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The chain may be called the fundamental stitch in crochet, for on this rest all the others. Make a loop of thread around the needle, put the thread over and draw through this loop, forming a new stitch or loop, and so continue until the chain is of the length required. The abbreviation for chain is ch.

The slip-stitch is properly a close joining stitch: Drop the stitch on the needle, insert hook through the stitch of work to which you wish to join, take up the dropped stitch and pull through, thus making a close fastening. The abbreviation is sl st.

Single crochet (frequently called slip-stitch, and sometimes mitten-stitch) is made thus: Having a stitch on

needle, insert hook in work, take up the thread and draw it through the work and the stitch on the needle at the same time. The abbreviation is sc.

Double crochet. Having a stitch on needle, insert hook in work, take up thread and draw through, giving

you two stitches on the needle; take up thread and draw through the two stitches. The abbreviation is d c .

Treble crochet. Having a stitch on the needle, take up the thread as if to make a stitch, insert hook in work, take up thread and draw through, making three stitches or loops on the needle; * take up thread and draw through

two, again and draw through two. The abbreviation for treble crochet, is $t r$. It will be noted that the single crochet has one "draw," the double two, and the treble three, from which these stitches take their names.

Half-treble or short-treble crochet. Like treble to *; then take up thread and draw through all three stitches at once.

Double treble. Thread over twice, hook in work, thread over hook, draw through the work, making four stitches on the needle, (thread over and draw through two) three times. The abbreviation is d tr.

Triple treble. Thread over three times, hook in work, thread over hook, draw through work, making five stitches on the needle. Work off the stitches two at a time. The abbreviation is t tr .

Quadruple treble has the thread over needle sour times before inserting in work. Longer stitches are made in the same way.

Picots, frequently used to finish the edges of crochetlace and other work, are made in various ways, directions usually accompanying the piece of work on which they are used. For a closed picot, make a chain of three, four, five or more stitches, according to size of picot wanted, and join

in a loop by catching into the 1st stitch of chain (the last, counting from hook), drawing closely together. Open picots are not caught in 1st stitch of chain but are made between two stitches placed close together. The abbreviation is p .

Roll-stitch. This stitch, revived as are so many of the "new" things, was formerly called bullion-stitch. It consists simply of a coil of "overs" through which the thread is drawn. Working on any foundation, and having a stitch on the needle, wind thread around the latter smoothly ten times, or as many times as called for by your directions-such details are always given; insert hook in work, take up thread and draw through, again and draw carefully through the coil on the needle, again and draw through the remaining stitch. A slender needle, tapering to the hook, is better for the purpose than a straight one, and its passage through the coil or roll is facilitated if the latter be held firmly between the thumb and finger of the left


Roll-Stitch hand as the hook is worked through by the right. The length of the roll-stitch is determined by the number of "overs" used. Abbreviation is roll st.

## TERMS USED IN FILET-CROCHET

Space. Spaces are the open squares on the chart. They are made by working chain 2 , miss 2 , treble in next stitch. The abbreviation is sp.

Blocks. These form the solid or close parts of the work. They are made of three trebles. Where one block stands alone there will be 4 trebles in the group, of which the first belongs to the previous space; where two blocks stand alone there will be 7 trebles in the group, 3 each for the two blocks and 1 for the previous space; while three blocks will contain 10 trebles, that is, 9 for the blocks and 1 for the space. It will be seen that any group of blocks will have three times as many trebles as there are blocks, with one additional for the space. When working trebles into trebles always take up two threads. The abbreviation is bl.


## Filet-Crochet

Parentheses () and asterisks or stars (*) are used to prevent the necessity of repetition and to save space. They indicate repeats of like directions. Thus: (Chain 3, miss 3, 1 treble in next) 3 times, is equivalent to chain 3 , miss 3,1 treble in next, chain 3 , miss 3 , 1 treble in next, chain 3 , miss 3,1 treble in next; or to $*$ chain 3 , miss 3,1 treble in next, repeat from * twice.

## PORTIERE IN FILET-CROCHET



Figure 1. Use No. 5 crochet-cotton, with a hook of suitable size to carry the thread smoothly, and do firm, even work. Make a chain of 148 stitches, turn.

1. Miss 4, a d tr in each following st of ch, turn.
2. Ch 6, miss 4 of ch, a d tr in 5 th and 6 th st, and 4 in 4 $\mathrm{d} \operatorname{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$ (of ch 2, miss 2, a d tr in next), 3 more d tr, * 37 $\mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{dtr}$ (counting all), $6 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{dtr}$, turn.
3. Narrow (by slipping to 4 th d tr, ch $4,2 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{tr}$ in sp , and dtr in dtr$), 5 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{dtr}, 14 \mathrm{sp}, 22 \mathrm{dtr}, 17 \mathrm{sp}, * 4 \mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4$
d tr, making the 4th thus: Having the 4 st on needle, take up thread and draw through 1 st, then work off as usual; the extra st gives 1 ch in which to insert the hook for the next d tr, make 2 more in this way, then the next as usual, turn. Or, if preferred, a ch for this widening may be made at beginning of 2 d row, thus: Ch 11, drop the st on hook; insert hook in next st, pick up the dropped st and pull through, repeating until you have slipped over 4 st , then miss 4 ch , a d tr in each of next $2,4 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{tr}$ in 4 d tr . The working-pattern may now be followed.


## PEACOCK-DESIGN IN FILET-CROCHET

Figure 2. Use mercerized crochet-cotton of a size which will give 4 spaces to the inch, or according to size of square wanted. The model is of dimensions suitable for pillowcover or chair-back.
Make a chain of 188 stitches, turn.

1. A tr in 8 th st, for $1 \mathrm{st} \mathrm{sp},(2 \mathrm{ch}$, miss $2,1 \mathrm{tr}$, forming a sp) 60 times, turn.
$2,3,4$. Ch 5 , tr in next tr (for 1 st sp of row), 60 sp , turn.
2. Five sp , $(10 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}) 8$ times, $10 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
3. Four sp, ( $7 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$ ) 17 times, $7 \mathrm{tr}, 4 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
4. Four sp, ( $4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$ ) 8 times, $4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$,

4 sp , turn.
8. Like 6th row.
9. Five sp , ( 10 $\operatorname{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}) 8$ times, $10 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
10. Eight sp, (10 $\mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}) 7$ times, 10 tr, 8 sp , turn.
11. Five sp, 10 $\operatorname{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 130 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$, $10 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
12. Four $\mathrm{sp},(7$ $\mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp})$ twice, 4 tr , *39 sp, * 4 tr, (1 sp, 7 tr ) twice, 4 sp , turn.
13. Four sp, 4 $\mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$, $4 \mathrm{tr}, * 39 \mathrm{sp}, * 4 \mathrm{tr}$, $1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, 4 sp , turn.
14. Border (like 12 th to $\left.{ }^{*}\right) ; 6 \mathrm{sp},(7$ tr, 2 sp ) twice, 7 tr , 23 sp ; border (like 12th from *).
15. Five $\mathrm{sp}, 10$ $\mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}, * 4 \mathrm{sp}$, $10 \mathrm{tr}, 12 \mathrm{sp}$, ( $7 \mathrm{tr}, 2$ sp) 3 times, 7 tr, 6 $\mathrm{sp}, * 7 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}$, 5 sp , turn.

51 to 61. Same as 11th to 1st.
The edge may be finished with fringe, as shown, or with a crocheted scallop. For the fringe, wind the thread around a card seven inches wide as many times as desired for thickness of fringe-say five times; slip off, double, put loop through a space, bring the end through loop, draw up, and repeat. Clip ends of fringe evenly.
In finer thread this pattern makes an effective inset for a table-runner, or it may be applied to a wide variety of purposes which will suggest themselves to the worker.

Figure 3. Five balls of No. 5 crochet-thread, ecru, were used; choose a hook that will carry the thread easily and smoothly, yet do close, even work. Make a chain of 20 stitches.

1. A tr in 8 th st from hook, ch 2 , miss 3 , shell of $2 \mathrm{tr}, 2$ ch and 2 tr in next, ch 2, miss $2,1 \mathrm{tr}$, ch 2, miss $2,1 \mathrm{tr}$, turn.
2 to 21. Ch $5, * \operatorname{tr}$ in $\operatorname{tr}$, ch 2 , shell in shell, ch 2 , $\operatorname{tr}$ in $\operatorname{tr}$, ch $2, \operatorname{tr}$ in 3d of 5 ch , turn.
2. Like 2 d row; do not turn at end but ch 18, miss 4 sp , fasten in next tr back, ch 3, fasten at end of next row back, turn.
3. Twenty-seven tr under 18 ch , and continue the border or insertion like 2 d row from *.
4. Border (like 2d row, always); (ch 3, miss 3 tr of

36 to 55 . Like 2 d row (border).
56 to 68 . Same as 22 d to 34 th row.
69. Oh 3, a d c over the 3 ch , as before, ch $3,3 \mathrm{tr}$ in shell, fasten in end of strap of 14 tr , continue from 1st $*$ in 35th row until you have made the four long straps, then (ch 3, fasten over 3 ch , ch 3 , shell in shell) 7 times, ch 3 , fasten over $3 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{ch} 3, \mathrm{tr}$ in tr; border.
70. Border; (ch 5 , shell in shell) 7 times, ch 5 , shell in center of next shell, with strap, ch 5 , miss 11 tr of strap and make a shell between next 2, also under the 3 ch at end of 4 th strap of 35 th row, ch 5 , shell between 22 d and 23 d tr of same strap and also under 3 ch of 3 d strap of 35 th row, ch 5 , shell between 34th and 35 th tr of strap and under 3 ch at end of 2 d strap, ch 5 , shell under 3 ch at end of strap you

