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Abbreviations of Crochet Stitches

St stands for stitch.

Ch stands for chain and is made thus: Catch thread with hook, making a loop. Draw thread thru the loop. This makes the first stitch. Repeat, drawing thread thru as many loops as required. Each loop is termed a chain.

Sl st stands for slip stitch, made thus: Insert hook into the work; draw thread thru work and the loop on the hook at the same time.

* Asterisk. Means that the work is to be repeated from the preceding *

Se stands for single crochet: Insert hook into the work, draw thread thru, making 2 loops on the hook. Place thread over the hook and draw thru both loops.

De or double crochet: Thread over hook; draw thru work; thread over hook, draw thru 2 loops twice.

Sde or short double crochet: Thread over hook once; draw thru work; thread over hook, draw thru all 3 loops at once.

Tr or treble crochet. Thread over hook twice; draw thru work; thread over hook, draw thru 2 loops 3 times.

Tt or triple treble crochet: Thread over hook 3 times; draw thru work; thread over hook, cast off 2 loops 4 times.

Ltr or long treble crochet: Thread over hook 5 times, cast off 2 loops twice. Ch. 6.—Keeping remaining loops on hook, sl st into 5th ch from hook for pi. Bring hook under 2nd loop on the hook; then cast off 2 loops 3 times.

B or Ba stands for bar and is made thus: Ch. 5.—1 dc.

La or lacet: Ch. 3.—1 sc into ch of 5.—ch. 3.—1 dc.

Om or M stands for open mesh; Ch. 2.—skip 2 ch.— 1 dc in next ch.

Sm or solid mesh: 1 dc in each of 4 following sts.

Skip 2 chs.—1 tt (thread over hook 3 times) into last ch.—Turn. 2nd Row: 1 sl st in last dc before tt was made.—Ch 5.—1 dc in next dc, then 75 om.—Turn. 3rd Row: Ch 5.—17 om.—4 dc or 1 sm.—13 om.—1 sm.—20 om.—16 dc or 5 sm.—17 om.—1 tt in next dc.—Turn.

Follow design for rest of pattern. French hem a 38-inch

Finish a piece of linen 13¼ inches square with French hem and sew diagonal side to the linen. Make 2 rows of om around the entire napkin. Then 1 row of sm, making 1 pi of 4 chs in every 5th mesh.

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
