#### Iris Arrangement

No. 7584

**MATERIALS:** 

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS

BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 50:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—97 balls of White or
Ecru, or 117 balls of OR
any color,

J. & P. COATS—60 balls of White or Ecru.

Steel crochet hook No. 12.

GAUGE: 9 sps make 2 inches; 9 rows make 2 inches. Completed block measures about 15 inches square. For a table-cloth 75 x 90 inches, make 5 x 6 blocks.

BLOCK . . . Starting at bottom of chart, make a chain about 20 inches long (18 ch sts to 1 inch). 1st row: Tr in 6th ch from hook, (ch 1, skip 1 ch, tr in next ch) 5 times; ch 3, skip 3 ch, tr in next ch (sp made), then (ch 1, skip 1 ch, tr in next ch) 8 times; \* make 1 sp, (ch 1, skip 1 ch, tr in next ch) 6 times. Repeat from \* 12 more times; then work 1 sp, (ch 1, skip 1 ch, tr in next ch) 8 times; 1 sp, (ch 1, skip 1 ch, tr in next ch) 8 times; 1 sp, (ch 1, skip 1 ch, tr in next ch) 6 times. Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: Tr in next tr, (ch 1, tr in next tr) 3 times; ch 3, skip 1 tr, tr in next tr

(sp made over shadow sp), 3 tr in next sp, tr in next tr (bl made over sp), ch 3, skip 1 tr, tr in next tr, (ch 1, tr in next tr) 4 times; \* ch 3, skip 1 tr, tr in next tr, make 1 bl, 1 sp, (ch 1, tr in next tr) twice (shadow sp made over shadow sp). Repeat from \* 12 more times; then work 1 sp, 1 bl, 1 sp, (ch 1, tr in next tr) 4 times; 1 sp, 1 bl, 1 sp, (ch 1, tr in next tr) 4 times; 1 sp, 1 bl, 1 sp, (ch 1, tr in next tr) 3 times; ch 1, skip 1 ch, tr in next ch. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: Tr in next tr, ch 1, tr in next tr, work 1 sp, ch 3, tr in next tr (sp made over sp), tr in next 4 tr (bl made over bl). Work 1 more bl, 2 sps, \* 3 bls, 1 sp. Repeat from \* 12 more times; then work 3 bls, 2 sps, 2 bls, 2 sps, 1 shadow sp, ch 7, turn. 4th row: Skip 1 tr, tr in next tr (sp made at beginning of row),

work 2 bls, ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in next tr (sp made over bl). Work 1 bl, then work sps across until there are 59 sps in all, then work 1 bl, 1 sp, 2 bls, 1 sp. Ch 5, turn. 5th row: Tr in next sp, ch 1, tr in next tr, then work 1 sp, 5 bls, 55 sps, 5 bls, 1 sp, ch 1, tr in next sp. ch 1, tr in 4th st of turning ch. Ch 5, turn. 6th row: Tr in next tr, ch 1, tr in next tr, ch 1, tr in next sp, ch 1, tr in next tr. Work 2 sps, 3 bls, 10 sps, ch 1, tr in next sp, ch 1, tr in next tr (shadow sp made over sp). Work 8 more shadow sps, 17 sps, 9 shadow sps, 10 sps, 3 bls, 2 sps, 2 shadow sps. Ch 5, turn. Starting with 7th row, follow chart to top. Fasten off.

Make 5 x 6 blocks and sew together on wrong side with neat over-and-over stitches.

## Page Polka Dots

**MATERIALS:** 

#### CLARK'S O.N.T. BIG BALL MERCERIZED CROCHET Size 30:

11 balls of White or Ecru and 13 balls of any color.

Steel crochet hook No. 10 or 11.

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches in diameter after blocking. For a tablecloth about 60 x 80 inches make 26 x 35 motifs.

FIRST MOTIF... With White ch 6, join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 1, 12 sc in ring. Do not join rnds. 2nd rnd: \* Sc

in next st, 2 sc in next st (1 sc increased). Repeat from \* around (18 sts). 3rd rnd: \* Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st. Repeat from \* around (24 sc). 4th to 7th rnds incl: Sc in each st around, increasing 6 sc in each rnd (48 sc in 7th rnd). Fasten off. 8th rnd: Attach color, ch 4 (to count as tr), holding back the last loop of each tr on hook make 2 tr in same place as thread was attached, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (a 2-tr cluster made), \* ch 5, skip next 2 sts, holding back the last loop of each tr on hook make 3 tr in next st, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (3-tr cluster made). Repeat from \*\*around (16 clusters), ending with ch 2, dc in tip of 1st cluster. 9th rnd: \* Ch 6, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, tr in top of dc of last rnd. 10th rnd: \* Ch 8, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-8 to base of 1st ch-8. Fasten off.

SECOND MOTIF . . . Work 1st 9 rnds as for 1st motif. 10th rnd: Ch 4, sl st in any ch-8 loop on 1st motif, ch 4, sc in next loop on 2nd motif, ch 4, sl st in next loop on 1st motif, ch 4, sc in next loop on 2nd motif. Complete this rnd as for 1st motif (no more joinings).

Make necessary number of motifs and join 2 loops of each motif to 2 loops of adjacent motifs, leaving 2 loops free on each motif between joinings.


FILL-IN-MOTIF . . . 1st rnd: Attach color to a free loop following a joining, ch 4 (to count as tr), make a 2-tr cluster in same loop, 3-tr cluster in next loop on same motif, \* ch 3, 3-tr cluster in next loop on next motif, 3-tr cluster in next loop on same motif. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-4 to top of 1st cluster. 2nd rnd: Ch 1, work 4 sc over each ch-4 around. Fasten off. Work Fill-in-motifs in this manner in all sps between joinings.

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 30:

SMALL BALL:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—77 balls,

J. & P. Coats —49 balls of White or Ecru, or 64 balls of any color.

BIG BALL:

J. & P. COATS—25 balls of White or Ecru, or 32 balls of any color.

Steel crochet hook No. 10 or 11.

GAUGE: Each motif measures about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches in diameter. For a tablecloth about 60 x 80 inches, make 13 x 17 motifs.


