

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No. 3 Crochet Cotton for leaves and stems. No. 5 Crochet Cotton for grapes.

#### **GRAPE LEAF**

Ch 18, turn, sk 3, 15 dc in 15 st, turn with a loose loop, sl st in 2d and 3d following dc, ch 3, a dc in same st with last sl st, a dc in each following dc, working in back loop of st to form a rib, 2 dc in 1st st of the 3 ch. Ch 6, sk 2d st of 3 ch and 2 dc in next, then a dc in each st down other side, leaving 4 at end, turn, work as before to make the notch of leaf (a sl st in 2d and 3d following dc, ch 3, a dc in same st with last sl st), dc in each dc, with 2 in last, next to ch, dc in each of 1st 3 sts of ch 6. Ch 6, a dc in each last 3 sts of same ch 6, 2 dc in dc following, a dc in each dc, 2 in last, 3 in 3 of ch 6. Ch 6, 3 in last of ch 6, dc in dc down other side to end, turn, sl st to 5th dc as before and work around leaf, leaving 4 at end, turn, continue in this way until you have 5 sps formed by ch 6 at base of leaflet, and when making the last large notch (ch 3, dc in each dc), put 1 dc of 1st 2 sts of ch 3, 2 dc in each of next 2, 1 in each of next 2, and finish row to match other side, turn, sl to 5th dc as before and break off 10 in. of thread with which to join sections.

The 2d section, or leaflet, has 4 sps in the center, and is worked in the same way, with notches as follows: End notch as directed, small notch each side, 1 large notch and 2 small notches.

The large notches are formed by commencing with 3 ch and carrying the dc to the end on the opposite side to the small ones by slipping to 5th dc at beginning and leaving 4 dc at end to correspond. Leave 10 in. of thread to join.

Now count the sts on the side of section which is to join the center, or section first made, beginning with

the 2 dc in last dc next to sp and counting to end of row, place at corresponding dc of center section, counting from 2 dc and make sl st in a vein of each st, the one next you and the further one on the other section. After the 2 dc and joined, break the thread and fasten securely. The small leaflet, or section, has 2 center sps and 3 small notches each side the center notch. Join the side to next, or 2d, section, putting the 2 dc together, counting to end of row on small section and the same number of dc on the 2d section.

Having finished the leaf, wind thread around four

matches held together, slip off and fill with dc.

Sew the sections to under side of ring having the smallest section about 1/4 inch apart.

For the leaf stem, make a ch of 44 sts, turn, sk 1 ch, a dc in each following st to the end, ch 1, turn a dc in each 12 dc, taking both veins of st, 2 dc in next (1 in each of 3, 2 in next), 4 times, then 1 dc in each de to end. Sew to under side of ring between small,


Ch 4, 7 dc under ch. Make 2 dc in each of 7 dc in next row make a dc in dc, 2 in next, and in next a dc in each of 2 dc, 2 in next, sk 3d st in next row, sk every 2d st in the next row, then with top of the crochet hook stuff in some cotton tightly until the ball is full and a good shape, continue crocheting around and close the top with one or two sl sts. (Always take

up both loops in working the ball.)

Ch 15, turn, sk 1, 1 dc in each st, ch 1, turn, 1 dc in each dc.

Join the grapes neatly together, having 16 in cluster, and arrange like plate. Cut out between the leaves and stems, turn back and hem neatly.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR CROCHETING STITCHES

- 1. CHAIN: Make a loop, insert hook, throw thread over hook, and draw a loop through first one made. Each loop is a chain stitch.
- 2. SLIP STITCH: Insert hook in foundation chain, draw a loop through it and the loop on hook.
- SINGLE CROCHET: Make chain, insert hook through second last chain, throw thread over hook, draw through, throw thread over hook, draw through both loops at once.
- 4. DOUBLE CROCHET: Throw thread over hook and draw a loop through foundation chain; throw thread over hook and draw through two loops, thread over hook and draw through last two loops.
- 5. TREBLE CROCHET: Throw thread over hook twice, draw a loop through foundation chain, throw thread over again, draw through the two loops, throw thread over and draw through two, thread over and draw through last two.
- 6. PICOT: Chain 4 and make single crochet in fourth chain from hook.
- 7. SPACE: This is for Filet Crochet Work. Chain two stitches, skip two stitches, one double crochet into next stitch.
- KNOT STITCH: Having a st on the needle, drawing the loop out to the length of 3 ch, draw the thread through for ch st. Take up the single thread of this loop and work one sc st on it. Repeat once. Skip 5 sts of the previous row, if not knot st, and work 1 sc. If the previous row be knot st, make 1 sc each side of the selection of the selection of the selection. side of the sc between the long loops of last row.
- 9. BLOCK: Also for Filet Crochet. Four dc in adjoining sts. The number of dc in adjoining blocks is found by multiplying the number of blocks by 3 and adding one.
- 10. HALF DOUBLE CROCHET: Worked in groups of 3, 4 or more dc, by making 1st half of each st, holding last st of each till you have all of the stitches half made and working all off at once.
- HALF TREBLE CROCHET: This is worked like the half dc except you throw thread over twice, two off, two off, holding last st of each tr until you have all 3, or 4, as the case may be, when all are worked off together as one st.

