

Colored linens frequently have lint on them when ironed. To prevent this, wash well by themselves and rinse through three waters. Roll in a Turkish towel for an hour and a half; straighten out and dry. Press on wrong side with moderately warm iron. This advice is especially good for colored handkerchiefs.


### Capitol Bedspread

MATERIALS: "Daisy Thread," No. 10 in Cream, Yellow, Lavender, Salmon Rose, and Turquoise. No. 7 hook, 26 skeins, cream, 6 skeins each color.

BLOCK: With Cream, ch 5 drawing out 1st st to about twice the usual length, a 2-dc-Cluster in this 1st long st, (ch 5, a 3-dc-Cluster in the same 1st long st) 3 times, ch 5, 1 sl st in top of 1st Cluster. 2nd ROW: Ch 4, a 2-dc-Cluster in same place, (ch 4, a 3-dc-Cluster in the 3rd st of next 5-ch, ch 4, 3-dc-Cluster in next Cluster) repeated around. Ch 4, 1 sl st in top of 1st Cluster. 3rd ROW: Ch 1, (6-sc over next 5-ch, 1 sc in next Cluster) repeated around. 1 sl st in 1ch at start. 4th ROW: 1 sl st in back loop of next sc, ch 12, 1 sl st in 6th st of ch from hook, ch 20, remove hook from loop, insert in 14th ch st and pull hook, catch loop through, forming a ring, 4 se in ring, a 4-ch p in last sc, \* 13 sc over balance of ring, 7 sc over next ch, 1 sc at base of p, 6 sc over balance of ch down to ring, 1 sl st in back loops of next 2 sc on ring. Ch 12, 1 sl st back in last 7th sc. This is the sc at base of p on Stem. Ch 3, 1 sl st in 9th st of 12-ch, counting from Center Ring, ch 21, remove hook and form a ring as before in the 14th st of ch from hook, 3 sc in ring, ch 2, 1 sl st in 4th sc up side of previous ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in last sc, 14 sc over balance of ring, 9 sc over next ch, 1 se at base of next p, 8 sc over balance of ch down to Center, 1 sl st in next 2 sc on Center. Ch 13, 1 sl st in last 9th sc (at base of Stem p), ch 2, 1 sl st in 11th st of 13-ch, counting from Center, ch 24, remove hook and form a ring as before in 14th st from hook, 3 sc in ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in 5th sc up side of previous ring ch 2, 1 sl sc up side of previous ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in last sc. 14 sc over balance of ring, 12 sc over next ch, 1 sc at base of p, 11 sc over balance of ch, 1 sl st in next 2 sc on Center. Ch 15, 1 sl st in last 12th sc (at base of p), ch 2, 1 sl st in 13th st of 15-ch, ch 29, remove hook and form a ring in 14th st from hook, 2 sc in ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in 5th sc up side of previous ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in last sc, 7 se over ring, (ch 14, remove hook and form a ring with a sl st in 1st st of 14-ch, 9 sc over half of ring) twice, 8 sc over balance of last ring, (8 sc over balance of next ring) twice, 16 sc over next Stem ch, 1 sc at base of p, 12 sc over balance of Stem, 1 sl st in next 2 sc on Center. Ch 13, 1 sl st back in last 13th sc (at base of p), ch 2, 1 sl st back in 11th st of 13-ch, ch 24, remove hook and form a ring in 14th st from hook, 5 sc in ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in 2d sc up side of previous ring, ch 2, 1 sl st in last sc, 12 sc over balance of ring, 12 sc over next Stem, 1 sc at base of p, 11 sc over balance of Stem, 1 sl st in next 2 sc

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12th sc, ch 3, 1 sl st back in 9th st of 12-ch, ch 21, remove hook and form a ring in 14th st from hook, 5 sc in ring, ch 2. 1 sl st back in 3d sc up side of last ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in last sc, 12 sc over ring, 9 sc over next ch, 1 sc at base of p, 8 sc over balance of Stem, 1 sl st in next 2 sc on Center. Ch 10, 1 sl st back in last 9th sc, ch 3, 1 sl st back in 7th st of 10-ch, ch 20, remove hook and form a ring in 14th st of 20-ch, 4 sc in ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in 3rd sc up side of previous ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in last sc, 13 sc in ring, 7 sc over next ch, 1 sc at base of p, \* \* 6 sc over balance of Stem, 1 sl st in next 2 sc on Center. Ch 13, 1 sl st back in 7th sc up last Stem, ch 3, 1 sl st under ch, ch 3, 1 sl st in 7th st of same 13-ch counting from Center, ch 20, remove hook and form a ring in 14th st from hook, 4 sc in ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in 4th sc up side of previous ring, ch 2, 1 sl st back in last sc. Repeat from \* twice, then repeat from \* to \* \* once. A 5-ch p in last sc, 6 sc over balance of Stem, 1 sl st in next st on ring. Fasten off. Sew the ps on 1st and last Stems and Rings together to complete circle.



