




fer. Also on the transfer you will receive cutting guides and directions for the clever patchwork skirt and apron pictured, as well as a number of handy turbans.




Two crocheted rugs, inspired by the geometric patterns of the Navajos, are made from easy to follow charts. For these you may use rags—either cotton or woolen, or one of the heavy rug materials which may be bought. The same charts worked in regular crochet thread of string weight, produce mats for many uses.

In crochet there will also be three refreshment sets and a cunning little holder which is crocheted around a wishbone.



This may be used for your thimble or merely for decoration.



The quilt is the Tulip Basket, a pieced block of lasting beauty.

Versatile Crocheted Edge

Use number 20 or 30 mercerized crochet cotton in white or ecru, and a number 11 hook. The edge at top will be about 4 inches wide.

Ch 44. Row 1: sk 8 sts from hook, work 2 dc in 9th st from hook, *ch 5, sk 5 sts of ch, dc in next st of ch, ch 2, dc in same st with last dc, repeat from * 5 times (six 2 ch spaces in work), ch 5, turn. Row 2: dc on last 2 ch worked, (ch 2, dc on same 2 ch) 3 times, *dc on next 2 ch, (ch 2, dc on same 2 ch) 3 times, repeat from * on each 2 ch, making 6 shell-like groups; 2 dc in 2 dc



of row 1, 2 dc on 8 ch, ch 3, dc in 4th st of 8 ch, ch 7, turn.

Row 3: 2 dc on 3 ch, 4 dc in 4 dc, ch 5, dc on center 2 ch of first shell of row 2, ch 2, dc on same 2 ch, *ch 5, dc on center 2 ch of next shell, ch 2, dc on same 2 ch, repeat from * on each shell; ch 5, turn. Row 4: work shells back as for row 2, work 6 dc in 6 dc, 2 dc on 7 ch, ch 3, dc in 4th st of 7 ch, ch 7, turn.

Row 5: 2 dc on 3 ch, 8 dc in 8 dc, finish as for row 3. Continue in this way, increasing 2 dc in each row until there are 12 rows of dc (6 rows of shells).

In the next row, where second point begins, you will be at beading or straight edge of lace. Ch 7, turn, 2 dc on 3 ch, (ch 5, sk 4 dc, dc in next dc, ch 2, dc in same st with last dc) 5 times, ch 5, dc on center 2 ch of first shell of last row, ch 2, dc on same 2 ch, ch 5, turn. Begin with the 2nd row directions again and repeat through 12th until edge is of


desired length. To join ends of lace, fit the diagonal ends together and whip.

Matching edges of varying widths are easily made—these are nice for guest towels, pillow cases and other items where a narrower edge seems more suitable. Three additional widths are shown . . . the one having 3 rows of shells is $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide; that with 2 rows of shells is $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide, and the narrowest with only 1 row of shells is 1 inch wide.

In making the beginning ch for the narrow edges, ch 6 for each shell, and 8 to turn as for the wide edge. For instance in the edge which has only one row of shells, ch 14, sk 8 sts from hook, 2 dc in next st of ch, ch 5, dc in end of 14 ch, ch 2, dc in end of ch with last dc. Ch 5, turn, work a shell on the 2 ch, 2 dc in 2 dc, 2 dc on 8 ch, ch 3, dc in 4th st of 8 ch, ch 7, turn; 2 dc on 3 ch, ch 5, sk 3 dc, dc in 4th dc, ch 2, dc in with last dc, ch 5, turn, and repeat from 2nd row to desired length.

The edge which has 2 rows of shells is begun with a ch of 20, sk 8 sts, 2 dc in next, ch 5, sk 5 sts of ch, dc in next, ch 2, dc in with last dc, ch 5, dc in end of 20 ch, ch 2, dc in with last dc, ch 5, turn, work 2 shells, 2 dc in 2 dc, 2 dc on 8 ch, ch 3, dc in 4th st of 8 ch, ch 7, turn, 2 dc on 3 ch, 4 dc, ch 5, dc on center 2 ch of first shell, ch 2, dc on same 2 ch, ch 5, repeat on next 2 ch, ch 5, turn, work 2 shells, 6 dc, 2 dc on 7 ch, ch 3, dc in 4th st of 7 ch, ch 7, turn, 2 dc on 3 ch, ch 5, dc in 4th dc, ch 2, dc in same dc, ch 5, dc in last dc (9th), ch 2, dc in same dc, repeat from 2nd row.


The edge having 3 rows of shells is begun with a ch of 26, work the same, with three shells, 12 dc in last row. When beginning 2nd point, work 2 dc on 3 ch, (ch 5, dc, ch 2, dc) in 5th dc, 9th dc, and in center 2 ch of first shell.

