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

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
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# Centerpieces and Doilies

#### **Explanation of Stitches**

CHAIN (ch). With a slip knot on the hook, draw thread through this loop; again draw thread through this second loop and continue until the chain is the required length.

SLIP STITCH (sl). Having a st on the hook, put hook through work; draw thread through work and loop on hook at the same time.

DOUBLE (d). Having a st on hook, put hook through work, draw thread through work (having two loops on hook), thread over again and through toth loops.

HALF TREBLE (ht). Having a st on hook, thread over, hook through work, thread over and through work (having three sts on hook), thread over and through all three sts at once.

TREBLE (t). Having a st on hook, thread over, hook through work, thread over and through work (having three sts on hook), thread over, hook through work, thread over and through work (having three sts on hook), thread over and through two loops, thread over and again through two loops.

DOUBLE TREBLE (dt). Having a st on hook, thread over twice, hook through work, thread over and through work (having four sts on hook), thread over and through two, over and through two, over and through two.

LONG TREBLE (lt) OR TRIPLE TREBLE (tt). Like double treble, with thread over three times, and after thread through work, crocheting off by twos. Some-

times "lt" is used for anything longer than dt, and the number of loops given.

Ploor (p). A p is formed on a ch by joining the last four sts (or any given number) in a ring by working a sl or a d in the fourth st from hook; a sl st is understood unless otherwise designated. In a few cases the p is joined by a t, but it is so stated stated.

CLUNY STITCHES, OR GROUPS OF CLUNY. Two, three, or four (any given number) t, dt, or long t are crocheted off, except the last loop of each, which is kept on the hook and one loop drawn through

all together.

L STITCH. Thread over hook a given number of times, thread through work, thread over and through all the loops, (but not through the st on hook), thread over and through both on hook. The hook for roll st should be of uniform thickness ROLL STITCH.

The nook for roll at should be of uniform thickness for several inches. ck of 4, or Block of 3, btc. A given number of t, dt, or long t worked without ch between. Lt. A group of t, ch 1 (or more), the same number of t, all joined in the same st or over same ch, as (4 t, ch 3, 4 t). The number of t, as well as the number of ch, may vary. "Shell over shell," the t are all made over ch of shell below. SHELL. below.

#### **Directions**

The crochet cotton men-Materials. tioned in this book refers to any hardtwisted cotton sold under the names of Cordonnet Special, Cordonnet, Kord-net, Cordichet, etc. These cottons can be bought where needlework supplies are sold.

Figure 1. Centerpiece. MATERIALS. -No. 70 crochet cotton, No. 14 hook. This piece is 14 inches in diameter.

Make II medallions ( compared to follows: Chain 6, join. 1st round — 16 d in ring. 2d round—Ch 4, \* miss 1st, 1 t in next, ch 2; repeat from \* making 8 spaces, join each round with sl. 3d round-4 d in each space. 4th round -\* 2 long t (thread 3 times over) in each d, ch 5; repeat from \* (The first long t of the round is 5-ch.) 5th round \* 8 dt (the 1st dt is 4-ch) in 8 long t, working the 8 sts together as a Cluny group, ch 5, sl in middle of 5-ch, ch 5; repeat from \* 6th round—5 dt in each space with 5-ch between groups of 5. 7th round — Ch 4 as ist of \* 5 dt in 5 dt (as a Cluny group), ch 5, sl in middle of 5-ch, ch 5; repeat from \*. 8th round—S1 to middle of 5-ch, \* picot loop of sch 2, picot of 3, ch 2, p, ch 2), join in ne 3; 5-ch with sl; repeat. from \*. There should be 32 picot loops. 9th and 10th rounds-Like 8th round, beginning each round with sl over picot loop to middle of loop. When making the 10th round the med are joined in a ring, joining 6 loops together; count 13 loops around the

outer edge between joining; see Figure 1. FOR THE CENTRE. - Make a med like the first 9 rounds of outer med. In the 10th round add one picot loop in the round, making 33 loops. 11th and 12th rounds -(SI over 1st picot loop to middle of loop, and join with sl in middle of next picot loop throughout the rest of the center); \* ch 2, p, ch 3, p, ch 2; repeat from \*. 13th and 14th rounds — \* Ch 2, p, ch 4, p, ch 2; repeat from \*. 15th, 16th, 17th, and 18th rounds-\* Ch 3, p, ch 3, p, ch 3; repeat from \*. 19th and 20th rounds - \* Ch 3, p, ch 4, p, ch 3; repeat from \*. 21st and 22d rounds—\* Ch 4, p, ch 4, p, ch 4; repeat from \*. 23d round—\* Ch 4, p, ch 5, p, ch 4; repeat from \*. If necessary add another round to fill the ring of

