Three Little Bears

CROCHETED TEDDY BEAR

Materials Required—The following
AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY Products:

13" BEAR. (Top of head to sole of feet.) "DAWN" WORSTED FLOSS. 1 oz. Balls. 4 Balls Pink, 1 Ball Blue. Bone Crochet Hook No. 2 or 3.

16" BEAR. "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED, 11/4 oz. Skeins. 6 Skeins White, 1 Skein Brown. Bone Crochet Hook No. 4 or 5.

19" BEAR. "STAR" COTTON YARN, 100 yd. Skeins. 7 Skeins Brown, 1 Skein Yellow. Bone Crochet Hook No. 6.

Cotton or Kapok for filling.

The entire body and head of Bear is worked in 1 row of s c and 1 row of double loop sts.

BACK OF BODY. With White ch 26 and work 25 s c on ch (ch 1 to turn each row). 2nd Row-1 double loop st in each s c (loop st, wind yarn over index finger twice, insert hook in st, draw yarn through pulling yarn from under finger, drop loops from finger, letting them fall to right side of work and complete s c). 3rd Row-1 s c in each s c. Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows 18 times, then work 1 more row of loop sts. 41st Row-SI st in each of the next 4 s c and work 1 s c in each of the next 17 sts, leaving 4 sts free at each end for shoulders. 42nd Row-Work 1 loop st in each st. 43rd Row—Work in sc, increasing 1 s c in first and last st. 44th Row-Work even in loop st. Repeat last 2 rows 5 times. 55th Row-Start decreasing to shape back of head, 1 s c in each st decreasing 1 st at the beginning and end of row. 56th Row-Work even in loop st. Repeat the last 2 rows 5 times, break yarn.

LEFT FRONT OF BODY. Ch 20 and work 19 s c on ch. 2nd Row—Work a row of loop sts even. Continue working the same as back for 30 more rows, break yarn.

33rd Row starts HEAD. Join yarn in 5th st from end leaving the 1st 4 sts free for shoulder and work 1 s c in each of the next 15 sts. 34th Row—Work even in loop sts. 35th Row—Increase 1 s c at the beginning and end of row. Repeat the 34th and 35th rows once, then ch 8 for nose, turn. 38th Row—Work 7 s c on ch, then continue across head in loop sts. 39th Row—1 s c in each s c of head and nose. 40th Row—1 s c in each of the 7 s c, then continue across head in loop sts. Repeat the last 2 rows 3 times. 47th Row—Decrease 1 st at the beginning of row, 1 s c in each s c omitting the last 8 s c, ch 1, turn. 48th Row—Work even in loop sts. 49th Row—Decrease 1 st at the beginning and end of row. Repeat last 2 rows once, then work 1 more row of loop sts, break yarn.

RIGHT FRONT. Work the same as the first 32 rows of left front. 33rd Row-Without breaking yarn turn and work 1 s c in each of the next 15 sts, leaving last 4 sts free for shoulder. 34th Row-Work even in loop sts. 35th Row-Increase 1 s c at the beginning and end of row. 36th Row-Work in loop st, then ch 8 for nose. 37th Row-7 s c on ch, 2 s c in next st, 1 s c in each of next 15 sts, 2 s c in last st. 38th Row-1 loop st in each of next 19 s c, 1 s c in each of the 7 nose sts. 39th Row-1 s c in each st. 40th Row-1 loop st in each s c, working 1 s c in each of the 7 nose sts. Repeat the last 2 rows twice. 45th Row-1 s c in each st. 46th Row-1 loop st in each of the 19 sts, omitting last 7 nose sts, ch 1, turn. 47th Row-1 s c in each st, decreasing 1 st at end of row. Next 5 Rows-Work same as last 5 rows of left front, break yarn.

CENTER HEAD PIECE. Ch 2, 1 s c in second st from hook, ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd Row—2 s c in s c. Work 2 rows even. 5th Row—2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in next s c. Work 2 rows even. 8th Row—2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in each of next 2 s c. Work 2 rows even. Continue to increase 1 s c at the beginning of every third row until there are 9 s c in row, then work 2 rows even. 26th Row—Loop st in each s c. 27th Row—Work in s c, increasing one s c in first and last st. Repeat the last 2 rows until there are 17 s c in row, then work even, working 1 loop st row and 1 s c row until there are 44 rows from beginning, break yarn.

ARMS. With Brown, ch 2, 6 s c in second st from hook. 2nd Row—Without joining rows work 2 s c in each s c, working in back loop of st. (12 s c). 3rd Row—* 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from * all around. (18 s c). 4th Row—Increase 1 s c in every 3rd s c. (24 s c). 5th Row—Increase 1 s c in every 4th s c. (30 s c). Work 1 row even, break yarn, 7th Row—Join White and working in back loop of st work 1 row even. Working in both loops of st, work next 15 rows even.

LEGS. With Brown, ch 2, and work 8 s c in 2nd st from hook. Work next 4 rows same as arms, increasing in same manner having 40 s c in the last row and work 1 row even. Next Row—Attach White and work same as 7th row of arms. Working in both loops work 22 rows even. Next Row—Decrease 8 sts and work 4 rows even, break yarn.

EARS. With White, ch 20, work 19 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd Row—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of row, work 3 s c in center s c, decrease 1 s c at end of row. Work next 6 rows same as 2nd row, break yarn. Join yarn in first row and work 1 row of s c around both sides of ear, working 1 s c in each row, and 1 s c in each s c, break yarn.

HUMPTY DUMPTY

Materials Required-The following AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY Products:

71/2" HUMPTY. "DE LUXE" MERCERIZED CRO-CHET AND KNITTING COTTON. 1 400-yd. Ball White and 1 250-vd. Ball Color. (Worked with single thread.) Steel Crochet Hook No. 7.

10" HUMPTY. "STAR" PEARL COTTON Size 5, 60-yd. Balls. 6 Balls Color and 2 Balls Cream. Steel Crochet Hook No. 6. (Worked with double thread.)


13" HUMPTY. "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED, 11/4-oz. Skeins. 2 Skeins each of Color and White. Bone Crochet Hook No. 5. (Worked with single yarn.)

15" HUMPTY. "STAR" COTTON YARN, 100-yd. Skeins. 3 Skeins Color and 2 Skeins White. Bone Crochet Hook No. 6. (Worked with single yarn.) "Star" Six Strand Embroidery Cotton, 1 Skein Black will be sufficient for all Humpties. 1 Skein Red for each Humpty.

Cotton or Kapok for filling.

BODY SECTION. With Color, ch 2 and work 8 s c in 2nd st from hook. Without joining rounds, work 2 s c in each s c, (16 s c), place a marker. 3rd Round-1 s c in first s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from beginning all around. 4th Round-* 1 s c in each of the next 2 s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from * all around. Work 4 more rounds in the same manner having 1 more st between increasing points in each round, there should be 64 s c at end of the 8th round. 9th Round-Start Pattern, 1 s c in first s c, 1 d c in next s c, repeat from beginning all around, join all pattern rounds, ch 1, and turn each round. (End each round with a d c and start each round with an s c.) 10th Round-1 s c in d c, 1 d c in next s c, repeat from beginning all around. Work 4 more rounds the same as 10th round. 15th Round-Work in s c, increasing 6 sts in round, evenly spaced. 16th, 17th 18th Rounds-Work in pattern. Repeat last 4 rounds twice. Next Round-Work in s c increasing 10 sts, (92 s c), work 3 rounds in pattern even. 31st Round-1 s c in each st, then work 1 round of pattern, break thread.