If the bottoms of legs of furniture are waxed they will not scratch polished floors when moved.

Palm Leaf Quilt

From white cut 240 each of 1, 3, 5 and 7. From green cut 240 each of 2, 4 and 6. It would be wise to cut a pattern without seams from cardboard, and draw around each piece so you will have a line on which to sew; otherwise, the blocks may not be perfectly square. If material has right and wrong side, half of all pieces are cut in reverse. Sew blocks together as shown in small sketch. Sew four 8" blocks together to form 16" block. It takes thirty 16" blocks to make a quilt about 90x106, and this size includes a 5" border.

Starting with white piece I, sew to green piece 2, matching notches. To this sew white piece 3 matching notches and keeping outside edge even. Next sew on green, 4, keeping center piece even. White piece 5 is added, then green piece 6—be careful to get this piece on properly. Join white piece 7. This completes half of block—make other half in same way, except use reversed pieces. Sew the two halves together, matching notches. This makes an 8" square. Sew four of the 8" squares together in order shown in small sketch to make one 16" block.



Crocheted Centerpiece

Use number 5 mercerized crochet cotton in white or ecru, and a number 10 hook. If you prefer a lustrous finish you may use rayon crochet thread. The cloth will be about 36 inches in diameter. For a smaller cloth you may stop at the end of any round after the large center motif is completed. To make a cloth about 46 inches across repeat rnds 34 thru 44 inclusive after completing directions given. For a larger piece you may continue working mesh rounds as in the 43rd and 44th; for extra fullness add 1 st in each ch of rnd. If more fullness is desired repeat the 34th and 35th rnds at intervals.

Ch 8, sl st in end of ch to form ring.

Rnd 1: ch 4, (4 ch counts as 1 tr), I tr
on ring, *ch 4, 2 tr on ring, repeat from

* 6 times, ch 4 and sl st in 4th st of
4 ch at beginning of rnd, (8 spaces
around ring). Rnd 2: ch 4, I tr in at
base of 4 ch, I tr in next tr of rnd 1,
I tr in first st of next 4 ch of rnd 1,
*ch 5, sk 2 sts of 4 ch of rnd 1, I tr in
last st of 4 ch, 2 tr in next 2 tr of

rnd 1, tr in first st of next 4 ch, repeat from * all around ending with ch 5, sl st in 4th st of first 4 ch to close rnd.

Rnd 3: ch 4, I tr in at base of ch, tr in each of the next 3 tr of rnd 2, I tr in first st of next 5 ch, *ch 6, sk 3 sts of next 5 ch, I tr in 5th st of ch, I tr in each of 4 tr, I tr in first st of next 5 ch, repeat from * all around, ch 6, sl st in 4th st of 4 ch to close. The next 5 rnds are worked in same manner, each increasing 2 tr in each group and with an increase in each ch.

Rnd 4: inc to 8 tr in each group, (4 ch at beginning always counts as 1 tr, and first and last tr in each group are worked in ch of previous rnd as before), ch 6 between tr groups. Rnd 5: work the same with 10 tr, and ch 7 between. Rnd 6: 12 tr, 8 ch. Rnd 7: 14 tr, 9 ch. Rnd 8: 16 tr, 10 ch. If your work should not lie flat after any round, rework rnd adding 1 st in each ch between tr groups.

Rnd 9: ch 4, tr in at base of 4 ch, 4 tr in next 4 tr, *ch 5, sk 2 tr, tr in next, ch 5, sk 3 tr, 5 tr in next 5 tr, 1 tr in first st of 10 ch, ch 11, 1 tr in last st of same 10 ch, 5 tr in first 5 tr below, repeat from * all around, ending with 11 ch, sl st in top of 4 ch at beginning. Rnd 10: ch 4, tr in at base of 4 ch, 4 tr in next 4 tr, *ch 4, tr over first 5 ch of rnd 9, ch 5, tr over next 5 ch, ch 4, sk 1 tr in next group of previous rnd, 5 tr in next 5 tr, 1 tr in first st of next 11 ch, ch 12, tr in last st of same 11 ch, 5 tr in next 5 tr, repeat from * all around.

