

Filet Popcorn Bedspread No. 424

Double Bedspread, Approx. Size 84x102"

Bucilla Super Crochet Cotton, Article 3457, 18 skeins. Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook No. 3, Article 4300.


3 rows = 1 inch

3 meshes = 1 inch

Stripe A-1st row: ch 90, 1 d c in 4th st from hook, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, * ch 2, skip 2 sts on chain, 1 d c in each of the next 4 sts; repeat from * to end of chain, thus having an open mesh alternate with a closed mesh and ending row with a closed mesh (29 meshes in row). 2nd row: ch 5, turn, 1 d c on 4th d c below (an open mesh), * 2 d c in next space (under ch 2), 1 d c on next d c, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c on next d c; repeat from * across, ending with an open mesh (see chart). 3rd row: 1 closed mesh, as at beginning of 1st row, * ch 2, skip 2 sts, 1 d c on next d c; repeat from * to within 1 mesh of end, 1 closed mesh on last mesh. 4th row: ch 5, turn, 29 open meshes to end of row (see chart). 5th row: ch 3, turn, 1 closed mesh, 13 open meshes, 5 d c in next space (center mesh), remove loop from hook, insert this in top of first d c of the 6 d c just made (the d c on the d c below), then insert hook in the dropped loop, thread over hook and through the 2 loops on hook, tighten thread, 1 d c on next d c below; this forms a popcorn mesh (which will not again be described in detail); 13 open meshes, 1 closed mesh at end of row. 6th row: 29 open meshes. 7th row: 1 closed mesh, 12 open meshes, 1 popcorn mesh, 1 open mesh, 1 popcorn mesh, 12 open meshes, 1 closed mesh. 8th row: 29 open meshes. 9th row: 1 closed mesh, 11 open meshes, 1 popcorn mesh, 1 open mesh, 1 popcorn mesh, 1 open mesh, 1 popcorn mesh, 11 open meshes, 1 closed mesh. 10th row: 29 open meshes. 11th row: 1 closed mesh, 10 open meshes, 1 popcorn mesh, 1 open mesh, 1 popcorn mesh, 1 open mesh, 1 popcorn mesh, 1 open mesh, 1 popcorn mesh, 10 open meshes, 1 closed mesh. Continue in this way to follow chart until 9 diamond patterns are worked, then work 1 row of 29 open meshes and 1 row with a closed mesh at each end; finish stripe with 1 row the same as 2nd row and 1 row the same as 1st row of stripe. Work 5 stripes of type A.

Stripe B—Ch 92, 1 d c in 8th st from hook, 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts of chain, * ch 2, skip 2 sts, 1 d c in each of the next 4 sts; repeat from * across, ending with an open mesh (29 meshes on chain). 2nd row: ch 3, turn, 2 d c in next space, 1 d c on next d c; continue to alternate 1 closed and 1 open mesh, and end with a closed mesh. 3rd row: 29 open meshes. 4th row: 1 closed mesh. 27 open meshes. 1 closed mesh. 5th row: 29 open meshes. 6th row: 1 closed mesh, 5 open meshes: 1 popcorn mesh and 1 open meshes, 1 closed mesh. 7th row: 29 open meshes, 5 open meshes, 1 closed mesh. 6 open meshes; 1 popcorn meshes. 8th row: 1 closed mesh, 6 open meshes; 1 popcorn mesh and 1 open mesh, alternately, until there are 8 popcorn meshes; 6 open meshes,

1 closed mesh. 9th row: 29 open meshes. 10th row: 1 closed mesh, 7 open meshes; 1 popcorn mesh and 1 open mesh, alternately, until there are 7 popcorn meshes; 7 open meshes, 1 closed mesh. Continue in this way to follow stripe B chart until there are 8 full diamonds and 17 rows on next diamond (to correspond to part diamond at beginning of B-stripe); end with 5 rows the same as the 5 rows at beginning (in reverse order). Make 4 stripes of type B.



