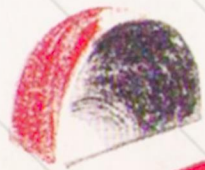
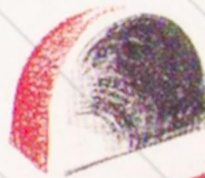
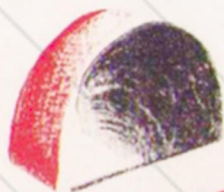

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## ***DRAMATIC ENTRANCE***

### **DRESS-UP COLLAR AND CUFFS—No. 2101**

**Materials Required—AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“STAR” or “GEM” MERCERIZED CROCHET COTTON  
Size 30—1 Large Ball White.**

**Steel Crochet Hook Number 12.**

Make a ch 27 inches long, d c in 6th ch from hook, \* ch 1, skip 1 ch, d c in next ch, repeat from \* until work measures 25 inches, cut off remaining ch.

**2nd Row.** Ch 4 turn, d c in d c, ch 1, d c in next d c, repeat from \* across row. Repeat this row 10 times.

**13th Row.** Ch 6, turn, s c in d c, \* ch 5, s c in next d c, repeat from \* across row.

**14th and 15th Rows.** Ch 7, turn, (always add 1 ch for

turning) and work 6 ch loops, then work 2 rows of 7 ch loops, 2 rows of 8 ch loops, 2 rows of 9 ch loops, and 2 rows of 10 ch loops.

**24th Row.** Ch 11, turn, s c in loop, \* ch 5, 2 d c in next loop, ch 4, sl st in top of d c for picot, 2 d c in same loop, ch 5 and repeat from \* to within the last 2 loops, ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in loop. Break thread.

Attach thread in 3rd row of meshes and work 5 ch loops in ch of mesh. Then repeat from 14th row. Break thread.

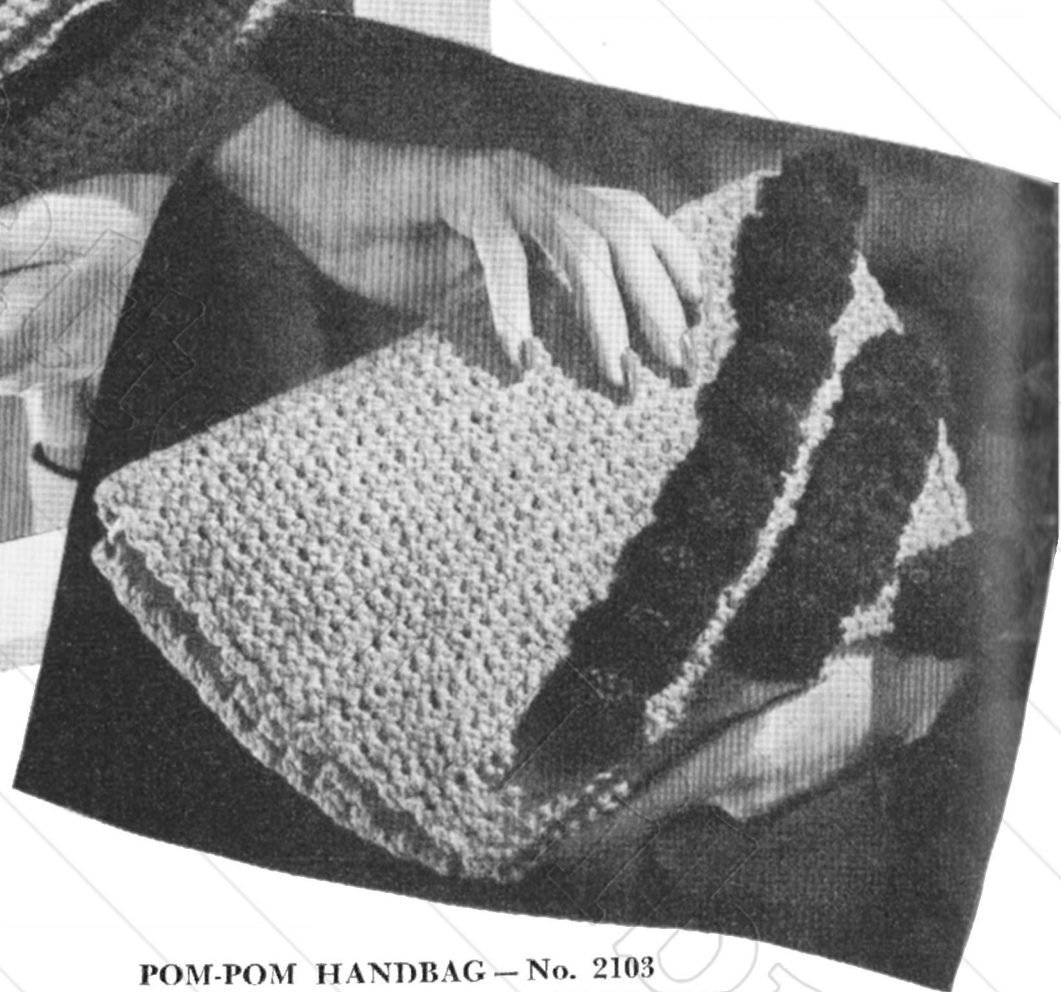
**Cuff.** Make a ch 13 inches long, d c in 6th ch from hook, \* ch 1, skip 1 ch, d c in next ch repeat from \* until work measures 10 inches, then work 9 more rows of 1 ch meshes same as for collar. Repeat from the 13th row of collar.

Starch pieces slightly and iron while still damp.



# FOUR

Handbags made of Cotton Yarn will be valued as gifts in a time when other handbag materials are scarce.



## CORDED HANDBAG — No. 2102

Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“GEM” COTTON YARN.

3 Skeins Red.                      1 Skein Black.                      2 Snaps.

Bone Crochet Hook Number 4 or 5.

**First Section.** With Red, ch 35 and work 34 s c on ch, ch 1, turn.

**2nd Row.** Increase 1 st both ends and work 1 row even. Repeat the last 2 rows 4 times. Then work 15 rows even, break yarn.

Repeat the first section, then work 15 more rows even. Next 8 rows decrease 1 st at both ends, break yarn.

Crochet a row of s c around both sides of first section, then crochet a row around 26 rows of both sides of the other section. Sew bag together.

**Cord Trim.** With Black, measure 6 strands about 3 yards long. Twist tightly, fold in half and allow it to twist itself holding the 2 ends. Knot one end and sew to bag as illustrated. Double the remainder, and then wind off 6 strands of 24 inches and knot over cord to form tassel. Cut loops at bottom of tassel.

Line if desired and sew snaps at each end.

## POM-POM HANDBAG — No. 2103

Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“GEM” COTTON YARN.

3 Skeins Red.                      1 Skein Black.                      2 Snaps.

Bone Crochet Hook Number 4 or 5.

**Front Section.** With Red, ch 39 and work 38 s c on ch, ch 1, turn and work 14 rows even.

**16th Row.** Decrease 1 st both ends and work 2 rows even. Repeat the last 3 rows 3 times, break yarn.

**Back Section.** Ch 31 and work 30 s c on ch, ch 1, turn and work 1 row even.

**3rd Row.** Increase 1 st both ends and work 2 rows even. Repeat last 3 rows 3 times, then work 30 rows even. Repeat from 16th row of 1st section.

**Gusset.** Ch 3, and work 2 s c on ch, ch 1, turn and work even until gusset measures 24 inches. Sew gusset in position.

**Pom-Poms.** Wind 20 strands of Black around a 2-inch cardboard, cut both ends and tie in center, clip ends and fasten to bag.

Line with any suitable material if desired. Sew snaps at each end.

## CROCHETED GLOVES—No. 2104

Materials Required—AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
"SILLATEEN SANSIL."

8 Balls Seasonal Colors.

5 Yards "Star" Six Strand Embroidery Cotton, any Color  
desired for Trim

Steel Crochet Hook Number 6 or 7.

Left Glove. Do not work glove too tightly.

Ch 98, join, being careful not to twist the ch, ch 2, skip 1 ch, 1 s c in next ch, \* ch 1, skip 1 ch, s c in next ch, repeat from \* all around, ch 1 and without joining rows, s c in the 2 ch loop, \* ch 1, s c in next 1 ch mesh, repeat from \* all around and repeat the last row 34 times.

Next Row. Decrease every 5th mesh and work 10 rows even.

Next Row. Decrease every 6th mesh (34 meshes left) and work 16 rows even.

## KNITTED GLOVE WITH CROCHETED CUFF

No. 2105

Medium Size

Materials Required—AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
"STAR" PEARL COTTON Size 5.

3 Medium Balls of Main Color and 1 Ball of any Contrasting  
Color for stripes.

1 Set of Double Pointed Steel Knitting Needles Number 15.

1 Crochet Hook Number 8 or 9.

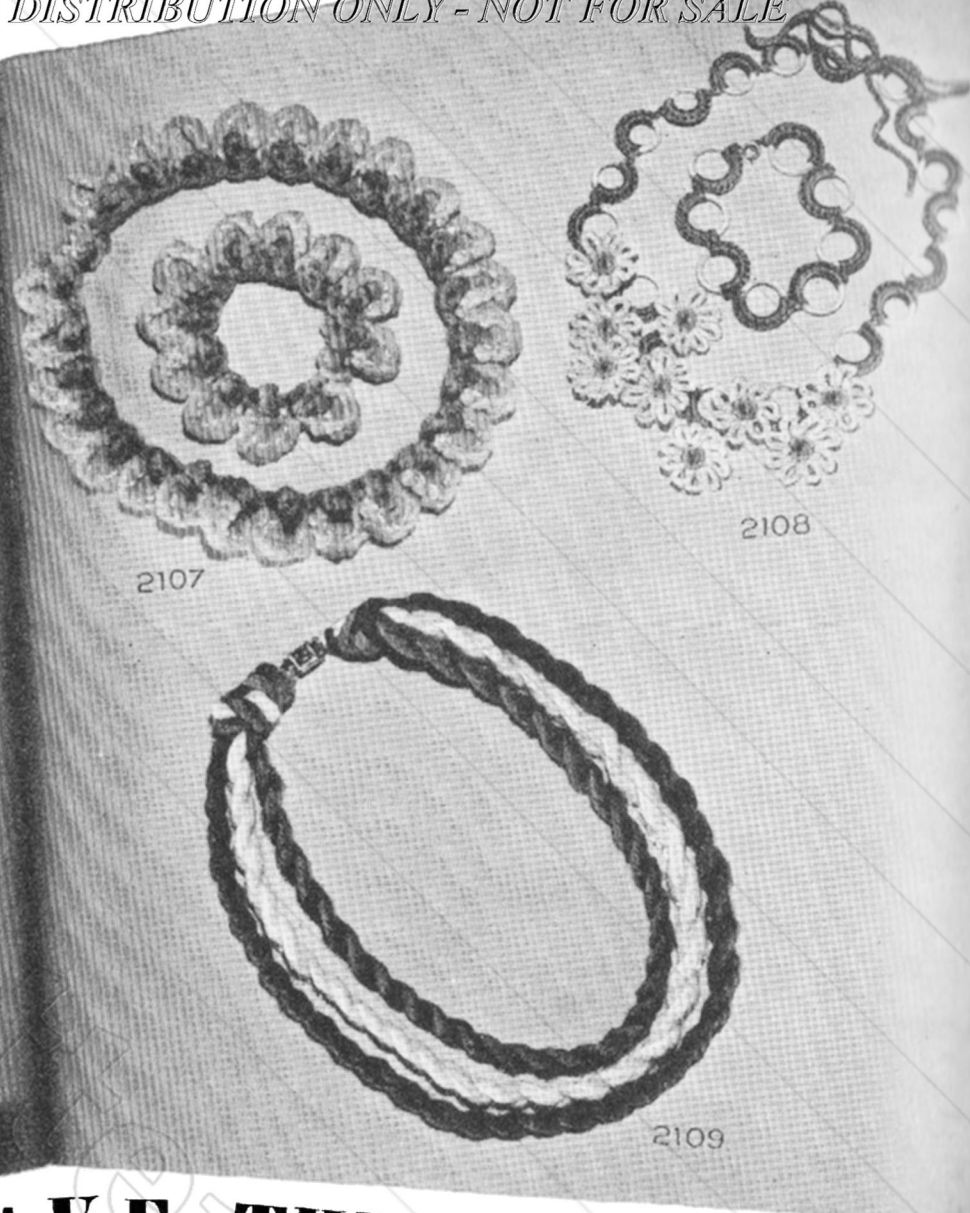
Right Glove. On 3 needles cast on 50 sts (14-18-18) and K 10 rounds.

Next round begins the thumb. K 1, increase in next st by working into front and back of st, K 1, increase in next st, K to end of round and K 2 rounds even.

4th Round. K 1, increase in next st, K 3, increase in next st and K even to end of round, K 2 rounds even.

## RING NECKLACE, BRACELET AND BELT No. 2106

Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“GEM” COTTON YARN.

If 2 or 3 Colors are used, 1 Skein of each Color will make the entire set. The set illustrated was made in Yellow, Blue and Red.