Dumpty

HEAD. With Cream, work same as Body for first 7 rounds, then work 3 rounds of s c even. Next 17 Rounds-Work in s c as follows: 11th Round-Increase in every 7th s c, then work 3 rounds even. 15th Round-Increase in every 8th s c, then work 3 rounds even. 19th Round-Increase in every 9th s c, then work 3 rounds even. 23rd Round-Increase in every 10th s c, then work 3 rounds even. 27th Round-Increase enough to have 92 s c in round. 28th Round-Work in Pattern same as body section, break thread.

FEET. With Color, ch 9, 3 s c in second st from hook (toe), 1 s c in each of the next 6 sts, 3 s c in next st, (heel) working on opposite side of ch, 1 s c in each of the 6 sts, do not join rounds. 2nd Round-2 s c in each of the 3 toe sts, 1 s c in each of the next 7 s c, 2 s c in center st of heel, 1 s c in each s c on opposite side to toe. 3rd Round-Increase 1 s c in each of the 3 center sts of toe, 1 s c in each remaining s c. 4th Round-Decrease 3 sts at toe, 1 s c in each remaining s c. 5th Round—Decrease 2 sts at toe, 1 s c in each remaining s c. 6th Round—Decrease 1 st at toe, then work 4 more rounds even. 11th Round-Working in back loop of st

only, work in pattern. Work 6 more rounds of pattern even, break thread.

ARMS. With Color, ch 14, join and work 8 rounds of pattern even, break thread. 10th Round-Join Cream, working in back loop of st only. work 1 s c in each st. 11th, 12th, 13th Rounds-Working in both loops work 1 s c in each s c, join the last round. Fold work, ch 1 and working through both sides, work 1 s c in each of the 7 s c, * ch 1, turn, skip 1 s c, 1 s c in each remaining s c, repeat from * until 3 sts remain, break thread. COLLAR. With Cream, ch 91, join, being careful not to twist ch. Work 1 s c in each st, join. 2nd Row-* Ch 3, 2 d c in same space, skip 2 s c, s c in next s c, repeat from * all around, break thread. To make Humpty Dumpty—Sew Head to Body, leaving opening to fill. Fill with cotton and sew remainder. Fill Arms and Legs and sew in position. Sew Collar in position. With Black work eyes and eyebrows, using outline st. Mouth with Red. Nose.—Over 2 fingers wind Red about 40 times for 71/2" Humpty, 60 times for 10" Humpty, 70 times for 13" Humpty and 80 times for 15" Humpty, tie through center, trim and sew in posi-

Our Mittens We Have Found

POMPON CAT AND KITTEN

Materials Required—
AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY
"DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED, 1½-oz. Skeins.

CAT. 8 Skeins White and 1 Skein Black if spotted cat is desired.

KITTEN. 3 Skeins White and 1 Skein Black if spotted kitten is desired. 1 Ball Red "Dawn" Worsted Floss for

MITTENS. 1 60-yd. Ball "Star" Pearl Cotton White Size 5. Bone Crochet Hook No. 2 and No. 5. ¾-yd. Ribbon and 2 Buttons for Eyes.

CAT is 19" long and KITTEN 11" long.

CAT

BODY FOUNDATION. With White ch 50 about 9½ inches. Work 3 s c in second st from hook, 1 s c in each st of chain, with 3 s c in last st, working on opposite side of ch work 1 s c in each st of ch, without joining, work 3 more rounds working 3 s c in center st at ends of each round. Join and break yarn.

LEG. Ch 36 and work 1 round the same as body foundation. Work another leg section in the same manner. TAIL. Ch 15, and work 1 round the same as Leg. Center and place each Leg section crosswise on body foundation, about 1½ inches from each end, sew in position, sew tail to one end of body foundation.

POMPONS FOR BODY. Over a 4" cardboard, wind wool 45 times, slip from cardboard and tie around center with "Star" Pearl Cotton, leaving about 10 inches of thread for sewing. Make 25 more body pompons. Make 21 White pompons for Legs and Tail, winding over a 3 inch cardboard 40 times, if Black is used wind 5 pompons over a 3 inch cardboard 40 times.

HEAD. Over a 5½" cardboard wind White 100 times, slip from cardboard and tie around center. Wind another pompon in the same manner.

TO MAKE CAT. Sew a double row of pompons to 3rd round of body foundation, starting at legs, leaving the 11/4 inch of foundation free at each end. 12 pompons are used for top of body. Sew 1 pompon in the 11/4 inch space at tail end of body. Turn the Foundation over, and sew the other 13 body pompons to foundation in the same manner. Sew 4 pompons to each leg, 2 on each side of leg foundation, sew 2 pompons to each side of tail foundation. Trim all pompons to shape body, legs and tail. Sew the 11/4 inch section for head back to body foundation, then place the two head pompons at each side and sew in position. Sew 1 White pompon under the head at neck. If Black is used sew 1 Black pompon at back of head at neck, 1 at the end of each front leg, 1 at the end of tail and 1 in the back of body. If Black is not used wind 5 extra White pompons to be used in place of Black. Trim Head pompons to shape head, trim all remaining pompons, comb lightly to fluff.

EARS. With Black ch 11 and work 10 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn each row. Work in s c decreasing 1 s c at the beginning of each row until 4 sts remain. Attach White and work in same manner until 1 st remains, then work 1 row of s c in White all around. If Black is not used, work Ear in White. With Red "Dawn" Worsted Floss embroider mouth, using a cross st.

WHISKERS. Starch a 36 inch heavy Black thread very stiffly, cut in 4½ inch lengths, draw through mouth and sew in position. Sew Buttons in position for Eyes and sew Ears in position.

KITTEN

BODY FOUNDATION. With No. 5 hook, ch 31 (about 7 inches) and work 3 s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 s c in each st of ch, with 3 s c in last st, working on opposite side of ch, work 1 s c in each st, join and break yarn.

LEG FOUNDATION. Ch 18 and work the same as body foundation. Work another leg in the same manner.

TAIL FOUNDATION. Ch 9 and work the same as body foundation. Center each leg foundation crosswise to body foundation and sew, leaving about 1 inch of body foundation free at each end. Sew tail to one end of body foundation.

POMPONS FOR BODY. Over a 4 inch cardboard wind White wool 45 times, slip from cardboard and tie around center with "Star" Pearl Cotton, leaving about 10 inches of thread for sewing. Cut loops and make 7 more body pompons in the same manner.

POMPONS FOR LEGS AND TAIL. Over a 3 inch cardboard wind wool 35 times, slip from cardboard, tie in same manner as body pompons, make 10 more in the same manner.