- 12. TRIPLE TREBLE: Worked like treble, but thread over 3 times.
- 13. FANCY MESH: Also called Lacet. consists of two rows. The first a row of long meshes, 1 dc, 5 ch, skip 5 st, 1 dc, repeat. For the second row, 1 dc in dc of long mesh, ch 3, catch in center of 5 ch of 1 m, ch 3, dc over dc.
- SHELL: Make chain required length. Ch 3 for 1st tr, 3 tr in 4th st of ch, ch 2, 3 tr in same st sk 5, 3 tr in next st, ch 2, 3 tr in same st. Repeat from \*.

2d row of shells—make shell in each ch 2.

- 15. LATTICE STITCH: For the Lattice st, make the first loop like the first loop of knot st, make a tight sc to hold the loop firm, then a dc, repeat as many times as desired.
- 16. DOUBLE TREBLE CROCHET: Is made similarly to the treble, the difference being that the thread is thrown around the needle twice and the loops are worked off two at a time for three repeats.
- 17. ROLL STITCH: Roll thread around needle 15 times, put thread over and draw loop through the entire 15 loops, then make one chain stitch.





1st Row-Ch 819, 271 sps.


2d Row-1 sp, 269 blks, 1 sp.


**3d Row**—1 sp, 1 blk, 267 sps, 1 blk, 1 sp.

4th Row—Like 3d row, then follow design.

Edge blks all around with a p after every 4th st.

The dot represents center of drawing, and in referring to drawings on this page and inside cover page the worker must center these dots before starting the four sides, so that the letters will be evenly distributed.

1st Row—Ch 63, 1 blk, 1 sp, 1 dc, ch 3, 3 dc in same st, 4 sps, 2 blks, 2 sps, 3 blks, 4 sps, 1 blk, 1 sp, ch 8, turn.

2d Row—1 blk, 5 sps, 7 blks, 5 sps, 3 dc in ch 3, ch 3, 1 dc in same ch, 1 sp, 1 blk, ch 3, turn.

3d Row—1 blk, 1 sp, 1 dc in ch 3, ch 3, 3 dc in same ch, 7 sps, 5 blks, 7 sps, 1 blk, 1 sp, ch 8, turn.

7th Row—1 blk, 1 sp, 1 dc in ch 3, ch 3, 3 dc in same ch, 6 sps, 3 blks, 3 sps, 8 blks, 7 sps, 1 blk, 1 sp, ch 5, turn.



13th Row—1 blk, 1 sp, 1 dc in ch 3, ch 3, 3 dc in same ch, 27 sps, 1 blk, 1 tr in last of blk of last row ch 5, turn.

14th Row—1 blk, 27 sps, 3 dc in ch 3, ch 3, 1 dc


in same ch, 1 sp, 1 blk, ch 3, turn.

15th Row—1 blk, 1 sp, 1 dc in ch 3, ch 3, 3 dc in same ch, 11 sps, 17 blks, 1 tr in last of blk of last row, ch 5, turn.

16th Row—15 sps, 1 blk, 13 sps, 3 dc in ch 3, ch 3, 1 dc in same ch, 1 sp, 1 blk, ch 3, turn. This completes one scallop.

### Fancy Ceaf Centerpiece



Crochet Cotton No. 20. Cut linen the size desired.

1st Row—Insert hook in linen, make 1 dc, ch 2, hook in linen, dc, ch 2. \* repeat around linen, join.

2d Row—Ch 8, sk 2 sps of 1st row, fasten with sl repeat around. 8 dc under ch 8 of last row, join.