**Necklace and Bracelet.** Ch 8, join to form a ring, ch 1 and work 12 s c over ring.

**2nd Ring.** With another color, ch 8, slip the end of ch through 1st ring, join and work 12 s c over ring. Repeat 2nd ring for desired length. Finish bracelet and necklace with clasps or crochet a ch at each end for tying.

**Belt Rings.** Ch 12, join and work 18 s c over ring. Work as many rings as required in any two Colors desired.

**Weaving Band.** With a third Color or one of the Colors used, make a ch about 40 inches long and work a row of s c on ch.

**Weave in Rings as Follows.** Place 2nd ring under 1st ring and weave band through 1st ring and under second then over upper half of 1st ring and under 3rd ring. Continue in same manner always placing next ring under the last ring. Leave about 6 inches of band for tying.

## SHELL NECKLACE AND BRACELET — No. 2107

Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“GEM” COTTON YARN.

26 Yards Peach or any Color desired.

11 Yards Green.

Bone Crochet Hook Number 4 or 5.

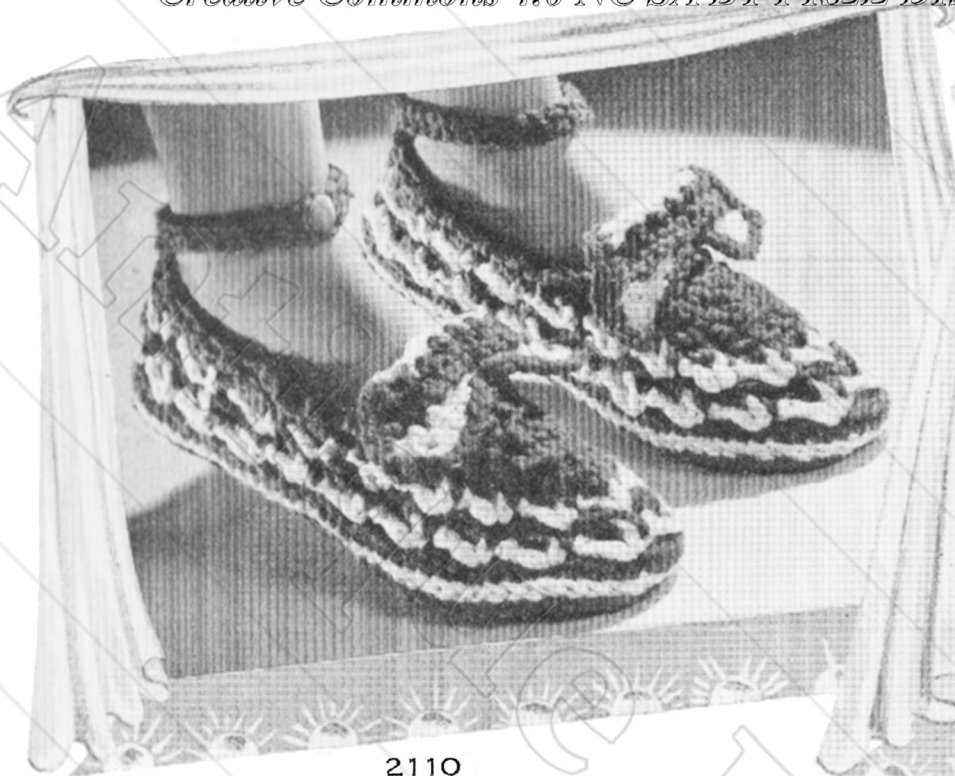
Leaving 8 inches of yarn free, \* ch 6, slip st to 5th st from hook for ring, (shell) ch 3, 1 d c, 1 s d c, 1 s c, 1 sl st in ring, repeat from \* 25 times for necklace about 18 inches long. Ch 1 after last shell. Break yarn leaving about an 8 inch length. Attach Green in last s c leaving an 8 inch length free. \* Yarn over needle 3 times, insert needle in loop of s c above shell, yarn over, pull through, yarn over, pull through, 2 loops, yarn over, through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through all loops on needle. Slip st in s c between shells, repeat from \* across shells. Chain the Green and Peach ends together for ties.

## DAISY NECKLACE AND BRACELET — No. 2108

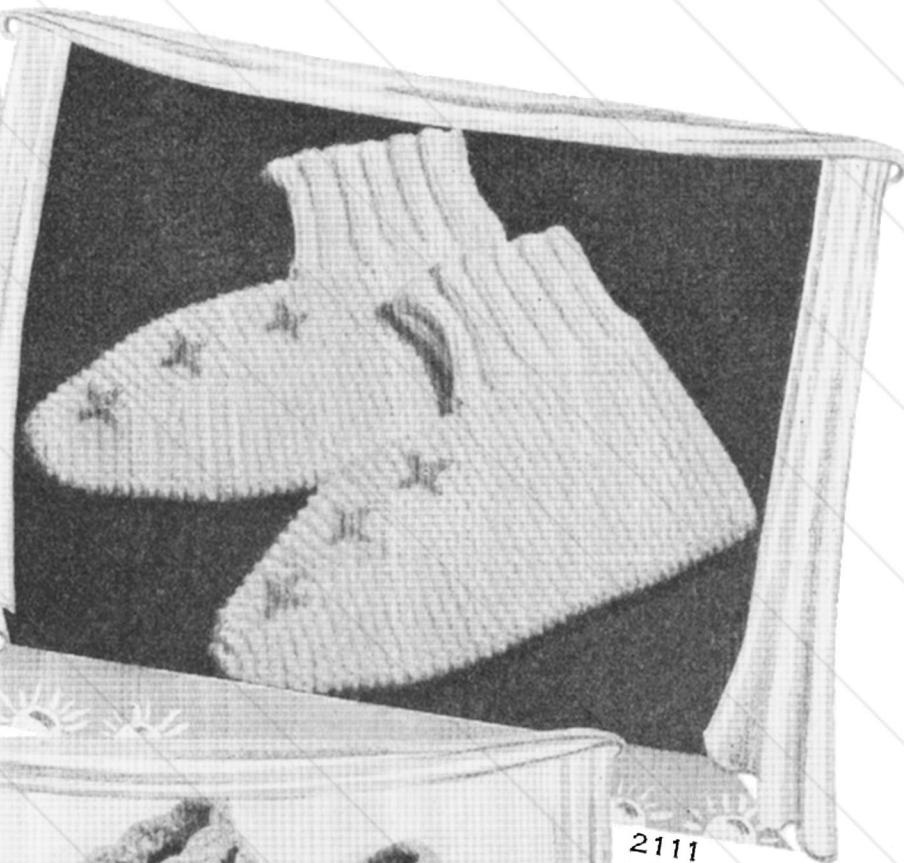
Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY

## SLIPPERS — No. 2110

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "GEM" COTTON YARN.**

1 Skein each of any 2 Colors desired.

**Bone Crochet Hook Number 5 or 6.**

Directions are given for a medium size (sizes 5-6-7). Small size (sizes 3-4) and large size (sizes 9-10) are given in parenthesis.

**Soles.** For both slippers. With Dark Color ch 24 (20-28) and work 2 s d c in 2nd st from hook, (s d c, yarn over, insert in st and work off all loops at one time) 2 s d c in next st, 1 s d c in each of the next 19 sts. (15-23) sts, 2 s d c in next st, 3 s d c in last st. Working on other side of ch 24 (20-28) work 2 s d c in next st, 1 s d c in each of the next 19 sts (15-23) 2 s d c in next st, 1 s d c in same space with 1st 2 sts, join with a sl st.

**2nd Row.** Ch 2, s d c in same space, 2 s d c in each of the next 2 s d c, 1 s d c in each of the next 21 sts (17-25) 2 s d c in each of the next 7 sts, 1 s d c in each of the next 20 sts (16-24) 2 s d c in each remaining st, join.

**3rd Row.** Ch 2, d c in same space, 2 d c in each of the next 3 sts, 1 d c in each of the next 11 sts (9-13) 1 s c in each of the next 15 sts (13-17) 2 s c in each of the

next 5 sts, 1 s c in each of the next 15 sts (13-17) 1 d c in each of the next 11 sts (9-13), 2 d c in each remaining st, break yarn. The d c section is the toe of slipper.

**Next Row.** Start upper section of slipper. With wrong side of work toward you, join Light Color in st under the loops and work one row of s c taking up the entire st under the loops, break yarn.

**2nd Row.** With right side of work toward you, attach Dark Color in back loop of st, and work one row of s c all around taking up back loop of st only, join and break yarn.

**3rd Row.** Attach Light Color, \* ch 2, 1 d c in same space, skip 2 sts, s c in next st, repeat from \* all around.

**4th Row.** Attach Dark Color, work \* 1 s d c in s c between shells and 1 s c over ch 2 of shell, repeat from \* all around.

**5th Row.** With Light Color, same as 3rd row.

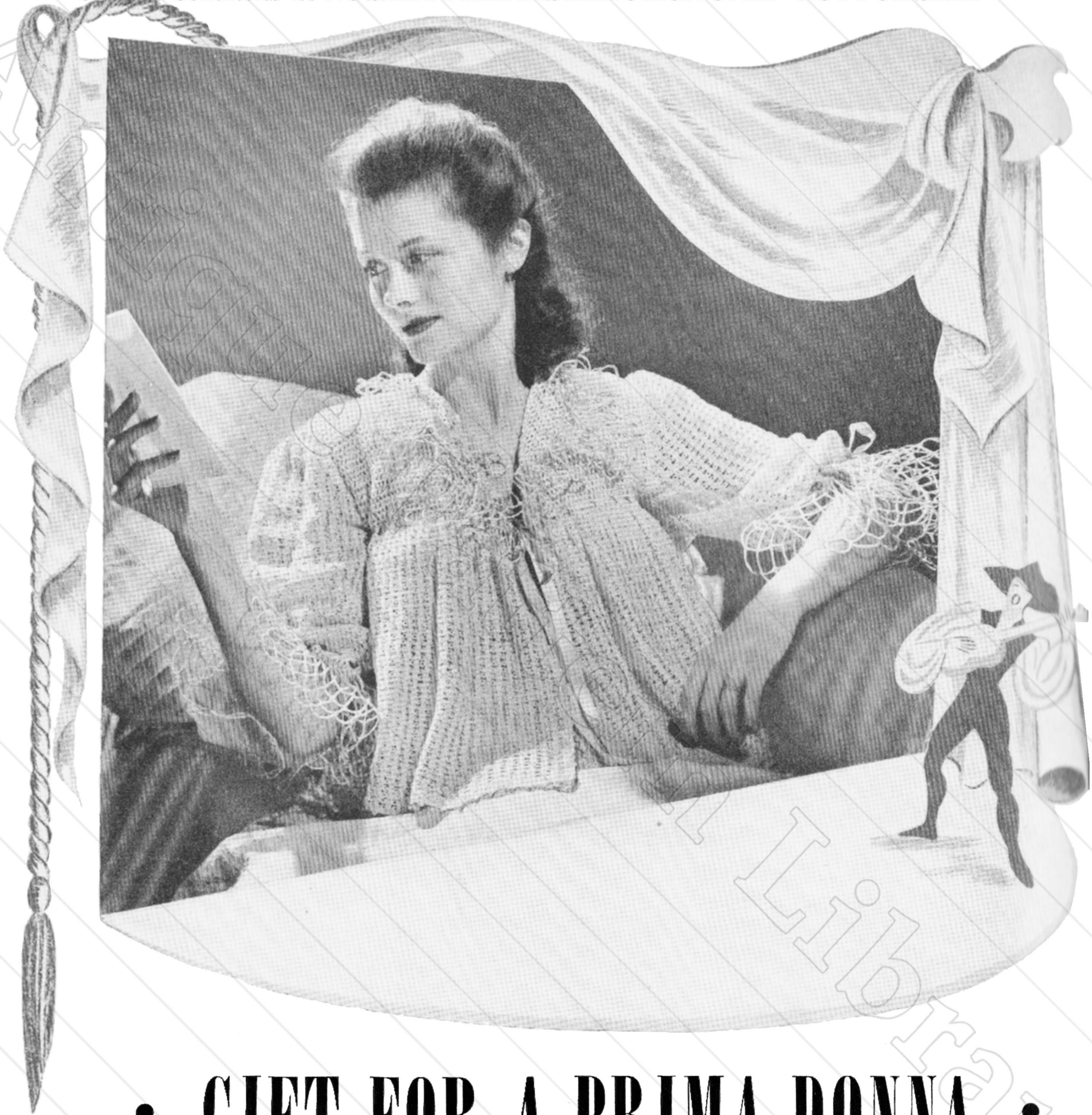
**6th Row.** With Dark Color. Work \* 1 s d c in s c between shells, ch 1, s c over ch 2 of shell, repeat from \* all around, at center of toe omit the ch 1 over 4 shells.

**7th Row.** Without breaking yarn work 1 s c and ch 1 between each s c and d c, omitting the ch over 6 center toe sts.

**Vamp.** With Dark Color, ch 8, s c in second st from hook \* ch 1, skip one st, s c in next st, repeat from \*

**BED JACKET — No. 2113**

Size 14 — 16

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“DE LUXE” MERCERIZED CROCHET COTTON.**

8 Balls White or Colors.

3 Yards Ribbon.

Steel Crochet Hook Number 7.