28. Border; (ch 9, fasten with a d c in center of shell) 5 times, ch 9; like 24th from *.
29. (Twelve tr under 9 ch$) 6$ times, tr in tr ; border.
30. Border; * ch 1, miss 1, tr in next, repeat from * around scallop, ch 1 ; like 24 th from *.
31. Ch 1 , tr under 1 ch ; repeat around scallop, ch $1, \mathrm{tr}$ in tr; border.
32. Border; (ch 3, miss 2 sp , shell in next) 12 times, ch 3; like 24th from *.
33. (Ch 4, shell in shell) 12 times, ch 4, tr in tr; border.
34. Border; (ch 5, shell in shell) 12 times, ch 5 ; like 24th from *.
35. (Ch 3, fasten with a d cover ch of 3 previous rows, ch 3 , shell in shell) 7 times, * ch 3 , a d c over 3 ch , as before, ch $3,3 \mathrm{tr}$ in next shell, ch 49, turn, miss 3, a tr in each of 46 st of ch, 3 tr in same shell, repeat from *3 times, ch 3, a d c over $3 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{ch} 3,3 \mathrm{tr}$ in next shell, ch 17, turn, miss 3, a tr in each of $14 \mathrm{st}, 3$ more tr in same shell, ch 3 , fasten over the 3 ch, ch $3, \operatorname{tr}$ in tr ; border.
have been working down and also under 3 ch at end of 1st strap of 35 th row, thus joining the ends of the two straps at center of point. Work up 1st strap of 35 th row in same way, that is, make a shell between 11th and 12th tr, counting from you, also under 3 ch at end of 3 d strap in 69 th row, lacing this strap under the 4 th, over the 3 d and under the 2d strap of 35 th row, ch 5 , shell between 23 d and 24 th tr, also under 3 ch of 2 d strap of 69th row, bringing this over the 4th, under 3d and over 2 d of 35 th row, ch 5 , shell between 35 th and 36 th tr , and under 3 ch at end of 1st strap of 69th row, lacing this as you did the 3d strap, ch 5, shell in center of shell with 1st strap of 35th row, (ch 5, shell in center of next shell) 7 times, ch 5; like 24th from *.
71. (Ch 6, shell in shell) 23 times, ch 6, tr in tr; border.
72. Border; (ch 6, shell in shell) 23 times, ch 6 ; like 24th from *.
73. (Ch 4, fasten over the ch of 3 preceding rows, ch 4 , 3 tr in shell, ch 4, fasten back in 1st st of ch for a p, 3 tr in same shell) 23 times, ch 4, fasten over $3 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{ch} 4, \mathrm{tr}$ in tr ; border.

Attach a tassel to the shell at center of point; wind the thread 15 times or more over a card nine inches across, slip off, double, put the loop through shell, bring the ends up through the loop, draw up evenly and clip the ends.

This scarf-end is very rich-looking and of unusual design. The border alone, repeating the 2 d row, makes a simple and pretty insertion for towels.

# CENTERPIECE-BORDERS AND TABLE-MATS 

## Pineapple-and-Fan Border in Roll-Stitch

Figure 4. Strike a circle on linen of desired size; the model is seven and one-half inches in diameter, but the border will be found very rich and handsome for any cen-

terpiece, plain or embroidered, of any size. Stitch the line on the machine, and just inside the line stitch with unthreaded needle. Cut outside the stitched line and work over the edge with double crochet, inserting the hook in the perforations made by the unthreaded needle, joining last double to 1st. The work is thus very quickly and easily done, and more even. No. 20 mercerized crochetcotton was used for the piece illustrated, but any number preferred may be chosen.

1. Ch $5, \mathrm{a}$ tr in same st, * ch 5 , miss 4 , a d c in next, ch 5 , miss $4,2 \mathrm{tr}$, separated by 2 ch , in next; repeat from * around, joining last 5 ch to 3 d of 1 st 5 ch . There must be an even number of the groups of tr .
2. A d c under 2 ch , ch $3, * 4$ roll-st (over 15 times) under same 2 ch , ch 4, 9 roll-st (over 22 times) under next 2 ch, ch 4; repeat from * around, join.
3. Ch 3,4 roll-st over 4 roll-st, ch 4 , fasten between 2 roll-st with a d c, (ch 5 , a d c between next 2) 7 times, ch 4 ; repeat, join.
4. Ch 3, 6 roll-st over 4 roll-st and under ch each side, ch 4 , fasten in loop of 5 ch, (ch 5 , fasten in next loop) 6 times, ch 4 ; repeat around, join.
$5,6,7,8,9$. Same as 4th row, decreasing the loops across pineapple by 1 each row, and increasing the roll-st in the fan by 2 each row, as directed. The 9 th row will have 1 loop and 16 roll-st.
5. Ch $3, * 16$ roll-st in 16 roll-st and 1 in ch each side, ch 4 , fasten in loop, ch 4 ; repeat around, join.
6. (Ch 6, fasten between roll-st) 17 times, ch 4, fasten under 4 ch , ch 2 , fasten under next 4 ch ; repeat around, and fasten off neatly.

## Doily with Cluny Border

Figure 5. Arrange a linen center four and one-half inches in diameter as directed for Figure 4, with the row of doubles, closely worked over the edge. Use No. 50 or No. 60 crochet-cotton.

1. Ch 5, * miss 2, 1 tr, ch 2 ; repeat from * around, joining to 3 d of 5 ch ; there should be a number of sp divisible by 8 , allowing 8 sp to each scallop.
2. Two de in sp and dc in tr; repeat around, join.
3. (Ch 5 , miss 3 , fasten between next 2) 4 times, ch $5,4 \mathrm{ttr}$ in same place, keeping top loops on needle and working all off at once, make a tight ch to close the cluster, ch 3 , miss 7 d c , a tr in next, ch 8, turn, fasten in top of cluster, (ch $5,3 \mathrm{t}$ tr under ch last made, keeping top loops on needle and working off as before, with a tight ch to close, ch 5 , fasten under same ch) 3 times, miss 7 d c, 4 t tr in next, forming a cluster as before, ch 5 , fasten in same place; repeat around, join.
4. Slip to middle of 1st loop, (ch 5, fasten in next loop) 3 times, (ch $10,2 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in top of next cluster) 3 times, ch 10, fasten in 1st loop of 5 ch ; repeat around, join.
5. Slip to middle of 1 st loop, (ch 5 , fasten in next loop) twice, ch 3 , fasten in 3 d of 10 ch , ch 5, miss 3 of 10 ch , fasten, (ch 5 , fasten between 2 d c at top of cluster, ch 5 , fasten in 3 d of 10 ch , ch 5 , miss 3 , fasten) 5 times, ch 3 , fasten in 1st loop of 5 ch ; repeat around, join.
6. Slip to middle of 1 st loop, ch 5 , fasten in next loop, ch 3 , fasten in next, (ch 5 , fasten in next) 9 times, ch 3 , fasten in next; repeat around, join and fasten off.

## Cover for Asbestos Mat

Figure 6. Using No. 30 crochet-cotton, make a chain of 26 stitches, turn.

1. Miss 3 for 1 st $\mathrm{tr}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$ in next st, a tr in each of $21 \mathrm{st}, 5$ tr in next (or end) st, a tr in each st along other side of ch, join to top of 3 ch .
2. Ch 3, a tr in same place, (ch $2,2 \mathrm{tr}$ in next st) 4 times,

* ch 2, miss 3, 2 tr in next, repeat from * along the side, work around the end same as at first, and along the side like opposite side, joining last 2 ch to top of 3 ch . It will be seen that by adding to the foundation-ch the mat may be made of any required size, 4 extra st being added for each repeat along the side.

3. Ch 3 for a tr, tr between tr and $1 \mathrm{in} \mathrm{tr} \mathrm{*} \mathrm{ch} 2,,3 \mathrm{tr}$ over $2 \operatorname{tr}$ ( 1 in each $\operatorname{tr}$ and 1 between), repeat around, joining last 2 ch to top of 3 ch .
4. Same as 3 d row, making 4 tr over 3 tr , join.
$5,6,7,8$. Same as 4th row, adding a tr to the solid sections, or spokes each row. This widening may be continued for several more rows for a larger mat.
9. Sl st between 3 ch and tr , ch 3 for a tr, a tr between each following tr, * ch 2, a tr under $2 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{ch} 2$, a tr between each of 8 tr , and repeat from *, joining as before.
10. Like 9 th to ${ }^{*}$, decreasing 1 tr , (ch 2 , a tr under 2 ch ) twice, ch 2, a $\operatorname{tr}$ between each 2 tr of next spoke; repeat around, join.
$11,12,13,14$. Same as 10 th row, decreasing each spoke 1 tr and adding 1 sp between spokes.
15. Sl st between 3 ch and tr , ch $5, *$ (a tr in next tr, ch 2) 6 times, tr between 2 tr; repeat from * around and join to 3 d of 5 ch .