3rd Row-1 dc in middle of 8 dc of previous row, ch 3, dc in same place, sk 4 dc of last row, dc, ch 3, dc in same place. \* repeat around.

4th Row—Dc under ch 3 of last row, ch 3, dc in same place. \* repeat around.

5th Row-Like 4th row.

6th and 7th Rows—Like 4th row. 8th Row—Dc, ch 4, dc under ch 3 of last row. 9th and 10th Rows—Like 8th row.

11th Row—Dc, ch 5, dc under ch 4 of last row.
12th Row—Dc under ch 5 of last row, ch 2, 6 dc with ch 2 between under next ch 5. \* repeat around.

13th Row—Dc in top of dc of last row, ch 3, 6 dc with ch 2 between under ch 5 of last row. \* repeat around.

Now, either sew these leaves to the lower edge of 14th Row—Like 12th row, with ch 4 between the centerpiece or with book and thread crochet 15th Row—Like 13th row, with the between the little of the centerpiece.

**FANCY LEAF** 

Ch 8, join 16 sc over ring, join 18 ch, 1 sc into 2d ch from hook, 1 ch, sk 1 st, 1 sc into next st, 1 ch, sk 1 st, 1 dc into next. Repeat from \* until 6 dc, with 1 ch between, are made. 1 ch, 1 sc into last ch, 1 sl st

into 1st sc on ring, turn.

2d Row—Work 17 sc up to the point of leaf on back of st and work 17 sc down on other side of leaf, 1 sl st into ring, 8 sl st up on leaf in back of st, 5 ch, 1 sc into 1st ch, sk 1 st, 2 sl sts on next 2 sts, 4 ch for p, sk 1 st, 2 sl sts, ch 4 for p, sk 1 st, 2 sl sts, 5 ch for p on top of leaf, work down in same way 2 sl sts into ring, 10 ch, catch to last p on leaf, 2 ch, 1 sc into the 8th ch, counting from beginning, thus forming 1st p of little flower, 5 ch, 1 sc into sp where 1st sc was made, 5 ch, 1 sc in same sp, 5 ch. Join the 4 p with sl st, 5 ch, 1 sc in same place where joined. 8 sl sts on 8 ch, 1 sl st on ring, 18 ch. Repeat leaf same as 1st leaf was made, joining the 1st p on to last p of flower. Repeat until 3 leaves and 2 flowers are made. Join the p on top of last leaf to the p on top of the 1st leaf on to each succeeding motif.

### Rose and Leaf Centerpiece



Cut a piece of linen 131/2 in. in diameter. Hem

Crochet 4 rows of ks around the linen, then 5

rows of the lat st (1/2 ks, with to between).

Now, with needle and thread sew the leaves around the center pieces. There will be 12 of these groups, or they can be crocheted to the lower edge.

#### ROSES

1st Row—\* ch 6, join ch 3, 1 dc in ring. from \* around ring, making 5 open sps in all.

2d Row-Under the 1st 3 ch, work 1 dc, 7 tc, 1 dc. Repeat around.

3d Row-\* ch 4, 1 dc in the top of the next dc of the 1st row, taken between the petals at back of work. Repeat from \* around.

4th Row-1 dc, 9 tc, 1 dc, under each 4 ch loop of previous row.

5th Row—Ch 5, 1 dc in top of 1st dc of 3d row, taken between petals at back of work. Repeat around

6th Row-1 dc, 11 tc, 1 dc in 1st loop. Repeat around and fasten off.

#### **LEAVES**

Ch 11, turn, sk 1, 1 dc in each of the next 10 sts, 1 dc in each of the next 8 sts down the other side of ch, \* ch 3, turn, 1 dc on each of the 8 dc of last row and 1 dc under 3 ch, ch 3, 1 dc under 3 ch, and 1 dc in each of the next 7 sts, ch 3, turn, 1 dc in each of the 8 dc of lest row 1 dc under 3 ch ch 3 1 dc under 3 ch 8 dc of last row, 1 dc under 3 ch, ch 3, 1 dc under 3 ch and 1 dc in each of the next 7 sts. \* repeat from \* to \* until you have 9 ribs on each side of the center.

Make 36 of these leaves and join together in groups of 3 (like plate), sew the rose in the center of the 3 leaves.

### Star Centerpiece



To make the Star Centerpiece, which is a variatio of the ever-popular rose in the roll st, use Crochet Cotton No. 5, and linen cut in shape of an hexagon, 7 in.