Rnd II: ch 4, tr in at base of 4 ch, 4 tr in next 4 tr, *ch 8, sk 4 ch, tr over 5 ch, ch 8—sk next tr, the 4 ch and 1 tr of 6 tr group; 5 tr in 5 tr, 1 tr in first st of next 12 ch, ch 11, tr in last st of same 12 ch, 5 tr in 5 tr, repeat from * all around. Rnd 12: sl st into top of first tr after 4 ch in previous rnd, ch 4, 4 tr in 4 tr, 1 tr in first st of first 8 ch, *ch 5, 1 tr over same 8 ch, ch 5, tr over next 8 ch, ch 5, tr in last st of same 8 ch. 5 tr in next 5 tr, ch 5, sk 4 sts of 11 ch, 3 tr in next 3 sts of 11 ch, ch 5, sk rest of 11 ch and 1 tr, 5 tr in 5 tr, I tr in first st of next 8 ch, repeat from * all around.

Rnd 13: sl st in first tr after 4 ch, ch 4, 4 tr in 4 tr, 1 tr in first st of 5 ch,

*ch 6, tr over 2nd 5 ch, ch 6, tr in last st of next 5 ch, 5 tr in 5 tr, ch 6, tr in last st of next 5 ch, 3 tr in 3 tr of last rnd, 1 tr in first st of next 5 ch, ch 6, sk first tr in next group of previous rnd, 5 tr in 5 tr, 1 tr in first st of next 5 ch, repeat from * all around, ch 6, sl st to close.

Rnd 14: sl st in first tr after 4 ch, ch 4, *4 tr in 4 tr, 1 tr in first st of 6 ch, ch 9, sk over and work a tr in the last st of 2nd 6 ch, 5 tr in 5 tr, ch 8, tr in last st of next 6 ch, 5 tr in 5 tr, 1 tr in first st of next ch, ch 8, sk first tr of next group, tr in next tr, repeat from * all around, close with sl st in 4th st of beginning ch.

Rnd 15: sl st in first tr after 4 ch, ch 4, 4 tr in 4 tr, *9 tr in 9 ch, 5 tr in first 5 tr in next group of last rnd, ch 9, tr in last st of next 8 ch, 7 tr in 7 tr, 1 tr in first st of next ch, ch 9, sk ch and first tr in next group, 5 tr in 5 tr, repeat from * all around.

Rnd 16: sl st in next 2 tr after 4 ch, ch 4, 15 tr, *ch 10, 1 tr in last st of next 9 ch, 5 tr in next 5 tr, ch 3, 1 tr in with last tr, 4 tr in next 4 tr, 1 tr in first st of next ch, ch 10, sk ch below, and sk first 2 tr in next group, 16 tr, repeat from *all around, ch 10 and sl st to close rnd. Rnd 17: ch 4, 5 tr in next 5 tr, *ch 4, sk 4 tr, 6 tr in last 6 tr of same group, ch 13, sk ch, 6 tr in next group of 6 tr, ch 4, sk 3 ch, 6 tr in next 6 tr, ch 13, sk ch, 6 tr in first 6 tr in next group, repeat from * all around.

Rnd 18: ch 4, 5 tr, *ch 4, sk ch of previous rnd, 6 tr in next group of 6 tr, ch 15, sk 13 ch, 6 tr in next 6 tr, ch 4, sk ch, 6 tr in next 6 tr, ch 15, sk ch, 6 tr, repeat from * all around. Rnd 19: ch 4, 5 tr, *ch 4, 6 tr in 6 tr, ch 15, sk ch, 6 tr, ch 4, 6 tr in next 6 tr, ch 15, sk ch, 6 tr in 6 tr, repeat from * all around. Rnd 20: ch 4, 5 tr, *ch 5, sk ch, 6 tr, ch 11, sc into 7th st of first 13 ch in rnd 17. Work this sc over the 15 chs of rnds 18 and 19, drawing all 4 long chs together, ch 11, 6 tr in next 6 tr, repeat from * all around.

Rnd 21: ch 4, I tr in at base of 4 ch, 3 tr, I tr in with last tr, *ch 3, tr in first st of next 5 ch, ch 3, tr in last st of same 5 ch, ch 3, sk 2 tr, 4 tr in 4 tr, 2 tr in first 2 sts of first 11 ch, ch 17, 2 tr in last 2 sts of next 11 ch, 4 tr in 4 tr, repeat from * all around.

Rnd 22: ch 4, I tr in at base of 4 ch, 3 tr, I tr in with last tr, *ch 3, tr over first 3 ch, ch 3, tr over next 3 ch, ch 3, tr over next 3 ch, ch 3, sk next 2 tr, 4 tr in next 4 tr, 2 tr in first 2 sts of 17 ch, ch 16, 2 tr in last 2 sts of 17 ch, 4 tr in next 4 tr, repeat from * all around. Rnd 23: ch 4, tr in at base of 4 ch, 3 tr, I tr in with last tr, *(ch 3, tr over next 3 ch) 4 times, ch 3, sk first 2 tr in next group, 4 tr in 4 tr, 2 tr in first 2 sts of 16 ch, ch 12, 2 tr in last 2 sts of 16 ch, 4 tr in 4 tr, repeat from * all around.