FIRST MOTIF . . . Ch 12. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 1, 24 sc in ring. Join with sl st to 1st sc made. 2nd rnd: Ch 7 (to count as d tr and ch-2), \* d tr in next st, ch 2. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-2 to 5th st of ch-7. 3rd rnd: Sl st in next sp, ch 4, tr in same sp, \* ch 2, 2 tr in next sp. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-2 to 4th st of 1st ch. 4th rnd: Sl st across to next sp, ch 1, sc in same sp, \* ch 5, sc in next sp. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-5 to 1st sc. 5th rnd: Sl st to center of 1st loop, ch 1, sc in same loop, \* ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 6th rnd: Sl st in next loop, ch 3, 3 dc in same loop, \* ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 3, 4 dc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-3 to top st of 1st ch. 7th rnd: Ch 3, dc in 3 dc, \* ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, dc in 4 dc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 8th rnd: Ch 3, dc in 3 dc, \* (ch 3, sc in next loop) twice; ch 3, dc in next 4 dc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 9th rnd: Ch 3, dc in 3 dc, 2 dc in next loop, \* ch 4, sc in next loop, ch 4, 2 dc in next loop, dc in 4 dc, 2 dc in next loop. Repeat from \* around, ending with 2 dc in last loop. Join. 10th rnd: Ch 3, dc in 5 dc, 2 dc in next loop, \* ch 3, 2 dc in next loop, dc in 8 dc, 2 dc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 11th rnd: Ch 7, \* skip 2 dc, dc in next 5 dc, in next sp make 2 dc, ch 4 and 2 dc; dc in next 5 dc, ch 4. Repeat from \* around. Join and fasten off.

**SECOND MOTIF** . . . Work as for 1st motif until 10th rnd is completed. 11th rnd: Ch 7, skip 2 dc, dc in next 5 dc, 2 dc in next sp, ch 2, drop loop from hook, insert hook in corresponding ch-4 loop on 1st motif and pull dropped loop through, ch 2, 2 dc in same sp on 2nd motif, dc in next 5 dc, ch 2, join as before to next sp on 1st motif, ch 2, skip 2 dc on 2nd motif, dc in next 5 dc, 2 dc in next sp, ch 2, join to next ch-4 loop on 1st motif, ch 2, 2 dc in same sp on 2nd motif. Complete rnd same as 11th rnd of 1st motif (no more joinings). Fasten off.

Make necessary number of motifs, joining them as 2nd motif was joined to 1st motif, having two ch-4 sps and one ch-4 loop free between joinings.

FILL-IN-MOTIF . . . Ch 6. Join with in ring. Join with sl st to 1st sc. 2nd rnd: Ch 5 (to count as ch 2 and dc), \* dc in next sc, ch 2. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-2 to 3rd st of

Repeat from \* around. Join. 4th rnd: Sl st in next loop, ch 4, tr in same loop, \* ch 5, 2 tr in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 5th rnd: Sl st in next loop, ch 3, dc in same loop, \* ch 2, join to free sp following joining of motifs, ch 2, 2 dc in same loop on Fill-inmotif, ch 5, 2 dc in next loop, ch 2, join to next loop on motif, ch 2, 2 dc in same loop on Fill-in-motif, ch 2, 2 dc in next loop, ch 2, join to next sp en motif, ch 2, 2 dc in same loop on Fill-in-motif, ch 5, 2 dc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join and fasten off. Work Fillin-motifs in this manner in all sps between joinings.

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 20:

SMALL BALL:

BIG BALL:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—15 balls,

J. & P. COATS—5 balls.

J. & P. Coats —9 balls.

Steel crochet hook No. 9 or 10.

This amount of material is sufficient for a set consisting of a centerpiece, 16 inches in diameter; 4 place doilies, 12 inches in diameter; 4 bread and butter plate doilies, 6½ inches in diameter, and 4 glass doilies, 5 inches in diameter.

**CENTERPIECE** . . . Starting at center, ch 12. Join. 1st rnd: Ch 4, 21 tr in ring. Join with sl st to 4th st of ch-4. 2nd rnd: Ch 5, tr in same place as sl st, \* ch 1, in next st make tr, ch 1 and tr. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 1, sl st in 4th st of ch-5. 3rd rnd: Sl st in next sp, ch 4, \* dc in next sp, ch 1. Repeat from \* around. Join to 3rd st of ch-4. 4th rnd: Sl st in next sp, ch 5, \* dc in next sp, ch 2. Repeat from \* around. Join to 3rd st of ch-5. 5th rnd: Ch 6, dc in same place as sl st, \* in next dc make dc, ch 3 and dc (shell made). Repeat from \* around. Sl st in 3rd st of ch-6. 6th, 7th and 8th rnds: Sl st in next ch, sl st in sp, ch 6, dc in same sp, \* in next ch-3 sp make dc, ch 3 and dc (shell). Repeat from \* around. Join. 9th rnd: Sl st in next ch, sl st in sp, ch 6, dc in same sp, make 2 more shells as before (3 shells made), \* ch 5, skip 1 shell, shell in next 3 shells. Repeat from \* around (each 3-shell group is the base of a spoke; there are 11 spokes in all). 10th rnd: Work 3 shells over 3 shells having 2 additional sts in ch bars between shell groups. 11th rnd: Same as previous rnd, having 1 additional st on ch bars between shell groups. 12th to 23rd rnds incl: Repeat the 10th and 11th rnds alternately (26 sts in ch bars between shell group on 23rd rnd). 24th rnd: Same as 11th rnd (27 ch between shell groups). 25th rnd: SI st across to sp of center shell of this group, ch 6, dc in same sp, \* ch 43, in sp of center shell of next group make a shell as before. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-43 to 3rd st of ch-6 (this begins scalloped edge). 26th rnd: SI st in next sp, ch 5, dc in same sp, \* ch 1, in next (ch-43) sp make dc, ch 2 and dc; ch 17, working over the ch bar below, sc in center st of ch on 24th rnd, ch 17, in next sp make dc, ch 2 and dc; ch 1, in sp of next shell make dc, ch 2 and dc. Repeat from \* around. Join.

Hereafter shells will be made of dc, ch 2 and dc. 27th rnd: SI st in next sp, ch 5, dc in same sp, ch 1, in sp of next shell make dc, ch 2 and dc; \* ch 1, in next sp make dc, ch 2 and dc; ch 27, in next sp make dc, ch 2 and dc, (ch 1, shell in sp of next shell) 3 times. Repeat from \* around. Join. 28th rnd: Sl st in next sp, ch 5, dc in same sp, (ch 2, shell in sp of next shell) twice; \* ch 25, (shell in sp of next shell, ch 2) 4 times; shell in sp of next shell. Repeat from \* around. Join. 29th rnd: Sl st in next sp, ch 5, dc in same sp, (ch 3, shell in next shell) twice; \* ch 12, working over the ch bar below sc in center st of chain on 2nd rnd below, ch 12, (shell in next shell, ch 3) 4 times; shell in next shell. Repeat from \* around. Join. 30th and 31st rnds: Same as 27th and 28th rnds respectively having ch-4 between shells; between scallops make ch 21 on 30th rnd and ch 19 on 31st rnd. 32nd rnd: Same as 29th rnd, having ch 5 between shells and ch 9 on both sides of the sc (between scallops). 33rd and 34th rnds: Same as 30th and 31st rnds, having ch 5 between shells on 33rd rnd and ch 6 on 34th rnd; between scallops make ch 16 on 33rd rnd and ch 15 on 34th rnd. 35th rnd: Same as 32nd rnd having ch 7 between shells and ch 7 on both sides of the sc between scallops. 36th and 37th rnds: Same as 33rd and 34th rnds, having ch 8 between shells on 36th rnd and ch 9 on 37th rnd; between scallops make ch 11 on 36th rnd and ch 9 on 37th rnd. 38th rnd: Sl st in next sp, ch 10, sc in 7th ch from hook, (ch 7, sc in same place as last sc) twice (triple p made); dc in same sp, (ch 10, dc in sp of next shell, ch 7, complete a triple p, dc in same sp) twice; \* ch 7, working over the ch bar below, sc in center st of ch on 36th rnd, ch 7, (dc in sp of next shell, ch 7; complete a triple p, dc in same sp, ch 10) 4 times; dc in next sp, complete a triple p, dc in same