Sew stripes together, alternating type A and type B stripes, and having an A stripe at each end, as shown in illustration. The closed meshes on edge of a stripe will come opposite the open meshes on edge of next stripe; the pattern along seams will thus be the same as the pattern at beginning and end of stripes. Finish sides of bedspread with a row of alternating closed and open meshes, as follows: beginning at lower right corner, work 1 d c in corner st, ch 2, 1 d c in same place as the first d c of next row, 2 d c under d c on edge of 2nd row, 1 d c in top of this d c, ch 2, 1 d c in top of turning chain in next row; continue in this way to work an open mesh on edge of a closed mesh, and a closed mesh on edge of an open mesh, along the entire side of bedspread;

IMPORTANT NOTES—Quantity given with each set of directions is for a double size Bedspread.


Single or smaller size Spreads will require proportionately less. Key of abbreviations is given on page 15.

Fringe—Cut thread over a 5-inch cardboard; tie a fringe of 8 strands in every open mesh on sides and lower edge of bedspread.

Magnolia Bedspread No. 425 Double Bedspread, Approx. Size 82x104"

Bucilla Super Crochet Cotton, Article 3457, 18 skeins. Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook No. 3, Article No. 4300.

Each large medallion should measure 51/2" in diameter

Large Medallions-Ch 6, join with a slip st into a ring. 1st round: ch 3, 23 d c in ring, join with a slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round (ch 3 counts as 24th d c). 2nd round: ch 6, * skip 1 d c in 1st round, 1 d c in next d c, ch 3; repeat from * around, end with ch 3. 1 slip st in 3rd st of ch 6 at beginning of round (12 spaces in round). 3rd round: * ch 7, 1 s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 1 tr (treble: thread twice around hook) in each of the last 2 sts of chain, 1 s c in top of next d c in 2nd round; repeat from * around (12 petals in round). 4th round: slipstitch to point of first petal (6 slip sts); * ch 8, 1 slip st in top of next petal; repeat from * 11 times, ending with a slip st in slip st at beginning of round. 5th round: 1 s c in each of the 8 sts of next chain. * skip the slip st at point, 8 s c on next chain; repeat from * to end of round (96 sts in round). Do not join, but from now on work 1 s c in each st, taking up back thread only of st below, until there are 5 rounds of s c (see illustration). 10th round: 1 slip st in next st, ch 6, * skip 1 st, 1 d c in next st, taking up 2 threads of st, ch 3; repeat from * around, ending with ch 3, 1 slip st in each of 3rd and 4th sts of ch 6 at beginning of round (48 meshes in round). 11th round: ch 3, skip 1 space, 1 d c in next space, ch 4, 1 s c in top of d c just made, ch 4, 1 s c in same place as last s c, ch 4, 1 s c in same place as last s c (i.e. 3 picots in top of same d c), * ch 3, 1 s c in next space, ch 3, 1 d c in next space, 3 picots in top of d c just made; repeat from * around (24 picot groups in round), ending with ch 3, 1 s c in slip st at beginning of round; fasten off. Complete the 11th round in only 1 medallion; on 2nd medallion work 20 picot groups in 11th round, then join this medallion to 1st medallion, as follows: make the first picot of next group, ch 1, insert hook from wrong side in 3rd ch of center picot of a group on edge of first medallion, draw thread through both loops on hook, ch 2, 1 s c in top of d c. to complete the picot; make the 3rd picot, ch 3, 1 s c in next space, ch 3, 1 d c in next space; join the center picot of next group to center picot of next group on first medallion; join next picot group in same way to next group on first medallion; finish round without further joinings, and fasten off. In 11th round of 3rd medallion join 3 picot groups to 4th, 5th and 6th picot groups from the last joining on 2nd medallion, leaving 3 picot groups free between joinings; these 3 picot groups will later be joined to the center medallion which unites 4 large medallions. Join a 4th large medallion in same

way to 3 picot groups of 3rd medallion, leaving 3 picot groups free between joinings on 3rd medallion; work 3 free picot groups on 4th medallion and join the next 3 groups to 3 groups of 1st medallion, leaving 3 picot groups of that medallion free between 2nd and 4th medallions. These 4 medallions now form a square with a large space in center; each side of this space has 3 free picot groups. The space is filled with a small center medallion.