Rnd 24: ch 4, tr in at base of ch, 3 tr, 1 tr in with last tr, *(ch 3, tr over next 3 ch) 5 times, ch 3, sk 2 tr, 4 tr in next 4 tr, 2 tr in first 2 sts of next 12 ch, ch 7, sc into 9th st of 17 ch in 21st rnd (over other chs as before), ch 7, 2 tr in last 2 sts of 12 ch, 4 tr in 4 tr, repeat from * all around. Rnd 25: ch 4, tr in at base of ch, 3 tr, 1 tr in with last tr, *(ch 3, tr over next 3 ch) 6 times, ch 3, sk 2 tr, 4 tr in 4 tr, 2 tr in first 2 sts of 7 ch, ch 5, sk over and work 2 tr in last 2 sts of next 7 ch, 4 tr in 4 tr, repeat from * all around.

Rnd 26: ch 4, tr in at base of 4 ch, 3 tr, 1 tr in with last tr, *(ch 3, tr over next 3 ch) 7 times, ch 3, sk 2 tr, 4 tr in 4 tr, 5 tr in 5 ch, 4 tr in 4 tr, repeat from * all around, ending with 5 tr in 5 ch, sl st to close. Rnd 27: ch 4, 2 tr in next 2 tr, *(ch 3, tr over next 3 ch) 8 times, ch 3, sk 2 tr, 9 tr, repeat from * all around, ending with 6 tr, sl st. Rnd 28: ch 7, tr over next 3 ch, (ch 3, tr over next 3 ch, 3 sk 2 tr, 5 tr, ch 3, tr over next 3 ch, repeat from * all around, ending with 4 tr, sl st in 4th st of 7 ch to close.

Rnd 29: 2 sl st to center of first 3 ch, ch 7, tr over next 3 ch, *(ch 3, tr over next 3 ch) 8 times, ch 3, sk 1 tr, 3 tr, ch 3, tr over first 3 ch, ch 3, tr over next

3 ch, repeat from * all around, close end with sl st in 4th st of 7 ch. Rnd 30: 2 sl st to center of next 3 ch, ch 7, tr over next 3 ch, *(ch 3, tr over next 3 ch) 8 times, ch 3, tr in 2nd tr of the next 3 tr group, ch 3, tr over next 3 ch, ch 3, tr over next 3 ch, ch 3, tr over next 3 ch, repeat from * all around; to close, ch 3, sl st in 4th st of 7 ch.

Rnd 31: 2 sl st to center of next 3 ch, ch 8, tr over next 3 ch, *(ch 4, tr over next 3 ch) all around. Rnds 32 and 33: same as 31. Rnd 34: ch 4, tr over first 4 ch, ch 2, 2 tr over same 4 ch, *2 tr over next 4 ch, ch 2, 2 tr over same 4 ch, repeat from * all around, close with sl st in 4th st of 4 ch.

Rnd 35: sl st over to first st of first 2 ch, ch 4, tr over same 2 ch, ch 2, 2 tr over same 2 ch, *2 tr over next 2 ch, ch 2, 2 tr over same 2 ch, repeat from * all around, close with sl st. Rnd 36: sl st over to first 2 ch, ch 8, tr over next 2 ch, * ch 4, tr over next 2 ch, repeat from * all around, close with sl st in 4th st of 8 ch. Rnd 37: sl st to center of 4 ch, ch 8, tr over next 4 ch, *ch 4, tr over next 4 ch, repeat all around. Rnd 38: same as 37. Rnd 39: ch 5 between trs. Rnd 40: sl st to 2nd st of 5 ch, *ch 24, sc over same 5 ch, ch 24, sc over same 5 ch, ch 24, sk one 5 ch, sc over next 5 ch, repeat from * all around, at end ch 24, and sl st in at base of first 24 ch, cut and fasten.

Rnd 41: fasten in end of one 24 ch loop, *ch 5, sc in end of next 24 ch loop, repeat from * all around, ch 5, sl st in with beginning 5 ch to close. Rnd 42: sl st over to center of first 5 ch, ch 8, tr over next 5 ch, *ch 5, tr over next 5 ch, repeat from * all around. Rnds 43 and 44 are the same as 42, cut, fasten and weave end in. Press under a damp cloth to size and shape.