sp. Repeat from \* around. Join and

PLACE DOILY (Make 4) . . . Starting at center, ch 10. Join. 1st rnd: Ch 3, 17 dc in ring. Join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-3. 2nd to 7th rnds incl: Work as for Centerpiece. 8th to 17th rnds incl: Same as 9th to 18th rnds incl of Centerpiece (9 spokes). 18th rnd: Same as 25th rnd of Centerpiece making ch 35 (instead of 43). 19th rnd: Same as 26th rnd of Centerpiece, making ch 15 (instead of 17). 20th to 27th rnds incl: Same as 27th to 34th rnds incl of Centerpiece, having 1, 2, 3, 4, 4, 5, 6, 7 ch's respectively between shells. Between scallops make 23 ch for 20th rnd, 21 for 21st rnd, ch 10 on both sides of the sc on the 22nd rnd; ch 17 for 23rd rnd, ch 15 for 24th rnd, ch 7 on both sides of the sc on the 25th rnd, ch 12 for 26th rnd and ch 11 for 27th rnd. 28th rnd: Sl st in next sp, ch 10, sc in 7th ch from hook, (ch 7, sc in same place as last sc) twice (triple p made); dc in same sp, (ch 8, dc in next sp, ch 7, complete a triple p, dc in same sp) twice; \* ch 5, working over the ch bar below, sc in center st of ch on 26th rnd, ch 5, (dc in sp of next shell, ch 7; complete a triple p, dc in same sp, ch 8) 4 times; dc in next sp, complete a triple p, dc in same sp. Repeat from \* around. Join and fasten off.


BREAD AND BUTTER PLATE DOILY (Make 4) ... Starting at center, ch 8. Join. 1st rnd: Ch 3, 13 dc in ring. Join. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, dc in same place as sl st, 2 dc in each dc around. Join (28 dc in rnd including starting ch). 3rd and 4th rnds: Same as 5th and 6th rnds respectively of Centerpiece. 5th to 10th rnds incl: Repeat 9th to 14th rnds incl of Centerpiece, having always 2 additional ch's between spokes on each successive rnd (7 spokes). 11th rnd: Same as 25th rnd of Centerpiece, making ch-25 (instead of ch-43). Shells of edging are also made of dc, ch-3 and dc on this piece and the Glass Doily. 12th rnd: Same as 26th rnd of Centerpiece, making ch-10 (instead of ch-17) on both sides of sc at center of scallops. 13th and 14th rnds: Repeat 27th and 28th rnds of Centerpiece, having ch-2 and ch-3 respectively between shells; between scallops make ch 9 for 13th rnd and ch 7 for 14th rnd. 15th rnd: Same as 38th rnd of Centerpiece having ch-5 between shells and ch-5 on both sides of sc between scallops. Fasten off.

GLASS DOILY (Make 4) ... Starting at center, ch 8. 1st rnd: Ch 3, 19 dc in ring. Join. 2nd to 6th rnds incl: Repeat 3rd to 7th rnds incl of Bread and Butter Plate Doily having 3 additional ch's (instead of 2) between spokes on each successive rnd (5 spokes). 7th rnd: Same as 25th rnd of Centerpiece, having 21 (instead of 43) ch's. 8th rnd: Same as 26th rnd of Centerpiece making ch 7 (instead of ch 17). 9th, 10th and 11th rnds: Repeat the last 3 rnds of Bread and Butter Plate Doily. Fasten off.

MATERIALS: CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 20:

Completed doily measures about 51/4 inches in diameter.

Ch 8, join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 5, d tr in ring, (ch 4, 2 d tr in ring) 5 times; ch 4, join with sl st in top st of 1st ch-5 made. 2nd rnd: Ch 1, sc in same place as sl st, ch 2, sc in next d tr, \* ch 4, sc in next d tr, ch 2, sc in next d tr. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-4 to 1st sc. 3rd rnd: Ch 5, \* in next ch-2 sp make d tr. ch 3, 2 d tr, ch 3 and d tr; d tr in next sc, ch 3, d tr in next sc. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-3 to top st of 1st ch-5 made. 4th rnd: Sl st to center of next ch-3 sp, ch 3, \* in next ch-3 sp

make dc, ch 3 and dc. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, join. 5th rnd: Ch 6, in same place as sl st make dc, ch 3 and dc, \* ch 3, sc between next 2 dc, ch 3, between next 2 dc make 3 dc with ch 3 between. Repeat from \* around, join last ch-3 to 3rd st of 1st ch made. 6th rnd: Sl st in next sp, ch 5, d tr in same sp, \* ch 3, 2 d tr in next sp, ch 9, skip ch 3, sc and ch 3, 2 d tr in next sp. Repeat from \* around. Join and turn. 7th rnd: SI st in ch 9, turn. Ch 1, sc in same place as sl st, \* ch 3, in next ch-3 sp make (dc, ch 3 and dc) twice; ch 3, sc in next ch-9, ch 6, sc in same

ch-9. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-6 to 1st sc made. 8th rnd: Sl st to 1st dc, ch 10, sc in same dc, \* ch 3, between next 2 dc make 3 dc with ch-3 between, ch 3, sc in next dc, ch 5, d tr in same dc, ch 3, d tr in next dc, ch 5, sc in same dc. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-3 to 5th st of ch-10 first made. 9th rnd: Ch 1, sc in same place as sl st, sc in next ch, \* (ch 5, 2 d tr in next sp) 4 times; ch 5, sc in top of ch-5, sc in next d tr, ch 2, sc in next d tr, sc in top of ch-5. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-2 to 1st sc. Fasten off.

#### Country COUSIN No. 7587 ..... Illustrated on opposite page

GAUGE: 10 dc make 1 inch; 4 rows make 1 inch.