Center Medallions-Ch 6 and follow directions for the first 2 rounds of large medallions. 3rd round: ch 3, 1 d c under ch 2 of next space, ch 4, 1 s c in top of d c just made, join next picot to center picot of first free group on one side of space between large medallions; make a 3rd picot in same d c, ch 3, 1 s c in top of next d c in 2nd row, ch 3, 1 d c in next space; join center picot in each of the next 2 groups to each of the next 2 groups of same large medallion; join the next 3 groups of center medallion to the 3 groups of next side of space (next large medallion); continue in this way to join 3 picot groups of center medallion to 3 groups of 3rd and 4th large medallion; join with a slip st at end of round and fasten off. The center medallion will thus have no free picot group (see illustration). Continue in this way to join medallions until bedspread is of desired size (15 medallions in width and 19 medallions in length).


Hexagons—Ch 5, join with a slip st into a ring. 1st round: ch 3, 19 d c in ring, join with a slip st in top st of ch 3 at beginning of round (the ch 3 will count as an additional d c, which make 20 d c in round). 2nd round:

ch 3, 1 d c in same st as ch 3 (the joining st), 1 d c in next st (always take up back thread only of sts below, so that front thread of top sts show as a ridge on right side, as seen in illustration), * 2 d c in next st, 1 d c in next st; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of ch 3 (30 sts in round). 3rd round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, * 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 2 d c in next st, ch 1, 2 d c in next st; repeat from * around, ending with 1 d c in each of 3 sts, 2 d c in last st, ch 1, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round (6 groups of 7 d c in round, with ch 1 between each group). 4th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 5 d c in next st, drop loop from hook, insert this in top of the first of the 5 d c just made, then insert hook in the dropped loop and draw this through loop on hook, tighten up st; this forms a popcorn stitch (which will not again be described in detail); 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 2 d c in next st, * ch 2, 2 d c in first st of next group, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 2 d c in next st (the last st of group); repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round. 5th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, * 1 d c in each of the next 7 sts, 2 d c in next st (the last d c in group), ch 3, 2 d c in first st of next group, skipping the ch 2; continue in this way to work 2 d c in first and last st of each group and 1 d c in each of the 7 d c between, ch 3 between each group and end round with ch 3, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round. 6th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of 2 sts, 2 d c in last d c of group, ch 4, 2 d c in first d c of next group; continue in this way around, ending with ch 4, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round. 7th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, 1 d c in each of 11 sts to last d c of group, 2 d c in last d c, * ch 5, 2 d c in first d c of next group, 1 d c in each of 11 sts, 2 d c in last d c of group; repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round; fasten off.

Half Hexagons-Ch 5, join into a ring. 1st row: ch 3, 8 d c in ring. 2nd row: ch 3, turn, 1 d c in first d c (take up back thread only in this row), 2 d c in each of the next 7 d c, 1 d c in top of turning chain (16 d c, and ch 3, in this row). 3rd row: ch 3, turn, skip first d c, * 2 d c in next d c (take up front loop of all sts in this row), 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 2 d c in next st, ch 1; repeat from * twice, but the last time omit ch 1; end row with 1 d c in top st of turning chain. 4th row: ch 4, turn, skip first d c below, * 2 d c in next d c (take up back thread in all sts), 1 d c in each of 2 sts, 1 popcorn, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 2 d c in next st, ch 2; repeat from * twice, but the last time ch 1 and end row with 1 d c in top of turning chain below. 5th row: ch 4, * 2 d c in first d c of group (take up front thread in all sts), 1 d c in each of the next 7 sts, 2 d c

in next st, ch 3; repeat from * twice, but the last time ch 1, end row with 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain. 6th row: ch 5, turn, * 2 d c in first d c of group (on back thread), 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of 2 sts, 2 d c in last st of group, ch 4; repeat from * twice, but the last time ch 2 and end row with 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain. 7th row: ch 5, * 2 d c in first d c of group (on front thread), 1 d c in each of 11 sts, 2 d c in last st of group, ch 5; repeat from * twice, but the last time ch 2 and end row with 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain. Make 12 full hexagons and 4 half hexagons; arrange them as shown on chart (Page 15) and sew them together, taking up both threads of edge sts and using same thread as for crocheting.