To Join Center to Med. Border.—Slip stitch to middle of picot loop on center, \* ch 5, sl in 2d p loop from where two med are joined, ch 4, 1 d on side of same p loop of center, ch 4, sl in next p loop of border, ch 4, d in side of next p loop of center, ch 4, sl in next p loop of border, ch 4, d in middle of p loop on center, ch 4, sl in next p loop of border, ch 4, d in side of same loop of center, ch 4, sl in next p loop of border, ch 5, d in middle of next loop of center, ch 4, p, ch 4, d in middle of next loop of center; repeat from \*.

Fill the large space left with rings made as follows: Chain 6, join. Ist round - 12 d in ring. 2d round—One d in each d with a picot after every two sts. These rings can be sewed in or crocheted in at each picot.

OUTER EDGE. — Fasten thread in 1st p loop at left of joining of med, \* (ch 7, d in next loop) 12 times, ch 7, d in 1st p loop of next med; repeat from \*: 2d round—(5 d, p, 5 d, p) over 7-ch, \* (5 d, p, 5 d) over next ch, 5 d in next sp, ch 7, catch back with sl at side of last p, (3 d, 1 ht, 2 t, p, 2 t, 1 ht, 3 d) over 7-ch, (p, 5 d, p) over unfinished sp \*, make from \* to \* 5 times, (5 d, p, 5 d, p) over next 7-ch, (3 d, 1 ht, 2 t, p, 2 t, 1 ht, 3 d, p) over 7-ch between medallions; repeat from first of round over each med.

Figure 2. Cluny Centerpiece. MATERIALS. — No. 40 linen spool thread, No. 9 hook.

Chain 693 and join in a ring; or if preferred, ch 693, turn and crochet the 1st round and then join, this will avoid the difficulty of twisting the chain. 1st round —Ch 3 additional (for 1 t), 2 t in 4th st from hook, ch 5, miss 4 ch sts, 24 d in next 24 sts, ch 5, miss 4, \* 3 t in next st, ch 5,

miss 4, 24 d in next 24 sts, ch 5, miss 4; repeat from \* around, joining the last 5-ch to 3d st of 1st 3-ch with sl. Each round is joined in this way and the next round started with 3 ch, which is considered as the 1st t. 2d round-\* 3 t over 1st t, ch 4, 3 t over 3d t, ch 4, miss 2 d, 20 d over 20 d, ch 4; repeat from \*. 3d round-3 t over 3 t, ch 4, 3 t over ch, ch 4, 3 t over 3 t, ch 4, miss 1 d, 18 d over 18 d, ch 4; repeat from \*. 4th round—\* 3 t over 3 t, ch 4, 3 t over 1st of next group, ch 4, 3 t over 3d t of same group, ch 4, 3 t over next 3 t, ch 4, miss 1 d, 16 d over 16 d, ch 4; repeat from \*. 5th round - \* 3 t over 3 t, ch 4, 3 t over next 3 t, ch 4, 3 t over ch, ch 4, 3 t over 3 t, ch 4, 3 t over next 3 t, ch 4, miss 1 d, 14 d over 14 d, ch 4; repeat from \*. 6th round-\* (3 t over 3 t, ch 5) 4 times, 3 t over 3 t, ch 4, miss I d, 12 d over 12 d, ch 4; repeat from \*. 7th round-Ch 4, 2 dt drawn together as one Cluny group, ch 7, (Cluny group of: 3 dt over 3 t, ch 7) 3 times, Cluny group of 3 dt over last group of 3 t, ch 10, sl in center of doubles, ch 3, turn, sl in 3d st of 10-ch (counting from row of doubles), ch 7; repeat from first of round, making 3

Cluny sts in first group. 8th round of picot loops (ch 3, picot of 5, ch 3) joined with sl over each group and half way between groups; break thread.