16,17 . Ch $5, *$ tr in next tr, ch 2 , repeat from * around and join to 3d of 5 ch .
18. Ch 4, * tr in next tr, ch 1 ; repeat around and join to 3 d of 4 ch . The last 3 rows fold over the edge of mat to the wrong side and hold it in place.
19. For the edge, worked in 15 th row, 3 d tr (ch 4 for 1st) in a sp, ch $2,3 \mathrm{~d}$ tr in same sp, miss 1 sp , repeat around and join to top of 4 ch .
20. Three half tr under 2 ch of shell, ch 4, 3 half tr under same 2 ch , a d c between shells; repeat around and fasten off neatly. Any preferred edge may be used, but this is simple and attractive.

## Hot-Dish Mat

Figure 7. Use carpet-warp, coarse knittingcotton, crochet-cord or crochet-cotton of any desired size. No 25 linen thread makes a heavy, durable and rich-looking mat. Chain 5 , join.

1. Make 8 d c in the ring, join to Ist d c with a s c , turn.
2. Two d c in each d c (always working in back vein of st to form a rib), join and turn.
3. A d c in each d c, join and turn. All odd rows the same.
4. Three $\mathrm{d} c$ in 1st st, 1 in next; repeat around, join and turn.
5. Two d c in 1st st, 1 in each of 3 ; repeat around, join and turn.
6. Three d c in 1st, 1 in each of 4 ; repeat, join and turn.

Continue in this way, always working the row of plain doubles between the widening rows, increasing 2 stitches between corners in 1 widening row (as in 4th), and 1 stitch in next widening row (as in 6th), until you have completed 9 ribs outside of center, or the center is as wide as desired with the material used. The hexagons made for the set, of which one of the oval mats is illustrated, are four inches in diameter. Join two of them on one side by crocheting together, and one between these two on two sides.

For the border:

1. Fasten in the joining between two hexagons, ch 3 for a tr, 2 tr in same place, $* \mathrm{ch} 4$, miss 6 de (or one third the distance across the section or gore), 3 tr in next, (ch 4, miss $6,3 \mathrm{tr}$ in next) twice, the last group coming at point of hexagon, repeat from * along next two sides, ch 4, 3 tr in joining, or between hexagons, and continue around the mat, joining last ch to top of 1st tr.
2. Slip to $2 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch} 3,3 \mathrm{tr}$ in same place, * $\mathrm{ch}, 3 \mathrm{tr}$ in 2 d of next 3 tr , repeat around, join.
3. Same as 2 d row, with 7 ch between groups of tr .
4. A d c in 2 d of $3 \mathrm{tr},(2 \mathrm{tr}$ under 7 ch , ch 4 , fasten in top of last tr for a p) 3 times, 2 tr under same ch; repeat around, join and fasten off securely.

Smaller oval mats may consist of two hexagons, joined at one side, with the border, and larger ones may have three or four joined in a row. Small round mats may have the border added to a single hexagon, larger ones may have three hexagons joined for the center (as in the oval mat illustrated, omitting one end hexagon), and still larger ones may have six hexagons joined around a seventh, for the center. The mats may be varied as to size and shape in many ways, and there may be as many in a set as desired, say two each of the smallest and medium-sized round ones, and one large round one, one large oval and two each of the other sizes.

# HOT-DISH MATS 

Figure 8. Use about No. 10 crochet-cotton, with a hook that will carry the thread easily and smoothly. I like a rather coarse perle cotton, mercerized, for these mats.

For the oval mat: Make a chain of 29 stitches.

1. A tr in 8 th st from hook, 7 sp (of ch 2, miss $2,1 \mathrm{tr}$ ), ch 4 , a tr in same st with last tr.

2. Ch $5, \mathrm{a}$ tr under the tr last made (which forms a part of the end sp ), (ch $2, \operatorname{tr}$ in sp ) 7 times, ch $2, \operatorname{tr}$ in end sp , (ch $2, \operatorname{tr}$ in same sp ) 6 times, (ch $2, \operatorname{tr}$ in next sp ) 7 times, ch 2 , tr in end sp , (ch 2, tr in same sp ) 4 times, ch 2, join to 3 d of 5 ch .
3. Ch $3, \mathrm{tr}$ in same place, ch $2,2 \mathrm{tr}$ in next tr, ch 2 , miss $1 \mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{tr}$ in next, (ch 2, tr in next sp) 6 times, (ch 2, 2 tr in next tr) 7 times, ch 2, miss $1 \mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{tr}$ in next, (ch 2, tr in next) 6 times, (ch 2,2 tr in next tr) 5 times, ch 2 , join to top of 3 ch .
4. Ch 3, 2 tr in tr, ch 2, 3 tr over next 2 tr ( 1 in Ist and 2 in 2d), (ch 2, tr in sp) 8 times, (ch 2, 3 tr over 2 tr$) 7$ times, (ch $2, \operatorname{tr}$ in sp ) 8 times, (ch $2,3 \mathrm{tr}$ over 2 tr ) 5 times, ch 2 , join. You have thus started 7 points at each end, with 9 sp between, on both sides.
5. A tr in each $\operatorname{tr}$ (ch 3 for 1st) with 2 tr in last tr , ch 2, 4 tr over 3 tr , ch 2, miss $1 \mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{tr}$ in next, (ch $2, \mathrm{tr}$ in next sp ) 7 times, (ch 2, 4 tr over 3 tr ) 7 times, (ch 2, tr in next sp) 8 times, ch 2, miss next sp, ( 4 tr over 3 tr , ch 2) 5 times, join.
$6,7,8$. Same as 5th row, adding 1 more tr to each point, every row; keep the same number of sp (9) along the sides, missing 1st sp in one row and last sp in next, so the wide sp will not come all on one side.
9. Six tr over 7 tr, missing last, ch $2, \mathrm{tr}$ in sp, ch $2,6 \mathrm{tr}$, (ch 2, tr in next sp) 10 times, (ch 2, 6 tr in $6 \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch} 2, \mathrm{tr}$ in sp , ch 2) 7 times, 10 sp , ( $6 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}$ ) 5 times, join last 2 ch to top of 3 ch .
10. Five tr over $6 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 5 \mathrm{tr}, 11 \mathrm{sp},(5 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}) 7$ times, $11 \mathrm{sp},(5 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}) 5$ times, join.

11, 12, 13. Same as 10 th row, decreasing 1 tr in each point, increasing 1 sp between points, and adding 1 sp to each side, every row.
14. Ch $5, \operatorname{tr}$ in sp, (ch $2, \operatorname{tr}$ in next sp$) 5$ times, ch $2, \mathrm{tr}$ in $\mathrm{tr}, 15 \mathrm{sp}$ along the side, tr in tr , and continue around, all sp ; join last 2 ch to 3 d of 5 ch .

15, 16. Sp all around, 5 ch to begin, and joining last 2 ch to 3 d of 5 ch .
17. Two tr in sp, ch 4 , fasten in 1st st of ch for $\mathrm{p}, 2 \mathrm{tr}$ in same sp, a d c in next sp; repeat around.
18. For the binding, turn the mat over and make 1 tr between 2 of the little scallops, ch 5 , tr between next 2 ; repeat around, join.
19. Tr under 5 ch, ch 7 ; repeat around, join.
20. Tr under 7 ch , ch 6 ; repeat. The band should be snug enough to hold the asbestos mat when in place, yet not so tight that it is difficult to slip the mat under it.

This mat may be made as much longer as desired by adding to the number of spaces in 1st row, along the sides. The widening of the points may be continued, following the directions in other particulars, and extra rows of spaces worked around the edge.
Figure 9. For the round mat: Chain 7, join.

1. Ch $3,25 \mathrm{tr}$ in ring, join to top of 3 ch .
2. Ch $5, *$ miss 1 , tr in next, ch 2 ; repeat around, joining to 3 d of $5 \mathrm{ch}, 13 \mathrm{sp}$ in all.
3. Two tr (ch 3 for 1st tr ) in each $\mathrm{tr}, 2$ ch between groups; join last 2 ch to top of 3 ch , always.
4. Tr in 1st tr, 2 in next, ch 2 ; repeat around, join.
5. Tr in each tr with 2 in last, ch 2 ; repeat, join.
$6,7,8,9$. Same as 5 th row, increasing 1 tr in each point, every row. For a larger mat, as suggested, these increasing rows may be added to.
6. Seven tr in 7 tr , ch $2, \mathrm{tr}$ in sp of 2 ch , ch 2 ; repeat around, join.

11, 12, 13, 14, 15. Same as 10 th row, decreasing each point 1 tr , and increasing 1 sp between points, every row.
16. $\operatorname{Tr}$ in 1 st of 2 tr , (ch $2, \mathrm{tr}$ in sp$) 7$ times, ch 2 ; repeat around, join.

17, 18. Sp all around, join.
Edge and band as directed for oval mat.
Another way of making the band or turnover is as follows:

1. A tr between scallops, * ch 3 , tr between next 2 ; repeat.
2. Tr in sp, ch 2 ; repeat, join.
3. Tr in sp, ch 1, tr in next sp, ch 2 ; repeat, join.

The spacing may be varied as required; if one works very tightly it may be necessary to add a stitch to the chain. Crochet a chain long enough to extend around the mat, allowing for tying, and lace this through the last row of spaces. Put the mat on over the asbestos, pulling and stretching the latter in order to get the stitches exactly even, then draw up the cord and tie.