**Yoke.** Ch 154, d c in 4th st from hook, \* ch 1, skip 1 st, d c in next st, repeat from \* to end of ch.

**2nd Row.** Sl st across 4 meshes, ch 4, d c in next mesh. \* ch 1, d c in next mesh, repeat from \* to within 4 meshes of end of row, ch 4, turn, (ch 4 at the beginning of each mesh row).

**3rd to 27th Rows.** Work 1 mesh in each mesh.

**28th Row.** Work 24 meshes, ch 40, turn, d c in 4th st from hook, \* ch 1, skip 1 st, d c in next st, repeat from \* to end of ch and work a mesh in each mesh, this begins the right front yoke.

**30th to 53rd Rows.** Work even meshes.

**54th Row.** Ch 12, turn, d c in 4th st from hook, work

# CARDIGANS PLAY A LEADING ROLE

CABLE STITCH CARDIGAN — No. 2114

Size 14

Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“GEM” COTTON YARN.

10 Skeins White or Colors.

1 Pair Bone Knitting Needles Number 6.

Gauge—4 sts = 1 inch. 5 Rows = 1 inch.

Length of side seam 12 inches.

Width between shoulders 13 inches.

Length of sleeve at underarm 5 inches.

Pattern:

1st Row. \* P 2, K 6, P 2, K 1, repeat from \* ending with P 2.

2nd Row. \* K 2, P 6, K 2, P 1, repeat from \* ending with K 2.

Repeat 1st and 2nd rows.

5th Row. This is the first cable row, then work a cable row after every 9 rows beginning with the 2nd row.

Cable Row. \* P 2, slip the next 2 sts on a double pointed needle, hold in back of work, K the next 2 sts, bring the 2 sts on double pointed needle in front of

# UTILITY BAGS RECEIVE A ROUND OF APPLAUSE



## KNITTING BAG — No. 2115

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“GEM” COTTON YARN.**

5 Skeins National Blue.

1 Skein Orange.

Bone Crochet Hook Number 4 or 5.

Small wooden button mold.

Cut two 5 inch circles from cardboard.

**Circle.** Ch 3, 7 s c in 1st st of ch, join each row.

**2nd Row.** Ch 1, 1 s c in same space, 2 s c in each remaining s c.

**3rd and 4th Rows.** Ch 1, 1 s c in same space. \* 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from \* all around and work 2 rows even.

**7th and 8th Rows.** Ch 1, s c in same space, s c in next s c \* 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in each of the next 2 s c, repeat from \* all around. Work 3 more circles. Place cardboard between 2 sections and sew together. Sew other 2 sections over cardboard.

With Blue. Ch 61 and work 60 s c on ch.

**2nd Row.** Start to carry Orange underneath for rest of bag. When two colors are used carry the second color under the sts for entire row, drawing up the yarn being

carried to insure its not looping on wrong side. In changing color pick up the 2nd color when completing the last st of 1st color. Work 10 sts in Blue, 4 sts Orange, 32 sts Blue, 4 sts Orange, 10 sts Blue, ch 1, turn. Repeat this row twice.

**5th Row.** Work 6 sts Blue, 4 sts Orange, 4 sts Blue, 4 sts Orange, 24 sts Blue, 4 sts Orange, 4 sts Blue, 4 sts Orange, 6 sts Blue. Repeat this row twice. Then repeat from beginning until work measures 17½ inches.

Decrease 1 st each end of bag for next 11 rows, break yarn. Starting at side of bag work a row of s c around shaped part, then work 18 s c, ch 9, skip 2 s c, s c in next s c and work other side to correspond.

**Button.** With Orange, ch 3, 7 s c in 1st st of ch, join.

**2nd Row.** Ch 1, s c in same space, 2 s c in each of the next 2 s c, join.

**3rd Row.** Ch 1, 1 s c in each s c, join. Insert wooden button mold and \* skip 1 s c, 1 s c in next s c, repeat from \* all around. Leave an end to sew to bag.

Pin circles in position, sew all around and sew button in center of 12th row.

**Shoulder Cords.** Ch 5 and work 1 s c in each ch.

**Next Row.** 1 s c in each s c. Without joining rows, repeat last row until cord measures 41 inches. Work another cord slightly longer allowing for knot. Sew cords in position as illustrated.

**INITIAL KNITTING BAG — No. 2116**

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“GEM” COTTON YARN.**

**6 Skeins Light Henna or any Color desired.**

**Bone Crochet Hook Number 4 or 5.**

**Front.** Ch 45 and work 44 s c on ch, ch 1, turn and work 23 more rows of s c.

**25th Row.** Decrease 1 st at both ends and work 1 row even. Repeat the last 2 rows 7 times, break yarn and work a second section.

**Gusset.** Ch 4 and work 3 s c on ch, ch 1, turn. Work 8 more rows of s c even.

**Next Row.** \* Increase 1 st and work 8 rows even. Repeat from \* twice.

**Next Row.** Increase 1 st and work 30 rows even. Next row. Decrease 1 st, then decrease 1 st every 9th row 3 times.

**Tufting.** Cut strands 2 inches long, take 24 strands for each tuft and tie about 1 inch apart around edges of both sides of bag.

**Initial.** Outline with a basting thread the letter desired. Cut strands 1½ inches long, take 24 strands for each tuft and place about ½ inch apart.

**Shoulder Cord.** Ch 5, 1 s c in each ch. Next row. 1 s c in each s c. Without joining rows, repeat this row until cord measures 35 inches or is length desired.

**Sew gusset in position.** Sew shoulder cord to each side at gusset. Make ten 5 ch loops leaving an end to sew to bag for drawstring. Sew loops starting in second row about 3 inches apart.

**Drawstring.** Make a ch about 26 inches long, lace through loops and finish with a knot at each end.

**SHOPPING BAG — No. 2117**

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“GEM” COTTON YARN.**

**3 Skeins Beige.**

**2 Skeins Black.**

**2 Snaps.**

**Bone Crochet Hook Number 4 or 5.**

With Black ch 26, work 25 s c on ch, ch 1, turn. Work 3 rows even taking up the back loop of st only.

**Next 2 Rows.** Decrease 1 st both ends and work 1 row even. Repeat the last 2 rows.

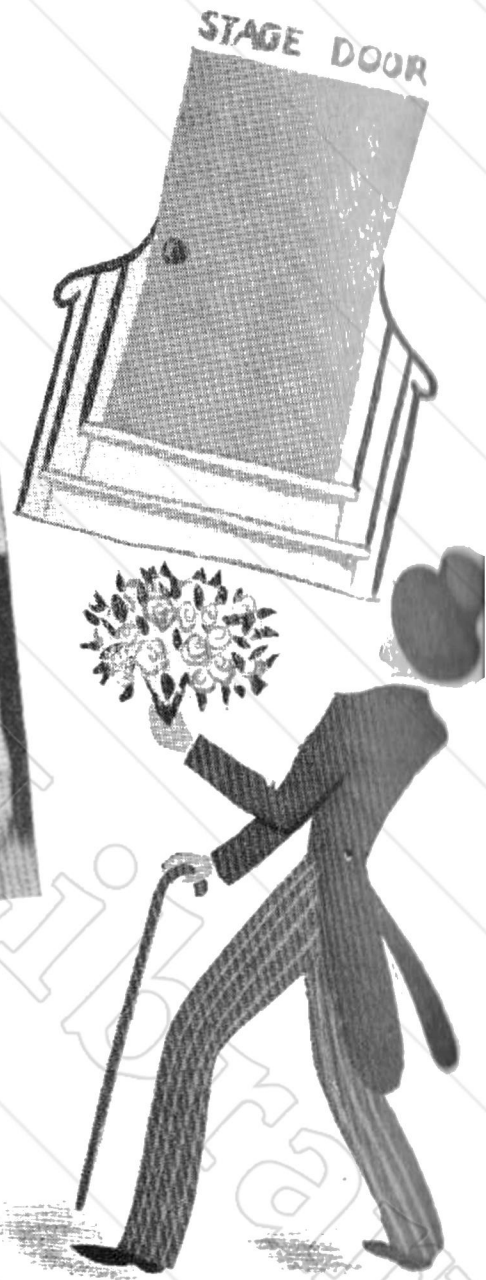
**Next 4 Rows.** Decrease 1 st both ends, break yarn. Work a row of s c around 3 sides working 3 s c in each corner.

Attach Beige in 1st s c and work in knot st, (knot st, \* pull up a ¾ inch loop on hook, s c over the single loop, repeat from \*) in each of the next 11 s c, \* skip 1 s c, knot st in the next s c, repeat from \* 8 times, and then work 1 knot st in each remaining s c. Work a 3 loop knot st to turn each row.

**Next Row.** \* S c in center s c of knot st in previous row, knot st and repeat from \* across row. Work 2 more rows in Beige, 2 in Black, 5 in Beige and 2 rows in Black. Work a 2nd piece to correspond. Join the two sections together in last row as follows, work a knot st, turn, s c in center s c of first section, \* work 1 loop knot st, s c in center s c of 2nd section, work 1 loop knot st, s c in center s c of 1st section, repeat from \* across row.

**Pockets.** With Beige, ch 14, and work 13 s c on ch, ch 1, turn and continue in s c. *Continued on page 27*





## A DRESS UP TOUCH FOR AN ADMIRING AUDIENCE

### IRISH CROCHET JABOT — No. 2118

Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“STAR” or “GEM” MERCERIZED CROCHET COTTON.

1 Large Ball Size 30 White.

Steel Crochet Hook Number 12 or 13.

Ch 108, d c in 5th st from hook, \* ch 1, skip 1 st, d c in next st, repeat from \* across ch, ch 3, turn.

2nd Row. Work 1 d c in each d c and 1 d c in each ch, ch 4, turn and work 1 more row of 1 ch meshes, ch 8, turn.

4th Row. S c in 1st mesh, \* ch 7, s c in next mesh,

ch 7, s c in same mesh, repeat from \* to corner mesh, in corner mesh work 7 loops, work 4 loops over end d c, 7 loops in next corner and work other side to correspond, ch 8, turn and work 14 more rows of 7 ch loops, ch 8, turn.

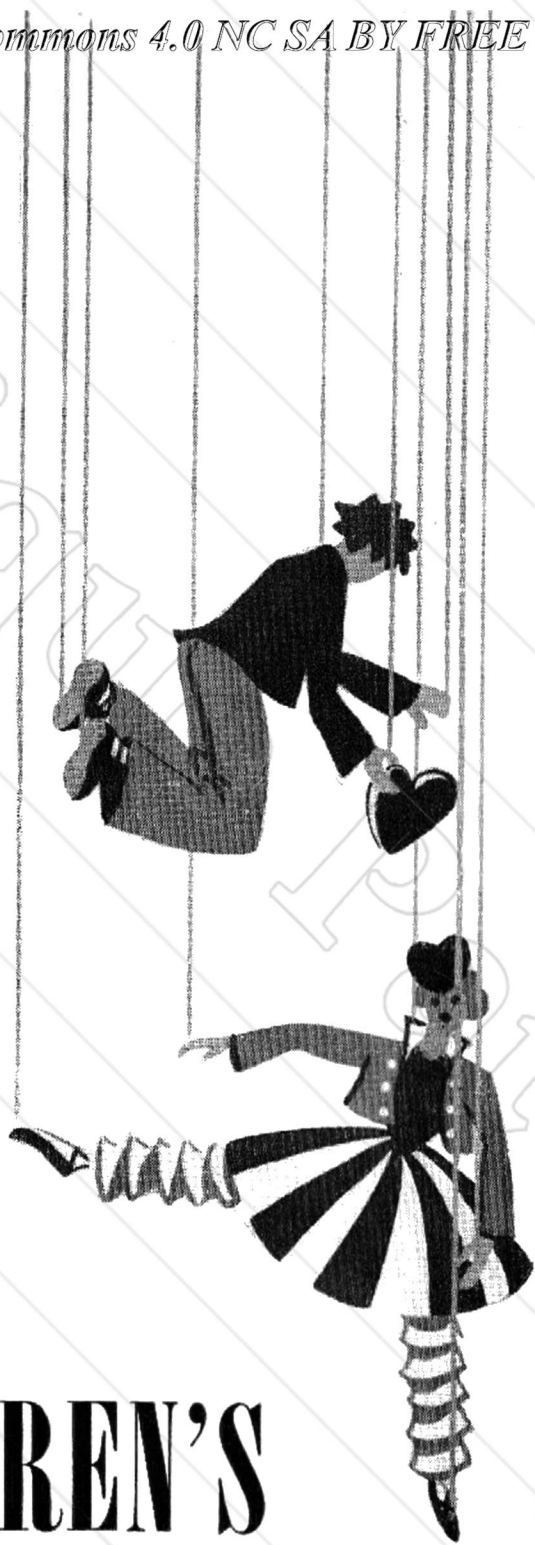
19th Row. S c in 1st loop, \* ch 4, in next loop work 2 d c, 1 ch picot, and 2 d c, ch 4, s c in next loop, ch 7, s c in next loop, repeat from \* across row, ch 8, turn.

20th Row. Work a shell in each 7 ch loop and work a 7 ch loop over each shell. Repeat last row twice.

Starch with a thin starch if desired and iron while still damp.

## CARDIGAN — No. 2119

Size 3 — 4

Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" SHETLAND TYPE FLOSS.