This completes the outer half of the lace; for the inner half, make group of 3t opposite, in sane st with 3 t of 1st round, (the first of these 3 t will be ch 3), fliss 2 d. 20 d in next 20 sts ch 4; repeat t around. 2d, 3d, 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th rounds - Like same rounds of outer half, except there will be 2 less d in




Fig. 2. Cluny Centerpiece. See page 4




Fig. 3. Detail of Fig. 2

each inner round than in the corresponding outer round. 8th round - 2 dt (ch 4 for 1st dt) over Cluny group, ch 3, (1 t in middle of ch, ch 3, 1 t over Cluny group, ch 3) 3 times, I t in middle of ch, ch 3, 2 dt over group, ch 3; repeat from first of round, joining last 3-ch to 4th ch st (or 1st dt), sl to 1st t. 9th round—Ch 6, t over next t, (ch 3, t over next t) 5 times, ch 3, t over ch, ch 3, \* (t over next t, ch 3) 7 times, t over ch, ch 3; repeat from \*, join to 3d st of 6-ch. 10th round-Make 3 dt in every 2d mesh (the 1st dt will be 4-ch) with 1-ch between groups. When making the 3d d t, stop in the middle of working off and catch around the 1st and 2d dt. 11th and 12th rounds - One t in each st of preceding round. If it seems necessary, miss I t occasionally in the 12th round to draw it in.

Ascertain the size of linen center and allow for a roll hem; turn the hem, baste closely and cover with d all around; overcast the lace to this round of d.

Figure 4. Doily. MATERIALS. — No. 40 crochet cotton, No. 9 hook; or spool cotton No. 8 may be used; the doily is 8 inches in diameter.

Chain 8, join in ring. Ist round—25 t in ring, join with sl. 2d round—Ch 3, I t in 1st t, \*2 t in 2 t, 2 t in I t, I t in I t, 2 t in I t; repeat from \*; there should be 35 t. 3d round—7 t in 7 t, ch 3, \* 7 t in next 7 t, ch 3; repeat from \*. 4th round—Sl st to 2d t, ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, \* ch 5, d in 3-ch, ch 5, miss I t, t in next 5 t; repeat from \*. 5th round—Sl st to 2d t, ch 3, t in next 2 t, \* ch 5, d in 5 ch, ch 5, d in next

5 ch, ch 5, miss 1 t, 3 t in 3 t; repeat from \*. 6th round—SI st to 2d t, ch 3 (for I t), ch 5, d in 1st 5-ch, \* ch 5, d in next 5-ch, ch 5, d in next 5-ch, ch 5, t in 2d t; repeat from \*. 7th round — Sl st in 5-ch, ch 3, 4 t in same 5-ch, \* ch 4, d in 5-ch, ch 4, 5 t in next space; repeat from \*. 8th round — Ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, \* ch 5, d in d, ch 5, 5 t in 5 t; repeat from \*. 9th round-Ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, \* ch 6, d in d, ch 6, 5 t in 5 t; repeat from \*. 10th round-Ch 3, 4 t in 4 t, \* ch 11, 5 t in 5 t; repeat from \*. 11th round—Ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, ch 6, d in 6th st of 11 ch, ch 6, \* 5 t in 5 t, ch 6, d in d, ch 6; repeat from \*. 12th round-Ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, \* ch 7, d in d, ch 7, 5 t in 5 t; repeat from \*. 13th round-Ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, \* ch 9, d in d, ch 9, 5 t in 5 t; repeat from \*. 14th round—Ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, \* ch 13, 5 t in 5 t; repeat from \*. 15th round -Ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, \* ch 7, d in 7th st of 13-ch, ch 7, 5 t in 5 t; repeat from \*. 16th round-Like 15th round, with ch 9 instead of ch 7. 17th round - \* Ch 7, d in 1st st of 9-ch, ch 7, d in 6th st of 9-ch, ch 7, d in 3d st of next 9-ch, ch 7, d in last st of 9-ch; repeat from \*. 18th round—SI st to middle of 7-ch, ch 9, d in each 7-ch space. 19th round - Like 18th round. 20th round-SI st to 2d st of 9-ch, 5 t in same space, ch 5, d in next 9-ch space, ch 5, \* 5 t in next space, ch 5, d in next space, ch 5; repeat from \*. 21st round-Ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, \* ch 7, d in d, ch 7, 5 t in 5 t; repeat from \*. 22d round-Ch 3, 4 t in next 4 t, \* ch 9, d in




Fig. 4. Doily. See page 5




Fig. 5. Centerpiece with Crochet and Coronation Braid Border See Fig. 6 and page 6

d, ch 9, 5 t in 5 t; repeat from \*. 23d round—\* Ch 7, d in 1st st of 9-ch, ch 7, d in 6th st of same 9-ch, ch 7, d in 3d st of next 9 ch, ch 7, d in last st of same 9-ch; repeat from \*. 24th round — S1 st to middle of 7-ch, ch 9, d in 7-ch space all around. 25th, 26th, and 27th rounds—Like 24th round.