Divide dark color into 3 balls.

PLACE MATS (Make 4) . . . Starting at long side with Dark color, ch 165 to measure 17 inches. 1st row: Dc in 4th ch from hook and in each ch across (163 dc counting turning ch as 1 dc). Ch 3, turn. 2nd and 3rd rows: Dc in each dc and in top st of turning ch. Ch 3, turn. 4th row: Dc in 7 dc; dc in next dc leaving the last 2 loops on hook, drop Dark, attach White and draw through 2 loops. \* Then, holding Light along top of previous row, make dc in next 4 dc (thus concealing Light); dc in next dc leaving last 2 loops on hook, drop White, pick up Light and draw

through 2 loops; holding White along top of previous row, make dc in next 4 dc (thus concealing White); dc in next dc leaving last 2 loops on hook, drop Light, pick up White and draw through 2 loops. Repeat from \* 13 more times. Carrying Light as before, make 4 White dc, dc in next dc leaving last 2 loops on hook, drop White and Light, attach another ball of Dark and draw through 2 loops; with Dark work 9 dc. Ch 3, turn. Hereafter, changing color and concealing unused color as before, work as follows: Work Dark border with balls already attached. 5th row: 9 Dark dc, 5 White dc, \* 5 Light dc, 5 White dc. Repeat from \* across, ending with 9 Dark dc. Fasten off White. Ch 3, turn. 6th row: 9 Dark dc, 5 Light dc attaching 3rd ball of Dark in last dc of last

group, \* 5 Dark dc, 5 Light dc. Repeat from \* across, ending with 9 Dark dc worked with border ball. Ch 3, turn. 7th row: 9 Dark dc, 5 Light dc, \* 5 Dark dc, 5 Light dc. Repeat from \* across, ending with 9 Dark dc worked with border ball. Fasten off 3rd ball of Dark. Ch 3, turn. Repeat the last 4 rows (4th to 7th rows incl) 8 more times; then the 4th and 5th rows once more. Fasten off all but 1 Dark ball. Work 3 rows of Dark border. Fasten off.

RUNNER . . . Starting at short side with Dark, ch 125 to measure 13 inches. Work as for Place Mat until piece measures 29½ inches ending with the 5th row of pattern. Fasten off all but 1 Dark ball. Work 3 rows of Dark border. Fasten off.

#### Memory Lane No. 7486

**MATERIALS:** CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 30:

SMALL BALL:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—123 balls,

J. & P. COATS —77 balls of White or Ecru, or 103 balls of

any color.

BIG BALL:

J. & P. COATS—38 balls of White or Ecru, or 51 balls of any color.

Steel crochet hook No. 10 or 11.

GAUGE: Each motif measures 4 inches square and  $5\frac{1}{2}$  inches diagonally. For a tablecloth about 72 x 110 inches make 488 motifs.

FIRST MOTIF ... Starting at center, ch 8. Join. 1st rnd: 18 sc in ring. Sl st in 1st sc made. 2nd rnd: Sc in same place as sl st, \* ch 5, skip 2 sc, sc in next sc. Repeat from \* around, ending with sl st in 1st sc made (6 loops). 3rd rnd: In each loop around make sc, h dc, 5 dc, h dc and sc (6 petals). 4th rnd: Ch 7, insert hook in next loop (from back of work) and in following loop (from right of work), thread over and draw loop through, thread over and draw through both loops on hook (a loop made). Make 5 more loops same as this. 5th rnd: In each loop around make sc, h dc, dc, 7 tr, dc, h dc and sc. 6th rnd: Sl st in 1st 4 sts of next petal, \* ch 5, sc in 4th ch from hook (p made), ch 2, p, ch 1, skip 5 tr, sc in next tr, ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, sc in 1st tr of next petal. Repeat from \* around (12 loops). 7th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop (between p's), ch 4, tr in same place as last sl st, ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, then holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make 2 tr in same place as last tr was made, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (2-tr cluster

made); \* ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, sc between p's of next loop, ch 9, sc between p's of next loop, ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, skip p of next loop and the following ch, make 2-tr cluster in next ch, ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, 2-tr cluster in same place as last cluster. Repeat from \* around. Join to 1st tr made.

8th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 4, tr in same place as last sl st, ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, 2-tr cluster in same place as last tr, \* ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, sc in next loop, ch 3, in ch-9 loop make (a 3-tr cluster, p) 3 times and a 3-tr cluster; ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, skip the p of next loop and the following ch, make a 2-tr cluster in next ch, ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, 2-tr cluster in same place as last cluster. Repeat from \* around. Join. 9th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 5, p, ch 1, tr in same loop, ch 1, p, ch 1, tr in same loop, \* ch 1, p, ch 1, tr between p's of next loop, ch 1, p, ch 1, tr in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, p, ch 1, skip next cluster, dc in tip of each of next 2 clusters, ch 1, p, ch 1, skip next cluster, tr in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, p, ch 1, tr between p's of next loop, ch 1, p, ch 1, in next loop (between p's) make 5 tr with ch 1, p, and ch 1 between each tr. Repeat from \* around. Join with sl st to 4th st of ch-5 first made. 10th rnd: Ch 17, tr in same place as sl st, \* (ch 1, p, ch 1, tr in next tr) 4 times; ch 1, p, ch 1, skip 1 dc, tr in next dc, (ch 1, p, ch 1, tr in next tr) 4 times; ch 1, p, ch 1, in next tr make tr, ch 13 and tr. Repeat from \* around. Join and fasten off.

SECOND MOTIF . . . Work as for 1st motif to 9th rnd incl. 10th rnd: Ch 10 (to count as tr and ch 6), sl st in center ch of corner loop of previous motif, ch 6, tr in same place as sl st, ch 3, sl st in corresponding p of 1st motif, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch preceding joining (thus joining p's) and continue as for 1st motif, joining next 9 p's and cor-

ner loop as before.

Make all motifs in same way, joining adjacent sides as 2nd motif was joined to 1st (where 4 corners meet, join 3rd and 4th corners to joining of previous 2. Place motifs in the following order: 1st row: 1 motif. 2nd row: 3 motifs (one extending on each side of previous row). 3rd row: 5 motifs. 4th row: 7 motifs. Continue thus having 2 more motifs on each row until there are 25 motifs in row. Make 7 more rows of 25 motifs each, having 1 motif extend beyond left edge and having 1 motif less on right edge. Now make 2 motifs less on each row (1 motif less on each side) until last row has 1 motif.