**HEADING ROW:** Join to the 6th sc on one corner ring, ch 3 in place of a dc, \* ch 3, 1 dc in next sc, ch 3, 1 tr in next, ch 3, 1 tr tr in next, ch 19, 1 tr tr in same last sc, ch 3, 1 tr in next sc, (ch 3, 1 dc in next) twice, ch 3, 1 d tr in the 3rd sc on next ring. ch 3, 1 d tr in same st, ch 3, 1 tr tr in same st, 1 long tr in 4th sc on next ring, ch 2, 1 d tr in 5th sc on next ring, (ch 3, 1 d tr in same st, ch 3, 1 d tr in same st, ch 3, 1 d tr in 5th sc on next ring) repeated 4 times, ch 3, 1 d tr in same st with last d tr, ch 2, 1 long tr in the 3rd sc on next ring, 1 tr tr in the 6th sc on next ring, (ch 3, 1 d tr in same st) twice, ch 3, \* \* 1 dc in the 6th sc on next ring which is a corner ring. Repeat from \* twice and from \* to \* \* once, 1 sl st in the 3rd st of 6-ch at start of row.

BEADING ROW: Ch 3 in place of a dc, (ch 1, sk next st of last row, 1 dc in next) 11 times, \* ch 27, sk last ch st, 1 sc in next 10 sts, (ch 1, sk next st, 1 h dc in next) 3 times, (ch 1, sk 1, 1 dc in next) 3 times, (ch 1, sk 1, 1 tr in next) twice, 1 dc in same st with next dc, (ch 1, sk 1 st, 1 dc in next) 60 times, which brings work to the center st of next corner 19-ch. Continue on around, repeating from \*. Join final 1-ch with a sl st to the 3d st of 1st 6-ch. Fasten off.

POPCORN ROW: Join to the 1st of the 10-sc at 1 corner \* ch 3, 1 dc in next 2 sc worked into a Cluster, drop Cream, pick up Yellow thread and draw a loop of it thru the loop on hook, and working over the Cream thread and the starting end of Yellow, make a 5-dc Popcorn in back loop of next st, ch 1, drop Yellow, pick up Lavender and draw a loop of it thru the loop on hook, ch 1, and make a Popcorn in back loop of next 3d st. working over Cream, Yellow and starting end of Lavender thread, ch 1. Drop Lavender, draw a loop of Pink thread thru the loop on hook, ch 1, and make a Popcorn in next 3d st, working over all threads not in use, ch 1. Drop Pink, draw a loop of Blue thru the loop on hook, ch 1, and make a Popcorn in next 3d st, working over all threads not in use, ch 1. After each Popcorn is completed, pull up all threads tight and close together. Now draw up Yellow and join, ch 1, and make a Popcorn in next 3d st, ch 1. Continue making 7 more Popcorns in same color order, working over all threads not in use, and drawing up each color as needed. This completes 12 Popcorns. At this point, clip away the Cream thread and the starting ends of 4 colored threads, as they will be sufficiently covered to be fastened off securely. Following 12th Popcorn, (in Blue), ch 1, join Yellow thru Blue loop on hook, but omit the following 1-ch st which has been made previously. Instead, make a Popcorn in next 3d st, ch 1, join Lavender and make a Popcorn in next 3d st. Continue in same way until there are 26 Popcorns in all. Final one will be in Lavender. Now make a Pink Popcorn in next 4th st and another, in Blue, in next 4th st. This is in exact center st of side of Block. From here, reverse the order of colors. Make the next Popcorn, in Pink, in the next 4th st, the next in Lavender, in next 4th st. From here, make the Popcorns in every 3d st, in this color order: (Yellow, Blue, Pink, and Lavender) repeated until there are 44 Popcorns altogether, the final one being in Blue. Now make 11 more Popcorns, in same color order, but make the extra ch st between Popcorns the same as between the first 12 Popcorns, as follows: (After each Popcorn, ch 1, join next color, ch 1, and make another Popcorn) repeated.