Figure 5. Centerpiece. MATERIALS.—Two balls No. 20 crochet cotton, 2½ bunches Coronation cord (full size given in detail, Fig. 6), No. 8 hook, and ½ yard linen for center.

Cut the circular piece of linen, 18 inches in diameter. Fold a narrow hem and stitch it on the machine, then cover the hem with double crochet, 14 or 15 sts to an inch. 2d round-Ch 5, miss I st, I t in next st, \* ch 2, miss I st, I t in next st; repeat from \*. 3d round-2 t over every 2-ch, join with sl. 4th round-Ch 5, miss 2 t, I t in next t, \* ch 2, miss 2 t, I t in next t; repeat from \*. 5th round—Ch 3 and 1 t in first space, \* ch 2, miss I space, 2 t in next space; repeat from \*. 6th round - 3 t over every 2-ch, with 2-ch between groups of t. 7th round-4 t over every 2-ch with 1-ch between groups of 4 t. 8th round -On wrong side, \* form double braid loop and catch down with 2 d, ch 8, miss 2 groups of 4 t; repeat from \*. 9th round-

On wrong side, catch large loops together with I d, \* ch 2, 3 t in small loop, ch 4, 3 t in same loop, ch 2, catch large loops together with d; repeat from \*. 10th round - On right side, starting from where large loops are joined, ch 6, 4 t in end of large loop, ch 3, 4 t in same loop, \* ch I, dt between loops, ch 1, 4 t in next loop, ch 3, 4 t in same loop; repeat from \*. 11th round - One d in dt, \* ch 2, (3 t, ch 3, I t, ch 4, 1 t, ch 3, 3 t) over ch, ch 2, I d in d t; repeat from \*. 12th round-One d over dt. ch 3, d in 3-ch, ch 4, d in 4-ch, ch 5, d in same space, ch 4, d in next ch, ch 3, d over dt; repeat from \*.

The double loops are made of a loop of two sections of the cord,

another loop of four sections of the cord, with the crossings both together and caught





Fig. 6. Detail of Fig. 5. Full Size

down to the work with 2 d. The double loop is laid flat on the work (as two edges are overcast together), and the crocheting done from the wrong side.

Figure 8. Centerpiece. MATERIALS. —




Fig. 7. Detail of Fig. 8. Full Size

Two balls No. 20 crochet cotton, 4 bunches Coronation cord (size shown in detail, Fig. 7), No. 8 hook, and ½ yard linen.

Cut the linen 18 inches in diameter. Over a narrow hem (machine - stitched), make double crochet, about 14 sts to an inch. 2d round — Ch 5, miss I d, I t in next; repeat from \*, sl in 3d of 5-ch. 3d

round-2 dt over every ch, join with sl. 4th round—Ch 5, miss 2 dt, I t between 2d and 3d dt, \* ch 2, miss 2 dt, I t between next dt; repeat from \*. 5th round-2 ht over every 2-ch. 6th round-On wrong side, form double loop of cord, and holding flat on work, catch through loops of cord and between ht of last round with 2 d, ch 8, form next double loop of cord, catch with 2 d between 8th and 9th ht; repeat, missing 8 ht between loops of cord. 7th round-On wrong side, catch outer side of two loops of cord together with I d, ch 2, d in small loop, ch 3, d in same loop, ch 4, d in same loop, ch 3, d in same loop, ch 2, join next 2 loops with I d; repeat. 8th round - On wrong side, fold cord as for 6th round, fasten with 2 d in first cord loop, ch 8; repeat. 9th round - Like 7th round, except ch 3 instead of ch 2. 10th round-On right side, start from d between loops, ch 5, \* (3 t, ch 3, I t, ch 4, I t, ch 3, 3 t) in same loop on point, ch 1, 1 dt between loops, ch 1; repeat from \*.

The double loops in this and the following piece are made of a loop of two sections of the cord, another loop of four sections of the cord, with the crossings both together and caught down to the I st, thread over and through 4 sts, thread work with 2 d. The double loop is laid over and through last 2 on hook. This flat on the right side of the work (as two edges are overcast together), and the crocheting done from the wrong side.

Ist, thread over and through 4 sts, thread over and through 1 sts, thread over and through 2 sts, thread over and through 4 sts, thread over and through 2 sts, thread over and through 4 sts, thread over and through 1 sts, thread over and through 2 on hook. This makes one puff. Chain 3, miss 2 t, puff in next t, and repeat around until there are cheting done from the wrong side.

All coronation cord work should be ironed on a thick blanket, with wrong side up and covered with a damp cloth.

Figure 9. Centerpiece. MATERIALS. — Six balls écru Macramé cord No. 6, No. 3 hook.