#### Summer Snowflake No. 7530.

GAUGE: Each motif measures 41/2 inches from loop to loop across center. For a tablecloth 72 x 90 inches, make

FIRST MOTIF . . . Starting at center, ch 10. Join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 3, 23 dc in ring, sl st in top of ch-3. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, \* ch 5, dc in next 3 dc. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 5, sl st in top of ch-3. **3rd rnd:** Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, \* ch 3, sc in next sp, ch 3, dc in next 3 dc. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, join. 4th rnd: Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, \* ch 5, then holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, work dc in next 2 sps, thread over and draw through all loops on hook, ch 5, dc in next 3 dc. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 5, join. 5th rnd: Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 3 dc in next sp, \* ch 9, 3 dc in next sp, dc in next 3 dc, 3 dc in next sp. Repeat from \* around, ending with 3 dc in last sp, sl st in top of ch-3. 6th rnd: Ch 3, dc in next 3 dc, \* ch 11, skip next sp and 2 dc of next dc-group, dc in next

5 dc. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 11, skip 2 dc, dc in last dc. Join. 7th rnd: Ch 3, then holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, work dc in next 2 dc, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made), \* ch 9, sc in ch-9 loop 2 rnds below (working over both ch bars), ch 9, skip 1 dc, then holding back on hook the last loop of each dc work dc in next 3 dc, thread over and draw through all loops on hook. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-9 with sl st to tip of 1st cluster. 8th rnd: Sl st in next 4 ch, sc in loop, \* ch 13, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around, ending with sl st in 1st sc made. 9th rnd: Sl st in next 6 ch, sc in loop, \* ch 15, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around, ending as before. Fasten off.


**SECOND MOTIF...** Work as for 1st motif to 8th rnd incl. 9th rnd: Sl st in next 6 ch, sc in loop, \* ch 7, sc in corresponding loop of 1st motif, ch 7, sc in next loop on motif in work. Repeat from \* once more and complete rnd as for 1st motif (no more joinings).





**EDGING...** Attach thread to joining between any 2 large motifs, \* 7 sc in 1st loop of next motif; in each free ch-15 loop of same motif make sc, h dc, 5 dc, 4 tr, 5 dc, h dc and sc; then work 7 sc in last loop (preceding joining). OR

J. & P. COATS —14 balls of White or Ecru, and 26 balls of variegated color.

BIG BALL:

J. & P. Coats—7 balls of White or Ecru, and 13 balls of variegated color.

Steel crochet hook No. 10 or 11.

GAUGE: Each motif measures about 3½ inches in diameter after blocking. For a tablecloth about 54 x 72 inches make 16 x 21 motifs.

FIRST MOTIF... Starting at center with White, ch 8. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 1, 24 sc in ring. Join with sl st to 1st sc. 2nd rnd: Ch 4, holding back last loop of each tr on hook made 2 tr in same place as sl st, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (2-tr cluster), ch 5, holding back last loop of each tr on hook make 3 tr in same place as last cluster, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (3-tr cluster), \* skip 3 sts, in next st make cluster, ch-5 and cluster. Repeat from \* around, joining last cluster with

sl st to tip of 1st cluster. 3rd rnd: Ch 4, make a 2-tr cluster in tip of cluster below, \* ch 4, make a 2-tr cluster in tip of cluster just made, 3-tr cluster in tip of next cluster below, ch 5, 3-tr cluster in tip of next cluster below. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-5 to tip of 1st cluster. Fasten off. 4th rnd: Attach variegated color to tip of 1st cluster of last rnd, ch 1, sc in same place where thread was attached, \* ch 9, sc in tip of next cluster. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 4, tr in 1st sc made. 5th rnd: (Ch 4, make a 2-tr cluster in top of joining tr of last rnd, ch 4, sl st in base of cluster) 3 times; \* ch 7, sc in center st of loop below, ch 5, make a 2-tr cluster in 5th ch from hook, ch 4, sl st in base of cluster, (ch 4, 2-tr

cluster in same place as last cluster, ch 4, sl st in base of cluster) twice. Repeat from \* around, joining last ch-7 to base of 1st cluster. 6th rnd: Sl st to tip of 1st cluster, \* ch 5, in tip of next cluster make sc, ch 5 and sc; ch 5, sc in tip of each of next 2 clusters. Repeat from \* around. Join and fasten off.

SECOND MOTIF . . . Work as for 1st motif until 5th rnd is completed. 6th rnd: Sl st to tip of 1st cluster, ch 5, sc in tip of next cluster, ch 2, drop loop from hook, insert hook in any ch-5 loop of 1st motif and pull loop through, ch 2, sc in tip of same cluster on 2nd motif, ch 5, sc in tip of each of the next 2 clusters, ch 5, sc in tip of next cluster, ch 2, join as before to next ch-5 loop of 1st motif, ch 2, sc in tip of same cluster on 2nd motif. Complete as for 1st motif. Fasten off.

Make 16 x 21 motifs, joining to adjacent motifs as 2nd motif was joined to 1st motif, leaving one ch-5 loop free between joinings.

FILL-IN-LACE . . . With White, ch 6, join. 1st rnd: Ch 1, 8 sc in ring. Join. 2nd rnd: Ch 1, sc in same place as sl st, ch 7, join to any free ch-5 loop, \* ch 7, sc in next sc on ring, ch 14, join to next joining of motifs, ch 14, sc in next sc on ring, ch 7, join to next free ch-5 loop. Repeat from \* around. Join and fasten off. Fill in all sps between motifs in same way.

#### Pineapples Nos. 7592—7592-M . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . Illustrated on pages 16-17

Ch 15, join with sl st to form a ring. 1st rnd: Ch 4, 43 tr in ring, sl st in top of ch-4. 2nd rnd: Ch 5, make tr in each tr making ch 1 between tr's. Join last ch-1 with sl st to 4th st of starting ch. 3rd rnd: Ch 6, make tr in each tr making ch 2 between tr's. Join as before. 4th rnd: Sl st in next ch, sc in sp, ch 4, sc in next sp. Continue making ch-4 loops around, ending with ch 1, dc in 1st sc made. 5th, 6th and 7th rnds: Ch 4, sc in next loop and continue making ch-4 loops around, ending with ch 1, dc in dc below. 8th rnd: Sl st in loop, ch 4, tr in same loop, \* ch 3, 2 tr in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 9th rnd: Sl st in next tr and in next sp, ch 3, in same sp make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc (shell made); in each sp around make a shell of 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 10th rnd: SI st in next dc and in next sp, ch 3 and complete a shell as before (shell over shell made), \* ch 1, shell in sp of each of next 2 shells. Repeat from \* around. Join. 11th rnd: Sl st in next dc and in next sp, ch 3 and complete a shell as before, \* ch 1, shell over next shell. Repeat from \* around. Join. 12th rnd: Make shell over shell increasing 1 ch in every other ch bar between shells. Join. 13th rnd: Make shell over shell increasing 1 ch in all remaining ch bars (where no increases were made on previous rnd). Repeat 12th and 13th rnds alternately until 30th rnd is completed (there are 22 ch-11 bars and 22 ch-10 bars between shells on 30th rnd).