Edging-Beginning at center of first half hexagon, on left edge, make 1 s c in center st, * ch 7, skip 1 row on edge, 1 s c in top st of next row; repeat from * twice, ch 7, 1 s c in first d c of next hexagon, ch 7, skip 4 sts, 1 s c in next st, ch 7, skip 3 sts, 1 s c in next st, ch 7, skip 4 sts, 1 s c in next st (the last d c of group), ch 7, 1 s c in top st of 6th row of next half hexagon; continue in this way along side edge to the ch 5 at first corner, * ch 7, skip the ch 5 below, 1 s c in first d c after chain, ch 7, skip 4 sts, 1 s c in next st, ch 7, skip 3 sts, 1 s c in next st, ch 7, skip 4 sts, 1 s c in last d c of group; repeat from last * twice, ending with 1 s c in last d c of hexagon (just before seam), ch 5, 1 s c in first d c of next hexagon, ch 7, skip 4 sts, 1 s c in next st; continue in this way around the entire piece, end with a slip st in first s c of round. 2nd round: slip-stitch to center of first chain, * ch 7, 1 slip st in 4th st from hook (a picot), ch 3, 1 s c under next ch 7; repeat from * around and fasten off.

Arm Rests—Make 5 full hexagons and 2 half hexagons. Join them as shown on chart (page 15) and work the 2 rows of edging as on Chair Back.



Hexagons—Ch 6, join with a slip st into a ring. Ist round: ch 3, 19 d c in ring, join with a slip st in top st of ch 3 at beginning of round (the ch 3 will count as an additional d c, which makes 20 d c in round). 2nd round: ch 3, 1 d c in same st as ch 3 (the joining st), 1 d c in next st (always take up back thread only of sts below, so that front thread of top sts show as a ridge on right side, as shown in illustration), * 2 d c in next st, 1 d c in next st; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round (30 sts in round). 3rd round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, * 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 2 d c in next st, ch 1, 2 d c in next st; repeat from * around, ending with 1 d c in each

of 3 sts, 2 d c in last st, ch 1, 1 slip in top of ch 3 at beginning of round (6 groups of 7 d c in round, with ch 1 between groups). 4th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 5 d c in next st, drop loop from hook, insert this in top of first d c of the 5 d c just made, then insert hook in the dropped loop and draw this through loop on hook, tighten st; this forms a popcorn stitch (which will not again be described in detail); 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 2 d c in next st, * ch 2, 2 d c in first d c of next group, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 2 d c in next st (the last d c of group); repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round. 5th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, * 1 d c in each of the next 7 sts, 2 d c in next st (the last d c in group), ch 2, 2 d c in first st of next group, skipping the ch 2; continue in this way to work 2 d c in first and last st of each group, and 1 d c in each of the 7 d c between, ch 2 between each group and end round with ch 2, 1 slip st in top st of ch 3 at beginning of round. 6th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of 2 sts, 2 d c in last d c of group, ch 3, 2 d c in first d c of next group; continue in this way around, ending with ch 3, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round. 7th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, 1 d c in each of 11 sts to last d c of group, 2 d c in last d c, * ch 3, 2 d c in first d c of next group, 1 d c in each of 11 sts, 2 d c in last d c of group; repeat from * around, ending with ch 3, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round. 8th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, * 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of 3 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of 2 sts, 2 d c in last st of group, ch 4, 2 d c in first st of next group; repeat from * around, ending with ch 4, 1 d c in top of ch 3 at beginning of round. 9th round: ch 3, 1 d c in joining st, * 1 d c in each of 15 sts, 2 d c in next st (the last st of group), ch 4, 2 d c in first st of next group; repeat from * around, ending with ch 4, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of round; fasten off.