## LACE DOILIES

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Figure 10 These doilies form a very lovely water-set, if it is desired to use them for the purpose. Three balls of No. 70 crochet-cotton will be sufficient to make them, and the border is first completed. For the motif or medallion of the small doily make a chain of 6 stitches, join.

1. Ch 4 for d tr , (ch 7, d tr in ring) 3 times, ch 7, join to top of 4 ch .


3 de before the $3 \mathrm{sp}, 1$ in each tr and ch of $\mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in loop, $\mathrm{p}, 4 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in same loop, $* \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in each d tr of group with p over middle d tr, 8 d c in next loop, omitting p , work across the 3 sp as before, with d c in each st , ch 7 , turn, fasten in the d c over 1st of the 4 tr , turn, fill the loop just made with $9 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, 4 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in next loop, ch 4, turn, miss 2 d c of last loop filled, t tr in next, (ch $4, \mathrm{t}$ tr in next) 4 times, ch 4 , fasten in middle of next loop back, turn, fill 1st 2 loops with $3 \mathrm{~d} c, p, 3 \mathrm{~d}$ c, 6 d c in each of next 2, omitting p , ch 4 , turn, a d tr over the 3 dttr , (ch 4, dtr in same place) twice, ch 4 , fasten in st over next t tr, turn, $3 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, \mathrm{p}$ and 3 dc in 1st loop, 6 d c in next, omitting $\mathrm{p}, 3 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in next, ch 9 , fasten in middle of preceding loop, turn, fill this loop with 7 d c, p, 7 $\mathrm{d} c, 3 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ to complete filling next loop, fill each of next 3 loops with $3 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, \mathrm{p}, 3 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, 3 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ to finish filling next loop, * work across the group of d tr as before, $4 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, \mathrm{p}$ and 4 d c in next loop, work across the sp with d c in each tr and $\mathrm{sp}, 3$ d c in next loop to the joining, and repeat.

To fill in the center:

1. Fasten thread in the $2 d$ of the 3 sp , ch 3 for a tr, * ch 4, a tr under 7 ch-loop at side, ch 4, a quadruple tr (over 4 times), in 4th of 7 d tr , ch 4, quadruple tr in 4th $\mathrm{d} \operatorname{tr}$ of group of next motif, ch $4, \operatorname{tr}$ under $7 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{ch} 4$, tr in 2 d of 3 sp ; repeat, joining last 4 ch to top of 3 ch .
2. Ch 4, miss 1, tr in next st, ch 1 ; repeat, joining last 1 ch to 3 d of 4 ch .
3. Sl st under $1 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{ch} 4, * \operatorname{tr}$ in next $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{ch} 1$; repeat, only missing every 13th sp (in small doily) to decrease the center.
4, 5, 6, 7, 8. Same as 3 d row, missing the sp over that of preceding row.
4. Ch 4 for a d tr, * ch 4, miss 2 sp, $d$ tr in next; repeat around, joining last 4 ch to top of 1st 4 ch .
5. Sl st to middle of sp , ch 5 for a t tr, * ch $1, \mathrm{t}$ tr in next sp; repeat around, joining last 1 ch to top of 5 ch .
6. Sl st in sp , ch 4 for a d tr, a d tr in each sp all, around, join and fasten off.

2. D tr in each of 7 ch st (ch 4 for 1st $\mathrm{d} \operatorname{tr})$, ch 9 ; repeat, joining last 9 ch to top of 4 ch .
3. D tr in each of 7 d tr (ch 4 for 1st, ch 7, miss 1 of 9 ch, tr in next, (ch 1, miss $1, \operatorname{tr}$ in next) 3 times, ch 7 ; repeat, joining last 7 ch to top of 4 ch .
4. Join the motifs when working a loop of 7 ch at each side, leaving 4 loops on outside and 2 loops on the inside, not counting the joining loops. Fasten the thread where the motifs meet, work

are made in the same way as for the smaller ones, save that the two connecting loops are of 10 chain instead of 7 chain; it is well to bear this in mind, as otherwise the border may be too full. On the inside fasten the thread in the same place as directed for the smaller doily, and work in the same way, with the same number of chain-stitches, except that between the quadruple trebles, where it is necessary to chain 6 instead of 4 , to correspond with the longer joining chain of the border. Then after working 2 rows of spaces
as directed, miss every 18 th space in 3 d row. Make 8 more rows of spaces, decreasing as directed for the small doily.
13. For the openwork center, ch 4 for a d tr, * ch $5, \mathrm{~d}$ tr in 3 d sp , repeat around, joining last 5 ch to top of 4 ch .
14. Sl st to middle of sp , ch 4 for a d tr, * ch $3, \mathrm{~d}$ tr in sp ; repeat around, joining last 3 ch to top of 4 ch .

15,16 . Like 10 th and 11 th rows of center of small doily. Fasten off.

## CHAIR-BACK, VASE OF ROSES

Figure 12. Use any size of thread that is desired, this depending on the size of the chair-back wanted. No. 50 ecru crochet-cotton makes a very attractive piece of work. It will be noted that there is a slight variation between the illustration and the directions, the latter giving an additional space, which is taken care of in the 3 d and 4 th rows. This is done in order to make a complete reverse, the odd space coming at the center of the pattern; otherwise there would be one less space on one side than the other, so that the reverse would not be perfect.

The work is begun at top or straight edge with a chain of 320 stitches.

1. A tr in 8 th st of ch from hook, 104 sp , (of ch 2 , miss 2 , tr in next).
2. Ch 5 (for 1 st sp of row), 104 more sp .
3. Two sp (ch 5 for 1 st$), 76 \mathrm{tr},(2 \mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}) 6$ times, $* 3 \mathrm{sp}$; reverse (from * to beginning of row).
4. Edge (of $2 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$ ) ; $24 \mathrm{sp},(7 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}) 6$ times, $* 10 \mathrm{tr}$; reverse.
5. Edge; ( $1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$ ) 10 times, * 59 sp ; reverse.
6. Edge; $2 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr},(1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}) 8$ times, $* 61 \mathrm{sp}$; reverse.

The tassels attached to the scallops are of the simplest description, but may be made more elaborate, if desired. Wind the thread around a four-inch card 50 times, or as required for the thickness of tassel, slip off, double, wind thread tightly around about one fourth inch from the fold to form the head of tassel, and attach to the scallop by means of a chain or twisted threads; clip the other end of tassel evenly.

81. One $\mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 19 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$.
82. Three sp, $7 \mathrm{tr}, 17 \mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}$.
83. Narrow $3 \mathrm{sp}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 13 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$.
84. Narrow ( 1 sp , always, unless otterwise directed), $2 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 9 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}$.
85. Narrow $2 \mathrm{sp}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}$.

For the edge: Fill all spaces with doubles, 3 doubles in each space along the straight edge and 5 doubles in each corner space. A tassel is attacked at the center of each scallop. Join to the scallop with a chain, put through the head of the tassel.

5. Ch 5 for d tr, * ch 11, d tr in d c over next tr; repeat around, ch 11, join to top of 5 ch .
6. Thirteen d c on ch, turn; ch 1 , miss $1 \mathrm{~d} c, d \quad \mathrm{c}$ in each of 12 d c , turn; ch 1 , miss $1, \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in each of 11 d c ; continue in this way, working in both threads or veins of st, until but 1 d c remains; this forms a point; * ch 18 , fasten with s c in next $\mathrm{dtr}, 13 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ on 11 ch , turn, make the point as before until but 2 d c remain, then work a quintuple tr (over 5 times) in 9 th st of 18 ch ,

$4 \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch} 4$, fasten back in 1st st of ch for a p, a tr in each of 5 tr, ch 9 , turn.

then draw through all at once and close the cluster with a tight ch-st, (ch 3, another cluster in same sp) twice, ch 5. miss 2 sp and fasten at corner of 1st sp, turn.

2. Ch $3,5 \mathrm{tr}$ under 2 ch and tr in $\mathrm{tr},{ }^{*} 1 \mathrm{sp}$, ch $5, \mathrm{tr}$ in next tr , forming a bar, 3 more $\mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, counting all, 1 bar, ch 2 , tr in 3 d of turning ch, turn.

Ch 6, tr in last tr made, ch 2, 2 tr in $2 \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch} 3$, fasten under $6 \mathrm{ch}, *$ ch 6 , turn, miss 1 st st, 1 d c in next, a tr in each of next 3 and 1 d c in next, turn, a d c in each st back to tip of petal, repeat from *, fasten with a d c under next loop of 6 ch , ch 3 ; edge (of 2 tr in 2 tr , ch 2, a tr in 3 d of 5 ch, turn).
4. Edge (as in 2 d row) ; ch $9,2 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in sp between 2 petals of last row, ch 9 ; like 2 d row from *.
5. Ch $6, \mathrm{tr}$ in last tr made, ch $2,2 \mathrm{tr}$ in 2 tr , ch 3 , miss 2 of 9 ch, a d c in next, $1 \mathrm{tr}, 4 \mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{tr}$ and 1 d c , bringing you to center of daisy, turn.
6. Ch 9 ; like 2 d row from *.
7. Like 5 th row, ending with 2 d c at center of daisy, 1 $\mathrm{tr}, 4 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{tr}$ and 1 d c on following 9 ch , ch 3; edge (as in 3d row).
8. Edge; ch 9,2 d c in center of daisy, ch 9 ; like $2 d$ row from *.