5 Balls White or Colors.

1 Pair Bone Knitting Needles Number 2.

1 Pair Bone Knitting Needles Number 4.

6 Buttons.

Measurements—Width Across Back 11 inches.

Length from Neck to Lower Edge 14 inches.

Length of Sleeve 9½ inches.

Gauge—8 sts = 1 inch. 10 rows = 1 inch.

Pattern. A multiple of 12 + 8 and on the fronts + 5 for garter st border.

1st Row. \* P 2, K 1, P 2, K 1, P 2, K 4, repeat from \* ending with P 2, K 1, P 2, K 1, P 2.

2nd Row. \* K 2, P 1, K 2, P 1, K 2, P 4, repeat from \* ending with K 2, P 1, K 2, P 1, K 2.

3rd and 4th Rows. Same as 1st and 2nd rows.

5th Row. \* P 2, K 1, P 2, K 1, P 2, slip the next 2 sts on a double pointed needle and hold in back of work. K the next 2 sts then K the 2 sts on separate needle (this is a cable). Repeat from \* ending row with P 2, K 1, P 2, K 1, P 2. Repeat from the 2nd row.

In decreasing and increasing be careful to keep the pattern straight.

Back. On fine needles cast on 92 sts and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1½ inches. Change to large needles and work in pattern for 8½ inches. Place a marker for the beginning of armhole and continue in pattern until work measures 14 inches from the beginning.

Next Row. Work across 28 sts, bind off the next 36 sts

## BABES IN TOYLAND

### CROCHETED PENGUIN — No. 2122

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“GEM” COTTON YARN.**

**4 Skeins Black.**

**3 Skeins White.**

**2 Bone rings for eyes.**

**Bone Crochet Hook Number 4 or 5.**

**Kapok or Cotton for filling.**

Work body and head of Penguin firmly taking up back loop of st only.

**Tail. 1st Row.** With Black ch 4. 3 s c on ch, ch 1, turn.

**2nd to 6th Rows.** 2 s c in first and last s c, 1 s c in each remaining s c.

**7th and 8th Rows.** 1 s c in each s c.

**9th to 17th Rows.** Same as 2nd row (31 s c).

**18th to 24th Rows.** Working on the 31 sts, start each row with ch 2, and end each row with a d c, work remainder of row in s c.

**25th to 26th Rows.** Same as 2nd row.

**27th to 28th Rows.** 1 s c in each s c.

**29th, 30th, 33rd, 34th, 37th, 38th Rows.** Increase 1 s c at the beginning and end of each row.

**31st, 32nd, 35th, 36th, 39th, 40th Rows.** 1 s c in each s c (there should now be 47 s c).

**41st to 55th Rows.** 1 s c in each s c.

**56th Row.** 1 s c in each of the first 7 s c, then decrease by crocheting the 8th and 9th s c together. Decrease at opposite side in 8th and 9th s c from end and 1 s c in each of the last 7 s c.

**57th Row.** 1 s c in each s c.



**Next 12 Rows.** Repeat 56th and 57th rows alternately (33 s c).

Without breaking yarn start head, work back over 15 s c, ch 1, turn.

**2nd and 3rd Rows.** Decrease 1 st at beginning of each row.

**4th and 5th Rows.** 1 s c in each s c.

**6th and 7th Rows.** Increase 1 st at beginning of each row.

**8th Row.** Same as 4th row.

**9th Row.** Same as 6th row.

**10th Row.** 1 s c in each s c then chain 12 for bill.

**11th Row.** 11 s c on ch, and 1 s c in each s c.

**12th Row.** Increase 1 st at beginning of row and omit the last 5 s c.

**13th Row.** Decrease 1 st at beginning of row and work 1 row even.

**15th and 16th Rows.** Increase 1 st at beginning of each row.

**17th, 18th, 19th, 20th Rows.** Decrease 1 st at beginning and end of each row. Break yarn.

Join yarn at 4th st from center at opposite side, leaving 3 center sts free, 1 s c in each of the next 15 s c.

**2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th Rows.** Work same as first half of head.

**9th Row.** Increase 1 s c at end of row, then ch 12 for bill.

**10th Row.** 11 s c on ch, and 1 s c in each s c.

**11th Row.** Increase 1 s c at beginning of row and work 1 s c in each s c, omitting last 5 s c.

**12th Row.** Decrease 1 st at beginning of row and work 1 s c in each s c.

**13th and 14th Rows.** 1 s c in each s c.

**15th and 16th Rows.** Increase 1 st at beginning of each row.

**17th, 18th, 19th, 20th Rows.** Decrease 1 st at beginning and end of each row, break yarn.

Join yarn between the two head pieces and work over the 3 free s c. Work 11 rows even.

**12th Row.** Increase 1 st at beginning and end of row and work 10 more rows even.

**23rd Row.** Increase 1 st at beginning and end of row and work 8 rows even, then decrease 1 st at beginning of each row until 2 sts remain. Work 12 more rows even, break yarn.

**Front.** With White starting at lower edge, ch 37, 36 s c on ch. Work 30 more rows even taking up back loop of st only.

**Next 9 Rows.** Decrease 1 st at beginning of each row (27 s c).

**41st, 42nd, 45th, 46th, 49th, 50th Rows.** 1 s c in each s c.

**43rd, 44th, 47th, 48th, 51st, 52nd Rows.** Decrease 1 st at beginning of each row.

**53rd to 70th Rows.** Decrease 1 st at beginning of each row or until 3 sts remain, then work 3 or 4 rows on the 3 sts, break yarn.

**Wings.** With White ch 9, 8 s c on ch, work 15 rows or until work measures about 7 inches. Make 2 White and 2 Black sections. Crochet them together with Black. Work a second row of s c all around wing decreasing at lower edge to shape. Across top of wing decrease until 3 sts remain.

**Feet.** Ch 6, 5 s c on ch and work 1 more row even.

**3rd and 4th Rows.** Increase 1 st in first and last s c.

**5th and 6th Rows.** Increase 1 st in first st.

**7th and 8th Rows.** Decrease 1 st at beginning of row. Work 2 feet White and 2 in Black. Crochet the 2 sections together with Black filling them slightly if desired. Lower circle section, work in s c taking up both loops.

Ch 2, 6 s c in first ch, join.

**2nd, 3rd, 4th Rows.** 2 s c in every other s c.

**5th, 6th, 7th, 8th Rows.** 2 s c in every 3rd s c. Work 3 rows even then work 29 s c, ch 1, turn. Work back over the 29 s c, work 2 more rows even.

**Next 9 Rows.** Decrease 1 st at beginning and end of row. Work 2 rows even.

**Next 5 Rows.** Decrease 1 st at beginning and end of row or until 3 sts remain, break yarn.

**To put Penguin together,** sew the two Black head pieces to center head-piece, allowing 3 or 4 rows of center section to extend below bill.

Starting at the 18th row from lower edge of Black, sew in White piece, being careful to match the rows of the body of Penguin, continue sewing White to end of bill.

Fill body. Cut a cardboard slightly smaller than the 11 rows of lower circle, cover it and sew to 2nd row of circle, fit section in and sew it to front of Penguin, sew around back of Penguin in 18th row taking up 1 loop of st only, then with Black crochet White and Black tail sections together. Sew feet in place. Sew wings in position.

**Eyes.** Crochet over the bone rings with White, and sew in place.

**6—2-oz. Skeins Zephyr Wool or 12 Balls Shetland Type Floss.**

**1 Pair each of Number 1 and Number 3 needles.**

**If Shetland Type Floss is used, one size larger Needles will  
be required.**

**Back.** On No. 1 needles cast on 112 sts and work in  
ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 3 inches. Next row increase to  
113 sts. Change to No. 3 needles and start pattern.

**1st Row.** K 3, on next 7 sts P 1, K 1, repeat from be-  
ginning, ending row with K 3.

**2nd Row.** P 3, next 7 sts P 1, K 1, repeat from begin-  
ning, ending row with P 3.

Repeat these 2 rows until back measures 14 inches from  
the beginning.

**Next 2 rows** bind off 6 sts at the beginning of each row  
then decrease 1 st at each end of every other row 8  
times keeping pattern straight.

Work even until armhole measures 10 inches from the  
1st decreasing point.

**Next 6 rows** bind off 8 sts at the beginning of each  
row and bind off remaining sts for back of neck.

**Front.** Work same as back until armhole measures 1 inch  
then divide sts for V neck. Work to center of front, tie  
in another ball of yarn and complete row working both  
sides at the same time and decreasing at armhole sides  
same as back.

**Next Row.** Decrease 1 st at each center edge then de-  
crease 1 st at each center edge every 4th row 17 times,  
or until there are 24 sts on 1 needle and 25 sts on the  
other. Work even until armhole measures 10 inches,  
bind off 8 sts at armhole edges every other row 3 times  
binding off 9 sts on the 1 needle once.

**Back Neck Band.** With No. 1 needles pick up 36 sts  
and K 2, P 2 for 1 inch.

**Front Neck Band.** Pick up 116 sts and K 2, P 2 always  
keeping the center 2 sts at point of V as 2 knit sts,  
decrease 1 st both sides of the center knit sts every  
row for 1 inch.

Sew shoulder seams then with No. 1 needles pick up  
128 sts around armhole and K 2, P 2 for 1 inch.

Work other armhole to correspond. Sew underarm  
seams.

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY**

Cast on 100 sts, K one row.

3rd Row. P 1 st, K 1 st, repeat to end of row. These 2 rows form the seed st pattern and are repeated for 2 inches and on 20 sts on either side of scarf and for 2 inches at end of scarf. The following directions are given for the 60 center sts, the border will not be referred to again.  
1st Row. K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10.  
2nd Row. P 1, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 9.  
3rd Row. K 8, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 2.  
4th Row. P 3, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 7.  
5th Row. K 6, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 4.  
6th Row. P 5, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 5.  
7th Row. K 4, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 6.  
8th Row. P 7, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 3.  
9th Row. K 2, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 8.  
10th Row. P 9, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 10, K 10, P 1.  
Repeat from the 1st row, Purling the Knitted stitches and Knitting the Purl sts, then repeat from beginning until scarf measures 43 inches and work 2 inch seed at border.  
Fringe. 1 s c in first st, draw up a loop on hook to 4 inch length, keep loop on hook, 1 s c in next st, draw up a loop same length, continue across row, always keeping one or two loops on hook to gauge length of next loop. Cut loops the desired length.

7th Round. Start gusset for thumb which is worked in stockinette st. Work 5 sts, increase 1 st in next st and complete round.  
8th, 9th and 10th Rounds. Work even in pattern working the 6th and 7th rounds in stockinette st.  
11th Round. Work 5 sts, increase 1 st in 6th and 7th st, complete round and work 2 rounds even.  
15th Round. Increase in 6th and 9th st and work 3 rounds even.  
19th Round. Increase in 6th and 11th st and work 3 rounds even.  
23rd Round. Increase in 6th and 13th st and work 3 rounds even.  
27th Round. Increase in 6th and 15th st and work 3 rounds even.  
31st Round. Increase in 6th and 17th st and work 3 rounds even.  
35th Round. Work 5 sts, place the next 14 sts on a thread, cast on 11 sts and complete round.  
Work even in pattern for 2 1/2 inches.

**3rd Row.** Ch 4, tr c in same space, ch 3, 2 tr c in same space, \* ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 5, 2 tr c, ch 3, 2 tr c in top of next cluster st, repeat from \* twice, ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 5, join in 4th st of ch.

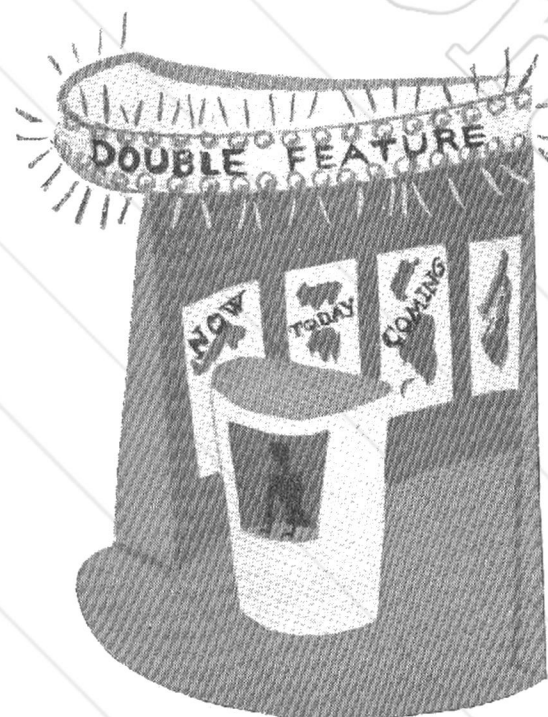
**4th Row.** Ch 1, s c in next tr c, \* 2 s c in corner loop, ch 5, 2 s c in same loop, 1 s c in each of the next 2 tr c, 5 s c in next loop, 3 s c, ch 3, 3 s c in next loop, 5 s c in next loop, 1 s c in each of the next 2 tr c, repeat from \* all around.