Half Hexagons—Ch 5, join into a ring. 1st row: ch 3, 8 d c in ring. 2nd row: ch 3, turn, 1 d c in first d c (take up back thread only in this row), 2 d c in each of the next 7 sts, 1 d c in top st of turning chain (16 d c, and ch 3, in this row). 3rd row: ch 3, turn, skip first d c, * 2 d c in next d c (take up front thread of all sts in this row), 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 2 d c in next st, ch 1; repeat from * twice, but the last time omit ch 1; end row with 1 d c in top of turning chain. 4th row: ch 3, turn, skip first d c below, * 2 d c in next st (take up back loop in all sts), 1 d c in each of 2 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of 2 sts, 2 d c in next st, ch 2; repeat from * twice, but the last time omit ch 2; end row with 1 d c in top of turning chain in row below. 5th row: ch 3, turn, skip the first d c,

* 2 d c in next st (take up front loop of all sts), 1 d c in each of the next 7 sts, 2 d c in next st, ch 2; repeat from * twice, but the last time omit ch 2 and end with 1 d c in top of turning chain. 6th row: ch 3, turn, skip first d c, * 2 d c in next d c (on back thread), 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of 2 sts, 2 d c in last st of group, ch 3; repeat from * twice, but the last time omit ch 3 and end row with 1 d c in top of turning chain. 7th row: ch 3, turn, skip first d c, * 2 d c in next st (on front thread), 1 d c in each of 11 sts, 2 d c in last st of group, ch 3; repeat from * twice, but the last time omit ch 3 and end row with 1 d c in top of turning chain. 8th row: ch 3, turn, skip the first d c, * 2 d c in next d c (on back thread), 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of 3 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of 2 sts, 2 d c in last st of group, ch 4; repeat from * twice, omit the last ch 4 and end row with 1 d c in top of turning chain. 9th row: ch 3, turn, skip first d c, * 2 d c in next d c (on front thread), 1 d c in each of 15 sts, 2 d c in last d c of group, ch 4; repeat from * twice, but the last time omit ch 4 and end row with 1 d c in top of turning chain; fasten off.

Make 233 full and 14 half hexagons for a full size bedspread. Arrange hexagons as shown on chart (page 15) and sew them together, taking up both threads of edge sts and leaving chains free (see illustration); use the same thread to sew with as for crocheting. Add the half hexagons at ends (see chart) and sew.

Edging—Beginning at seam just before a corner, make 1 d c in seam, ch 3, 1 d c in first d c of corner hexagon, * ch 3, skip 1 st on edge, 1 d c in next st, ch 3, skip 2 sts on edge, 1 d c in next st, ch 3, skip 2 sts on edge, 1 d c in next st; repeat from * along edge; work about 16 meshes on edge of the half hexagons; moderate the spacing of meshes, if necessary to have edging lie flat; join with a slip st to first st of round. 2nd round: ch 4, 1 d c under ch 3 of first mesh, * ch 3, 1 d c under ch 3 of next mesh, repeat from * around, join and fasten off.

Fringe—Cut thread in pieces about 11 inches long; tie a 4-thread fringe in each mesh on 3 sides of spread (sides and foot of bed).


Bucilla Super Crochet Cotton, Article 3457, 20 skeins. Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook No. 3, Article 4300.

Each square should measure about 7 inches.

Squares—Ch 12, join with a slip st into a ring. 1st row: ch 3 (which counts as 1 d c), 2 d c in first st, taking up 2 threads of ch, 1 d c in next st, * ch 7, 1 d c in next st, 2 d c in next st, 1 d c in next st; repeat from * twice, ch 7, 1 slip st in top st of ch 3 at beginning of row. (Always