trips and squares, the latter exactly ke the piece made up of A and B. For a quilt about 78x97, you will need 30 pieced blocks, a 3-inch border, 49 strips and 20 squares. The strips are as wide as the squares and their length is the same as the block. About 4½ yards of color, 5 1/6 yards of

Apadlernlibrary, org 34 yard for border white and needed. To piece it make first individual squares as shown in sketch. Join these into three strips and then into the block.

# Your NUMO Hot Iron Transfer

This transfer, as it comes to you, will seem wrong side out, but when Tirections are followed, the designgou stamp will be like the picture. 1. Heat your iron very hot—alsost to the scorching point. Use the small test design or a corner If the pattern to test the heat of Sour iron.

2. Cut out the design you plan to use, removing all unnecessary Lettering. Lay PRINTED SIDE SPOWN on the material in the posialon you wish it to be stamped.

3. Hold paper firmly in place and gress, keeping the iron moving to grevent scorching in case it should be too hot. A piece of tissue or thin paper may be laid over the pattern to protect the cloth in case your iron is larger than the design to be transferred. After having transferred the NUMO pattern a number of times, you may find this unnecessary.

The design is stamped slowly and each succeeding time, it will take a little longer, but the IRON MUST BE HOT. For very best results, the stampings should be in fairly rapid succession, one after another from the same design. Good results have been obtained, however, when the pattern has been laid away for some time.

## Sunbonnet Sue and Overall Bill Quilts

Girls in small figured prints may be used alone, or they may be alternated with boys; all may face in one direction, they may face in or they may form a parade around the quilt. In any case, the pretty border in print and colors will make a lovely frame.


The patterns are designs for nineinch blocks but may be used on a larger size. Applique the various pieces with almost invisible stitches. Blue or other plain color may be used for overalls with a small check for shirt; yellow for straw hat. Shoes are black or brown and hands un-

bleached or flesh colored. Bonnet an sleeve may be plain color to mater print of dress. Alternate with plain blocks, white or colored. For a crip quilt (45x54), if you use 9-inch blocks, vou will need 10 pieced and 10 plain 32 pieced and 31 plain will make quilt 72x90; the pieced border is 45 inches wide.

To make matching pajama bags, use the larger patterns supplied; complete the front, then cut a back to fit. The opening may be closed by a zipper underneath, at side or some other place you prefer. Small laundry bags may be made by leaving openings at both sides and slipping over a wire coat hanger, bent to fit. The back must be slashed so that the bag may be hung by the hook, protruding from back of head.

You will find that outlining the tea towel design with tiny running stitch is as effective and much more rapid than stem stitch. Use brown for faces, arms and legs: red for lips. The hair, of course, is black; French knots are used and cross stitch makes the pig tail braids. Add bright red bows for contrast. Each dress may have polka dots of a different color and the day may be worked to match or in black; broom, wash bowl, yarn, etc., may be done in natural colors or in black. The two pan holders should be cut double, interlined, and the edges blanket stitched or bound, and a loop or ring used for a hangar.

The final Popcorn—the 55th—in row, will be in Yellow. Draw Cream thru loop on hook and make a dc in next 2 sts worked into a Cluster, ch 3, 1 sl st in next st, 1 sc in same st. Now go around end and make 3 sc in 1st sc on opposite side and repeat from \* across next side. Continue on around until 4 sides are completed. Fasten off all threads.