HEAD POMPONS. Over a 5½ inch cardboard wind wool 75 times, slip from cardboard and tie in the same manner as body pompons, make 1 more head pompon. If Black is to be used make 4 Black pompons by winding wool 20 times over a 3 inch cardboard.

TO MAKE KITTEN. Sew 4 of the body pompons to top of body foundation, leaving about 1 inch free at each end of body foundation. Turn foundation over and sew the other 4 pompons to body in the same manner, trim to shape body. Sew 1 leg pompon to top and 1 pompon to under side of each leg foundation. Sew 1 pompon to each side of tail, trim to shape legs and tail. Sew the 1 inch of body foundation back to body, place the head pompons on each side and sew in position. Sew 1 White pompon under head at neck, trim to shape head. If Black is used, sew 1 Black pompon at end of tail, 1 at one front leg, 1 at back of neck and 1 in the back. If Black is not used, make 4 extra White pompons. Trim and comb to fluff wool.

CROCHETED LAMB

Materials Required—The following
AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY Products:

10" LAMB. (Top of head to sole of fcet.) "DAWN" WORSTED FLOSS. 4 1-oz. Balls. Bonc Crochet Hook No. 2 or 3.

12" LAMB. "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED. 7 11/4oz. Skeins. Bone Crochet Hook No. 5.

15" LAMB. "STAR" COTTON YARN, 100 yd. Skeins. 7 Skeins. 10 yds. Black for Feet, Mouth and Nose are required for each Lamb. Bone Crochet Hook No. 6.

Cotton or Kapok for filling.

LEFT SIDE OF LAMB. Starting at Left Hind Leg. Ch 7 and work 6 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd and 3rd Rows-1 s c in each s c. 4th Row-1 double loop st in each s c, (for double loop st see directions for Bear). 5th Row-Work in s c, increasing 1 s c at the beginning of row and decreasing 1 s c at the end of row. Repeat 4th and 5th rows twice, then work 1 row even in loop sts. 11th Row-Increase 1 s c at the beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining s c. 12th Row-Loop st in each s c. Repeat 11th and 12th rows 6 times. 25th Row-Increase 1 s c at the beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining st, then ch 28 for body, turn. 26th Row-Work 27 loop sts on ch, and 1 loop st in each s c of leg. 27th Row-Increase 1 s c at the beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining st. 28th Row-Loop st in each s c. 29th Row-1 s c in each loop st. 30th Row-Loop st in each s c. 31st Row-Decrease 1 s c at the beginning and end of row, 1 s c in each remaining st. 32nd Row-Loop st in each s c. Repeat 29th and 30th rows 6 times. 45th Row-1 s c in each s c, then ch 10 for head, ch 1, turn. 46th Row-Work 9 s c on ch and I loop st in each s c across back. 47th Row-1 s c in each of the first 39 sts, decrease 1 st (decrease, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loop on needle) 1 s c in each of the last 8 sts of head. 48th Row-Work in loop st, decreasing 1 st at end of row. 49th Row-Decrease 1 st at the beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining st. 50th Row-Loop st in each of the first 18 sts for head, ch 1, turn. 51st Row—Decrease 1 st at the beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining st. Work 6 rows even, alternating loop st row and s c row. 58th Row-Decrease 1 st at the beginning of row, I loop st in each remaining s c. 59th Row—Decrease 1 st at the beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining loop st. Repeat last 2 rows twice. 64th Row-Same as 58th row, break yarn.

MOUTH. Join yarn in the first st of the 46th row, work 1 s c in each of the 18 rows of head, ch 1, turn. 2nd Row—Decrease 1 s c at the beginning and end of row, 1 s c in each remaining s c. Continue working in s c, decreasing 1 st at the beginning and end of each row, until 2 sts remain, then decrease 1 st, break yarn. Join yarn at back of neck and work 1 loop st in each a c across back, ch 1, turn.

TAIL. 2 s c in first loop st, 1 s c in each of the next 5 loop sts, 2 s c in next loop st, ch 1, turn. 2nd Row—Loop st in each s c, ch 1, turn. 3rd Row—Decrease 1 st at the beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining s c. 4th Row—Loop st in each s c. Repeat 3rd and 4th rows 4 times, break yarn.

LEFT FRONT LEG. Work the same as first 4 rows of hind leg. 5th Row—1 s c in each loop st. 6th Row—Loop st in each s c. Repeat 5th and 6th rows twice. 11th Row—1 s c in each s c, increasing 1 s c in the last loop st. 12th Row—Loop st in each s c. Repeat 11th and 12th rows twice. 17th Row—Increase 1 s c at the beginning of row and decrease 1 s c at end of row. 18th Row—Loop st in each s c. Repeat last 2 rows once. Work next 4 rows even, alternating loop st row and s c row, break yarn. Sew to body starting at the first s c of 26th row and having the point at knee facing frontward.

RIGHT SIDE OF LAMB. Starting at the hind leg, work the first 24 rows same as left hind leg reversing all increasing and decreasing. At end of 24th row, ch 28 for body, turn. 25th Row-Work 27 s c on ch, 1 s c in each loop st of leg, increasing 1 s c at end of row. 26th Row-1 loop st in each s c. 27th Row-1 s c in each s c, increasing 1 s c at end of row. Work next 16 rows same as left side of lamb. 44th Row-1 loop st in each s c, ch 10 for head, turn. 45th Row-Work 9 s c on ch, 1 s c in each loop st across back. 46th Row-I loop st in each of the first 39 sts, decrease 1 st by working next 2 sts together, 1 loop st in each remaining s c of head. 47th Row-1 s c in each loop st. 48th Row-1 loop st in each s c, decreasing 1 st at the beginning of row. 49th Row-Work in s c decreasing 1 s c at end of row. 50th Row-Loop st in each s c. 51st Row-1 s c in each of the next 16 sts, decrease by crocheting the next 2 sts together, ch 1, turn. 52nd to 64th Rows-Same as left side.

MOUTH. Same as left side.

TAIL. Join yarn in 7th st from the back of the 50th row, 2 s c in same space with joining, 1 s c in each of the next 5 sts, 2 s c in last st, ch 1, turn. Continue working the same as left tail, reversing all decreasing, break yarn.

RIGHT FRONT LEG. Work same as left front leg, reversing all increasing and decreasing, break yarn.

center head and mouth section. Ch 2, 2 s c in the first st, ch 1, turn each row. 2nd Row—2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in next s c. Continue working in s c increasing 1 s c at beginning of each row, until there are 8 sts in row, then work next 3 rows even. Next Row—1 loop st in each s c. Next Row—1 s c in each loop st. Repeat last 2 rows 6 times. Next Row—1 loop st in each s c. Next Row—Decrease 1 st at the beginning of row 1 s c in each remaining st. Next Row—1 loop st in each s c. Next Row—1 s c in each loop st, decreasing 1 s c at end of row. Repeat the last 4 rows until 1 st remains, break yarn.

This Little Pig

CROCHETED PIGS

Materials Required—The following
AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY Products:

9½" PIG. "SILLATEEN SANSIL". 60 yd. Balls. 4 Balls Pink, 3 Balls each of Red and Green. Steel Crochet Hook No. 8. Work with double thread.