31st rnd: Sl st in next dc and in next sp, ch 3, dc in same sp, ch 5, 2 dc in same sp, \* ch 11, shell over next shell, ch 11, in sp of next shell make 2 dc, ch 5 and 2 dc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 32nd rnd: SI st in next dc and in next sp, ch 4, 14 tr in same sp—this is base of pineapple; \* ch 7, shell over shell, ch 7, 15 tr in sp of next shell. Repeat from \* around. Join. 33rd rnd: Ch 5, make \* tr in each tr, making ch 1 between tr's; ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5. Repeat from \* around. Join to 4th st of ch-5. 34th rnd: Sc in sp, \* (ch 3, sc in next sp) 13 times; ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next ch-1 sp. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-5 to 1st sc made. **35th rnd:** Sl st in next ch, sc in loop, \* (ch 3, sc in next loop) 12 times; ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next ch-3 loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. **36th rnd:** Sl st in next ch, sc in loop, \* (ch 3, sc in next loop) 11 times; ch 5, in sp of next shell make (2 dc, ch 2) twice and 2 dc; ch 5, sc in next ch-3 loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 37th rnd: \* Work 10 loops across pineapple, ch 5, shell in 1st ch-2 sp, ch 3, shell in next ch-2 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-3 loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 38th rnd: \* Work 9 loops, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 1, shell in ch-3 sp—this starts stem of 2nd rnd of pineapples; ch 1, shell over next shell, ch 5, sc in next ch-3 loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 39th rnd: \* Work 8 loops, ch 5,

shell over shell, (ch 2, shell over shell) twice; ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 40th rnd: \* Work 7 loops, ch 5, shell over next shell, (ch 4, shell over next shell) twice; ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 41st rnd: \* Work 6 loops, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 6, in sp of next shell make 2 dc, ch 5 and 2 dc; ch 6, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 42nd rnd: \* Work 5 loops, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, 15 tr in sp of next shell—this is base of 2nd rnd of pineapples; ch 5, shell in next shell, ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 43rd rnd: \* Work 4 loops, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, tr in each tr making ch-1 between tr's, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. 44th rnd: \* Work 3 ch-3 loops, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in 1st ch-1 sp, (ch 4, sc in next sp) 13 times; ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 45th rnd: \* Work 2 ch-3 loops, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next loop, make 12 ch-4 loops, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 46th rnd: \* Work 1 ch-3 loop, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next ch-4 loop, make 11 ch-4 loops, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join.

47th rnd: Sl st in next ch, sc in loop, \* ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next ch-4 loop, make 10 ch-4 loops—hereafter all loops on pineapples will be ch-4 loops; ch 5, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 48th rnd: Ch 5, \* shell over shell, ch 5, work across pineapple, ch 5, shell over shell, ch 1, tr in next sc, ch 1. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-1 to 4th st of ch-5. 49th rnd: Ch 3, in same place as sl st make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc (shell made)—this starts stem of 3rd rnd of pineapples; ch 2, \* shell over shell, work across pineapple, shell over shell, ch 2, shell in tr, ch 2. Repeat from \* around. Join. 50th rnd: Sl st in next dc and in next sp, ch 3 and complete shell as before, ch 3, shell over shell, \* work across pineapple, shell over shell, (ch 3, shell over shell) twice. Repeat from \* around. Join. 51st rnd: Shell over shell, ch 5, shell over shell and continue in pattern around. Join. **52nd rnd:** Sl st to sp, ch 3, dc in same sp, ch 5, 2 dc in same sp, \* ch 7, shell over shell and continue in pattern around. Join. 53rd rnd: Sl st to sp, ch 4, 17 tr in same sp—this is base of 3rd rnd of pineapples; \* ch 5, shell over shell, work across pineapple, shell over shell, ch 5, 18 tr in loop of next shell. Repeat from \* around. Join.

Work in pattern as established, working stem for 4th rnd of pineapples exactly as stem for 3rd rnd of pineapples until 3rd rnd of stem is completed. Next rnd: Work across pineapple, shell over shell, (ch 7, shell over shell) twice; and continue in pattern around. Following rnd: Work across pineapple, shell over

shell, ch 9, in sp of next shell make 2 dc, ch 5 and 2 dc; ch 9, shell over shell and continue in pattern around. **Next rnd:** Work 21 tr for base of each pineapple of 4th rnd of pineapples.

Continue in pattern as before until 4th rnd of stem of next (5th) rnd of pineapples is completed. Next rnd: Same as previous rnd but working ch 9 on each side of stem shell. Following rnd: Sl st to sp, ch 4, tr in same sp, ch 7, 2 tr in same sp, \* ch 7, shell over shell, work across pineapple, shell over shell, in sp of next shell work 2 tr, ch 7 and 2 tr. Repeat from \* around. Join. Next rnd: Sl st to sp, ch 5, 23 d tr in same sp, ch 5, shell over shell and continue in pattern around, making 24 d tr for base of each pineapple of 5th rnd of pineapples. Join. Following rnd: Ch 6, make d tr in each d tr with ch 1 between d tr's, ch 5 and continue in pattern around. Join to 5th st of ch-6.

Continue in pattern, working 6th rnd of pineapples exactly the same as 5th rnd of pineapples until 2nd rnd of d tr's at base of 6th rnd of pineapples is completed. Now continue to work ch-4 loops as before on 5th pineapple but work ch-5 loops on 6th pineapple until 5th pineapple is completed (there are 14 loops on each pineapple of 6th rnd).

To make points, sl st to sp of next shell and work in rows over each pineapple separately as follows: 1st row: Ch 3 and complete shell as before, work across pineapple, shell over shell, ch 5, turn. 2nd row: Shell over shell, ch 5, work across pineapple, shell over shell, ch 5, turn. Repeat the 2nd row until 1 loop remains on pineapple. Ch 5, turn. Next row: Shell over shell, ch 4, sc in loop, ch 4, 2 dc in next shell, ch 1, sl st back in ch-2 of last shell, ch 1, 2 dc where last 2 dc were made. Fasten off. Attach thread to sp of shell on next pineapple; complete point in same manner. Continue thus until all points have been completed.