To make 56 inches in diameter. Chain 16, join in ring. 1st round—Ch 3, 38 t in ring. 2d round—Ch 3, thread over hook, insert hook where joined, taking up both loops, draw thread through, thread over and draw through 2 sts, thread over, draw up another loop, thread over, draw through 2 sts; repeat this until there are four stitches into

makes one puff. Chain 3, miss 2 t, puff in next t, and repeat around until there are 13 puffs, ch 3, join with sl. 3d round—Ch 3, \* 1 t in 1st st, 2 t in 2d st, 1 t in 3d st, 2 t in 4th st; repeat from \*, making 76 t. 4th round-\* Ch II, sl in every 4th st (make 19 loops). 5th round—Sl st to 6th st of 11ch, \* ch 13, sl in 6th st of next 11-ch; repeat from \*. 6th round—SI st to 7th st of 13-ch, ch 3, (1 t, ch 2, 2 t) in same st, ch 7, \* shell (2 t, ch 2, 2 t) in 7th st of next 13-ch, ch 7; repeat from \*. 7th round—S1 to center of shell, ch 3, I t, ch 2, 2 t in shell, ch 6, \* shell on shell, ch 6; repeat from \*. 8th round-Like 7th round, with ch 5 between shells. 9th round-Like 7th round, with ch 6 between shells. 10th round—Like 7th round with ch 7 between shells. 11th




Fig. 9. Large Centerpiece. See page 8

round—SI to center of sh and fasten with d, I d in same sh, ch 5, thread over twice, over and around the 5 chs below (of 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, and 10th rounds) draw up a long loop and work off dt, ch 5, 2 d in centre of sh; repeat. 12th round—Ch 3, I t in every st. 13th round—Ch 4, miss I t, I t in next t, ch I; repeat from \*. 14th round—Ch 3, t in every st, increase by making 2 t in every 24th st.

This completes the center, and the next round (15th) is the first of the open net-work. 15th round—\* 3 d in 1st 3 t, ch 2, miss I t, I t in 2d st, ch 2, miss I t; repeat from \*. 16th round—Ch 3, I t in 2d d, ch 3, I d in last st of 2-ch, I d in t, I d in next st of ch (making group of 3 d), ch 3, I t in 2d of 3 d; repeat around. 17th, 18th and 19th rounds—Like 16th round, joining rows alternately

with I t and 3 d. 20th round—Ch 4, 3 d, \* cn 4, I dt, ch 4, 3 d; repeat from \*. 21st, 22d, 23d, 24th, and 25th rounds — Like 20th. 26th round—Ch 5, 3 d, ch 5, 1 dt; repeat around. 27th, 28th, 29th, 30th, 31st, 32d, and 33d rounds—Like 26th round. 34th round—Ch 5, 1 t, ch 5, 3 d; repeat around. 35th round-Ch 3, t in each st. 36th round-Puffs made in every 4th st with ch 3 between puffs, like those in 2d round. 37th round-Ch 3, I t in each st. 38th round—Ch II, sl in every 9th st. 39th round-SI to 6th st in 11-ch, \* eh 13, sl in 6th st of 11-ch; repeat from \*. 40th, 41st, 42d, 43d and 44th rounds-Like 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th rounds. 45th round—Like 11th round, but with ch 4 instead of ch 5. 46th round—Like 12th round. 47th round—Like 13th round. 48th round—Ch 3, t in each st.

SCALLOP. 1st round-\* 13 d in first 13 t, ch 4, miss 3 t, 3 t in next 3 t, ch 4, miss 3 t; repeat from \*. 2d round-\* Miss I d, II d in 11 d, ch 4, 1 t in last st of 4-ch, 3 t over 3 t, I t in 1st st of 4-ch, ch 4; repeat from \*. 3d round-\* Miss I d, 9 d in 9 d, ch 4, I t in last st of 4-ch, I t between Ist and 2d t, 2 t between 2d and 3d t, 2 t between 3d and 4th t, I t between 4th and 5th t, I t in 1st st of 4-ch, ch 4; repeat.
4th round—\* Miss I d, 7 d in 7 d, ch 4, I t in last st of 4-ch, I t in sp between each of the next 3 t, 2 t in center sp, 1 t in next 3 sps between t, I t in 1st st of 4-ch, ch 4; repeat from \*. 5th round-\* Miss I d, 5 d in 5 d, ch 4, I t in last st of 4-ch, (ch I, I t in next sp) 5 times, ch I, I t in same sp (ch I, I t in next sp) 4 times, ch I, I t



in 1st st of 4-ch, ch 4; repeat from \*. 6th and 7th rounds—Like 5th round, decreasing the number of d by 2, and increasing the number of t by 2.