12¼" PIG. "STAR" PEARL COTTON size 5. 60 yd. Balls. 4 Balls each of Yellow, Blue and Cream, 1 Ball Red. Steel Crochet Hook No. 3 or 4. Work with double thread.

15½" PIG. "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED. 1½-oz. Skeins. 2 Skeins each of Orange, Green and White, 10 yds. Red for snout. Bone Crochet Hook No. 5. The sweater of this Pig is worked in Orange stripes arranged as desired. Work in single yarn.

17" PIG. "DAWN" WORSTED FLOSS. 1 oz. Balls. 3 Balls each of Red, Green and Pink. Bone Crochet Hook No. 6. Work with double yarn.

21" PIG. "STAR" COTTON YARN. 100 yd. Skeins. 2 Skeins each of Cream, Yellow and Brown, 10 yds. Red for Snout and Mouth. Bone Crochet Hook No. 6. Work with Single Yarn. Color distribution is given for 9½" Pig. Other sizes use Cream, White or Pink for head, ears, hands, feet and tail and distribute other colors as desired.

2 Small Buttons for eyes for each Pig.

Cotton or Kapok for filling.

Trim Pigs with buttons as illustrated or desired.

BODY. With Green, ch 23, and work 22 s c on ch. Ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd Row—1 s c in each s c. 3rd Row—2 s c in first and last s c, 1 s c in each remaining s c. Work next 6 rows same as 3rd row Next 16 Rows—1 s c in each s c, break thread.

START PANTS. Working in back loop of st only, join Red and work 1 row of s c even. 2nd Row—Working



in both loops, 2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in each remaining s c. Next 3 Rows—Work same as 2nd row, then work 8 rows even. 14th, 15th, 16th, 17th Rows—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of each row, and work 3 rows even. 21st Row—Start Leg—1 s c in each of the first 17 s c, ch 1, turn. 22nd Row—1's c in each s c. 23rd Row—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of row. 24th Row—1 s c in each s c. Repeat the 23rd and 24th rows 3 times. 31st, 32nd, 33rd Rows—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of each row and work 1 row even, break thread. Join thread in 17th st from opposite side, leaving 2 s c in center free and work another leg in the same manner reversing decreases.

ARMS. Join Green in 9th row from top, work 1 s c in same space with joining, 1 s c in each of the next 9 rows, ch 1, turn, work 1 row even. 3rd Row—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of row and increase 1 s c at end of row. 4th Row—1 s c in each s c. Repeat 3rd and 4th rows 5 times, break thread. Join Pink, decrease 1 st at beginning of row. Next Row—Decrease 1 st at beginning of row and work 3 rows even. Next Row—Start hand, 1 s c in each of the first 5 s c, ch 1, turn and work 1 row even. Next 2 Rows—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of each row, break thread.

THUMB. Work 1 s c in each of the 3 free s c on

opposite side, ch 1, turn. Next Row—1 s c in each s c. Next 2 Rows—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of each row, break thread. Work another arm on opposite side. Work another section in same manner.

FOOT. With Pink, ch 11, 3 s c in 2nd st from hook (heel) 1 s c in each of the next 8 sts 3 s c in last st, (toe) working on opposite side of ch, 1 s c in each of the next 8 sts, without joining rows, work 1 s c in next s c, 3 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 10 s c, 3 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 10 s c, then work 2 rows of s c even. Next 2 Rows—1 s c in each s c decreasing 3 sts at toe in each row, then work 1 row even, break thread. Attach Red and work 1 row even, break thread. Work another foot in same manner.

SIDE OF HEAD. With Pink, ch 7, 1 s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 5 sts of ch, ch 1 to turn each row. Work 1 row even. 3rd Row—Work 1 s c in each s c increasing 1 s c in first and last s c. 4th Row—1 s c in each s c working 2 s c in last s c. 5th Row—2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in each remaining s c. Repeat 4th and 5th rows 8 times. (The increased side is for under part of head.) 22nd Row—1 s c in each s c. 23rd Row—Decrease 1 st at beginning of row. Repeat 22nd and 23rd rows 3 times, work 1 row even, break thread and work another side piece in same manner.

Materials Required—The following
AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY Products:

15" HEN. "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED. 11/4-oz. Skeins. 4 Skeins Red and 2 Skeins White. Bone Crochet Hook No. 5. (Worked single yarn.)

8" HEN. "DE LUXE" MERCERIZED CROCHET AND KNITTING COTTON. 1 400-yd. Ball White and 2 250-yd. Balls Red will make 2 hens. Steel Crochet Hook No 7. (Worked single thread.)

34 yd. Ribbon for each Hen.

Cotton or Kapok for filling.

BABY CHICKS. "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED. 1¼-oz. Skeins, White or Yellow. 1 Skein will make 2 chicks. 1¼ yds. Red for each bill. 1 Ball "Star" Pearl Cotton Size 5, Yellow will make feet for 6 chicks. Steel Crochet Hook No. 4.

2 Buttons for each Hen and Chick.

HEN. Right side—With Red, ch 23, insert needle in 3rd st from hook and pull loop through, skip 1 st of ch, insert needle in next st, and pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on needle, * ch 1, insert needle in same space with last st, pull loop through, skip 1 st of ch, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over, and pull through all 3 loops on needle, repeat from * to end of row, ch 3, turn (10 patterns). 2nd Row-Insert needle in 3rd st from hook and pull loop through, skip 1 st, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on needle, * ch 1, insert needle in same space with last st, pull loop through, skip 1 st, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on needle, repeat from * to end of row, ch 3, turn. Repeat 2nd row once. (Ch 2 to turn all decrease rows.) 4th Row-Decrease 1 pattern at the beginning of row, work in pattern even across remainder of row. (To decrease: skip 1 st, s c in next st.) Repeat the 4th row twice, then work 4 more rows even. 11th Row-Increase 1 pattern at the beginning of row. (Increase: insert needle in 3rd st from hook, pull loop through, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loops on needle, ch 1, insert needle in same space with last st, pull loop through, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loops on needle, ch 1.) Work even across remainder of row. Repeat the 11th row 12 times. 24th Row-Work even. 25th Row-Increase 1 pattern at the beginning of row. Repeat the last 2 rows twice, then work 4 rows even. 34th Row-Decrease 1 pattern at the beginning of row and work 1 row even. 36th Row-Start Head-Work 11 patterns, ch 3, turn, work 2 rows even. 39th and 40th Rows-Increase 1 pattern at the beginning of each row,

then work 8 rows even. 49th to 53rd Rows—Decrease 1 pattern at the beginning of each row, break yarn. Attach yarn at back of neck and work in pattern to end of row, ch 3, turn. Start Tail—Work 7 patterns, ch 2, turn. Decrease 1 pattern at beginning of row, work 6 patterns, ch 2, turn. Decrease 1 pattern at beginning of row and work 5 patterns, then work 1 row of s c all around section working 1 s c in each pattern and 1 s c in each row with 2 s c at feet corners and at tail tip, break yarn. Work another section in same manner.