Work 2 rnds all around tablecloth as follows: 1st rnd: Attach thread to tip of one point where shells were joined, ch 3, at base of ch-3 make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. \* (Ch 3, shell in next turning ch between 2 rows) 7 times; ch 2, then holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, work dc in sp of next shell (on last complete rnd of tablecloth) and dc in sp of next shell (where thread was attached to work next point); thread over and draw through all loops on hook, (ch 3, shell in turning ch between 2 rows) 7 times; ch 3, shell at tip of next point where shells were joined. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-3 to top of starting ch. 2nd rnd: SI st in next dc and in next sp, ch 8, sc in 5th ch from hook (p made). Dc in same place as sl st, \* ch 3, sc under next ch-3, ch 3, in next shell make dc, p and dc. Repeat from \* 6 more times; ch 3, sc in tip of joined dc's, ch 3, in next shell make dc, p and dc. Ch 3, sc under next ch-3. Continue thus around. Fasten off.

SQUARE... Repeat from \* around. Join. 3rd rnd: Ch 4, tr in 8 tr,

\* 4 tr in corner sp, ch 7, 4 tr in same corner sp, tr in next 13 tr. Repeat from \* around. Join. 4th rnd: Ch 7, \* skip 3 tr, tr in next 9 tr, 4 tr in next sp, ch 7, 4 tr in same sp, tr in next 9 tr, ch 3. Repeat from \* around. Join with sl st to 4th st of ch-7. 5th rnd: Ch 4, \* 3 tr in next sp, tr in next tr, ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in 9 tr, 4 tr in next sp, ch 7, 4 tr in same sp, tr in 9 tr, ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in next tr. Repeat from \* around. Join. 6th to 20th rnds incl: Work in this manner following chart, making ch-3 for sps and ch-7 for each corner sp, and joining each rnd with a

sl st. The heavy line on chart shows where each rnd begins. At end of 20th rnd, join and fasten off.

Make 3 x 5 squares and sew together on wrong side with neat over-and-over sts.

from hook make dc, 2 tr, ch 5, sl st in last tr (p made), in same place make (2 tr, p) twice; 2 tr and dc, ch 2, sl st in same place (a large petal made). Ch 6, in 4th ch from hook make dc, 3 tr and dc; ch 2, sl st in same place, dc between 1st 2 petals, ch 5, 3 dc in 4th ch from hook, ch 2, sl st in same place, ch 1, sl st in last sc made on center, 2 sc in same loop on center, 5 sc in next loop. Repeat from \* 5 more times. Join and fasten off. 6th rnd: Attach thread to 1st of 3 p's on any large petal, \* ch 12, skip next p, sc in next p, ch 8, tr in tip of next petal, tr in tip of corresponding petal on next group, ch 8, sc in next p. Repeat from \* around. Join.



Join. 5th rnd: Ch 3, dc in same place as sl st, \* dc in next 3 dc, ch 2, dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc, (ch 4, sc in next loop) twice; ch 4, 2 dc in next dc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 6th rnd: Ch 3, dc in same place as sl st, \* dc in 4 dc, ch 3, dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next dc, (ch 4, sc in next loop) 3 times; ch 4, 2 dc in next dc. Repeat from \* around.

7th rnd: Ch 3, dc in 5 dc, \* ch 3, dc in 6 dc, (ch 4, sc in next loop) 4 times; ch 4, dc in 6 dc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 8th rnd: Ch 3, dc in 5 dc, \* ch 3, dc in 6 dc, (ch 4, sc in next loop) 5 times; ch 4, dc in 6 dc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 9th rnd: Ch 3, skip next dc, dc in 4 dc, \* ch 3, dc in 5 dc, (ch 4, sc in next loop) 6 times; ch 4, skip next dc, dc in 5 dc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 10th rnd: Ch 3, skip next dc, dc in 3 dc, \* ch 3, dc in 4 dc, (ch 4, sc in next loop) 7 times; ch 4, skip next dc, dc in 4 dc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 11th rnd: Ch 3, skip next dc, dc in 2 dc, \* ch 3,

dc in 3 dc, (ch 4, sc in next loop) 8 times; ch 4, skip next dc, dc in 3 dc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 12th rnd: Ch 4, skip 1 dc, tr in next dc, \* in next sp make tr, ch 5 and tr, skip 1 dc, 2 tr in next dc, (ch 5, sc in next loop) 9 times; skip 1 dc, 2 tr in next dc. Re-peat from \* around. Join and fasten off.

Picot Ridge . . . With right side facing, attach thread at base of 1st dc on 3rd rnd; work around outer edge of petal design as follows: Ch 1, sc in same place where thread was attached, ch 3, sc in base of 1st dc on 4th rnd, \* ch 3, dc in base of next rnd. Repeat from \* to base of 12th rnd, ch 3, sc in ch-3 sp of 12th rnd (between tr's), ch 5, sc in same sp, ch 3 and work along opposite side of petal to correspond, \*\* work 3 sc in sp between petals, work around following petal in same way. Repeat from \*\* around. Join. Next rnd: In each ch-3 loop of last rnd make 2 sc, ch 3 and 2 sc; in ch-5 loops at tip of each petal make 3 sc, ch 5 and 3 sc. Fasten off.

SECOND MOTIF . . . Work 11 rnds as for 1st motif. 12th rnd: Ch 4, skip 1 dc, tr in next dc, tr in next sp, ch 2, sc in corresponding loop on 1st motif, ch 2, tr in same sp, skip 1 dc, 2 tr in next dc, (ch 2, sc in next loop on 1st motif, ch 2, sc in next loop on 2nd motif) 9 times; skip 1 dc, 2 tr in next dc, tr in next sp, ch 2, sc in corresponding loop on 1st motif, ch 2, tr in same sp, finish rnd as for 1st motif. Fasten off. Work picot ridge as before.



Join to 3rd st of 1st ch. 6th rnd: Sl st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp, (ch 5, sc in next sp) 5 times; \* ch 7, sc in next ch-1 sp, (ch 5, sc in next sp) 5 times. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-7 to 1st sc. 7th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 1, sc in same loop, \* (ch 5, sc in next loop) 4 times; ch 3, in center st of chain below make 6 dc, ch 3, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 8th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 1, sc in same loop, \* (ch 5, sc in next loop) 3 times; ch 3, dc in next 6 dc with ch-1 between, ch 3, skip next sp, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 9th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 1, sc in same loop, \* (ch 5, sc in next loop) twice; ch 4, sc in next ch-1 sp, (ch 5, sc in next sp) 4 times; ch 4, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 10th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 1, sc in same loop, \* ch 5, sc in next loop, ch 5, skip next sp, sc in next loop, (ch 5, sc in next loop) 3 times; ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. 11th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 1, sc in same loop, \* ch 8, skip next sp, sc in next loop, (ch 5, sc in next loop)



Join. 6th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 1, sc in same loop, ch 7, se in next loop, ch 7, join to 4th st of a free ch-11 between motifs, \* ch 7, sc under the next ch-10 of Fill-inmotif, ch 7, join to corresponding st on next ch-11 on motif, ch 7, sc in next loop on Fill-in-motif, ch 7, sc in next loop on Fill-in-motif, ch 7, join as before to next free ch-11 between motifs. 