PICOT EDGE.—Chain 4, sl back in 2d st for picot, ch 1, join in spaces with d until the 2 chains of 4 are reached; tie these, one over the other, with d and continue picot over next scallop and all around.

To make 60-inch piece (like illustration), make one more round like 16th, — one more round like 20th, and two more rounds like the 26th round.

Figure 10. Doily. MATERIALS. - No. 40 crochet cotton, No. 9 hook.


Chain 256, join in ring. 1st round—Ch 6, \* miss I st, I dt in next st, ch I; repeat from \*, join with sl to 4th st of 6-ch. There should be 128 dt including 1st 6-ch. 2d round—Ch 3 (as I t), 3 t making Cluny group of 4 over ch, ch 3, (miss 1 mesh, Cluny group of 4 t over next mesh, ch 3) twice, miss I mesh, I dt in next mesh, ch 7, I dt in same mesh, ch 3, miss I mesh; repeat from first of round, sl to top of first group to join. 3d round—Ch 3 (as 1 t), Cluny group of 4 t in first mesh, ch 3, miss 1 mesh, Cluny group of 4 k in next mesh, ch 3, (dt, ch 1) 8 times over 7-ch, 1 dt over same ch, ch 3; repeat from first of round, sl in top of group, sl on ch. 4th round—Ch 3 (as I t), 3 t, making Cluny group of 4 over ch, ch 2, I dt over each ch below with 2-ch between; repeat from first of round. 5th round -Two d over first ch, (2 d, picot, 2 d) over each of next 7 meshes, 2 d over next ch; repeat from first of round. Fit a circular linen center (about 6 inches in diameter) to the edge, allowing for a narrow hem; overcast the edge to linen.


The crocheting may be done directly on the linen instead of on a chain, if 256 d are made around the linen; that would require 13½ sts to an inch.

Figure 11. Table Cover. MATERIALS. — 40 balls No. 5 crochet cotton and No. 5 crochet hook.

This piece is 56 inches in diameter. 8th round—(First round of pyramids); SI st in first st of 12-ch, then work a pyramid as follows: - \* draw up a loop through each of the next II sts of ch, making 12 sts on needle, (thread over and work off 2 sts) II times, (this is afghan st), miss the first upright loop, and take up a st through each of next g sts, work off by twos as before, then make a picot of 4-ch, pick up 7 loops and work off, pick up 5 loops, work off, picot of 4-ch, pick up 3 loops, work off, pick up I loop, work off, ch I, sl st down the side of





pyramid, making 2 picots to correspond with those on right side, sl st in top of dt and first st of next 12ch; repeat from \* around. gth round—Ch 16, 1 d in point of pyramid, \* ch 9, 1 long t (over 4 times) in st between pyramids, ch 9, 1 d in point of pyramid; repeat from \* around. 10th round-Ch I, I d in each st all around, (taking up back thread of st throughout the piece). 11th and 12th rounds-Like 9th round. 13th round-Ch 5, miss I, I t in next st, (ch 2, miss I, I t in next st) repeat around, join last 2-ch to 3d st of 5-ch. 14th round -Ch I, I d in each st all around. 15th round-Like 14th round. 16th round-Ch I, (I d in each of next 9 sts, turn, ch 7, fasten back in 6th double, 14 d in 7-ch loop) 3 times, \* I d in each of next 12 sts, turn, ch 7, fasten back in 6th d, 14 d in 7-ch loop, (1 d in each of next 9 sts, turn, ch 7, fasten back in 6th d, 14 d in 7-ch loop) twice; repeat from \* around. There will be 24 7-ch loops filled with 14 d, divided in groups of 3, each group separated by 6 d. 17th round-Ch 20, I d in top of 2d ring, ch 16, I long t (thread over 3 times) halfway between 3d and 4th rings, \* ch 16, miss I ring, I d in top of next ring, ch 16, miss I ring, I long t in d between next two rings; repeat from \* around, join last 16-ch to 4th st of 20-ch.

18th round—(Second round of pyramids); S1 st in 1st st of 16-ch, work a pyramid on each 16-ch, as in 8th round, only beginning with 16 sts on hook, and having 3 picots on each side of pyramid. 19th round-Ch 19, 1 d in top of first pyramid, ch 18, 1 d in top of 2d pyramid, ch 9, 1 long t (thread over 7 times) between 2d and 3d pyramids, \* ch 9, 1 d in top of 3d pyramid, ch 18, 1 d in top of 4th pyramid, ch 9, 1 long t between pyramids; repeat from \* around, join last 9-ch to 10th st of 19-ch. 20th round — Ch 1, 1 d in each st all around. 21st, 22d, 23d, and 24th rounds—Like 20th round.