1st Row-Ch 10, join, ch 5, fasten in ring. Repeat 4 times.

2d Row-In each loop make 1 sc, 5 rolls and fasten with 1 sc.

3d Row-Ch 6, letting ch pass at back of petal, fasten between petals. Repeat 4 times.

4th Row-Fill each loop with 1 sc, 6 rolls, 1 sc.

5th Row—Like 3d row, with ch 7.

6th Row-Fill each loop with 1 sc, 8 rolls, 1 sc. This completes the rose.

#### **RINGS**

Wind thread around little finger, slip off and fill

with sc. You will need 18 rings for each star and 3 rings between the stars.

Ch 20, 3 sc in 19th st, 1 sc in each of the next sts. (Turn, ch 2 in each st to 3 sc, taking up back to form a rib.)

3 sc in middle st of 3 sc.

Continue around, making 1 st in each 20th st, until you have 6 ribs on each side.

Sew together neatly with needle and thread. Make 6 stars and join like plate.

SI st in end of leaf of star, sc, ch 3, dc in next rib, ch 3, tr in next with ch 3 between, increasing and decreasing the length of the st where necessary.

Join the 6 stars together in this way and sew neatly

### Block Centerpiece



Crochet Cotton No. 3. No. 6 Steel Crochet Needle.

1st Row-Ch as many st as desired, join.

2d Row—Ch 9, turn, sk 1st st of ch, a sc in each of 8 st, \* ch 1, turn, a sc in each sc of last row. Repeat from \* until you have made 6 rows in all. Ch 8, sk 6 sts of ring, fasten between next 2, turn, ch 1, a sc in each st of 8 ch and again fasten from 1st \* until you have finished the block of 6 rows. Continue until the ring is filled with blocks. After working the 6th row of last block, fasten neatly to the corner of 1st block.

3d Row—Ch 4, a d tr in same place, \* ch 6, fasten in corner of blk, ch 6, 2 d tr where next 2 blks join. Repeat from \* around, joining at top of 4 ch.

4th Row—Ch 3, a tr in each st all around, widening as required to keep the work flat.

5th Row—Ch 9 and make a blk as in 2d row sk, 3 tr, ch 4, fasten in next, ch 4, fasten at corner of blk where 1st 4 ch started, ch 8, sk 3 tr of last row, fasten, turn and make the 2d blk like 2d blk in 2d row.

Repeat around, alternating the ch loops and blks, joining after last ch loops to corner of 1st blk.

6th Row—Ch 4, a d tr in same place, \* ch 6, a dc in corner of next blk, ch 11, dc between blks, over ch loops of last row, ch 4, sk 4 of 11 ch, fasten. Repeat \* around, join.

7th Row—Like 4th row, always widening to keep the work flat.

8th Row—Ch a tr in next tr, \* ch 7, sk 6, 2 tr in next 2 tr. Repeat from \* around, joining last 7 ch to top of 3 ch.


9th Row—Same as 4th row, widening to keep work flat.

10th Row—Same as 5th row, sk 5 tr between each blk and loop and working in next.

11th, 12th and 13th Rows—Same as 6th, 7th and 8th rows.

14th Row—Same as 5th row, only using ch 12 for blk instead of ch 9.

### Daisy Centerpiece



Crochet Cotton No. 5.

Cut linen the size desired. Hem neatly.

1st Row—Insert hook in linen, make 1 dc, ch 2, hook in linen, dc, ch 2. \* repeat around linen, join.

2d Row—Ch 5, dc in dc of 1st row, ch 2, dc in next dc. \* repeat around.

3d Row—Tr tr in 1st sp from hook, 3 ch, thread around hook 3 times, insert hook into same sp where 1st leaf is made, make 2d, 3d and 4th leaves in same way as 1st is made, with ch 3 between. Sk 2 sps, tr'tr in next sp. \* repeat around.

4th Row—Tr tr in top of tr tr of last row, 4 leaves under ch 4, between 2d and 3d leaves of previous row.
\* repeat around.

5th Row-Like 4th row, with ch 5 between.

6th Row—Like 5th row, with ch 2 between tr tr and leaf.

7th Row—Like 6th row, with ch 3 between tr tr and leaf.