Like 5 th row, making 1 d c in center of daisy, do not turn but make the 7 th petal of $1 \mathrm{tr}, 4 \mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{tr}$ and 1 d c along 9 ch , turn, thread over 6 times for a sextuple tr , insert hook in tip of 6th petal made, draw thread through, then work off the loops or st 2 at a time, in the usual manner, forming a loop between 6 th and 7 th petals, ch 3 ; edge.

For example, chain 102 stitches, to begin; work the 1st row to *, again make 7 spaces, 10 trebles, ( 1 space, 4 trebles) twice, turn. Continue from 2 d row, only including the extra pattern.

1. Count 6 groups of tr from lower edge of sleeve toward the top, and fasten in top of 3 ch of 7 th group, ch $3,3 \mathrm{tr}$ between groups, (ch 4, 4 tr between next 2 groups) twice, ch $4,3 \mathrm{tr}$ in next sp, 4 over group of tr , and 3 in sp . ( 1 sp , $4 \mathrm{tr})$ twice, the last 4 tr under 3 ch at side of 1st group at bottom of sleeve, turn.
2. One sp, $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$, 7 tr , ch 4, miss 2, 7 tr , (ch 4, fasten under 4 ch ) twice, ch 4 , tr at end of row, turn.
3. Same as 3 d row of sleeve, omitting the 3 sp , and ending with $7 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$, shell under 5 ch , turn.
4. Like 4 th row of sleeve to *, ch 4 , fasten under 4 ch, ch 4, a tr at end of row, turn.
5. Like 5 th row to *, omitting the 10 tr , and ending with 7 tr , ch 2 , shell in shell, turn.
6. Like 6 th row to *, ch 4 , fasten under 4 ch, ch 4 , a tr at end of row, turn.
7. Like 7 th row to $*$, omitting the 3 sp and ending with ( $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$ ) twice, turn.
8. Like 8 th to ${ }^{*}$, (ch 4 , fasten under 4 ch) twice, ch 4 , a tr at end of row, turn.
9. Like 9 th to $*$, ( $1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$ ) twice, turn.

Repeat from 2d row of front three times, joining last row neatly to edge of sleeve.

For the back count up the 6 groups from lower edge of sleeve and fasten in at bottom of 7 th; repeat from 1st row of front until you have two patterns. Make the other half of back in the same way.

For the beading:

1. Fasten in at upper corner of back, ch $6, * 2 \mathrm{~d}$ tr in sp between groups of tr , ch $2,1 \mathrm{dtr}$ in side of next group; repeat. At corners of neck make 2 dtr between groups, a tr at corner, and 2 d trin next sp, no ch between; then continue as before.
2. Oh 3, 3 tr in same place, fasten with a d e between 2 dtr , ch $3,3 \mathrm{tr}$ in same place, fasten in top of tr; repeat.
Finish the ends of back with a double in each stitch, to keep the edge firm. Run ribbon under the 2 double trebles, and over the single one, and finish with a bow

41. Six sp, $7 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 10$ $\mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}, 2$ $\mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 7 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}, 4$ $\mathrm{tr}, 6 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 5$ sp , turn.
42. Eight sp, $7 \mathrm{tr}, 4 \mathrm{sp}$, $10 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}$, $10 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4$ $\mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 3$ $\mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
43. Nine $\mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}, 4 \mathrm{sp}$, $10 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 14 \mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}$, $3 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 13 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
44. Thirty-eight sp, 4 $\mathrm{tr}, 7 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 10 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.

45, 46, 47, 48. Fiftyseven sp.

For the edge: In corner space of front make a shell of 2 double trebles, (chain 5, 2 double trebles) twice, chain 5 , miss 1 space, fasten with a double in treble. * chain 5 , miss 2 spaces, shell in next, chain 5 , miss 2 spaces, fasten in treble, repeat from $*$ to corner, miss 1 space before corner space, shell in that space, and repeat the edge around the neck. Any pretty border may be used that is preferred to this. It may be made more elaborate with little extra work by substituting a picot-chain for the chain of 5 stitches, thus: Chain 7, fasten back in 5th stitch from hook, chain 2.

## Bonnet in Roll-Stitch with Strawberry Crown

Figure 44. White crochet-cotton, No. 50, was used for the model; coarser thread will result in a larger bonnet, using the same directions. The one illustrated is about fourteen inches face measurement, or from one corner of front to the other.

Make a chain of 8 stitches, join to form a ring.

1. Ch 5 , fill the ring with 22 roll-st with 20 "overs" to each st, join to top of 5 ch .
2. Ch $5, *$ a tr between 2 roll-st, ch 2 ; repeat around, joining last 2 ch to 3 d of 5 ch .
3. Ch $1,3 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in each sp between tr , join.
4. Ch 5, a roll-st in each d c, join.
5. Ch 4, miss 2 roll-st, fasten between next 2 ; repeat.
$6,7,8$. Slip to center of 1st loop, * ch 4, fasten in next loop; repeat, fastening last ch where 1 st started.
6. A s c under 1 st ch of last row, ch $5, * 8$ roll-st under same ch, ch 3, miss 1 loop, 2 tr in next, ch $2,2 \mathrm{tr}$ under same ch, ch 3 , miss 1 loop, and repeat from *, joining last 3 ch to top of 1st roll-st. Each repeat of the pattern requires 4 loops, hence there should be 32 loops in 8 th row. An extra loop may be missed, however, should the count not be quite accurate.
7. Sl st back under preceding ch, * (ch 3 , fasten with a d c between 2 roll-st) 7 times, ch 3 , fasten under 1 st of 3 ch beyond shell of roll-st, ch 3 , shell of $2 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{ch}$ and 2 tr in shell of last row; repeat around.
8. (Ch 3 , fasten under 3 ch$) 8$ times, ch 3 , shell in shell; repeat around.
9. Same as 11 th row, with 1 less loop across strawberry.
10. (Ch 3 , fasten under 3 ch$) 6$ times, $\mathrm{ch} 3,2 \mathrm{tr}$ in shell, (ch 2, 2 tr in same shell) twice; repeat around.
11. Ch 4 , fasten under 3 ch , (ch 3 , fasten under next 3 ch) 4 times, ch 4 , shell of $2 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{ch}$ and 2 tr under 1 st 2 ch , ch 4 , shell under next 2 ch ; repeat around.
12. Ch 5 , fasten under 3 ch , (ch 3 , fasten in next loop) 3 times, ch 5 , shell in shell, ch 4 , fasten under 4 ch , ch 4 , shell in shell; repeat around.
13. Ch 6 , fasten in 3 ch , (ch 3 , fasten in next loop) twice, ch 6 , shell in shell, ch 4 , fasten under 4 ch , ch 3 , fasten under next 4 ch , ch 4, shell in shell; repeat around.
14. Ch 6 , fasten in 3 ch , ch 3 , fasten in next loop, ch 6 , shell in shell, ch 4 , fasten under 4 ch , (ch 3, fasten under next ch) twice, ch 4, shell in shell; repeat around.
15. Ch 7, fasten in 3 ch at tip of strawberry, ch 7 , shell in shell, ch 4, fasten under 4 ch , (ch 3, fasten under next ch) 3 times, ch 4, shell in shell; repeat around.
16. Shell in shell, (ch 3, fasten under next ch) 5 times. ch 3, shell in shell; repeat around. This row completes the crown.
17. Slip back under last 3 ch preceding shell, ch 3 for a tr, * shell of 8 roll-st in shell, tr in next shell, miss 2 loops of 3 ch , shell of roll-st in next, miss 2 loops, tr under next, repeat across front, or until you have 13 roll-st shells; turn, after last $t r$ in shell.
18. Chain 9 , fasten between 4 th and 5 th rolls of last shell made, * ch 6 , fasten in same place, forming a p or loop in which to make the roll-st shells of next row, ch 5 , a d tr in tr , ch 5 , fasten in top of next shell; repeat across, ending with ch 5 , tr in top of tr, turn.
19. Ch 3 , shell of 8 roll-st in $p$, tr in d tr; repeat, ending with a tr in 4 th of 9 ch , turn.

23 to 28 . Same as 21st and 22d rows. At end of 28 th row, after making the 13 th shell, turn and work entirely around the cap to opposite corner, making 3 shells across the lower edge of front, and the same number across the back and opposite front.
29. Same as 21st row, continuing around the bonnet.
30. Same as 22 d row, working around bonnet, making a shell at each corner of front, 13 shells across front, and 9 shells around neck.

The cap may be readily enlarged by increasing the rollstitches in 1st and 4th rows, and thus the chain-loops, so that there will be an extra pattern (strawberry and shell) in the crown, adaing also to the number of rows of roll-stitch shells across front. Make ties of ribbon or hemstitched mull, as preferred.

## Baby's Shoes

Figure 45. These little shoes may be made of crochetcotton, or silk, white or delicate color, or of wool. They are very firm and neat, and shaped to the foot. The sample pair was made of No. 15 crochet-cotton; finer or coarser material will result in a smaller or larger shoe, by the same directions.

Commence at lottom of the sole with a chain of 33 stitches.