.25th round — (The first of 20 rounds of Edelweiss pattern); \* Ch 10, miss 3, 1 d in next st, turn, 5 d in 5 sts of 10-ch, ch 5, miss 3, d in next st, (ch 3, miss 1, d in next st) twice; repeat from \*, join last 3-ch in 1st d. 26th round-\* One d in each of first 5 sts of 10-ch, ch 3, 1 d in each st of 5-ch, d in 3-ch, ch 3, d in next 3-ch; repeat from \*, join last 3-ch in 1st d. 27th round—Sl st over 5 d, \* ch 3, d under 3-ch, ch 3, d in 1st d following, ch 10, d under 3-ch below, turn, 1 d in each of the last 5 sts of 10-ch, ch 5, d in last of 5 d following; repeat from \*. 28th round—D under 3-ch, ch 3, d under next 3-ch, I d in each st of next ch, ch 3, I d in each st of next ch; repeat around. 29th round—Like 27th round. Continue in this way until 20 rounds have been made, but as the border widens, increase the 10-ch to 12, 14, 16 and 18-ch, filling half of each ch with as many doubles.

45th round—SI st to center of 3-ch, ch 16, I d in next 3-ch, ch 12, I dt in next 3-ch, \* ch 12, I dt in next 3-ch, ch 12, I dt in next 3-ch; repeat from \* around, join last 12-ch in 4th st of 16-ch. 46th round—Ch 1, I d in each st all around. 47th, 48th and 49th rounds—Like 46th round. 50th round—Ch 1, (I d in each of the next 10 sts, turn, ch 8, fasten back in 6th d, 15 d in 8-ch loop) 3 times, \*

I d in each of next 13 sts, turn, ch 8, fasten back in 6th d, 15 d in 8-ch loop, (I d in each of the next 10 sts, turn, ch 8, fasten back in 6th d, 15 d in 8-ch loop) twice; repeat from \*. 51st round — Ch 25, miss 1st ring, 1 d in top of 2d ring, ch 20, miss 3d ring, I long t (thread over 3 times) halfway between 3d and 4th rings, \* ch 20, miss I ring, I d in top of next ring, ch 20, miss I ring, I long t between two rings; repeat from \*, join last 20-ch in 5th st of 25-ch. 52d round—Sl st in 1st st of 20-ch, and work a pyramid on each 20-ch, as in 18th round, but beginning with 20 sts on hook, and making 4 picots on each side of pyramid. This is the third round of pyramids. 53d round—Ch 20, I d in top of 1st pyramid, ch 8, I long t (thread over 9 times) between 1st and 2d pyramids, \* ch 8, 1 d in top of pyramid, ch 8, 1 long t (over 9 times) between pyramids; repeat from \* around, join

last 8-ch in 12th st of 20-ch. 54th round — Ch I, I d in each st all around. 55th, 56th, 57th, 58th, 59th, and 60th rounds—Like 54th round. This completes the outer (fifth) band of solid doubles, and is followed by 15 rounds of network.

61st round—Ch 4, miss 2 sts, 1 t in each of 3d, 4th, 5th sts, ch 4, miss 2 sts, I d in next; repeat from \*, join last 4-ch in 1st d. 62d round—S1 st to 1st t, \* 3 d ih 3 t, ch 7; repeat from \* around. 63d round-Sl st to 2d d, \* ch 4, 3 t in 3d, 4th, and 5th sts of 7-ch, ch 4 I d over 3 d; repeat from \*. 64th round—SI st to 1st t, \* 3 d over 3 t, ch 7; repeat from \*. 65th round-Like 63d round. 66th round-S1 st to 1st t, \* 3 d over 3 t, ch 8; repeat from \*. 67th round—Sl st to 2d d, \* ch 4, I t in 3d, 4th, 5th and 6th sts of 8-ch, ch 4, 1 d over 3 d; repeat from \*. 68th round—S1 st to 1st t, \* 4 d over 4 t, ch 8; repeat from \*. 69th round—S1 st to 2d d, \* 2 d over 4 d, ch 4, I t in 3d, 4th, 5th and 6th sts of 8-ch; repeat from \*. Continue in this way until 15 rounds have been made, but do not widen any more.