There will be 4 groups of 4 d c, with ch 7 between each group. 2nd row: turn, skip the joining st, * 1 s c in each st of the ch 7 (taking up 2 threads of ch sts), 1 s c in each of the next 4 d c; repeat from * around. 3rd row: without turning, make 1 slip st in each of the first 4 s c, taking up back thread only, ch 3, turn, skip the first slip st, * 1 d c in each of 11 sts, taking up back thread, ch 7, 1 d c in same st as last d c; repeat from * 3 times, ending with ch 7, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of row. 4th row: turn, skip the joining st, * 1 s c in each of the 7 ch sts (taking up 2 threads as in 2nd row), 1 s c in each d c to next chain (taking up both threads of top sts); repeat from * to end of row. 5th row: without turning, make a slip st in each of the first 4 s c, taking up back loop only, ch 3, turn, skip the first slip st, * 1 d c in each st to center st of corner space (20 d c in row, including the ch 3), taking up back thread only, ch 7, 1 d c in same st as last d c; repeat from * 3 times, ending with ch 7, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of row. 6th row: same as 4th row. 7th row: same as 5th row (28 d c on each side of square). 8th row: same as 4th row. 9th row: same as 5th row (36 d c on each side of square). 10th row: same as 4th row. 11th row: slip st over the first 4 s c, ch 3, turn, skip the first slip st, 1 d c on back thread of next st, ch 2, 1 slip st in top of last d c (a picot), 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, * ch 4, skip 4 sts, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, 1 picot, 1 d c on each of the next 2 sts; repeat from * to corner, ending with a group of 4 d c (with a picot) on the first 4 s c of corner space; ch 7, 1 d c in same st as last d c, 1 d c in next st, 1 picot, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, ch 4, skip 4 sts; continue in this way on all 4 sides; end with ch 6, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of row. 12th row: ch 3, turn, 1 d c in first st of ch 6, 1 picot, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts on chain, ch 7, 1 d c in same st as last d c, 1 d c in next st, 1 picot, 2 d c on the remaining 2 sts of chain, * ch 4, a group of 4 d c, with a picot in center, on the next ch 4 below (always taking up 2 threads of ch sts); repeat from * to corner; work a group of 4 d c, with picot, on the first 4 sts of corner space, ch 7; continue in this way on all 4 sides, ending with ch 4, 1 slip st in top of ch 3 at beginning of row; break off and darn in end. Final row of first square: turn, make a loop on hook, 1 d c in 4th st of a corner space, 1 picot, 1 d c in next st of corner space, 1 picot, 1 d c in next st, 1 picot, 1 d c in last st of space. * ch 1, insert hook under ch st in picot and make 1 s c, ch 1, 1 d c in first st of next space, 1 picot, 1 d c in next st, 1 picot, 1 d c in next st, 1 picot, 1 d c in last st of space; repeat from * to corner, ending last group with 1 d c in 4th st of corner space; ch 3, 1 d c in same st as last d c, 1 picot, 1 d c in next st, 1 picot, 1 d c in next st, 1 picot, 1 d c in last st of corner space; continue in this way on all 4 sides of square; join with a slip st and fasten off. Work the final row on next square, but on 4th side join this square to first square, as follows: begin row with 1 d c in 4th st of a corner space, 1 picot,

1 d c in next st, ch 1, insert hook from wrong side in center picot of first group from corner on the first square, and make a ch st, 1 slip st in top of last d c on second square, 1 d c in next st, 1 picot, 1 d c in last st of corner space, ch 1, 1 s c in top of picot of next group below on second square, ch 1, 1 d c in first st of next space; continue in this way to join center picot of group on side of one square to center picot of corresponding group on other square, until all groups on one side are joined; finish corner as before and fasten off. Join square after square in this way until 15 squares are joined into a strip. In next strip the squares have to be joined on two sides: to preceding square of same strip and to one side of square in first strip. Continue to join square after square until spread is 12 squares wide and 15 squares long; darn in all ends. At all points where 4 squares meet, make an extra joining, as follows: working from right side with a separate end of thread, make 1 s c in center st of ch 3 at corner of 1st square, ch 1, 1 s c in center st of ch 3 at corner of 2nd square, ch 1, 1 s c in center st at corner of 3rd square, ch 1, 1 s c in center st at corner of 4th square, ch 1, 1 slip st in first st of joining ring; fasten off and darn in ends.

Pinwheel Bedspread No. 423


Double Bedspread, Approx. Size 82x102"

Bucilla Super Crochet Cotton, Articla 3457, 13 skeins. Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook No. 3, Articla 4300.