SIDE SECTIONS: Join Cream to the top of Cluster in Cream at start of 1 row of Popcorns, ch 3, 1 de between 1st 2 Popcorns, (ch 2, 1 dc between next 2 Popcorns) 52 times, ch 2, 1 dc between next 2 Popcorns and 1 dc in next dc-Cluster, holding the last loop of each de on hook, thread over and draw thru all loops on hook at once, forming a Cluster. 2nd ROW: Ch 3, turn, sk last 2-ch space of last row, 1 dc in next, \* (ch 2, 1 dc under next 2-ch space) 24 times, ch 2, sk next space, 1 dc in next, (ch 2, 1 dc in next space) 23 times, ch 2, 1 dc in next space, sk next, and make a dc in next dc, working these 2 dc into a Cluster. 3rd ROW: Ch 3, turn, sk last 2-ch space of last row, 1 dc in next, (ch 2, 1 dc in next space) 21 times, ch 2, sk next space, 3 dc in next, ch 2, sk next space, 1 dc in next, (ch 2, 1 dc in next space) 20 times, ch 2, 1 dc in next space and 1 dc in next 2-dc-Cluster, worked into a Cluster. 4th ROW: Ch 3, turn, sk last 2-ch space, 1 dc in next, (ch 2, 1 dc in next) 19 times, ch 1, sk next 2-ch space, 1 dc in next dc, 3 dc in next dc, 1 dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next 2-ch, 1 dc in next space, (ch 2, 1 dc in next) 18 times, ch 2, 1 dc in next space and 1 dc in next Cluster worked into a Cluster. 5th ROW: Ch 3, turn, sk last space, 1 dc in next, (ch 2, 1 dc in next) 17 times, sk next 1-ch space, 1 dc in next 2 dc, 3 dc in next, 1 dc in next 2 dc, sk 1-ch space, 1 dc in next space, (ch 2, 1 dc in next) 16 times, ch 2, 1 dc in next space and 1

dc in next Cluster worked into a Cluster. 6th ROW: Ch 3, turn, sk last space, 1 de in next. (ch 2, 1 de in next) 14 times, sk next 2-ch space and next de, 2 de in next de, 1 de in next 2 de, 3 de in next de, 1 de in next 2 de, 2 de in next de, sk next de and next space, 1 dc in next space, (ch 2, 1 dc in next) 13 times, ch 2, 1 dc in next space and 1 dc in next Cluster worked into a Cluster. 7th ROW: Ch 3, turn, sk last space, 1 de in next, (ch 2, 1 de in next) 11 times, sk next space and next dc, 2 tr in next dc, 1 tr and 1 dc in next, 1 dc in next 7 dc, 1 dc and 1 tr in next dc, 2 tr in next, sk next space, 1 dc in next, (ch 2, 1 dc in next) 10 times, ch 2, 1 dc in next and 1 dc in next Cluster worked into a Cluster. Sth ROW: Ch 3, turn, sk last space, 1 h de in next, (ch 2, 1 de in next) 8 times, sk next space and next dc, 1 dc in next 15 sts, sk next space, 1 dc in next, (ch 2, 1 dc in next) 7 times, ch 2, 1 h dc in next, 1 dc in next Cluster. 9th ROW: Ch 1, turn, sl st across last 2-ch space, 1 sl st in next dc, (1 sc over next 2-ch space, 1 sc in next dc) 7 times, 1 sc in next 16 sts, (1 sc over next 2-ch, 1 sc in next dc) 6 times, 1 sc over next 2-ch, 1 sl st in next dc. 10th ROW: Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, 1 sl st in next 2 sc, 1 sc in next 39 sc, 1 sl st in next. 11th ROW: Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, 1 sl st in next 2 sc, 1 sc in next 35 sc, 1 sl st in next. 12th ROW: Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, 1 sl st in next 2 sc. 1 sc in next 31 sc, 1 sl st in next. 13th ROW: Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, 1 sl st in next 4 sc, 1 sc in next 23 sc, 1 sl st in next. Fasten off. Fill out each side of Block in same way.

On tissue paper, draw a true square about an inch larger than finished Block. Stretch and Pin Block right-side-down on this pattern on a well-padded ironing board and steam with a wet cloth and hot iron, then press through a dry cloth until thoroughly dry. A Spread pressed in this way will keep its shape and flatness indefinitely.

Sew Blocks together by placing them face to face and overcasting edges closely.