UNDER SECTION. With White, ch 7, work 2 patterns on ch, ch 3, turn. 2nd Row—Increase 2 patterns, (4 patterns in row) ch 3, turn. 3rd to 10th Rows—Increase 1 pattern at the beginning of each row, then work 3 rows even. Next 2 rows—Decrease 1 pattern at the beginning of each row. 16th to 24th Rows—Work even. Next 6 Rows—Increase 1 pattern at the beginning of each row. 30th to 40th Rows—Work even. 41st to 50th Rows—Decrease 1 pattern at the beginning of each row, then work 2 rows even. 53rd to 57th Rows—Increase 1 pattern at the beginning of each row. Work 24 more rows even, then decrease 1 pattern at the beginning of each row until 1 pattern remains. Work 1 row of s c all around, 1 s c in each row, break yarn.

UNDER SECTION FOR LEG. With Red, work 2 sections following the first 11 rows of right side, then work 1 row of s c all around.

WINGS, COMB AND TAIL. With Red, ch 21 and work 20 s c on ch, ch 1, turn, working remainder in back loop of st only, 1 s c in each of the next 19 s c, ch 3, turn, 1 s c in first st of ch 3, 1 s c in each of the next 4 s c, ch 3, turn, 1 s c in first st of ch 3, 1 s c in each of the next 4 s c, ch 3, turn, 1 s c in first st of ch 3, 1 s c in each of the next 4 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 2 s c on base, repeat from * 7 times, working the last 2 s c over the 2 rows of base, break yarn and work 7 more Red and 6 White sections in same manner.

BILL. With Red, ch 9 and work 8 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn each row. Work 5 more rows of s c even, then decrease 1 s c at the beginning of each row until 2 sts remain. Work 1 row of s c all around, break yarn. Work 1 more section in Red and 1 section in White.

TO ASSEMBLE HEN. Sew the under section for legto lower edge of side section, starting at the 12th row. Sew other under section to other side in same manner. Sew tail together for about 14 rows starting at straight part of back at lower edge of neck. Sew under section in position starting at about the 26th row at tail and 1st row of under section working down to 12th row, then sew to under section of leg, up front and around head. Sew other side to correspond leaving enough opening for filling. Stuff with cotton or Kapok and sew remainder.

JACK AND JILL

Materials Required—The following
AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY Products:

11" DOLLS. "STAR" PEARL COTTON Size 5, 60-yd. Balls. 4 Balls White, 3 Balls Red, 2 Balls Medium Blue, 1 Ball each of Light Blue, Pink and Brown. "STAR" SIX STRAND MERCERIZED EMBROIDERY COTTON, 2 Skeins Brown. Steel Crochet Hook No. 8.

16" DOLLS. "DAWN" WORSTED FLOSS, 1-oz. Balls. 2 Balls each of Red and White, 1 Ball each of Pink, Light and Medium Blue. 2 Balls of "SILLATEEN SANSIL" Brown (this is used double for Jack's Wig and Shoes). "STAR" SIX STRAND MERCERIZED EMBROIDERY COTTON, 4 Skeins Brown and 1 Skein each of Red and Black will be sufficient for embroidering all faces. Bone Crochet Hook No. 1.

Cotton or Kapok for filling.

JACK

SHOES. With Brown ch 30, join to form a ring, ch 1 and work 1 s c in 1st 9 sts of ch, ch 1, turn and work 7 more rows of s c, then work 1 row of s c decreasing 1 st each side. 10th Row—Ch 1, 1 s c in each s c, 1 s c in each row at side, skip 1 st at instep, work s c on each remaining st of ch skipping last st at instep, 1 s c in each row of s c on other side, join and work 2 more rows of s c decreasing 1 st at each side of instep. Work 4 rows even, break thread and sew seam of sole. Attach Brown at center back of heel, ch 3 and work 25 d c around shoe, join, ch 3 and work 1 more row of d c, break thread. Attach Medium Blue and work 11 rows of d c working the 1st row only in the back loop of sts, break thread and with Medium Blue work a row of d c in free loop of last row of Brown. Place a piece of shaped cardboard in the soles of feet and stuff feet and legs. Place side centers of legs together and with Medium Blue, starting at front, crochet legs together with 6 s c working through both loops of sts on each leg, do not break thread. Ch 3 and working through both loops, work a row of d c around outside of legs, join. 2nd Row-Ch 3, work a row of d c, increasing 4 sts in back of each leg, join. Ch 3 and work 5 more rows, break thread. With Light Blue work a row of d c into back loops of sts then work 7 rows working into both loops. 16th Row-Ch 3, * 1 d c, decrease 1 st, 2 d c, decrease one st, repeat from * all around. 17th Row-Decrease every other st then work 1 row even, break thread. Mark the 15 center sts in front of the last row of Medium Blue and beginning in the first st, work a row of d c in free loops of row, join and on the 15 center sts work 6 rows of d c, ch 1, turn and work 1 s c in each of the 1st 2 d c, ch 1, turn and continue rows of s c until strap meets overalls in the back. Work a similar strap on the other side.

HANDS AND ARMS. With White, ch 20, join, ch 1

and work 19 s c on ch, join. Ch 1 and work 3 more rows of s c.

NEXT ROW START THUMB. Ch 1, work 1 s c in each of the next 7 s c, join in ch 1. Ch 1 and work 3 rounds of s c. Next Row—Decrease 2 sts, break thread and sew tip of thumb. Attach thread to side of thumb, ch 1 and work 12 s c around remaining sts, join and work 5 more rows of s c. Next Row—Decrease 4 sts, break thread and sew tip of hand.

ARMS. Attach Light Blue at wrist above thumb, ch 3 and work 17 d c around wrist, join, ch 3 and work 7 more rows of d c. 9th to 12th Rows—11 d c, 1 s d c, 4 s c, 1 s d c, join, break thread. In the 2nd arm work the last 4 rows as follows: 1 s d c, 4 s c, 1 s d c, 11 d c. Stuff arms and body.

HEAD. With White, ch 7, join. Ch 1 and work 15 s c into ring. Join each row and start each row with ch 1. 2nd Row-1 s c in each s c. 3rd Row-Increase in every other st. Work 1 row even. Repeat last 2 rows twice increasing if necessary to 53 sts in last row. Work 10 rows even. 19th Row-1 s c in each of the next 9 sts, decrease one st, 1 s c in each of the next 9 sts, decrease one st, 1 s c in each of the next 9 sts, place a marker and work remaining sts for face. Work 3 rows even. 23rd Row-1's c in each of the next 11 sts, decrease one st, 1 s c in each of the next 4 sts, decrease one st, 1 s c in each of the next 10 sts, decrease one st, 1 s c in each of the next 16 sts, decrease one st, 1 s c in each of the next 2 sts. Work 1 row even. 25th Row-1 s c in each of the next 10 sts, decrease 2 sts, 1 s c in each of the next 10 sts, decrease one st, 1 s c in each of the next 19 sts, decrease one st. Work 1 row even. 27th Row-* 1 s c in next st, decrease one st, repeat from * 6 times, 1 s c in each of the next 8 sts, decrease 2 sts, 1 s c in each remaining st. Work 1 row even, break thread and stuff head. Indicate face with pencil as illustrated and embroider the mouth in Red and remainder of face in Black.