Pinwheel-Ch 8, join with a slip st into a ring. 1st round: 16 s c in ring. Work round and round without joining. 2nd round: 1 s c in first s c, taking up 2 threads of st below, ch 1, * 3 d c in ring, working over the sts in s c round below, ch 6; repeat from * 3 times, ending with ch 6. 3rd round: 1's c in each of the first 3 d c in row below (always take up 2 threads of stitch), 3 s c under next chain, * ch 6, 1 s c in each of the next 3 d c, 3 s c under next chain; repeat from * twice, ending round with ch 6. 4th round: * skip first s c of next group. 1 s c in each of the next 5 s c, 3 s c under next chain, ch 6; repeat from * 3 times, ending with ch 6. 5th round: * skip the first s c of next group, 1 s c in each of the next 7 s c, 3 s c under next chain, ch 6; repeat from * 3 times, ending with ch 6 (10 s c between chains). 6th round: * skip the first s c of next group, 1 s c in each st to next chain, 3 s c under chain, ch 6; repeat from * 3 times, ending with ch 6 (12 s c between chains). Repeat 6th round, thus in every round having 2 more s c in groups than in preceding round, until in the 10th round (the 8th s c round) there are 20 s c between chains. 11th round: * skip first s c of next group, 1 s c in each of the next 18 s c of same group (leaving the last s c free), ch 6, 1 s c under next chain, ch 6; repeat from * 3 times. 12th round: * skip first s c of next group, 1 s c in each st to within 1 s c of end of group (16), ch 6, 1 s c under first chain, ch 6, 1 s c under next chain, ch 6; repeat from * 3 times. 13th round: * skip first

Section of Pinwheel Bedspread No. 423

The sheer laciness of this charming Spread will endear it to all lovers of the beautiful. The motif is unusual — yet the actual work is easy and fascinating — the individual Pinwheels can be carried with you to a Tea or Bridge and joined later.



s c, 1 s c in each of the next 14 s c, skip last s c of group, ch 6, 1 s c under first chain, ch 6, 1 s c under next chain, ch 6, 1 s c under next chain, ch 6; repeat from * 3 times. 14th round: * skip first s c of next group, 1 s c in each of 12 sts, skip last s c of group; ch 6 and 1 s c under next chain, 4 times, then ch 6 once more; repeat from * 3 times. 15th round: * 10 s c, skipping the first and the last s c in group below; ch 6 and 1 s c under next chain, 5 times, then ch 6 once more; repeat from * 3 times. 16th round: * 8 s c, skipping the first and the last s c in group below; ch 6 and 1 s c under next chain, 6 times, then ch 6 once more; repeat from * 3 times. 17th round: * 6 s c, skipping the first and the last s c of group below; ch 6 and 1 s c under next chain, 7 times, then ch 6 once more; repeat from * 3 times. 18th round: * 4 s c, skipping the first and the last s c in group below; ch 6 and 1 s c under next chain, 8 times, then ch 6 once more; repeat from * 3 times. 19th round: * 2 s c, skipping the first and the last s c in group below; ch 6 and 1 s c under next chain, 9 times in succession, then ch 6 once more; repeat from * 3 times. Work the 19th round complete on only 1 wheel. On 2nd wheel, work the 19th round over the first 2 points only, then join this wheel to 1st wheel as follows: counting from the 2 s c of 2nd point, ch 6, 1 s c under next chain, ch 6, 1 s c under next chain, ch 6, 1 s c under next chain, ch 2, 1 s c under 4th chain after a point in 1st wheel (holding wrong side of 1st wheel toward wrong side of 2nd wheel), ch 3, 1 s c under next chain in 2nd wheel, * ch 2, 1 s c under next chain in 1st wheel, ch 3, 1 s c under next chain in 2nd wheel; repeat from * twice; ch 6, 1 s c under next chain in 2nd wheel, ch 6, 1 s c under next chain in same wheel, ch 6, 2 s c on next point of wheel; continue to end of round as in first wheel. Make a 3rd wheel and join in same way to the 4 center meshes of next quarter of 2nd wheel. On 4th wheel, work the 19th round on the first 2 quarters; join the 4 center meshes of 3rd quarter to the 4 center meshes of next quarter of 3rd wheel and then to the 4 center meshes of next quarter in 1st wheel; the 4 wheels will now form a square; finish 19th round in 4th wheel and fasten off.