BORDER: With Cream, ch 199, sk last ch st, 1 sc in next 2 sts. sk next 5 ch sts, 1 sc in next 3 sts, sk next 5 ch sts, 1 sc in next 2 sts, ch 3, sk 2 sts of long ch, 1 dc in next, (ch 2, sk 2 sts of long ch, 1 dc in next) 53 times, ch 3, sk next 2 sts, 1 sc in next 2 sts, sk next 5 sts, 1 sc in next 3 sts. sk next 5 ch sts, 1 sc in remaining 2 sts of long ch. 2nd ROW: Ch 1, turn, sl st to top of last dc in last row, ch 3, sk next 2-ch space, 1 dc in next. Now repeat from \* in 2nd Row of "Side Section" directions until Section is completed. Press in same way as Blocks and sew one of these Sections to each Block around bottom and



FRINGE: Wind Cream and 4 colors of thread separately around a 4½ inch card. Clip at 1 end and tie in groups of 4 strands. Tie Cream in the two 5-ch loops at each end of Border Sections. Then tie a colored group in each space around each Section in exactly the same color order as the row of Popcorns.

#### Chair Back Set

MATERIALS: "Daisy Thread" in No. 10, Ecru, 684 yards. No. 7 hook.

CHAIR BACK DOILY: Block Mesh: Ch 230, 1 dc in 9th st from hook, 1 dc in next st, \* (ch 2, sk 2 sts, 1 dc in next) 3 times, (ch 2, sk 2 sts, 1 dc in next 2 sts) twice. Repeat from \* 11 times. (Ch 2, sk 2, 1 dc in next) 4 times, 1 dc in next st, ch 2, sk 2, 1 dc in next. 2nd ROW: Ch 1, turn, 1 sc in last dc, \* 2 sc over next 2-ch, 1 sc in next 2 dc, 2 sc over 2-ch, 1 sc in dc, ch 8, sk 1 dc, 1 sc in next dc, 2 sc over



2-ch, 1 sc in 2 dc. \* Repeat from \* to \* 12 times. 2 sc over next 2-ch. 1 sc in 3d st of same and ch. 3d ROW: \* Ch 5, turn, sk last 3 sc, 1 dc in next 2 se, (ch 6, 1 dc in 4th and 5th sts of next 8-ch loop, ch 6, sk next 3 sc, 1 dc in next 2 sc, ch 2, sk 2 sc, \* 1 dc in next 2 sc) 11 times, ch 6, 1 dc in 4th and 5th sts of next 8-ch loop, ch 6, sk 3 sc, 1 de in next 2 sc, ch 2, sk 2 sc, 1 de in next. 4th ROW: \* \* Ch 2, turn, sk last 2-ch space of last row, 1 tr in next dc, making tr the length of 5 ch sts, ch 5, 1 dc thru the center of tr, \* ch 4, 3 sc over the left-hand half of next 6-ch, 1 sc in next 2 dc, 3 sc over half of next 6-ch, ch 7, sk next de,

1 dc in next dc, \* \* ch 2, 1 dc in next de, ch 2, turn, sk last 2 sts of 7-ch, 1 dc in next st, turn. Repeat from \* 12 times. Do not turn following final dc. 5th ROW: Ch 5, 1 dc in same st with last dc, 1 dc in next st, \* ch 6, sk next 3 sc, 1 dc in next 2 sc, ch 6, sk 2 st 2 sc, ch 6, sk 3 sts of next 4-ch, 1 dc in next st, 1 dc in next dc, ch 2, 1 dc at base of same dc of last row, 1 dc in 1st st of next 4-ch. Repeat from \* 12 times. omitting final dc in row. 6th ROW: Ch 1, turn, 1 sc in last dc, \* 2 sc over 2-ch, 1 sc in next 2 dc, 3 sc over half of next 6-ch, ch 5, 3 sc over left hand half of next 6-ch, 1 sc in next 2 dc.

\* Repeat from \* to \* 12 times. 2 sc
over next 5-ch, 1 sc in 3d st of same 5-ch. 7th ROW: Ch 5, turn, sk last 3 sc, 1 dc in next 2 sc. Now make the same as 1st Row, starting at \*. 8th ROW: Ch 1, turn, 1 sc in last dc, \* 2 sc over 2-ch, 1 sc in 2 dc, 2 sc over 2-ch, 1 sc in dc, \* ch 8, sk next dc, 1 sc in next dc. Repeat from \* to \*.

9th ROW: Repeat from \* to \* in 3rd Row. 1 dc in next sc. 10th ROW: Repeat from \* \* to \* \* in 4th Row. Ch 2, 1 dc in 3d st of next 5-ch, ch 2. turn, sk last 2 sts of 7-ch, 1 dc in next. 11th ROW: Ch 5, 1 dc in same st with last de, 1 de in next ch st, ch 6, sk 3 sc, 1 de in next 2 sc, ch 6, sk 3 sts of next 4-ch, 1 dc in next.

