Work other pineapples to correspond. Holding butterfly in place on corner of handkerchief, trace outline of wings. Cut out around line, leaving 1/4 inch for hem. Turn under 1/4 inch and sew neatly in place.

EDGING... Attach thread to corner just cut out and sc neatly across, sc in next hole along side of handkerchief, ch 4, sc in 4th ch from hook (picot made), \* sc in next 5 holes, picot. Repeat from \* around, making sc, picot and sc in each corner hole. Join and break off.

ANTENNAE . . . Ch 4, 15 dc in 4th ch from hook. Join. Ch 40, 15 dc in 4th ch from hook. Join and break off. Sew butterfly in place. Sew on antennae.