Fill the open space in center of the 4 wheels, as follows: ch 10, join with a slip st into a ring, ch 12, 1 s c under chain of 3rd mesh before a point of 2 s c in one of the wheels; ch 12, 1 s c in ring, ch 12, 1 s c under ch 6 of next mesh of same wheel, ch 12, 1 s c in ring, ch 12, 1 s c in next mesh (the mesh just before point of 2 s c), ch 12, 1 s c in ring; join in same way the next 3 meshes of same wheel (on other side of the 2 s c) to the ring; continue in this way to join 6 meshes of each of the other 3 wheels to ring, and end with ch 12, 1 s c in ring (24 loops, in all, in ring); fasten off and darn in ends. Join wheels in this way until spread is 11 wheels in width and 14 wheels in length.

Fringe—Cut thread in pieces about 12 inches long; the an 8-strand fringe in each mesh on edge of the two long sides and one short side; divide the fringes and the another knot 1 inch below the first, as shown in illustration (8 strands from one fringe tied with 8 strands from next fringe).

Filet Rose Bedspread No. 415

Double Bedspread, Approx. Size 87x102"

Bucilla Super Crochet Cotton, Article No. 3457, 17 skeins. Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook No. 5. Article 4300.

7 meshes = 2 inches

7 rows = 2 inches

Strip A—Ch 122, 1 d c in 8th st from hook, * ch 2, skip 2 sts on chain, 1 d c in next st; repeat from * to end (39 open meshes on chain). 2nd row: ch 5, turn, 1 d c on 2nd d c in row below (taking up 2 threads), * ch 2, 1 d c on next d c; repeat from * until there are 14 meshes from beginning of row, 2 d c on next ch 2, 1 d c on next d c (this is a closed mesh of 4 d c), 24 open meshes to end of row (see chart page 14). 3rd row: 25 open meshes, 1 closed mesh, 13 open meshes. Continue in this way to follow chart until there are 8 roses in length, ending the 8th rose with the row that completes the 2 last leaves (marked on chart with an arrow). Finish strip with a row of all open meshes, as at beginning of strip. Strip when finished should measure 11 inches in width and about 95 inches in length.

Strip B—Ch 122 as in A strip, 39 open meshes on chain. Work 8 rows in all open meshes before beginning the rose stem, as shown on chart on page 15. Follow B chart until there are 7 roses, then end the strip as shown on the special chart (25 rows after the row that completes the last 2 leaves). Make 4 A-strips and 3 B-strips; sew them together lengthwise, alternating A and B-strips and having an A-strip at each end. Be careful to have rows worked from same side meet at seams.

Border—Beginning in 4th mesh before a corner, make 1 s c in mesh, ch 7, skip 1 mesh, 1 s c in next mesh, ch 7, 1 s c in next mesh (corner), ch 7, 1 s c in next mesh, * ch 7, skip 1 mesh, 1 s c in next mesh, repeat from * to next corner, continue in this way around all 4 sides, making all corners alike. 2nd row of border: end last row with a slip st in first s c, 2 slip sts on next chain, 1 s c under same chain, * ch 7, 1 s c under chain of next mesh, repeat from * around, ending with 1 slip stitch in first s c of round; fasten off.

Fringe—Cut thread over a 6 inch cardboard, tie 8 strands in every mesh on 3 sides of bedspread, divide fringe and tie another knot 1 inch below first, as shown in illustration.

Note—If so preferred, use 4 strips (A) of Filet and 3 strips of Linen Material (cut from 36-inch wide Linen).

Section of Filet Rose Bedspread No. 415.

This Filet Rose motif makes an extremely attractive counterpane and will cause many sighs of envy. It is worked in strips and then joined. You can create a new effect by alternating three 12" bands of 36" width Linen with four 12" strips of the Crochet.






Chart for Filet Rose Bedspread No. 415