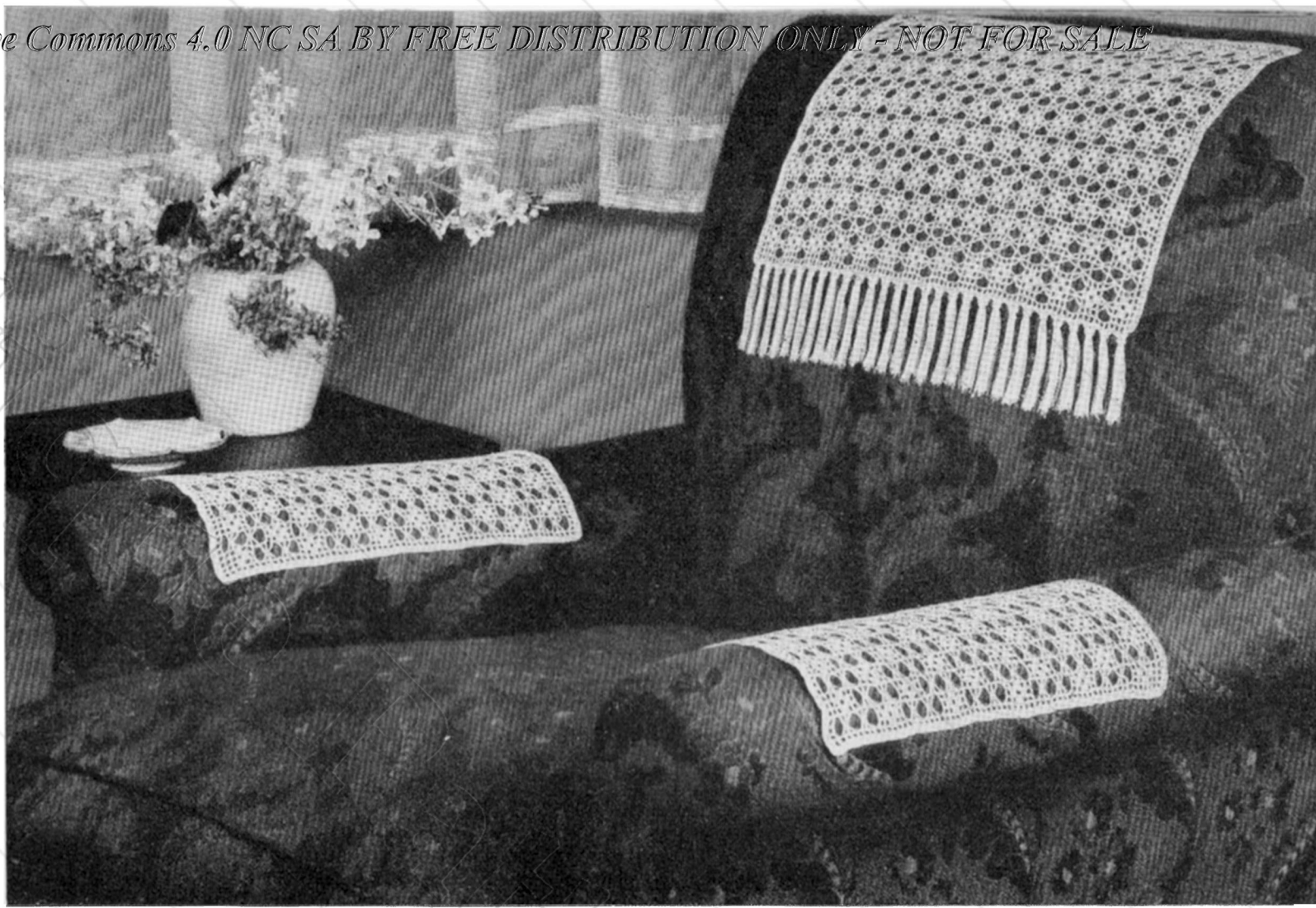

**7th Row.** D c in d c, \* ch 5, s c in center of ch 8 of 5th row, ch 5, d c in d c, ch 8, skip 3 spaces, d c in d c and repeat from \* to end of row, ch 5, turn.

**8th Row.** D c in d c, \* ch 8, d c in d c, repeat from \* to end of row, ch 5, turn.

**9th Row.** D c in d c, \* ch 2, skip 2 ch sts, d c in next ch, work 2 more meshes over 8 ch loop (3 spaces) ch 5,

s c in center ch of the 7th row, ch 5, d c in d c and repeat from \* to end of row, ch 5, turn.

**10th Row.** D c in d c, \* ch 2, d c in next d c, 2 d c over ch, d c in next d c, ch 2, d c in next d c, ch 8, d c in next d c and repeat from \* to end of row, ch 5, turn.

**13th Row.** D c in d c, \* ch 2, d c in next d c, ch 2, skip 2 d c, d c in next d c, ch 2, d c in next d c, ch 8, d c in next d c and repeat from \* to end of row, ch 5, turn.

**14th Row.** Repeat 2nd row working three 2 ch spaces over 8 ch loop.

The second to the 13th row inclusive forms the pattern, repeat pattern three times, finish with one row of spaces same as 1st row.

**Edge.** Across the top and 2 sides, work 3 d c in each space. Lower edge. Work 3 d c, ch 3, 3 d c in first space, \* skip one space, s c in next d c, skip one space, 3 d c, ch 3, 3 d c in next space and repeat from \* across row.

**Fringe.** Wind thread around 3 inch cardboard and cut one end. Take 16 strands and knot over 3 ch loop.

**Arm Rests.** Ch 101 and work same as chair back repeating 2nd to 13th row 5 times (or about 12 inches) and finish all around with a row of d c, working 3 d c in each space.

Work other half to correspond.

The pattern is darned in by working 3 rows through each mesh lengthwise working over 1 d c and under the next and reverse the over and under in the 2nd row. Darn 2 meshes in Rust, 1 mesh Orange, 1 mesh Rust, 2 Yellow, 3 Rust, 2 Orange, 1 Rust, 1 mesh Yellow, 3 meshes Rust (this is the center) complete other half to correspond.

**Plate Mat.** Ch 38, d c in 6th st from hook, ch 1, skip 1 st, d c in next st and repeat from \* across row ch 4, turn (17 meshes).

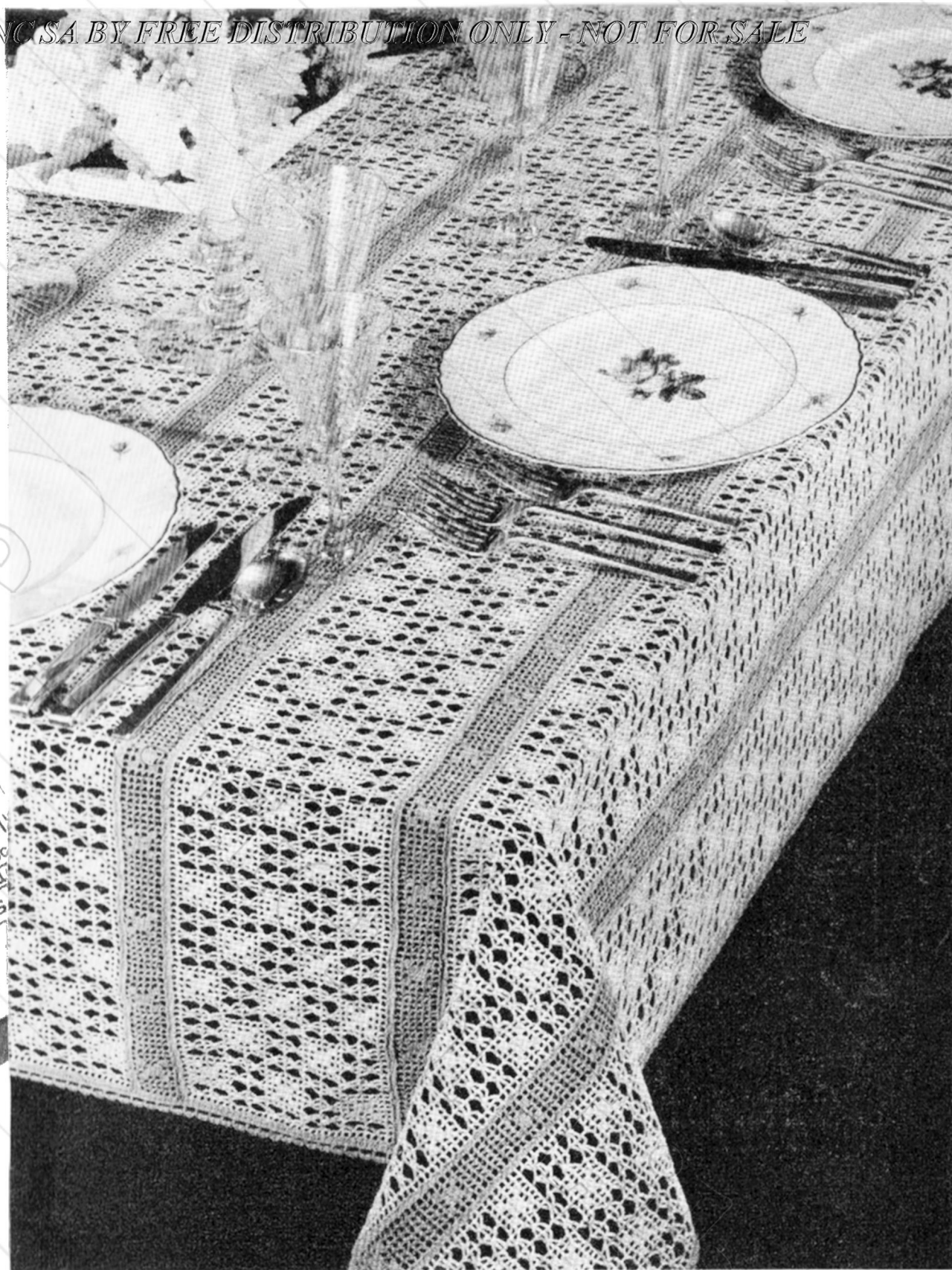

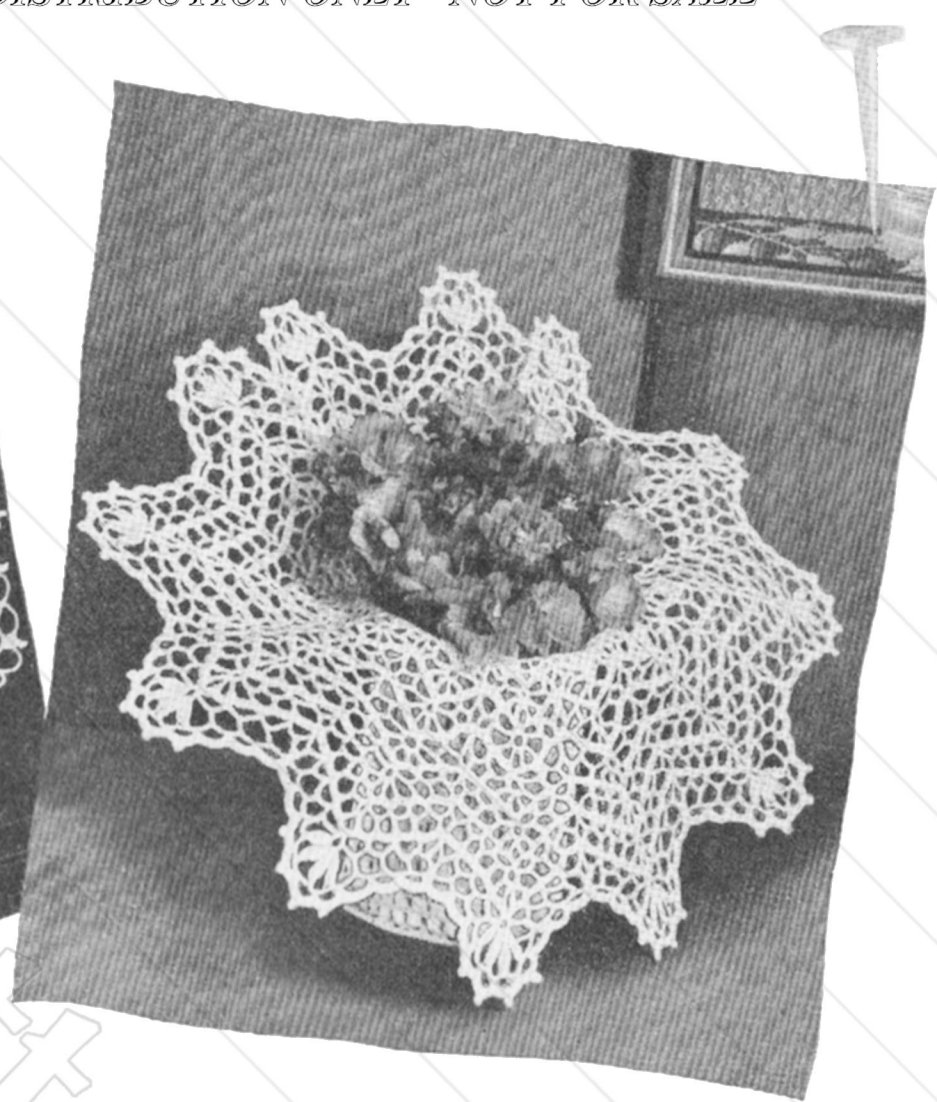
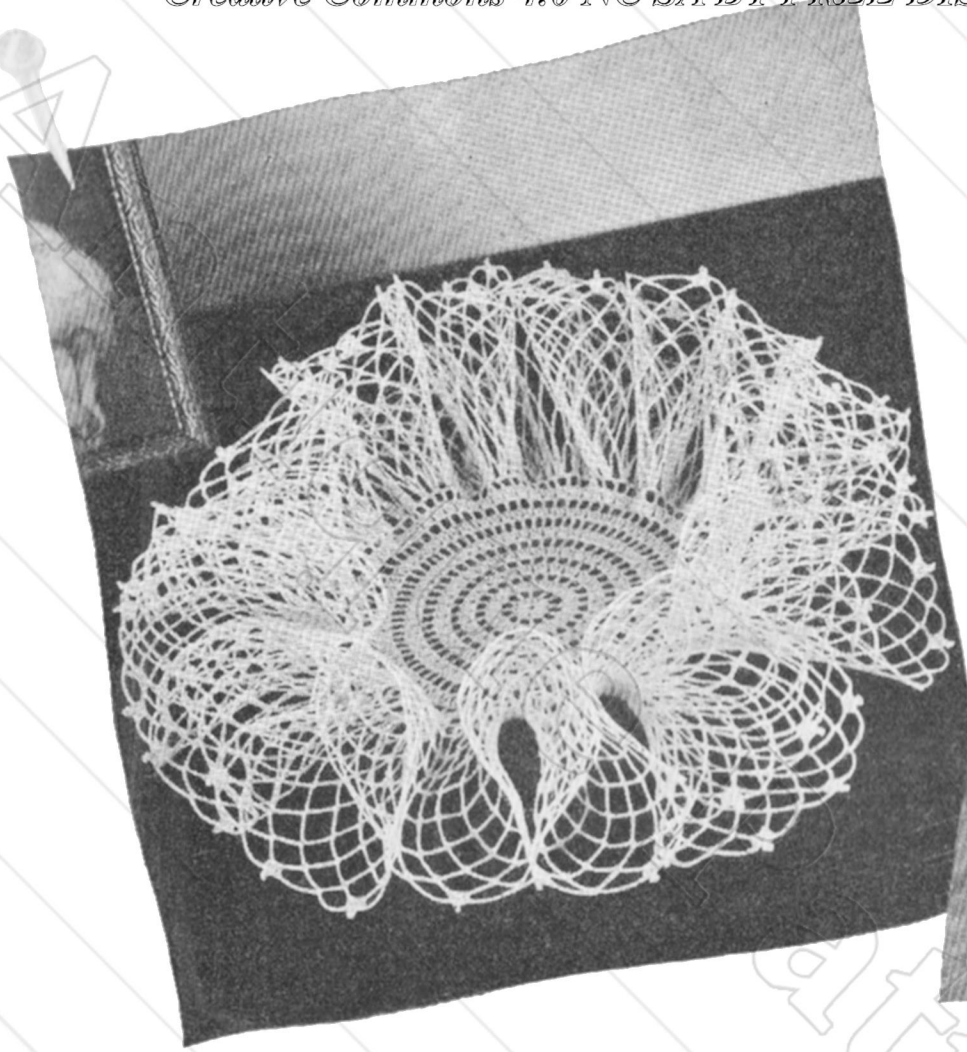