1. Miss 1st st, a d c in each of 31 stitches, 3 in end st, 1 in each of 31 st down other side and 3 in last, join.
2. A d c in 1st st, 2 in next, 1 in each $d c$ down the side to within 2 st of middle of toe, 2 in next, 1 in next, 3 in middle st, 1 in next, 2 in next, 1 in each down side, ending with 2 in 3d st from middle of heel, 1 in next, and 3 in next, join.
3. Ch 1, a d c in each of 2 st, 2 in next, 1 in each down the side to within 4 of the end, 2 in next, 1 in each of 3,3 in middle st, 1 in each of 3,2 in next, 1 in each down side, 2 in 4th st from the end, 1 in each of 3,2 in middlest of heel, join.
4. Same as 3d row, making an extra st between widenings.
5. Ch 4, miss 1 , a tr in next, ch 1 ; repeat, making 2 tr with 1 ch between in each of the widenings of the toe, and 3 tr , with 1 ch between, at back of heel.
6. Ch 1, a d c in each st all around, making 2 d c in the widening sp at side of toe and in the middle of heel.
7. Ch 1, a d c in each st around, widening as usual on each side of toe and in the middle, also in middle of heel ; join.
8. Same as 7th row.
9. Ch $4, *$ miss 1 , a tr in next, ch 1 ; repeat around, join to 3 d of 4 ch .
10. Ch 1, a d c in each tr and in sp , narrow 11 st from middle of toe by putting hook through 2 st at once, or by missing a st, also at middle of toe, join.

11, 12. Same as 10th row, making d c in d c, and narrowing as directed.
13. Like 11 th row until you have reached the $3 d$ narrowing on the vamp, then turn and work back across vamp, narrowing at the end, turn.
14. Ch 1, a d c in each d c across vamp, narrowing in the middle and at end.

15, 17. Like 13 th row.
16,18 . Like 14 th row.
19. Ch 1 , a d c in each d c , narrowing at middle of vamp and on the sides.
20. Turn and work across top of vamp with a d e in each st.
21. For the upper part of shoe, slip to 1 st $d$ c at side

of vamp, 2 d row back, ch 11 , turn, miss $1,10 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in 10 st , catch in 1 st d c of side of shoe, a s c in next d c on side of shoe, turn; adc in each of $9 \mathrm{de}, 2$ in last. turn; ch 1,2 d c in 1st d c, 1 in each following d c, join to next $d$ c of side, a s c in next, turn; a d c in each d c of last row, with 2 at end, turn; ch 1, a d c in each of 2 d c, ch 5 , miss 5, a d c in each following d c, join to next d c of side, a s c in next, turn; d c in each d c with 5 in 5 st of ch, turn; ch 1, a d c in each d c, join, slip in next d c of side, turn; work 5 more rows, widening 1 st at end of every other
row; then ch 4 , turn, miss 1 , a d $c$ in each of 3 st and $\overline{d c}$ in each d c, join, slip in next d c, turn; work back with de in each d c, ch 1 , turn, 2 d c in 2 d c , ch 5 , miss 5 , d c in d c , join, slip in next d c, turn, work back with d c in d c , ch 1 , turn, and work de in d c around to within 14 st of top of vamp on other side, turn; ch $1, \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ in d c to edge of flap, turn; ch 1, and make a d c in d c around to the other side. Continue thus until you have worked 6 rows around top of shoe, then make a buttonhole as before, and finish with 4 rows.

For the buttons: Chain 3, join; 8 doubles in ring; 2 doubles in each double; a double in each double; a double in every other double; slip in a pearl or porcelain button of requisite size, draw together, and sew to the shoe, matching the position of the buttonholes.

## Summer Shoes for the Baby

Figure 46. Crochet-thread No. 10 was used for these little shoes, with a hook of suitable size for firm work. Make a chain of 38 stitches, turn.

1. Miss 3, a tr in each st of ch following, 6 in end st to widen for the toe, a tr in each st on other side of ch, with 5 in the last st (not counting the 3 ch which stands for 1st tr ), join to top of 3 ch .
2. Ch 3 for 1 st tr , tr in each tr , widening around toe by putting 2 tr in each widening tr , work down other side with tr in $\mathrm{tr}, 2$ in each widening tr , join to top of 3 ch .

3,4 . Same as $2 d$ row, widening by putting 2 tr in every other widening tr, or enough to keep the work flat. This completes the sole.
5. Ch 1, turn, a d e in top of each tr, taking up back thread of st only, and without widening; join at end of row.
$6,7,8,9$. Same as 5 th row, working a d c in each d c . This will give 3 ridges.
10. Ch 3, turn, a tr in each d c, working in back thread of st, join to top of 3 ch .
11. Ch $5,{ }^{*}$ miss 2 , a tr in next, ch 2 ; repeat from * around and join to 3 d of 5 ch .
12. Ch 3, a tr in each st all around, join.
13. Ch 1, a d c in 1st tr, * miss 1 tr , a d c in next; repeat until you have $14 \mathrm{~d} c$, turn.

14 to 26 . Ch 1, d c in d c, taking back thread of st, turn. This completes the instep. Break and fasten thread, turn the shoe wrong side out and join the vamp to the shoe with s c or by means of needle and thread, picking up a stitch from each part evenly.
27. Fasten thread at center of back, or heel, and repeat 11 th row. Fasten off neatly.
28. For the ankle-ties, make a ch of thirty st, sl st along the top of 4 sp at center of back, ch 35 st , turn.
29. A tr in 8 th st of ch, * ch 2 , miss 2,1 tr, repeat from *.
30. Three d c in each sp, all around strap and toe of shoe.

Run baby-ribbon in and out the spaces, leaving the ends long enough to bring the ties together and finish with a pretty bow. These little shoes are easily made larger or smaller, and are very cool and comfortable for summer wear.

## The Individual Basket

Figure 47. For the small or individual basket: Chain 9, join to form a ring.

1. Ch $3,19 \mathrm{tr}$ in ring, join to top of 3 ch .
2. Ch 3, a tr in same place, * 1 tr in next st, 2 in next; repeat from *, making 30 tr in all, and join to top of 3 ch which represents 1 st tr.
3. Shell of 8 tr in a st, (ch 3 for 1st tr), miss 4 ; repeat, making 6 shells in all, and joining last $t r$ of 6 th shell to 1st of 1st shell.
4. Ch 4, fasten in 2 d tr; repeat around shell, fastening last loop between shells, and continue around each shell, fastening last ch where 1 st started. This completes the bottom of basket.
5. Either break thread and fasten in, or slip down side of shell to top of 2 d row, then work 1 d c in back loop of each tr all around, join.
6. Four tr in 4 dc (always ch 3 for 1 st tr of the row), ch 3, miss 2 , 2 d c in next 2 d c, ch 3, miss 2; repeat around, joining last ch to 1st tr (or top of 3 ch which represents 1 st tr ).
7. A d c in each tr, ch 5 ; repeat around, join.
8. A d c in 2 d and 3 d of 4 d c (to start the row, slip over 1 st d c), ch 3,4 tr under 5 ch , ch 3 ; repeat around, join.
9. Same as 7 th row.
10. With color (pink was used for the model, but blue, violet, green or other color may be chosen to harmonize with the china-decoration, or the baskets may be entirely of white) make a tr in each of $2 \mathrm{st}, 2 \mathrm{in}$ next; repeat.
11. Shell of $2 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{ch}$ and 2 tr in a st, miss 3 ; repeat around, join.
12. Ch 3, a tr in each st all around, join.
13. Same as 6 th row, putting 4 tr in 4 tr , and so on.
14. Same as 7 th row, with 7 ch between groups of de instead of 5 ch .
15. Shell of 4 tr , with 1 ch between, in a st, miss 3 ; repeat around, join.
16. Same as 4 th row. Fasten off neatly.

## The Large Bonbon-Basket

Figure 48. Chain 9, join.
1,2 . Same as 1 st and 2 d rows of small basket.
3. Two tr in a st, 1 in each of 2 st; repeat, join.
4. Two tr in a st, 1 in each of 3 st; repeat, join.
$5,6,7$. Same as 4 th row, with 1 more tr between widenings, each row; or widen as required to keep the work perfectly flat and smooth.
8. Same as 11 th row of small basket. There are 23 shells in the row, and 3 or 4 st may be missed between, as required; join last shell to 1 st.
9. Slip to center of shell, and make a shell as in 15 th row of small basket in each shell of last row; join.
10. Same as 4 th row of small basket; fasten off neatly, completing bottom of basket.
11. Fasten in at top of last row ( 7 th row) of tr, in which 1 st row of shells of the bottom was worked, and make a tr in each tr all around; join.
12. A d $c$ in each of 4 tr , ch 5 , miss 4 ; repeat around, join.
13. Same as 8 th row of small basket.
14. Same as 7 th row of small basket.
$15,17,19$. Same as 13 th row.
16,18 . Same as 14 th row.
20. With color, a tr in each st (working in back loop) all around: join.
21. Same as 11 th row of small basket, missing 4 between shells; join.

22 . Slip to center of shell, and repeat 21 st row, making shell in shell; join.
23. Same as 20 th row.
24. Same as 12 th row.

25,27 . Same as 13 th row.
26,28 . Same as 14 th row.
29,30 . Same as 15 th and 16 th rows of small basket.
For the rings or handles: Chain 7 , join. A double in each stitch of chain, then double in double, working around and around until the strip is three inches long; finish off neatly, sew together with needle and thread, and attach to basket at top of 23 d row (color) ; make another handle and fasten to the opposite side.