1 dc in dc, ch 2, 1 dc in 3d st of
next 5-ch. 12th ROW: Ch 1, turn, 1 sc in last dc. Repeat from \* to \* in 6th Row. 2 sc over next 5-ch, 1 sc in 3d st of same ch. 13th ROW: Ch 5, turn, sk last 3 sc, 1 dc in next 2 sc, (ch 2, sk 2 sts, 1 dc in next) 4 times, 1 dc in next st, ch 2, sk 2 sc, 1 dc in next. Now, beginning at 8th Row, repeat the last 6 rows once, completing another Block of Mesh. Then repeat 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th Rows once more. Then ch 47 and cut thread 6 inches from hook and leave hanging. Do not fasten off.

Now drop down to 7th Row. This is the last long row clear across work. On this row, counting from end of 8th Row, sk fourteen 2-ch spaces and the next dc, then join to next dc, ch 1, 1 sc in same dc. Repeat from \* to \* in 2nd Row 5 times, 2 sc over 2-ch, 1 sc in next dc. Now, working across this last row, which forms the 5-Block wide Center Section, make 5 rows the same as the 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Rows, completing a row of Blocks. Then repeat the last 6 completing another rows, row Blocks. Then make 5 more rows, the same as 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Then ch 47 and cut thread again but do not fasten off. Pick up previous 47-ch and join with a sl st to the 1st sc of last row, and fasten it off—forming the 4th side of a large square opening.

Now drop down to original 7th Row. On this row, counting from end of 1st row of Center Section, sk fourteen 2-ch spaces and the next dc, then join to next dc. Ch 1. 1 sc in same st. Repeat from 1st \* in 8th Row. Then repeat 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th and 13th Rows, completing a Block. Now, beginning at 8th Row, repeat the last 6

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rows once, completing another Block of Mesh. Then repeat 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th Rows once more. Now pick up the last 47-ch left from Center Section and join to the 1st sc of last row and fasten it off-forming another large square opening. Ch 5, turn, sk last 3 sc, 1 dc in next 2 sc. Now repeat from \* in 1st Row, com-pleting 2 more large openings. Ch 5, turn, sk last 3 sc, 1 dc in next 2 sc.
Then repeat from \* in 1st Row thru
the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th
Rows. Fasten off. Turn, sk last ten 2-ch spaces and the next dc, join to next dc, ch 1, 1 sc in same st, and repeat from \* to \* in 2nd Row 3 times. 2 sc over next 2-ch, 1 sc in next dc. Turn, and working across this last row, 3 Blocks long, make 5 rows the same as the 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Rows, completing a row of Blocks. Then repeat the last 6 rows, completing another row of Blocks. Fasten off. Turn, sk last ten 2-ch spaces and the next dc, join to next dc, ch 1, 1 sc in same st. Now repeat from the 1st \* in 8th Row thru to end of 12th Row. Ch 47 and cut thread. Drop down to fourteen Center Section, sk spaces and the next dc, then join to next dc, ch 1, 1 sc in same dc. Repeat from \* to \* in 2nd row 3 times, 2 sc over next 2-ch, 1 sc in next dc. Turn, and working across this last row, 3 Blocks long, make 5 rows the same as the 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Rows, completing a row of Blocks. Then repeat the last 6 rows, completing another row of Blocks. Then repeat 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th Rows. Pick up last 47-ch and join to 1st se at start of last row-forming another large opening. Ch 5, ing another large opening. turn, sk last 3 sc, 1 dc in next 2 sc. Now make 7 rows—5 Blocks long—starting at \* in 1st Row and stopping at end of 7th Row directions. This completes Block Mesh. Do not fasten off.

EDGE: Ch 1, 2 sc over last dc, \* 1 sc in next sc, 1 sc at base of sc, (1 sc over next space, 1 sc in next st) 3 times, 1 sc over next space, 1 sc in next sc. \* 1 sc at base of sc, 1 sc over next space. Repeat from \* to \* once. Cross corner, 1 sc in next dc, (1 sc over next 2-ch space, 1 sc in dc) 4 times, 1 sc in next dc, 1 sc over next space, 1 sc in 2 dc, (1 sc over next space, 1 sc in dc) 4 times, 1 sc in next dc, 5 sc over corner 5-ch. Continue on around in same way and join to 1-ch at start of row. 2nd ROW: Ch 2, 1 se in back loop of next sc, (ch 2, sk 1 se, 1 se in back loop of next sc) repeated around. At corner points, (ch 2. 1 sc in next sc) twice. 3rd ROW: Sl st to center of 1st 2-ch, (ch 7, sk next 2-ch loop, 1 sc in next) repeated around. Fasten off.