**2nd Row.** Ch 6, \* d c in next d c, ch 3, repeat from \* all around, join.  
**3rd Row.** Ch 3, 3 d c in mesh, \* d c in d c, 3 d c in mesh, repeat from \* all around, join.  
**4th Row.** Ch 5, skip 1 d c, \* d c in next d c, ch 2, skip 1 d c, d c in next d c, ch 2, repeat from \* all around, join.  
**5th Row.** Sl st to mesh, ch 3, 2 d c in same mesh, \* 3 d c in next mesh, repeat from \* all around, join.  
**6th Row.** Ch 5, skip 1 d c, \* d c in next d c, ch 2, skip 1 d c, d c in next d c, ch 2, repeat from \* all around, join. Repeat the 5th and 6th rows twice.  
**11th Row.** Same as 5th, but having 2 d c in each mesh.  
**12th Row.** Repeat 6th row.  
**13th and 14th Rows.** Repeat 5th and 6th rows.  
**15th Row.** Ch 10, s c in mesh, ch 10, s c in same mesh, \* ch 10, s c in next mesh, ch 10, s c in same mesh, repeat from \* all around. Work 6 more rows of 10 ch loops.  
**Edging.** \* Ch 8, 2 d c in next loop, ch 4, sl st in top of d c for picot, 2 d c in same loop, ch 8, s c in next loop, repeat from \* all around. Starch slightly and iron while still damp.

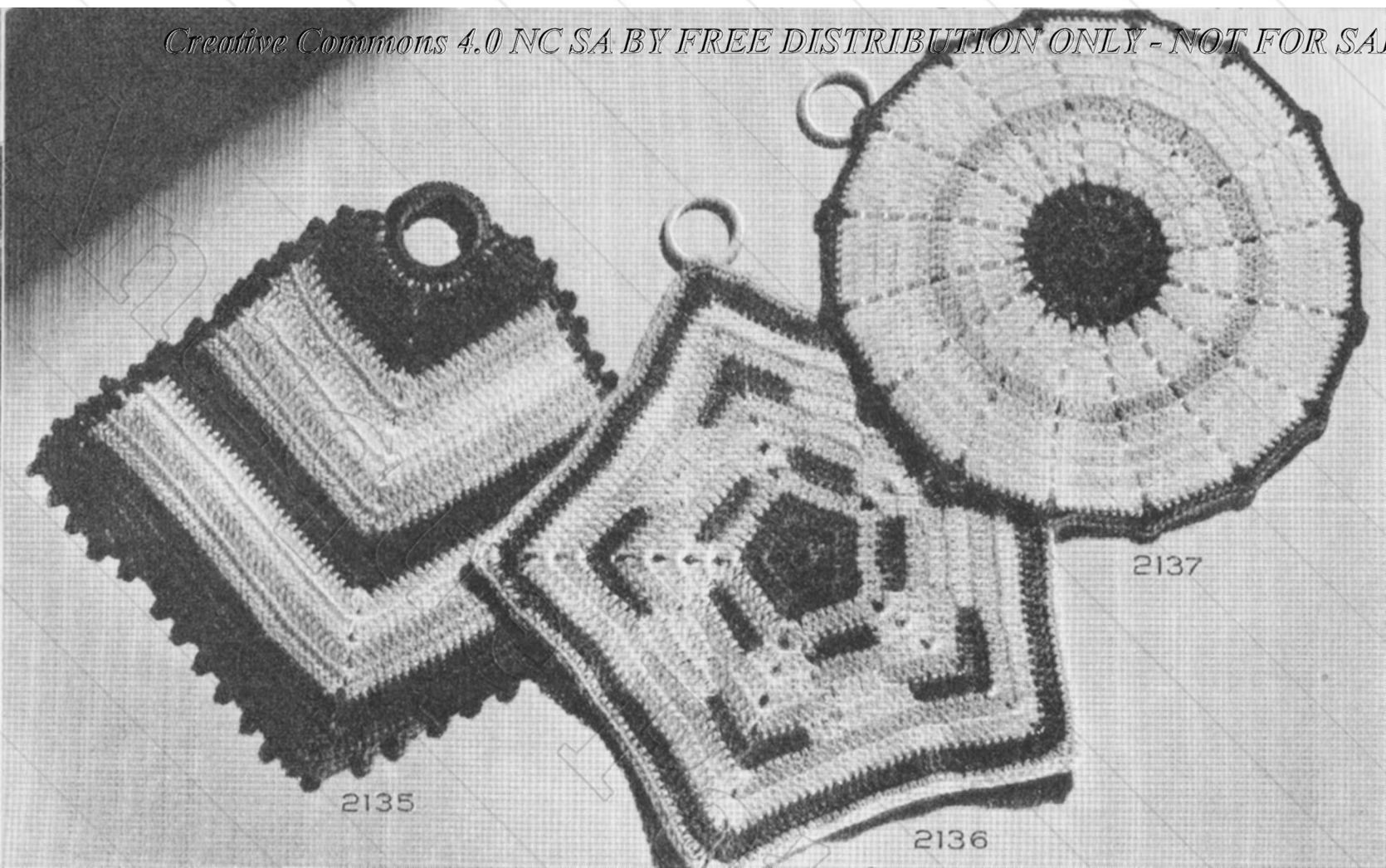

**1 Large Ball White. Steel Crochet Hook Number 11.**

Ch 7, join to form a ring and work 12 s c into ring.  
**2nd Row.** Ch 5, d c in next s c, \* ch 2, d c in next s c, repeat from \* all around, ch 2, join in 3rd st of ch 5.  
**3rd Row.** Sl st into mesh, ch 3, 2 d c in same mesh, \* 3 d c in next mesh, repeat from \* all around.  
**4th Row.** Ch 6, skip 1 d c, d c in next d c, \* ch 3, skip 1 d c, d c in next d c, repeat from \* all around, ch 3, join in 3rd st of ch 6.  
**5th Row.** 4 d c in each mesh, join.  
**6th Row.** Repeat 4th row.  
**7th Row.** 3 d c in each mesh, join.  
**8th Row.** 1 s c in each d c.  
**9th Row.** Ch 3, 3 d c in same space, remove hook, insert in 3rd st of ch 3 and pull loop through, (popcorn st) \* ch 2, skip 2 s c, 4 d c popcorn st in next s c, repeat from \* all around, ch 2, join.  
**10th Row.** Sl st into mesh, \* ch 4, sl st in next mesh, repeat from \* all around.  
**11th Row.** Sl st into loop, popcorn st in same space, \* ch 2, popcorn st in next loop, repeat from \* all around, ch 2, join.  
Repeat the 10th and 11th rows 13 times. Repeat the 10th row once more.  
**39th Row.** Turn, sl st to center of loop, s c in same space, \* ch 2, d c in next loop, ch 3, tr c in same loop, ch 3, tr c in next loop, ch 3, d c in same loop, ch 2, s c in next loop, repeat from \* all around, join.  
**40th Row.** Ch 1, turn, \* 2 s c in next loop, 4 s c in

**Materials Required—AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
“DE LUXE” MERCERIZED CROCHET COTTON.**

**1 Ball each of Yellow, Red and White will make all three pot holders.**

**Steel Crochet Hook Number 7.**

**1 Bone Ring for each.**

### **POT HOLDER — No. 2135**

With Red, work 48 s c over ring, join.

**2nd Row.** Ch 3, (this counts as 1 d c) 1 d c in each of the next 11 s c, ch 2, 1 d c in each of the next 12 s c, ch 3, turn.

**3rd Row.** 11 d c, 2 d c in ch 2, ch 2, 2 d c in same ch, 1 d c in each remaining d c, ch 3, turn.

**4th Row.** 13 d c, 2 d c in ch 2, ch 2, 2 d c in same space, 1 d c in each remaining d c, break thread. Attach Yellow, ch 3, turn, continue in same manner increasing 4 sts in each row and working in the following Color scheme. 2 rows Yellow, 2 rows White, 2 rows Yellow, 2 rows Red, 2 rows White, 2 rows Yellow, 2 rows Red. The reverse side is made in one Color, working the 1st row of d c between the sts of first side.

Pin the 2 sections together and join with a row of s c working a picot after every 4th s c.

### **POT HOLDERS — No. 2136**

With Red, ch 6, join, ch 3, 2 d c in ring, \* ch 3, 3 d c in ring, repeat from \* 3 times. (5 sections.) Join each row.

**2nd Row.** Ch 3, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, \* 2 d c in loop, ch 3, 2 d c in same loop, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, repeat from \* all around, break thread.

**3rd Row.** With Yellow, ch 3, and work 1 d c in each d c and 2 d c, ch 3, 2 d c in each loop, break thread.

**4th Row.** This row is worked in Red and White carrying the Color not being used under the other Color. Start with Red, ch 3, this counts as 1 d c, 1 d c in each of the next 8 d c, with White 1 d c in next d c, 2 d c in loop, ch 3, \* 2 d c in same loop, 1 d c in next d c, change color, 1 d c in each of the next 8 d c, with White, 1 d c in next d c, 2 d c in loop, ch 3, repeat from \* all around.

**5th Row.** With Yellow, ch 3, 1 d c in each of the next 8 d c, with White, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, 2 d c in loop, ch 3, 2 d c in same loop, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, with Yellow, 1 d c in each of the next 8 d c, with White, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, 2 d c in loop, ch 3, 2 d c in same loop, repeat last section all around.

**6th Row.** With White, ch 3, 1 d c in each of the next 5 d c, with Yellow, 1 d c in each of the next 6 d c, 2 d c in loop, ch 3, 2 d c in same loop, 1 d c in each of the next 6 d c, with White, 1 d c in each of the next 6 d c, with Yellow, 1 d c in each of the next 6 d c, 2 d c in loop, ch 3, repeat last section all around.

**7th Row.** With White, ch 3, 1 d c in each of the next 9 d c, with Red, 1 d c in each of the next 5 d c, 2 d c in loop, ch 3, 2 d c in same loop, 1 d c in each of the next 5 d c, with White, 1 d c in each of the next 12 d c and repeat last section all around, break thread. Work 1 row in Yellow, 1 row White, 1 row in Red working 1 d c in each d c and 2 d c, ch 3, 2 d c in each ch 3. Work a second section in same Color scheme or work it all one Color.