WIG. With Brown, ch 5, join, ch 1 and work 10 s c into ring. 2nd Row—2 s c in each s c. Work 2 rows even. 5th Row—Increase in every other st. Work 3 rows even. 9th Row—Increase in every 5th st. Work 2 rows even.

NEXT ROW STARTS CURLS. Ch 3, turn work and working into back loop of st, s c in same space, * pull up a loop on hook the length of the ch 3 and s c in next st, pull up a loop on hook and s c in same space, repeat from * all around, slipping loops off hook about every 10 sts then slipping last 2 back on hook to use as a gauge for the following loops. Finish row with 2 s c without loops. Ch 1, turn work and work a row of s c in free loops of sts. Repeat the last 2 rows twice and work 1 row of loops working into both loops of sts. Attach wig to head.

Materials Required—The following
AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY Products:

7¼" FROG. (Length of Body) "STAR" PEARL COTTON, Size 5, 60 yd. Balls. 2 Balls Yellow, 3 Balls Green. Steel Crochet Hook No. 8. Work with single thread.

10½" FROG. "STAR" PEARL COTTON Size 5, 60 yd. Balls. 4 Balls Yellow, 6 Balls Green. Steel Crochet Hook No. 4. Work with double thread.

151/2" FROG. "STAR" COTTON YARN, 100 yd. Skeins. 2 Skeins Yellow, 3 Skeins Green. Bone Crochet Hook No. 6. Work with single yarn.

Cotton or Kapok for filling.

2 Small Buttons for each frog.

HEAD. With Green, ch 17, 1 s c in 2nd st from hook, * 1 d c in next st, 1 s c in next st, repeat from * 6 times, 1 d c in last st, ch 1, turn. 2nd Row-1 s c, 1 d c, 1 s c in first d c, * 1 d c in next s c, 1 s c in next d c, repeat from * 6 times, then 1 d c, 1 s c, 1 d c in last s c, ch 1, turn. 3rd Row-1 s c in first d c, 1 d c in next s c, * 1 s c in next d c, 1 d c in next s c, repeat from * across row. (Always end row with a d c and ch 1 to turn each row). 4th Row-1 s c, 1 d c, 1 s c in first d c, work even across row working 1 d c, 1 s c, 1 d c in last s c. Repeat last 2 rows twice. 9th to 21st Rows-Work same as 3rd row. 22nd and 25th Rows-Work same as 4th row. 23rd, 24th and 26th Rows-Work same as 3rd row. 27th Row-Work even to end of row, then ch 7, turn. 28th Row-1 s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 d c in next st, 1 s c in next st, 1 d c in next st, 1 s c in next st. 1 d c in next st. continue working across row, then ch 7 and turn. 29th Row—Work across ch same as 28th row, then continue across row. Next 5 Rows Work even. 35th Row-Start decreasing, skip the first 2 sts, s c in next d c, d c in next s c, continue even across row. Work 14 more rows the same as 35th row, break thread.

With Yellow-Work under section in same manner.

HIND LEG. With Green, ch 12, work 11 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd Row—1 s c in each s c, work 10 more rows even.


START FEET. 13th, 14th and 15th Rows—1 s c in each s c increasing 1 s c in first and last st in each row. 16th Row—1 s c in each of the first 4 s c, 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 3 s c, 3 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 3 s c, 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the last 4 s c, 17th Row—1 s c in each of the

first 4 s c, 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 5 s c, 3 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 5 s c, 2 s c in next s c, ch 1, turn. 18th Row—2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in each of next 7 s c, 3 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of next 7 s c, 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of next 7 s c, 2 s c in next s c, ch 1, turn. 19th Row—Increase 1 s c at beginning and end of row and in the center st, break thread and work 3 more sections in same manner.

FRONT LEG. Ch 10, work 9 s c on ch, ch 1, turn and work 21 more rows even. 23rd, 24th, 25th Rows—Increase 1 s c at beginning and end of each row. 26th Row—1 s c in each of first 4 s c, 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 2 s c, 3 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 2 s c, 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the last 4 s c. 27th Row—1 s c in each of first 4 s c, 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 4 s c, 3 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 4 s c, 3 s c in next s c, 1 turn. 28th Row—2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in each of the next 6 s c, 3 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 6 s c, 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 6 s c, 2 s c in next s c, 1 turn. 29th Row—Increase 1 s c in first, center and last s c, break thread. Work 3 more front leg sections in same manner.

TO ASSEMBLE FROG. Sew one of the front leg pieces to each side of Green section starting at about the 21st row, and sewing towards back, sew one of the hind leg sections to each side of Green, starting at about the 40th row, ending at last row. Sew the other 4 leg sections to Yellow section in same manner. Match the Yellow to the Green section and sew all around leaving enough opening at side to allow for filling. Stuff legs and feet slightly, stuff body and sew remainder. Tack feet down to indicate toes.

EYES ARE WORKED WITH SINGLE THREAD. Using Yellow, ch 9, work 1 s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 6 sts, 3 s c in next st, working on opposite side of ch, work 1 s c in each st, 2 s c in same st with first s c, do not join rows. 2nd Row-1 s c in each s c. 3rd and 4th Rows-Increase 2 sts at each end of each row. 5th Row-1 s c in each s c. 6th Row-Working in back loop of st only, 1 s c in each s c. Next 3 Rows-Working in both loops, work 1 s c in each s c, break thread. Work another Yellow eye. With Green, ch 9 and work 8 s c on ch, ch 1, turn. Decrease 1 st at beginning of each row until 3 sts remain, break thread. Work another section in same manner. Sew the two Green sections to the top of Yellow eyes, stuff with cotton and sew in position. With Yellow embroider mouth as illustrated. Finish with two small buttons as illustrated.

CROCHETED HORSE

Materials Required—The following AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY Products:

91/2" HORSE. (Top of head to feet) "STAR" PEARL COTTON, Size 5. 60 yd. Balls. 8 Balls White and 1 Ball Red. Steel Crochet Hooks No. 4 and 8. Work with two strands of thread.

131/2" HORSE. "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED, 11/4 oz. Skeins. 4 Skeins Brown and 1 Skein Tangerine or Orange. Bone Crochet Hooks No. 3 and 6. Work with single yarn.

Cotton or Kapok for filling.

171/2" HORSE. "STAR" COTTON YARN, 100 yd. Skeins. 7 Skeins Black and 1 Skein White. Crochet Hooks No. 6 and G. Work with double yarn.