Stiffen the baskets by dipping in a solution of sugar and water, in melted paraffin or starch, shaping them nicely as they dry.

## A Dainty Nut-Basket

Figure 49. Use No. 30 crochet-thread (one ball will be sufficient for at least two baskets), and a little No. 70 tat-ting-thread, pink, for the rose-spray.
Commence at center of bottom of basket with a chain of 8 stitches, join.

1. Fill the ring with 16 d c .
2. (Ch 5 , miss 1 , fasten in next with a d c) 8 times.
3. Slip to center of 1 st $5 \mathrm{ch}, * \mathrm{ch} 2,9 \mathrm{tr}$ under next 5 ch , ch 2 , fasten in center of next, repeat from * around, joining last ch where 1st started.
4. Slip to 1 st $\mathrm{tr}, * \operatorname{ch} 9$, miss 7 , a d c in next, ch 4 , fasten in 1st of next 9 tr , repeat from *, joining last 4 ch to top of 1st tr of last row.
5. Eleven d c under $9 \mathrm{ch}, 3$ $\mathrm{d} \mathrm{c}, \mathrm{p}$ of $3 \mathrm{ch}, 3 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$ under 4 ch ; repeat around.
6. Six $\operatorname{tr}$ (ch 3 for 1st) in 6 $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 2$, a tr in same st with last tr and 1 in each of 5 d c , ch 3 , fasten in $p$, ch 3 ; repeat.
7. A d c in each of 6 tr , ch 3 , a d c under $2 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{ch} 3,6 \mathrm{~d}$ c in 6 tr, turn, ch 6, fasten under 3 ch , ch 2 , fasten under next $3 \mathrm{ch}, 6$ d c in 6 tr , turn, 8 d c under 6 ch, 3 under $2 \mathrm{ch}, 8$ under next $6 \mathrm{ch}, 4$ under each 3 ch , and repeat. This row completes the bottom of basket.
8. Ch 4, miss 4, 1 d c , repeat around.
$9,10,11$. Slip to center of loop, * ch 4, fasten in next loop; repeat.
$12,13,14,15$. Slip to center of loop, ch 5, fasten in next loop; repeat.
9. Slip to center of loop, ch 5 , fasten back in 4th st, ch 2 , fasten in next loop; repeat around and fasten off.

For the handle: Make a chain of 8 stitches, turn; a double in 5 th stitch from hook, chain 2, miss 2, 1 double, turn; * chain 3 , a double under 2 chain, chain 2, a double under 2 chain, turn. Repeat from * to length required; the handle of the little basket is four and one-half inches long.

For the rose-spray: Make a chain about 3 inches long, turn; a single in 1st stitch from hook, a double in next, 2 trebles, 3 double trebles, 2 trebles, 1 double and 1 single, then on other side of same chain, make 10 doubles, fasten in single, turn, and make a double in each double back to foundation-chain; cover about seven-eighths inch of chain with doubles, for the stem; chain 11, turn, and make a leaf as before, make a similar leaf on opposite side of stem, and cover with doubles to the end. Fasten the leaf-spray on the side of basket, curving the stem prettily, and sew a tiny rose on the stem about three-eighths inch from the pair of leaflets. For the rose: Wind thread around a small match fifteen times, slip off and fill the ring with 21 doubles; chain 4, * miss 2, 1 double, chain 3, repeat from * around, joining last 3 chain to 1st of 4 chain, and making 7 loops in all; in each loop work 1 double, 3 trebles and 1 double; chain 4, fasten between petals, letting the chain pass at back, repeat; fill each loop with 1 double, 5 trebles, 1 double; fasten off, sew the rose in place, as suggested, sew on the handle, and stiffen the little basket with a syrup of sugar and water, and shape over a small glass or mold of suitable size.

Figure 50. One ball of crochet-cotton will be sufficient for a cunning little purse in lacet-stitch and filet, choosing a thread that will give 9 spaces to the inch, and making the purse three and one-half inches deep. Chain 98 stitches, turn.

1. A tr in 8th st, 30 more sp (of ch 2, miss $2,1 \mathrm{tr}$ ), turn. 2,3 . Ch $5, \mathrm{tr}$ in next tr , for $1 \mathrm{st} \mathrm{sp}, 30$ more sp , turn.
2. Eleven sp, $7 \mathrm{tr}, 18 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
3. Eleven $\mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 16 \mathrm{tr}, 10 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
4. Ten sp, $(4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$ ) twice, $10 \mathrm{tr},(1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr})$ twice, 10 sp , turn.
5. Ten sp, 4 tr , (ch 3, miss 2, a d c in next, ch 3, miss 2 , 1 tr , forming a lct) 4 times, 7 tr (counting all), 10 sp , turn.
6. Eleven $\mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, ( ch 5 , miss the lct of last row, tr in tr , forming a bar) 4 times, $1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 13 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
7. Two sp, ( $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$ ) twice, $7 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4$ lct, 4 $\mathrm{tr}, 11 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
8. Twelve sp, $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$, * 3 bars, ( $1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$ ) twice, 2 lct, $1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
9. One sp, $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 2$ bars, ( $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$ ) twice, 3 lct, 4 tr, 13 sp , turn.
10. Ten sp, $4 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$; like 10th from *.
11. Two sp, 4 tr, 2 bars, ( 1 $\mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr})$ twice, 2 sp , 4 tr, 1 sp, 4 tr, 9 sp, turn.
12. Nine $\mathrm{sp},(4 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp})$ twice, $16 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}$, $1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
13. Four $\mathrm{sp}, 19 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 4$ tr, $1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr},(2 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr})$ twice, 10 sp , turn.
14. Fifteen sp, 4 tr, $1 \mathrm{sp}, 13$ $\mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 10 \mathrm{tr}, 6 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
15. Eight sp, ( $2 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{tr}$ in next st, keeping top loops on needle and working off together, a ch to hold the cluster) 6 times, 3 tr in next tr, working off as before, tr in next and 3 in next, forming a cluster, 4 tr , 14 sp , turn. This row forms the body of the butterfly.

Reverse directions for other half of butterfly, making 18th row like 16th, 19th like 15th, and so on, ending with 3 rows of spaces, which completes the front of purse. Continuing, work 33 rows of spaces for back. For the flap:

1. Work along the upper edge of the back, making 33 sp, turn.
$2,3,4$. Thirty-three sp.
2. Slip over $2 \mathrm{sp}, 29 \mathrm{sp}$, turn, leaving 2 sp .

6 to 10 . Same as 5th row, decreasing 4 sp each row.

Work around the flap and sides and bottom of purse(taking back and front together) as follows: Three trebles in a space, chain 4, fasten back in 1st stitch of chain for a picot, 3 trebles, in same space, a double in next space; repeat. In corner spaces work 5 trebles, picot, 5 trebles.

Cover an ivory ring, three-fourths inch in diameter, closely with doubles, joining 1st to last; make a chain about three inches long, or 60 stitches, fasten at corner of flap, at the back, chain 60, or same length as before, fasten in next double of ring, a single in each of 2 doubles, make a chain as before, drop stitch on needle, insert hook in 7th space of flap, from front to back, pick up dropped stitch and pull through, fasten in corresponding space at upper edge of front, make the same chain, returning through the same space of back, and fasten to next double of ring. Make four more of these double chains in the same way, missing 5 spaces between, and joining the last at opposite corner of top. Work around the ring with 3 doubles in 3 doubles, picot of 3 chain; repeat and fasten off securely.

## Cover for Sugar-Bowl and CreamPitcher in Filet-Crochet

Figure 51. Choose a thread that will give about 8 spaces to the inch, closely worked. Make a chain of 68 stitches, turn.

1. A tr in 8 th st, 20 more $\operatorname{sp}$ (of ch 2 , miss $2,1 \mathrm{tr}$ ), turn.
2. Ch 5 , miss $2,1 \mathrm{tr}$, for $1 \mathrm{st} \mathrm{sp}, 20$ more sp, turn.

3, 4. Four sp, $7 \mathrm{tr}, 9 \mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}, 4 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.
5, 6. (Two $\mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}$ ) twice, $5 \mathrm{sp},(7 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}$ ) twice, turn.
7, 8. Like 3 d and 4th rows; at end of 8th row make a ch of 28 st, turn.
9. A tr in 8th stitch, 7 more sp on ch, last tr in tr of last row, 21 'sp across work, widen 8 sp , thus: Chain 2, a

t tr in same st with last tr made, (ch $2, \mathrm{t}$ tr in middle of t tr) 7 times, turn.
10. Thirty-seven sp , turn.
11. Four sp, $7 \mathrm{tr}, 8 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, * 7 \mathrm{sp}$, work back from * to beginning of row.
12. Four $\mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}, 8 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, ${ }^{*} 5 \mathrm{sp}$; work back.
13. (Two sp, 7 tr ) twice, $6 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, * 3 \mathrm{sp}$; work back.
14. (Two sp, 7 tr ) twice, $6 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, * 1 \mathrm{sp}$; work back.
15. Four $\mathrm{sp}, 7 \mathrm{tr}, 4 \mathrm{sp}, 16 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, * 4 \mathrm{tr}$; work back.
16. Four sp, $7 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{sp}, * 4 \mathrm{tr}$; work back.
17. Twelve sp, $4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, * 4 \mathrm{tr}$; work back.
18. Thirteen $\mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, * 10 \mathrm{tr}$; work back.
19. Fourteen sp, $28 \mathrm{tr}, 14 \mathrm{sp}$, turn.