Pin the 2 sections together and join them with a row of s c working 3 d c over each loop. Finish with ring as illustrated.

**Next Row.** 3 s c with ch 1 between in next mesh, (this starts the increase for thumb) 1 s c in each mesh with ch 1 between. Work 2 more rows of meshes even, working a mesh in each mesh of thumb.

**Next Row.** Work 3 s c with ch 1 between in mesh over last increasing point at thumb, then increase over same increasing point every 3rd row 4 more times and work 2 rows even.

**Next Row.** Work to within 6 meshes before the increasing point, ch 9, skip 12 meshes, s c in next mesh, continue in pattern to ch over thumb, ch 1, s c in 1st ch, \* ch 1, skip 1 st, s c in next st, repeat from \* 3 times, ch 1, s c in next mesh and work even in pattern for 15 rows.

**Next row** starts the first finger. Fold glove in half through center of thumb opening placing thumb on left side, work 6 meshes on back of hand, ch 3, counting back, skip 13 meshes, s c in next mesh, then work in pattern to ch between fingers, ch 1, s c in 1st ch, ch 1, skip 1 ch, s c in next ch and work 11 rows of pattern around finger.

**Next Row.** Decrease 1 mesh and work 3 rows even. Repeat last 4 rows twice. Decrease 1 mesh and work 1 row even, then decrease every 3rd mesh 4 times. Next row work 1 s c in each mesh without the ch 1 between, break thread leaving an end and sew top together.

**Second Finger.** Join thread to last st at base of 1st finger on back of glove and work 5 meshes, ch 3, s c in 4th free mesh from 1st finger on palm of glove, 1 s c with ch 1 between in each of the next 3 meshes, ch 1, s c in s c at base of 1st finger, 2 meshes between fingers working on ch same as 1st finger. Continue in pattern for 14 rows then decrease same as 1st finger.

**Third Finger.** Join thread in same manner as 2nd finger and work 5 meshes on back of glove, ch 3, s c in 4th free mesh on palm side of glove and work same length as 1st finger.

**Little Finger.** Attach thread on back of glove at base of 3rd finger and work in pattern for 8 rows, then decrease 1 mesh and work 2 rows even. Repeat last 3 rows twice, then decrease every 3rd st twice and finish same as other finger.

**Thumb.** Attach thread and work 2 rows of meshes.

**Next Row.** Decrease 2 meshes and work 2 more rows even. Repeat the last 3 rows.

**Next Row.** Decrease 2 meshes and work 11 rows even, then decrease every 3rd mesh 5 times and finish same as other fingers.

Work right glove same as left glove to 1st finger. Fold glove in half same as left glove having the thumb on right side and work 7 meshes on front of glove, ch 3, counting back 13 meshes, s c in next mesh and finish same as other glove.

**Scallop.** \* Ch. 3, d c in same space, sl st in next mesh, repeat from \* all around.

With 6 Strand Embroidery Cotton work bow knots 1 inch apart down center back of glove, working 4 stitches crosswise about  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch long, then work 2 stitches about  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch long over the 4 sts forming a knot.

19 sts between increasing points and K 2 rounds even. There should be 34 sts on 1st needle and 18 on other 2 needles.

**Next Round.** K 1, slip next 21 sts on a thread, cast on 6 sts next to the K 1 and K to end of round. K 26 more rounds. For a larger hand add a few more rounds.

**First Finger.** Mark the beginning of a round with a colored thread. K 10 sts from the 1st needle, slip 36 sts on a thread leaving 9 sts on the last needle, cast on 5 sts for the gusset. Arrange these 24 sts on 3 needles and \* K 8 rounds.

**Next Round.** K 12, K 2 together and finish round. Repeat from \* 4 times and K 4 rounds even.

**Next Round.** \* K 1, K 2 together, repeat from \* all around and K 1 round even. Repeat the last 2 rounds once, break thread leaving an end. Thread the end into blunt pointed needle and pick up all remaining sts, draw up tight and fasten firmly on the wrong side.

**Second Finger.** Pick up 5 sts on the gusset of 1st finger (if needed pick up 1 st to prevent a hole), pick up 7 sts on palm side of glove, cast on 5 sts, pick 8 sts from back of glove (pick up another st if necessary to prevent a hole). Arrange these sts on three needles, repeat directions of first finger from the \* adding 1 more round in each repeat to make the finger a little longer and finish same as first finger.

**Third Finger.** Pick up 5 sts on gusset, 5 sts on palm of glove, cast on 5 sts, pick up 6 sts from back of glove and follow directions for first finger.

**Little Finger.** Pick up 5 sts on gusset, and the remaining sts on thread. K 30 rounds even and finish same as tip of other fingers.

**Thumb.** Pick up 6 sts on gusset and 21 sts on thread (pick up extra st to prevent a hole if necessary). Arrange on 3 needles as follows: Counting from the center of the 21 sts leave 9 sts on 2nd, 10 on third and slip remaining sts on both sides of 1st or gusset needle. \* Work 6 rounds.

**Next Round.** 1st needle, K 2 together at the beginning and end of needle, K to end of round. Repeat from \* 3 times. K 4 rounds even. Finish tip same as other fingers.

**Left Glove.** Work same as right glove to the first finger.

**First Finger.** K the 19 sts from the 1st needle, slip 36 sts on a thread, cast on 5 sts for the gusset (24 sts) Arrange these 24 sts on 3 needles and continue same as 1st finger on other glove. Remainder of the glove is worked same as the right glove.

**Crocheted Cuff.** With Main Color crochet 78 s c around edge of glove, join.

**2nd Round.** Ch 3, 1 d c in same space with joining, skip 2 s c, s c in next s c, \* ch 3, 1 d c in same space, skip 2 s c, s c in next s c, repeat from \* all around. (26 shells) sl st into first ch 3 of row and turn work.

**3rd Round.** Ch 3, d c in same space, s c in ch 3 of shell, repeat from beginning all around ending last shell in d c of previous row, sl st into ch 3 of 1st shell and turn work.

End each row and turn each row in same manner.

Work 3 more rows in Main Color, 2 rows in Contrasting Color, 5 rows Main Color, 2 rows Contrasting Color, 4 rows Main Color.

Cord, with Contrasting Color ch 24 and work 23 sl sts on ch, break thread, leaving an end to slip through glove. Work a second cord. Slip cords through glove and tie as illustrated.

**7th Round.** K 1, increase in next st, K 5, increase in next st, K even to end of round, K 2 rounds even.

**Continue** increasing in every 3rd round until there are

- 1 Ball each of Blue, Yellow and White.**
- 12 Bone Rings**  $\frac{5}{8}$  inch in Diameter at outer edge.
- 14 Bone Rings**  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch in Diameter at outer edge.
- 1 Clasp for Bracelet.**
- 1 Small Bottle Colorless Nail Polish.**
- Steel Crochet Hook Number 7.**

**Flowers.** With Yellow, ch 4, join with a sl st to form a ring.

**1st Round.** Ch 1, 8 s c in ring, join to first s c with a sl st, ch 5, break thread about 6 inches from hook, pull end of thread through last st of ch 5. Tie in knot to loose end at starting point and fasten both ends securely (this makes the loop on back of flower to string it by).

Attach White to one st of flower center and working through back loops of last row of Yellow \* ch 8, sl st in same st, sl st in next st, and repeat from \* in every st. Fasten off. Make 9 flowers.

Slip the loops of the flowers on a small pencil, this makes them easier to hold while applying the Colorless Nail Polish and holds the loops out in shape while drying. Coat both sides of the flowers and the loops with the Polish. Shape the petals with fingers while still wet, allow to dry thoroughly, then give them a second coat.

**Chain for Necklace.** With Blue ch 60 (for tie at back) then continue with \* 12 s c in one of the smaller bone rings, ch 1, repeat from \* until half of each of six small rings have been covered. Then make 14 s c in one of the larger rings, \* ch 4, drop st from hook, draw it through the loop of a flower, sl st in the 3rd st from hook of ch 4, ch 1. Work 7 s c in another  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch ring, ch 2, drop st from hook, draw it through a flower loop, sl st in second ch from hook and continue in same ring, with 7 more s c. Repeat from \* until all flowers are fastened, working 14 s c in last  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch ring. \* Ch 1, 12 s c in a small ring, and repeat from \* for remaining 5 rings. Ch 60 for other end of back tie and fasten off.

**Bracelet.** With Blue 14 s c in a  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch ring, \* turn the work over and sl st through both loops of the 13th s c in ring, then work 14 s c in another ring, and repeat from \* for the 8 rings. Fasten clasp in position.

**TWISTED NECKLACE — No. 2109**

*Illustrated on page 6*

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "GEM" COTTON YARN.**

- 5 Yards Red.**                      **5½ Yards White.**                      **6 Yards Blue.**

Fold 5 yards of Red in three lengths, twist tightly, hold the two ends, fold in half and let the strands twist themselves. Do the same with the 5½ yards of White and the 6 yards of Blue. Arrange strands so each strand is about a half inch below the other and tie a tight knot at ends. Sew fasteners to knots or crochet a cord for tying.

across row. Ch 1, turn. Picking up back loop of st only, repeat last row for about 3 inches. Join Light and work 1 s c, ch 1, 1 s c in same st, \* ch 1, s c in back loop of next s c and repeat from \* across row and work 1 row Light Color even.

Work two rows same in Dark Color, and 2 rows in Light, break yarn. Attach yarn at first increase at side

and work 1 row of s c with 1 ch between up side of slipper. Across top, work 1 sl st with ch 1 between in each s c taking up back loop of st only. At corners work 2 sl sts with ch 1 between. Finish other side of vamp to correspond, break yarn.

Sew in position drawing it up at center as illustrated.

**Ankle Band.** Ch for desired length and work 1 row of s c with ch 1 between in every other st. Work a chain loop at end for button. Sew band to back of slippers and attach button at other end of ch.

**BED SOCKS — No. 2111**

*Illustrated on page 7*

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" ZEPHYR WOOL or "DAWN" SHETLAND TYPE FLOSS.**

- 2—2 oz. Skeins of Zephyr Wool or 2 Balls Shetland Type Floss.**

- 1 Skein Six Strand Art Thread.**
- 1 Pair Bone Knitting Needles Number 7.**
- 1 Pair Bone Knitting Needles Number 4.**

**Gauge—6 sts = 1 inch. 5 ribs = 1 inch.**

On large needles cast on 40 sts and work 6½ inches in garter st (K each row).

Next row start decreasing.

- 1st Row.** K 9, K 2 together, K 18, K 2 together, K 9.
- 2nd row and all even rows,** K even.
- 3rd Row.** K 8, K 2 together, K 18, K 2 together, K 8.
- 5th Row.** K 8, K 2 together, K 16, K 2 together, K 8.
- 7th Row.** K 7, K 2 together, K 16, K 2 together, K 7.
- 9th Row.** K 7, K 2 together, K 14, K 2 together, K 7.
- 11th Row.** K 6, K 2 together, K 14, K 2 together, K 6.
- 13th Row.** K 6, K 2 together, K 12, K 2 together, K 6.
- 15th Row.** K 5, K 2 together, K 12, K 2 together, K 5.
- 17th Row.** K 5, K 2 together, K 10, K 2 together, K 5.
- 19th Row.** K 4, K 2 together, K 10, K 2 together, K 4.
- 21st Row.** K 4, K 2 together, K 8, K 2 together, K 4.
- 23rd Row.** K 3, K 2 together, K 8, K 2 together, K 3.
- 25th Row.** K 2 together across row, break yarn leaving about 12 inches. Slip the remaining 8 sts on yarn and draw up tight and fasten. Lace seam over instep to within last 18 ridges for top of cuff.

With small needles pick up 26 sts on each side (52 sts). Work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 2 inches.

Bind off loosely, break yarn leaving an end to seam back of sock. Work other sock to correspond and embroider with Rambler Roses on each side of center rib as illustrated.

**SLIPPERS — No. 2112**

*Illustrated on page 7*

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "GEM" COTTON YARN.**

- 1 Skein each of Black and Red or any 2 Colors desired.**
- Bone Crochet Hook Number 5 or 6.**

Soles worked same as Slippers Number 2110.

Work the soles in Black or the Darker shade used.

**Upper Section.** With Red or Light Color. Ch 12, 11 s c on ch, (ch 1 and turn each row) work remainder of slipper taking up back loop of st only.

**2nd Row.** 1 s c in each of the first 5 s c, 1 s c, 1 pull st, 1 s c in 6th st. (Pull st, yarn over needle, insert in st, pull loop through, \* yarn over needle, insert in

same st, pull loop through, repeat from \*, yarn over and pull through all loops on needle but one, yarn over and pull through two loops) 1 s c in each of the last 5 s c.

**3rd Row.** 1 s c in each s c, working 3 s c in center s c over puff st.

**4th Row.** 1 s c in each s c, working 1 s c, 1 puff st and 1 s c in center s c.

Repeat 3rd and 4th rows 4 times.