MEDALLIONS: Ch 8, join with a sl st into a ring, 12 sc over ring, 1 sl st in 1st sc. 2nd ROW: (Ch 20, 1 sc in same sc, 1 sc in next sc) 11 times, ch 20, 1 sl st in last sc on ring. Fasten off. 3rd ROW: Join to center of 1

4th ROW: 4 sc over half of next loop, 3 sc in 5th st of same loop, 4 sc over balance of loop) 12 times. 5th ROW: This row is worked in back loops only of sts of last row. Sk next sc over next 9-ch, \*\*\* 1 sc in next 3 sc, a 4-ch p, 1 sc in next 2 sc, ch 6, 1 sl st in 1st st of 6-ch, ch 7, 1 sc in 5th st from hook to form a 5-ch p, ch 5, 1 sl st in a corner of 1 Square Opening of Block Mesh, ch 9, a 5-ch p, ch 3, 1 sl st in same st at base of 6-ch p, ch 6, 1 sl st in same place, 1 sc in same last sc of last row, 1 sc in next 2 sc, a 4-ch p, 1 sc in next 2 sc, \* sk 2 sc, 1 sc in next 3 sc, a 4-ch p, 1 sc in next 2 sc, ch 6, 1 sl st in 1st st, ch 4, \* \* sk next five 2-ch spaces out from corner of Opening and sk the next dc, then make a sl st in next dc, ch 4, 1 sl st back in same st at base of 6-ch p, ch 6, 1 sl st in same st, 1 sc in same sc of last row, 1 sc in next 2 sc, a 4-ch p, 1 sc in next 2 sc. Repeat from \* to \* \* once. Sk next four 2-ch spaces, 1 sl st in next st, ch 4, 1 sl st back in same st at base of 6-ch p, ch 6, 1 sl st in same st, 1 sc in same sc of last row, 1 sc in next 2 sc, a 4-ch p. 1 sc in next 2 sc. Sk next 2 sc and repeat from \* \* \* 3 times, and fasten off. Make 4 more Medallions and fill

in remaining 4 Square Openings.

ARM REST DOILIES—Ch 94, 1 dc in 9th st from hook, 1 dc in next st. Now beginning at \* in 1st Row of Chair Back Doily, work across to end of ch. (Then make 6 rows the same as 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Rows) 3 times. This completes 3 rows of Block Mesh, 5 Blocks long. Now repeat from the 8th Row thru to end of 13th Row twice, making 2 Blocks. Then repeat from 8th Row thru to end of 12th Row, ch 47, and cut thread.

Drop down to last long row, sk 14 2-ch spaces and the next dc, then join to next dc, ch 1, 1 sc in same dc. Repeat from 1st \* in 8th Row thru to end of 13th Row, then repeat again from start of 8th Row thru 13th Row, and again from 8th Row thru 12th Row. Pick up 47-ch and join to 1st sc at start of last row and fasten off, forming a Square Opening. Ch 5, turn, sk 3 sc, 1 dc in next 2 sc. (Now, working clear across Doily-5 Blocks wide-repeat from \* in 1st Row thru to end of 7th Row) 3 times, making 3 rows of Block Mesh, 5 Blocks long. Fasten off. Turn, sk last five 2-ch spaces and next dc, join to next dc, ch 1, 1 sc in same st. Repeat from \* to \* in 2nd Row 3 times. 2 sc over next 2-ch, 1 sc in next dc. Now across this row, work 5 rows, repeating from 3rd Row thru to end of 7th Row, completing Block Mesh. Now make the same 3 rows of Edge as on Chair Back Doily. Fill in the Square Opening with a Medallion.

Stretch and pin finished Doilies right-side-down on a well-padded ironing board, pinnig down each loop of Edge, and steam with a wet cloth and hot iron, then press thru a dry cloth until thoroughly dry.