Reverse the pattern from 18th to 10th row, making 20th row like 18 th, and so on, with 29 th row also like 10 th, of 37 spaces; at beginning of 30 th row decrease by slipstitching over 8 spaces, and reverse pattern from 8 th to 1 st row, omitting, of course, the widening chain at end of 8th row. Fill the spaces of the edge with doubles, a picot of 4 chain over every 3 d treble.

Attach a large glass bead at each corner; the beads may be of any desired color, and heavy enough to hold the cover in place.

## Miser-Bag in Filet-Crochet

Figure 52. One ball of crochet-cotton No. 60 will be sufficient, with a very little of any harmonizing or contrasting color for stripes and rings. Blue was used for the main color in the model, with stripes and rings of white, but any preferred color or colors may be selected, or the purse may be of one color, matching one's suit, if desired. The shaded crochet-cotton is very pretty for it.

Commence at the pointed end with a chain of 3 stitches, join.

1. Ch $3,3, \mathrm{tr}$ in ring, (ch $2,4 \mathrm{tr}$ in ring) 3 times, ch 2 , join to top of 3 ch .
2. Ch 5, 4 tr in next sp , ch $3,4 \mathrm{tr}$ in same sp, (ch $2,4 \mathrm{tr}$

In next sp) twice, ch $3,4 \mathrm{tr}$ in same sp, ch $2,3 \mathrm{tr}$ in next sp , join to 3 d of 5 chain.
3. Ch 3, 2 tr in sp and tr in tr , ch 2 , shell in shell the shell consisting of $4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{ch}$ and 4 tr$)$, (ch $2, \mathrm{tr}$ in 3 d of 4 tr following, 2 in space and 1 in tr$)$ twice, ch 2 , shell in shell, chain 2 , miss $2,4 \mathrm{tr}$, ch 2 , join to top of 3 chain.
4. Ch 5 , miss $2,4 \mathrm{tr}$, ch 2 , shell in shell, (ch 2 , miss 2 , $4 \mathrm{tr}) 3$ times, ch 2, shell in shell, ch 2, miss 2, 4 tr , ch 2, miss $2,3 \mathrm{tr}$, join to 3 d of 5 ch .
5. Same as 3d row, with 4 groups of 4 tr each between shells.
6. Same as 4 th row, with 5 groups between shells.
7. Same as 3d, with 5 groups between shells.
8. Ch 5, (miss 2, 4 tr , ch 2) 3 times, 4 tr in center of shell, (ch 2, miss $2,4 \mathrm{tr}$ ) 7 times, ch $2,4 \mathrm{tr}$ in center of shell, (ch 2, miss 2, 4 tr ) 3 times, ch 2 , miss $2,3 \mathrm{tr}$, join to 3 d of 5 ch.
9. Ch $3,3 \mathrm{tr}, * \operatorname{ch} 2$, miss $2,4 \mathrm{tr}$, repeat around, ch 2 , join to top of 3 ch .
10. Ch $5, *$ miss $2,4 \mathrm{tr}$, ch 2 , repeat from * around, ending with 3 tr , joined to 3 d of 5 ch .

11, 12. Same as 9 th and 10th rows.
13. Ch $3,3 \mathrm{tr}$, ch 2 , miss $2,4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}$ (of ch 2 , miss 2 , $1 \mathrm{tr}), 4 \mathrm{tr}$, counting all, $1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp},(4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}) 3$ times, $4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp},(4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp})$ twice, joining last 2 ch to top of 3 ch .
14. Ch 5 , miss 2 , ( $4 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}$ ) twice, ( $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$ ) twice, ( $4 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}$ ) twice, $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 3 \mathrm{tr}$, join to 3 d of 5 ch .
15. Ch $3,3 \mathrm{tr}, 13 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 13 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch} 2$, join to top of 3 ch .
16. Ch 5 , miss $2,1 \mathrm{tr}, * 14 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 15 \mathrm{sp}, 3 \mathrm{tr}$, join to 3 d of 5 ch .
17. Like 16 th to $*$ for 1 st $\mathrm{sp}, 31$ more sp , joining last 2 ch to 3 d of 5 ch .
18. Fasten in the other color of thread and work like 9 th row.

19, 20. With the main color, like 10th and 9 th rows. 21. Like 18 th row (with the other color). 22 to 26 . With main color, like 17 th row.
27 to 37 . Ch 5 , tr in next tr, for 1 st $\mathrm{sp}, 30$ more $\mathbf{s p}$.
turn. These rows make the opening for the bag.
38. Same as 27 th; at end ch 2 , join to 3 d of 5 ch .

39 to 47 . Same as 26 th to 18 th row, reversing the order. 48. One $\mathrm{sp}, * 4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}$, repeat around, ending with 2 sp, join.
49. Four tr (ch 3 for 1 st tr of row, always), $5 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1$ sp , repeat around, joining last 2 ch to top of 3 ch .
50. Seven $\mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$; repeat around, ending with 3 tr joined to 3 d of 5 ch .

51,52 . Like 49 th and 48 th rows.
53. Two $\mathrm{sp}, * 4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{tr}, 5 \mathrm{sp}$, repeat from * around, ending with 3 sp , join.
54. Three sp, * $4 \mathrm{tr}, 7 \mathrm{sp}$; repeat around, ending with 4 sp , join.

55. Same as 53d row.
56. One sp, * ( $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{sp}$ ) twice, $4 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{sp}$; repeat, ending with 2 sp , join.

57,58 . Like 9 th and 10 th rows.
59. Like 9 th row.

Fold the bag evenly and join the top of last row by taking a stitch from each side, drawing the thread through both as 1 stitch. At the corners and center of square end attach a crocheted ball, and also one at the point. The rings may be made by winding thread twenty-five or thirty times around two fingers, and filling closely with double crochet; or ivory rings may be used, covered with crochet or not, as preferred.

To make the balls, chain 3, 6 doubles in 1st stitch of chain, join; 2 doubles in each double, working in both veins of the stitch, join; do 3 rows plain, then narrow by taking 2 stitches together, all around, pack with cotton, using the end of your crochet-needle, narrow off, draw together snugly, fasten, and make a chain of 5 stitches, joining to the bag.

Using the same general directions, these miser-bags may be of any desired size. Crochet-silk may be used,

and the work done throughout in double crochet, for a coin-purse; begin at the point, as directed, widen until as large as wanted, then continue to the square end, making the opening at center. If you wish a bag large enough for shopping, continue the shells as in 5th and 6th rows until you have the requisite width, then do straight work to the other end, making the opening proportionately larger.

Figure 53. Using No. 40 crochet-cotton, make a ring by winding the thread several times around one finger, slip off and fill closely with 38 doubles; (chain 3 , miss 1, a double in next) 13 times, 12 doubles in 12 doubles, turn, a double in each double, taking back vein of stitch, and continue working back and forth until you have 5 ridges; widen at beginning and end of last row by making 2 doubles in a stitch.

1. Ch 3, 2 tr in same place, (ch 2, miss 1,1 tr) 7 times, 2 more tr in same place, turn.
2. Ch 3 , miss $1 \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{tr}$ in top of next, $* 3 \mathrm{sp}$, draw up a loop through next sp, (over, draw up a loop in same sp)

4 times, ch 1 to close the cluster, tr in tr, $3 \mathrm{sp}, 2$ more tr in same st, turn.
3. Like 2 d row to $*, 2 \mathrm{sp}, 1$ cluster, $1 \mathrm{sp}, 1$ cluster, 2 $\mathrm{sp}, 2$ more tr in same place, turn.
4. Same as 2 d row.

5, 6. Like 2 d to $*, 7 \mathrm{sp}, 2$ more tr in same place, turn.
Repeat from $2 d$ row until you have fourteen patterns, ending with 5th row, turn.

Work a double in each space and double in treble, turn; miss 1st double, a double in each of 12 doubles, turn. Work back and forth on 12 doubles, taking back loop of stitch, until you have 5 ridges; then make 10 doubles in 10 doubles, turn, chain 14, miss 7 doubles, a double in each of next 2 , turn, fill chain with 30 doubles, a double in each of next 2 doubles, turn, chain 3 , fasten in 1 st double of ring, $*$ chain 3 , miss 1 , fasten, repeat around; fasten off.

Figure 54. For the roses:

1. Wind the working-thread 10 times around a match, slip off and work 20 dc in the ring.
2. Ch 6 , (miss $3,1 \mathrm{~d}$ c, ch 5) 4 times, join to 1 st st of 1 st 5 ch , making 5 sp or loops in all.
3. Under each 5 ch work $1 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, 7 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$.
4. Ch 6 , fasten between petals at back of work; repeat around.
5. Under each 6 ch work $1 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, 9 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}$.
6. Like 5 th row, with ch of 7 st each.
7. Under each 7 ch work $1 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, 11 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{~d}$ c. Fasten off securely.

For the set of lingerie-pins: Select two safety-pins an

inch in length, and one an inch and a half long; cover the ring and bar, to the clasp, with double crochet; over the clasp of each small ring sew a small rose, made as directed; fasten a similar rose to clasp and ring of the larger pin, and to the middle of bar a third rose made as directed, but with petals of double trebles instead of trebles, 1 double and 1 treble at beginning and end of each petal.