BODY. With White and Large Hook ch 38 and work 37 s c on ch. Ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd and 3rd Rows -2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in each remaining s c. 4th and 5th Rows-1 s c in each s c. 6th Row-Increase 1 s c at beginning of row and work 2 rows even. 9th and 10th Rows—Increase 1 s c at beginning of each row. 11th Row-Increase 1 s c at beginning of row and work 4 rows even. 16th, 17th and 18th Rows-Decrease 1 s c at beginning of each row. 19th Row-Start Neck -Work 1 s c in each of the first 17 s c, ch 1, turn. 20th Row—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining s c of neck. 21st Row-1 s c in each s c. Repeat the 20th and 21st rows 3 times. 28th Row-Decrease 1 s c at beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining s c, ch 12 for head, turn. 29th Row-11 s c on ch, 1 s c in each s c of neck. Next 14 Rows-Decrease 1 s c at beginning of each row, break thread. LOWER SECTION OF FACE. Attach thread at neck edge in the 28th row and in the first st of the ch 12 and work 1 s c in each of the next 10 sts of ch, 2 s c in last st, ch 1, turn and work 3 more rows even. 5th Row—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of row and work 1 row even. Next 4 Rows-Decrease 1 s c at beginning of each row, break thread. Attach thread in first s c of 18th row and work 1 s c in each of the next 14 s c, ch 1, turn. Decrease 1 s c and work 1 s c in each of the next 13 s c, ch 1, turn, decrease 1 s c and work 1 s c in each of the next 12 s c, then work 1 s c in each s c across back, 1 s c in each row of neck, 1 s c in each s c at top of head, continue working around head and down the front to the first row without breaking thread.

START FRONT LEG. 2 s c in first s c of opposite side of ch 38, 1 s c in each of next 8 sts, ch 1, turn. 2nd Row—Decrease 1 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 9 s c. 3rd Row—Increase 1 s c at beginning of row. 4th Row—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of row. Repeat the 3rd and 4th rows 3 times. 11th Row-1 s c in each s c. 12th Row—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of row. Repeat 11th and 12th rows 3 times, then work 6 more rows even, break thread.

HIND LEG. Attach thread in 13th st from end of row, work 1 s c in each of the next 12 sts, ch 1, turn, and work 2 rows even. 4th Row—Increase 1 s c at beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining s c. 5th Row-Decrease 1 s c at beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining s c. Repeat the 4th and 5th rows once and work 1 row even. Next 8 Rows-Decrease 1 s c at beginning of each row and work 10 more rows even, break thread. Attach thread at top of head at face, work 1 s c in each of the s c of top of head to back of neck, ch 1, turn. Work 1 s c in each s c across top of head, down front of face, around mouth and up to under neck, ch 1, turn. Work 1 more row of s c all around head then work about 5 s c down back of neck, break thread. Work another section in the same manner.

UNDER SECTION. Work 2 under sections following the first 5 rows of body. Then work front and hind leg on each section.

EARS. Ch 2, 1 s c in first st, ch 1 to turn. 2nd Row-2 s c in s c. 3rd Row-2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in next s c. Work 8 more rows increasing 1 s c at beginning of each row, then work 1 s c in each row down one side, 3 s c in the first st, 1 s c in each row up opposite side, break thread.

TAIL. Ch 6, join and work 1 s c in each st, without joining rows and working in back loop of st only work 1 s c in each s c for 14 rows.

FRINGE. *Draw up a loop on hook about 3 inches or length desired, hold loop on hook, s c in next s c, draw up another loop on hook, s c in same s c, draw up another loop on hook, s c in next s c, repeat from * twice. Work a few loops in same manner in about 3 or 4 rows for under part of tail, break thread. Cut

MANE. Ch 51 and work 50 s c on ch, then work fringe same as tail fringe.

BLANKET. With 1 strand of Red and Small Hook ch 46 and work 45 s c on ch. 2nd Row-Ch 3, turn, * 2 d c in same space with ch 3, skip 3 s c, s c in next s c, ch 3, repeat from * across row. (Ch 3 to turn each row.) 3rd Row-2 d c in same space with ch 3, s c over the ch 3 of shell, * ch 3, 2 d c in same space, s c over the ch 3 of next shell, repeat from * across row. Attach White and work 1 row of White, 2 rows of Red, 1 row of White, 2 rows of Red, then work 1 row of shells all around blanket. Work a band of 2 shells to fit around horse.

TO ASSEMBLE HORSE. Lay the under sections on body sections matching legs. Sew around both legs and to body, then place both body sections together, leaving center of under section open for filling. Fill and sew together. Sew Tail, Ears and Blanket in position. Fold Mane in half, cut loops and sew in position. Embroider eyes or use buttons sewed into a small piece of white felt.

EARS. Ch 8, work 7 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd Row—1 s c in each s c, then decrease 1 s c at the beginning of each row until 1 st remains, break yarn and work another ear in the same manner. If Black is used make Black Ears. See directions for Cat for embroidering mouth, sew buttons in for Eyes. Whiskers are cut in 3½ inch lengths. Sew Ears in position.

MITTENS. With Red "Dawn" Worsted Floss and a No. 2 needle ch 14, join, ch 1 and work 1 s c in each st of ch. Next 2 Rows—1 s c in each s c. 4th Row—1 s c in each of the next 9 s c, ch 1, skip 4 s c for thumb, s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 8 s c, 1 s c in the ch 1 over thumb, then work 1 row even. Decrease 1 st in each row until 4 sts remain, break yarn, leaving an end. Thread into needle and draw together.

THUMB. Attach yarn and work 3 rows of s c even, break yarn leaving an end to draw together same as top of mitten.

CUFF. Attach yarn, ch 3, 2 d c in same space, ch 1, skip 1 st, 1 s c in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st, * 3 d c in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st, 1 s c in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st, repeat from * all around, break yarn and work another mitten in the same manner. Attach yarn at one front Paw, run yarn through Cuff of each mitten and attach to opposite paw.

COMB. Sew 2 Red and 1 White section together and sew to top of head as illustrated.

TAIL. Sew 2 Red and 1 White section together and sew to tail as illustrated. Sew 2 White and 2 Red Sections on each side for wings as illustrated.

BILL. Sew 1 White and 2 Red sections together and sew to front of face as illustrated. Sew eyes in position.

BABY CHICKS

BODY. With White, over a 3 inch cardboard wind wool 100 times, slip from cardboard and tie through center, leaving about 5 inches of thread.

HEAD. Over a 2 inch cardboard wind wool 75 times, slip from cardboard and tie through center leaving about 5 inches of thread.

BILL. With Red, ch 8, 2 s c in second st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 5 sts of ch, 2 s c in next st, working on opposite side of ch, 1 s c in each st of ch. Join-and break yarn.

LEGS. With Yellow "Star" Pearl Cotton, using double thread, ch 6 join, ch 1 and without joining rows, working in the back loop of st only, work 1 s c in each s c, until work measures about 1 inch.

FEET. * Ch 4, turn, work 3 s c on ch, s c in same space with ch 4, s c in next s c, repeat from * twice, then

ch 2, s c in second st from hook, s c in same space with ch 2, s c in next s c, break thread. Work another leg in same manner.

TO MAKE CHICKS. Trim pompons to shape body and head, tie head and body threads together. Sew eyes and legs in position. Fold Bill in half and sew in position. Comb Body and Head to fluff.