**Next Row.** Work over 7 s c, for back of slipper, ch 1, turn and work 31 more rows (for larger slipper increase the number of rows). Sew or crochet to 7 s c at opposite side of vamp. With wrong side of work towards you, slip st to next free s c in vamp and work beading all around back of slipper. (Beading. Ch 1, skip 1 row, s c in next row). Join to 8th st at opposite side of vamp. Ch 3, turn, 1 d c in same space, skip 1 mesh, s c in next mesh. \* Ch 3, 1 d c in same space, skip 1 mesh, s c in next mesh, repeat from \* around back, join in 8th s c at opposite side of vamp.

With Black crochet or sew tops and soles together, leaving 5 center toe sts free. Crochet a chain or run elastic through beading and trim with pom-poms as illustrated.

1 ch meshes on ch and continue meshes to end of row, break thread and work other front to correspond, do not break thread. Join underarm meshes and work beading, ch 3, 1 tr c in mesh and next d c, \* ch 3, skip 2 meshes, 1 tr c in the next d c, mesh and d c, repeat from \* across row. Ch 1, turn and work 1 s c in each tr c and 3 s c over each ch 3.

**Next row** start half knot st.

Ch 3, d c in next s c \* half knot st, (pull up a  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch loop on hook, thread over hook and pull through, s c into single strand of loop).

1 d c in each of the next 2 s c, half knot st, skip 1 s c, 1 d c in each of the next 2 s c, repeat from \* across row, ch 3, turn.

**2nd Row.** D c in d c, \* half knot st, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, repeat from \* across row and repeat 2nd row until knot st part of jacket measures 12 inches.

**Sleeves.** Ch 34, d c in 4th st from hook, \* half knot st, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, repeat from \* across row.

Ch 3, turn and work 1 row even.

**Next 16 rows** increase 1 pattern at end of each row as follows, work 2 d c in 1st d c at end of row, half knot st, 2 d c in last d c. At the end of the last row, ch 8, break thread. Join thread at opposite end, ch 10, turn, d c in 4th st from hook, half knot st, skip 2 sts, 1 d c in each of the next 2 sts, half knot st, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, continue pattern across row and work 2 patterns on ch, ch 3 turn and continue rows of pattern until sleeve measures 9 inches from underarm.

**Sew Seams.** Work 1 s c in each d c and 1 s c over 2 long loops of knot st.

**Beading.** Ch 3, 1 tr c in each of the 2 s c, \* ch 3, skip 3 s c, 1 tr c in each of the next 3 s c, repeat from \* all around. Next row work 1 s c in each tr c and 3 s c over each ch 3. Next row, \* ch 12, skip 1 s c, s c in next s c, repeat from \* all around ending last loop in 1st loop and work 6 more rows of 12 ch loops.

Join thread at lower edge of yoke and work a row of s c all around jacket easing in the back of neck to 5 inches. At lower edge work 1 s c in each d c and 2 s c in each knot st.

Begin ruffle at lower edge of yoke \* ch 12, skip 1 s c, s c in next s c, repeat from \* all around yoke and neck, in corners do not skip the 1 s c.

**2nd Row.** Ch 12, turn, s c in next loop, \* ch 12, s c in next loop, repeat from \* all around and repeat 2nd row twice. Finish the knot st section of jacket as follows. Join thread at lower edge of yoke, 1 s c in each of the 1st 4 s c, \* ch 4, sl st in top of last s c made for picot, 1 s c in each of the next 4 s c, repeat from \* all around.

Finish with ribbon as illustrated.

work, K the next 2 sts, K the 2 sts on double pointed needle, P 2, K 1, repeat from \* across row.

**Back.** Cast on 76 sts. Work even in pattern for 3 inches. Now increase 1 st each side every 4th row 4 times. Work even until back measures 12 inches.

**Next 2 rows** bind off 4 sts at the beginning of each row, then 2 sts at beginning of next 4 rows and 1 st each side of every other row 4 times. Work even until armhole measures  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches. Next 10 rows bind off 5 sts at the beginning of each row and bind off remaining sts for back of neck.

**Front.** Cast on 43 sts and work 3 inches even. Next 4 rows increase 1 st at armhole edge. Work even until front measures  $11\frac{1}{2}$  inches.

Decrease at front edge every 4th row 14 times and at armhole edge work even until work measures 12 inches. Next row bind off 4 sts, then bind off 2 sts twice and decrease 1 st 5 times. When armhole measures  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches bind off 4 sts every other row 5 times. Work other front to correspond reversing the shaping.

**Sleeves.** Cast on 43 sts. Increase 1 st each side every 4th row 7 times. Work even until sleeve measures 5 inches.

**Next 2 rows** bind off 4 sts at the beginning of each row. Decrease 1 st each side of every 4th row 4 times.

Decrease 1 st each side every 2nd row 5 times then decrease 1 st each side of every row 5 times. Next 2 rows bind off 6 sts at the beginning of each row and bind off remaining sts.

**Work 3 rows** of single crochet around fronts and neck, making 4 buttonholes of ch 4 in the 2nd row. Work a row of s c around lower edge of cardigan and sleeves.

**Next 4 Rows.** Taking up the back loop of st, increase 1 st each end of row.

**6th Row.** Work even.

**7th and 8th Rows.** Increase 1 st both ends and then work 1 row even. Repeat the last 2 rows.

**11th Row.** Ch 3, turn, d c in same space, skip 2 s c, sl st in next s c, \* ch 3, d c in same space, skip 2 s c, sl st in next s c, repeat from \* across row. Work a 2nd pocket to correspond. Sew pockets in position over Black sections on inside of bag.

**Handle.** Join Black in 3rd st of Black section at top of bag, ch 50, s c in 3rd st from other end, sl st in next st, turn, s c in each ch, sl st in each of the next 2 s c of Black section, turn, and work 1 s c in each ch working over s c of previous row. Work another handle on opposite side.

Sew top of bag together beginning at the 1st Black stripe. Sew snaps to pockets.

for back of neck and continue work on remaining 28 sts as follows. Work even for  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch then cast on 3 sts at neck edge every other row 3 times, then cast on 12 sts at neck edge. This completes the neck shaping. Continue front even, working the 5 sts at front edge in garter st. (K each row.) Work for  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches then work buttonholes on Left Front for Boys and Right Front for Girls.

**Buttonholes.** K 2, bind off 1 st, K 2. On the next row cast on 1 st over the bound off st. Following buttonholes are made  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches apart. Continue even until work measures 8 inches from the marker. Place a second marker (armhole) and finish front same as back. Work other front to correspond.

**Sleeves.** With right side of work toward you using large needles, pick up 68 sts between markers and work in pattern for  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches or length desired. Change to small needles work in ribbing for  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches.

**Neck Band.** With fine needles and right side toward you, pick up 94 sts around neck edge and work in ribbing for  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch. Work a buttonhole in line with other buttonholes and continue in ribbing until band measures  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch.

Press work under a damp cloth, sew seams and sew buttons in position.

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
"GEM" COTTON YARN.**

**1 Skein Red and 1 Skein White will be sufficient for  
Purse and Beanie.**

**4 inch Zipper.**

**Bone Crochet Hook Number 4 or 5.**

With Red, ch 32, sl st in 2nd st from hook, sl st in each of the next 3 chs, 1 s c in each of the next 23 chs, sl st in each of the next 4 chs, ch 1, turn.

**2nd Row.** Work another row of s c in Red, slip stitching the 1st and last 4 sts. Drop Red pick up White and repeat 2nd row. Work another row in White. Then work 2 rows in Red. Repeat the last 4 rows 4 times, break yarn.

With Red work a row of s c around both sides of purse. Fold in half and sew sides together. Crochet a row of s c across both tops and sew in zipper.

**Handle.** Twist 4 one yard strands of Red together, hold both ends and let it twist itself. Knot one end and sew to bag. Knot the other end leaving about a 2 inch length for fringe, sew to bag.

**CHILD'S BEANIE — No. 2121**

With Red, ch 17, 1 s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 11 chs, sl st in each of the next 4 chs, ch 1, turn.

**2nd Row.** Sl st in each of the first 4 s c, s c in each of the next 12 s c. Pick up White, ch 1, turn and \* work 2 rows in White, 2 rows in Red, repeat from \* 12 times and work 2 rows of White. Sew beanie together.

**Top of Beanie.** Ch 3, 7 s c into 1st st of ch, do not join rows.

**2nd Row.** 2 s c in each s c.

**3rd and 4th Rows.** \* 2 s c in 1st s c, 1 s c in next s c, repeat from \* all around, break yarn. Sew in place in top of hat.

**Pom Pom.** Wind 75 strands of White over a 4 inch

cardboard, slip off the cardboard, tie through the center, cut both ends, trim and fasten to beanie as illustrated.

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY  
"GEM" COTTON YARN.**

**1 Skein Black.**

**16 Yards of Red.**

**8 Yards of White.**

**2 Bone rings for ears.**

Fold skein of Black into a  $12\frac{1}{2}$  inch fold, tie tightly about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches from top (for hair), tie again about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches from last tie for head, tie again about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches from last tie for body. Separate the remainder and tie both sections about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches from bottom for legs, cut each loop at top for hair, trim and brush.

**Arms.** With Red cut 40 strands about 8 inches long, draw through body and tie ends.

**Skirt.** Cut 25 Red strands about 8 inches long and loop them over a 15 inch strand of yarn. Tie around waist.

Embroider eyes and nose with White, mouth with Red. Sew two bone rings in position for ears. Trim the yarn at ends of arms and legs.

**Next round** start finger. Work 1st 14 sts in stockinette st, place next 52 sts on a thread, cast on 2 sts to the 14 sts on needle and K the remaining 4 sts of the 3rd needle. Join these 20 sts and work in stockinette st for 3 inches.

**Next round** decrease, \* K 3, K 2 together, repeat from \* all around and work 1 round even. Next round K 2 together all around and work 1 round even. Draw thread through remaining sts and fasten firmly on the wrong side of finger.

**Second Finger.** Take 9 sts from each side of thread and start knitting on back of glove. K 9 sts from needle, pick up 2 sts on side of 1st finger, K 9 sts, cast on 2 sts, join and work  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inches decreasing one st on each side of finger in first round (20 sts). Decrease and finish same as 1st finger.

**Third finger** is made same as 2nd finger working  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches even.

**Little Finger.** Take last 8 sts from each side of thread, pick up 2 sts on side of 3rd finger and work even for  $2\frac{7}{8}$  inches. Decrease as follows, \* K 1, K 2 together, repeat from \* all around, work 1 round even. Draw thread through remaining sts and fasten firmly.

**Thumb.** Pick up the 14 sts from thread and K them, pick up 10 sts in back of thumb. Work on these 24 sts for  $2\frac{7}{8}$  inches, then decrease as follows, \* K 1, K 2 together, repeat from \* all around and work 1 round even. Next round, K 2 together all around, draw thread through remaining sts and fasten firmly.

**Left Glove.** Work same as right glove to gusset.

**7th round** after ribbing. K 24 sts in pattern, increase in 25th st, complete round and work 3 rounds even.

**11th Round.** Increase in 25th and 26th st and work 3 rounds even.

**15th Round.** Increase in 25th and 28th st and work 3 rounds even.

**19th Round.** Increase in 25th and 30th st and work 3 rounds even.

**23rd Round.** Increase in 25th and 32nd st and work 3 rounds even.

**27th Round.** Increase in 25th and 34th st and work 3 rounds even.

**31st Round.** Increase in 25th and 36th st and continue same as right glove to fingers.

**Start Fingers.** Place 1st 26 sts on a thread, use the next 18 sts for 1st finger and place remaining 26 sts on a thread. Cast on 2 sts on 18 sts, join and work finger same as other fingers. Work remaining fingers to correspond.

**MAN'S MITTENS — No. 2127**

**Materials Required — AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" KNITTING WOOL or "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED.**

2—1¼ oz. Skeins.

**4 Double Pointed Bone Needles Number 1.**

On 3 needles cast on 48 sts (16-16-16) and K 2, P 2 for 3½ inches.

**Next round** starts the thumb. 1st needle K 2 sts in 1st stitch, K 2, K 2 sts in 4th stitch, complete round and work 1 round even.

**3rd Round.** K 2 sts in 1st stitch, K 4, K 2 sts in next st, complete round and work 1 round even.

Continue increasing for thumb every other round until there are 22 sts between increases. K 1 round even. Slip the 22 thumb sts on a thread, cast on 4 sts over gusset and work 3 rounds decreasing 2 sts each round over the gusset. Divide the sts (15-15-16) and work even for 3¼ inches.

**Next Round.** K 2 sts together at the beginning and end of each needle and work 1 round even. Continue decreasing in same manner every other round until 6 sts remain, draw yarn through these and fasten firmly.

**Thumb.** Pick up the 22 thumb sts and the 4 cast on sts having 8 sts on 1st 2 needles and 10 sts on other needle, decrease gusset same as hand and work even for 1½ inches, then decrease same as mitten.

Work other mitten to correspond.

**7th Row.** With Red increase 1 st in each section, break thread.

**8th, 9th, 10th and 11th Rows.** With White increase 1 st in each section of each row.

Work a second section starting with Red and working the single stripe in Yellow.

Pin the 2 sections together and join them with Red as follows, 3 d c in each ch 2, and 1 s c in each d c.

Attach ring as illustrated.