8th Row—Tr tr in tr tr of last row, 8 leaves between 2d and 3d leaves of last row, with ch 6 between. 8 sc over each loop of 6 ch all around, fasten with sl st in top of each tr tr of last row.

### Picot Centerpiece



Crochet Cotton No. 5. Steel Crochet Needle No. 6. 1st Row—Tr, with ch 3 between, around center-

2d Row--Ch 3, tr in same place, \* ch 4. Repeat

3d Row—Ch 3, a tr in each st all around.
4th Row—Make 20 tr in 20 tr (ch 3 for 1st tr), ch 6, fasten back in 4th st from hook for a p, ch 2, sk

ch 6, fasten back in 4th st from hook for a p, ch 2, sk 4 tr, 1 d tr in next, ch 6, p, ch 2, sk 4 sts, repeat the row, joining last p, ch to the 3 ch, which represents the 1st tr of the row.

5th Row—Slip to the 2d tr to begin the row and make 18 tr (ch 3 for 1st), over 18 tr, sk 1st and last, ch 6, p, ch 2, d tr of tr, ch 6, p, ch 2, d tr in same place, ch 6, p, ch 2. Repeat around, join.

6th Row—16 tr over 18 tr, sk 1st and last, ch 6, p, ch 2, 1 d tr in top of tr, ch 2 (this we will call loop hereafter) d tr in d tr loop, d tr in p of last row, loop.

9th Row-8 tr over 10 tr, sk 1st and last, 2 d tr in d tr 4 times, loop, 2 d tr with loop in next p, loop, d tr in d tr 4 times, loop. Repeat around, join.

10th Row-6 tr over 8 tr, sk 1st and last, loop d tr in d tr 5 times, 2 d tr with loop between, next p of last row, loop d tr in d tr 5 times, loop. Repeat around,

11th Row-4 tr of 6 tr, sk 1st and last, loop d tr in d tr 6 times, 2 d tr with loop between in next p of last row, loop d tr in d tr 6 times, loop. Repeat around join.

4th Row-1 sc in ch 2, ch 5, 3 tr in next ch 2, Repeat.

5th Row—Ch 10, sc in center of 3 tr. Repeat. 6th Row—Ch 6, 3 tr in ch 10, ch 6, sc in sc of last

row. Repeat.
7th Row—Ch 11, sc in center of 3 tr. Repeat.
8th Row—Ch 7, 3 tr in ch 11, ch 7, sc in sc of last Repeat.



12th Row—Ch 5, 3 tr in ch 2, ch 2, 3 tr in same ch, ch 14, 1 sc in bottom of 9th row, ch 14, 1 sc in bottom of 7th row, ch 14, 1 sc in bottom of 5th row, ch 14, 1 sc in bottom of 3d row, turn, cover 1st, 2d and 3d ch of 14 with 14 sc each, cover half of 4th ch of 14 with 7 sc, turn, ch 14, sc in center of the 14 sc, ch 14, sc in center of next 14 sc, ch 14, sc in center of

Crochet Cotton No. 30.

1st Row—Ch 9, 3 tr in 4th st, ch 2, 3 tr in same st, 1 dc in 1st st of ch. 2d Row—Ch 5, 3 tr in ch 2, ch 2, 3 tr in same ch. 3d Row—Ch 5, 3 tr in ch 2, ch 2, 3 tr in same ch, 1 dc over dc, turn.

4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Rows—Like 2d and 3d rows. 8th Row—Ch 5, 3 tr in ch 2, ch 2, 3 tr in same ch, ch 14, 1 sc in bottom of 5th row, ch 14, 1 sc in bottom of 3d row, turn, cover the 1st ch 14 with 14 sc, cover half of next ch 14 with 7 sc, ch 14, turn, 1 sc in center of the 14 sc, turn, cover last ch 14 with 14 sc, cover the other half of ch 14 with 7 sc, ch 3, 3 tr in ch 2, ch 2, 3 tr in same ch, 1 dc over dc, turn.

9th Row—Ch 5, 3 tr in ch 2, ch 2, 3 tr in same ch, ch 3, 1 dc end of shell of last row, \* ch 2, sk 2 sc, 1 dc, repeat from \* all around scallop, making 11 open m,

10th Row-\* ch 9, sl st in 3d st of ch, ch 2, sc in next open m, repeat from \* around scallop, ch 5, 3 tr in ch 2, ch 2, 3 tr in same ch, 1 dc over dc, repeat from 1st row till there are 7 scallops.