IACK

CAP. With Medium Blue work the 1st 11 rows of wig and repeat the last 3 rows then turn work and into back loop of st work a row of s c. Tie a Ribbon around Jack's neck.

JILL

SHOES. With White work same as Jack's shoes.

LEG. Work same as Jack's working 2 rows White, two rows of d c in Red and 9 rows in White working the 1st row of White in back loop of st, break thread and with Red work a row of s c in free loop of last row of Red for cuff. With Pink—Join legs and crochet body same as Jack's, working 1st row through back loop only. Work 10 rows Pink, break thread. Attach Pink in free loop of last row in White * ch 3, sl st in next st, repeat from * all around, break thread. With Red work a row of d c then work 1 row into back loop of sts and 3 rows into both loops of sts. Repeat 16th, 17th and 18th rows of body.

SKIRT. Join Red in center back of free loop in 1st row of Red, ch 4, and work 2 tr c in each st, join. Ch 4 and work 3 more rows of tr c even then work * 1 row of s c in White, 1 row of d c in Red. Repeat from *, break thread.

HANDS. Work same as Jack's.

ARMS. With White repeat the first 8 rows of Jack's arms, break thread. With Red repeat 9th to 12th rows, working into back loop of sts in 9th row and both loops in 10th, 11th and 12 rows, break thread. Attach Red in free loop in last row in White * ch 5, sl st in next st, repeat from * all around.

HEAD. Work same as Jack's and embroider face same as Jack's.

HAIR. Take 2 Skeins (4 Skeins for large doll) of Six Strand Embroidery Thread and cut in 12" lengths (18" lengths for large doll), place strands on top of head spreading them to about 1½" or 2" and sew to head through the center forming a part in the hair. Tack hair to head at sides about half way down. Braid each side and tie with ribbons. With 2 strands of cotton embroider the bangs.

BONNET. With Red repeat 14 rows of Jack's cap. Next row. SI st across 1st 5 s c * ch 3, 2 d c in same space, skip 2 s c, sI st in next s c, repeat from * 12 times, ch 3, turn, * 2 d c in same space, sI st in ch 3 of next shell, ch 3, repeat from * across row, work 4 rows of shells and work 1 row of shells all around bonnet. Attach ribbon to bonnet and tie under the chin.

TO ASSEMBLE BEAR. Sew last row of center head piece to top of back body section (the plain part is for the nose). Sew left front section in position starting at last st of last row of left front section and seam of last section just completed. Sew across top of head and center head piece down to nose matching the loops above nose. Sew the plain part of center head piece around the nose piece of left front section having the point at throat. Sew right front section to opposite side in same manner. Sew the two front sections together at front. Sew back body section to front body section fitting the side of head to center head piece matching shoulders and leaving last 14 rows of back body section free for sitting down. Sew opposite side in same manner. Fill body and sew lower part of back section to lower part of front section. Cut cardboard inner soles for legs. Fill legs and arms, sew top edges together. Sew arms to body starting at shoulders Sew legs to body at first row of front section. Sew ears in position. Large brown buttons are used for eyes. Embroider nose as illustrated using satin stitch. Shear all loops if desired.

NECK SECTION. Ch 9 and work 8 s c on ch. 2nd Row—1 loop st in each s c. 3rd Row—1 s c in each loop st. Repeat the 2nd and 3rd rows 6 times. 16th Row—Loop st in each st. 17th Row—Decrease 1 st at beginning of row, 1 s c in each remaining st. 18th Row—1 loop st in each s c. 19th Row—1 s c in each loop st, decreasing 1 st at end of row. Repeat the last 4 rows until 1 st remains, break yarn.

UNDER SECTION. Work 1 section following the first 30 rows of left side and left front leg. Work another section following the first 30 rows of right side and right front leg.

FEET. With Black, ch 2, 6 s c in 2nd ch from hook. Next Row—Without joining, work 2 s c in each s c, break yarn, leaving a length of yarn long enough to embroider three lazy daisy sts.

EARS. Ch 15 and work 14 s c on ch. 2nd Row—1 loop st in each s c. 3rd Row—2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in each remaining st. 4th Row—1 loop st in each st. Repeat 3rd and 4th rows once. 7th Row—Decrease 1 st at the beginning of row. 8th Row—1 loop st in each s c. Repeat 7th and 8th rows once, break yarn.

TO ASSEMBLE LAMB. Match under section to body section, starting at inside of leg, sew up leg, across under part of body and down opposite leg. Sew outside of front leg together, leaving end of legs open for foot. Sew outside of hind leg together Sew other section in same manner. Match body sections, starting at the lower back, sew up back around tail and across back to neck. Sew center head piece in, starting at nose and working to back of neck. Sew the opposite side in same manner. Sew the remainder of mouth down as

far as the loop st row. Sew neck section in position, placing the narrow part to first row of loop st at mouth and sew to front of body. Sew opposite side in same manner. Sew the 4 rows of under section to the neck section. Fill with Kapok or Cotton and sew across under side of under sections. Sew feet to legs and with length of Black yarn embroider 3 lazy daisy sts on lower edge of leg for toes. Sew ears in position and embroider mouth as illustrated. Buttons are used for eyes.

BACK HEAD PIECE. With Pink, ch 2, 1 s c in 2nd st from hook, ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd Row—2 s c in s c. 3rd Row—2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in remaining s c.

Repeat 3rd row 11 times. Work 28 rows even, break thread.

UNDER HEAD PIECE. Ch 10, 1 s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 s c in each remaining st of ch, ch 1, turn. 2nd Row—2 s c in first s c, 1 s c in each remaining s c. Work next 4 rows the same as second row, then work 8 rows even. Next 11 Rows—Decrease 1 s c at beginning of each row, break thread.

SNOUT. With Red, ch 2, 6 s c in second st from hook, do not join row. 2nd Row—2 s c in each s c. (12 s c). Ch 1, turn. 3rd Row—* 1 s c in first s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from * to end of row, ch 1, turn and work 2 rows on the 18 s c, break thread.

EARS. With Pink, ch 12 and work 11 s c on ch, work next 3 rows even. Decrease 1 s c at the beginning of each row until 1 st remains, break thread.

TAIL. With Pink, ch 6, join to form a ring, ch 1 and work 1 s c in each st, without joining rows and working in back loop of st only, work 1 s c in each s c, continue working in same manner until tail is desired length. Leave a length of thread long enough to pull through tail, break thread.

TO ASSEMBLE PIG. Sew side head piece to back head piece beginning at narrow ends (snout) fitting in side head piece so that neck edges are even. Sew other side head piece in same manner. Sew under head to side head pieces joining narrow end to neck edge. Sew snout in position. Sew body sections together leaving leg and neck edges also the side of body open for filling. Sew head to body. Cut cardboard inner sole to fit bottom of foot. Sew feet to legs and stuff body. Sew openings and sew eyes in position.


BRIDLE AND REINS are made to fit. Using a single strand of Red, make a ch long enough to fit around mouth, join and work a row of s c on ch. The Bit is a ch to fit from one side of band in mouth and attached to opposite side. Work a band around head, across front of head and reins made of 2 rows of s c, break thread.