**SECOND MOTIF...** Work as for 1st motif to 9th rnd incl. 10th rnd: Sl st in next dc and in sp, ch 3, dc in same sp, (ch 7, sc in next loop) twice; ch 7, in next sp make 7 tr, ch 5; sl st in corresponding (corner) loop on 1st motif, ch 5, 7 tr in same sp on 2nd motif where last 7 tr were made; (ch 3, sl st in next loop on 1st motif, ch 3, sc in next loop on 2nd motif) twice; ch 3, sl st in next loop on 1st motif, ch 3, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc make 2 dc in sp of each of next 2 shells, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made); (ch 3, sl st in next loop on 1st motif, ch 3, sc in next loop on 2nd motif) twice; ch 3, sl st in next loop on 1st motif, ch 3, in next sp make 7 tr, ch 5, sl st to corresponding (corner) sp on 1st motif, ch 5, 7 tr in same sp on 2nd motif where last 7 tr were made; complete rnd as for 1st motif (no more joinings). Fasten off.

Make 17 x 22 motifs, joining adjacent sides as 2nd motif was joined to 1st (wherever 4 corners meet, join 3rd and 4th corners to joining of other corners).

MATERIALS: J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN

15 balls of White or Ecru, or 23 balls of any color. Steel

Steel crochet hook No. 6.

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures  $3\frac{3}{4}$  inches in diameter (from cluster to cluster). For a tablecloth about  $60 \times 80$  inches, make 408 motifs.

FIRST MOTIF... Starting at center, ch 6. Join. 1st rnd: Ch 1, 12 sc in ring. Sl st in 1st sc made. 2nd rnd: Ch 4, 2 tr in same place as sl st, \* ch 5, sc in

4th ch from hook (p made), ch 1, skip 1 sc, 3 tr in next sc. Repeat from \* around. Join. 3rd rnd: Ch 4, tr in same place as sl st, \* tr in next tr, 2 tr in next tr, ch 2, p, ch 2, 2 tr in next tr. Repeat from \* around. Join. 4th rnd: Ch 4, tr in same place as sl st, \* tr in next 3 tr, 2 tr in next tr, ch 9, skip p, 2 tr in next tr. Repeat from \* around. Join. 5th rnd: Ch 4, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make tr in same place as sl st and tr in next 2 tr, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made), \* ch 5, sl st in next st, ch 5; holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make tr in next 2 tr and 2 tr in next tr, thread over and complete cluster as before (4-tr cluster made); ch 6, in center st of ch-9 below

make sc, ch 4 and sc; ch 6, make a 4-tr cluster over next 3 tr, making 2 tr in 1st tr and tr in next 2 tr. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-6 to tip of 1st cluster made.

second motif. 5th rnd: Complete 1st cluster as for 1st motif, sl st in tip of corresponding cluster of 1st motif, ch 5, sl st in next st on motif in work, ch 5, complete another cluster as before, sl st in tip of next cluster on 1st motif, and complete rnd as for 1st motif (no more joinings). Make 408 motifs in all and join them as in diagram for joining hexagon motifs on page 31, having 19 motifs from A to B, and 21 motifs from A to C.

away excess linen underneath and making a hem. Attach thread to linen edge ½ inch from lace and work as follows: Ch 5, sc in same place (a loop made), \* ch 7, skip ½ inch on linen edge, make sc, ch 5 and sc in same place. Repeat from \* across to within last ½ inch, having an uneven number of loops. Fasten off. Work in this manner along opposite edge and the two short edges.

Now attach thread to 1st loop on corner lace and work around corner and all around tray mat as follows: Ch 4 and complete a cluster in same loop, (ch 7, 3-tr cluster in same loop) twice; ch 3, skip 5 tr, sc in next tr, ch 5, sc in next tr, ch 3, in next loop make four 3-tr clusters with ch-7 between; ch 3, skip 5 tr, sc in next tr, ch 5, sc in next tr, ch 3, 20 tr in next loop, ch 1, turn, sc in each tr of tr-group, ch 4, turn, tr in next 3 sts holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, thread over and draw through all loops on hook, (ch 7, make a 4-tr cluster over next 4 sts) 3 times; ch 7, make a 3-tr cluster over next 3 sts, ch 4,

sc in next sc, ch 3, skip 5 tr, sc in next tr; ch 5, sc in next tr, ch 3, in next loop make four 3-tr clusters with ch-7 between, ch 3, skip 5 tr, sc in next tr, ch 5, sc in next tr, ch 3, in next loop make three 3-tr clusters with ch-7 between; ch 3, sc in next ch-5 loop, ch 3, in next ch-5 loop make three 3-tr clusters with ch-7 between; ch 3, sc in next ch-5 loop and continue thus all around. Fasten off.



**Note:** Chart shows one quarter of design. To make second half of each row, repeat the first half, starting from center and working back.

Starting with 7th row, \*follow chart until 25th row is complete. Ch 3, turn. **26th row:** 3 bls, 3 sps, 4 bls, 1 sp, 3 bls, 1 sp, 5 bls, 3 sps, 2 bls. Ch 3, turn. Starting with 27th row, follow chart to top; then reverse chart and work back to 27th row incl (149 short rows). Fasten off. Count 25 bls and sps in from opposite edge, attach thread to 4th dc of

next bl and work to correspond, working back to the 26th row (not 27th row) incl (150 short rows). Do not fasten off but ch 449 and complete 26th row at opposite side. Then follow chart to 1st row, working across chain. Fasten off.

Cut linen into a square to fit center of lace allowing for a narrow hem. Hem linen and sew to lace.



#### General Information

**IMPORTANT**... Be sure to buy at one time sufficient material of the same dye lot to complete the article you wish to make, as it is impossible to avoid slight variations in color in different dye lots.

**GAUGE**... Before starting your article, make a small sample of the stitch or motif. If your working tension is too tight or too loose, use a finer or coarser needle, to obtain the correct gauge.

BLOCKING DIRECTIONS . . . Following measurements given, with rustproof pins pin article right side down on a well padded flat surface. If article is too large for pressing table. block in sections of convenient size. Be sure to pin out all picots, loops, scallops, etc., along outside edges. Press through a damp cloth with a moderately hot iron (do not rest iron on decorative raised stitches). When thoroughly dry, remove pins.

TO LAUNDER COTTON ARTICLES . . . Before laundering. record all important measurements. Launder article in warm water, using a good neutral soap or soap flakes. Do not

use bleaching solutions! Allow to dry thoroughly on a flat surface. Then block article, following Blocking Directions.