76th round—SI st to 1st t, \* 4 d over 4 t, ch 8; repeat from \*, join last 8-ch to 2d d. 77th round—Ch 5, 5 t in 3d d, I t in 4th st of 8-ch, ch 2, 5 t in 5th st, \* I t in 2d d, ch 2, 5 t in 3d d, I t in 4th st of 8-ch, ch 2, 5 t in 5th st of 8-ch; repeat from \*, join last t to 3d st of 5-ch. 78th round—(Ch 3 for 1st t), (5 t, ch 2, I t) in each 2-ch of previous round. 79th round—SI over 5 t, (I t, ch 2, 5 t) in each 2-ch of previous round.




Fig. 12. Edge of Fig. 11




Fig. 13. DETAIL OF CENTER OF Fig. 11

Figure 15. Table Set. MATERIALS.—No. 70 crochet cotton, No. 14 hook and linen for centers.


This set consists of Centerpiece, Plate, Bread and Butter and Tumbler Doilies. Linen for Tumbler Doily, 2% inches in diameter; for Bread and Butter Doily, 3% inches; for Plate, 5¼ inches; for Centerpiece, 16¾ inches in diameter.

TUMBLER DOILY. Ist round—Crochet closely with d, catching into the linen about an eighth of an inch, join. 2d round—Make 28 loops of 10-ch, sl st up to center of first 10-ch. 3d round—Make 28 loops of 10-ch, sl st up to 3d st of 10-ch. 4th round—Ch 3, 7 t in same loop, \* ch 1, 8 t in next loop; repeat from \*. 5th round—\* One d in 1st t, 2 d in next, 1 d in each of next 4, 2 d in next, 1 d in next, ch 9, miss group of 8 t, in next group make 1 t in 1st t, 2 t in next, 1 t in next, 2 t in next, 1 t in each of

next 2, 2 t in next, I t in next, ch 9, miss group of 8 t; repeat from \*. 6th round-\* One d in each of 10 d, ch 9, . I t in each of II t, ch 9; repeat from \*. 7th round-\* Miss 1st d, 1 d in each of 9 d, ch 9, 1 t in each of 11 t with I ch between each t, ch 9; repeat from \*. 8th round-\* One d in 1st d, miss I d, I d in each of next 5 d, miss I d, I d in next d, ch 9, I t in each t with I ch between, ch 9; repeat from \*. 9th round-\* One d in each of 7 d, ch 9, I t in each t with 2 ch between, ch 9; repeat from \*. 10th round-\* Miss 1st d, I d in each of 6 d, ch 9, I t in each t with 2 ch between, ch 9; repeat from \*. 11th round-\* One d in 1st d, miss 1 d, 1 d in each of next 2 d, miss I d, I d in next d, ch Q, I t in each t with 3 ch between, ch 9; repeat from \*. 12th round - \* One d in 1st d, miss 1 d, pull thread through next d, and through next d, catch thread and pull through all 3 at once, ch 9, I t in each t with 4 ch between, ch 9; repeat from \*. 13th round-One d in 1 d, sl st up to 7th st on ch, ch 8, p (catch back in 5th st from hook), ch 4, 1 d in next t, \* make a picot loop on each t, I on 3d st of 9 ch, make another and catch in 6th st of next 9-ch; repeat from \*, fasten.

Make bread and butter doilies the same way, having 3 rounds of 10-ch loops and 40 loops in each round. Make the plate doilies the same, having 5 rounds of 10-ch loops and 56 loops in each round.

CENTERPIECE. — Work around twice with d, catching 2d round in back loops of 1st round. 3d round.—One d in each of 1st 4 d, \* ch 5, miss 4 d, I d in each of next 4 d; repeat from \*, having 124 loops. 4th round.—Sl st in 1st d of 1st group of 4 d,




FIG. 14. ACTUAL SIZE OF BRAID USED ON CENTERPIECE FIG. 16

From this make the edge the same as for doilies, beginning with the 4th round, 8 t in each loop with I ch between.

Figure 16. Centerpiece. MATERIALS.

—Two balls No. 40 crochet cotton, hook No. 10, and 6 yards novelty medallion braid of size shown in Fig. 14.

Begin with the ends of a bunch of braid containing 6 yards. Cross the stems and sew them securely with fine thread, leaving one medallion (med) on each end. Have 3 med on inside, and 5 meds on outside of circle, composed of 14 figures. Do not twist the braid.

CENTER. — Chain 8, join, ch 4, 2 dt in ring, ch 3, ch 5 for picot, sl, in 3d st of 3-ch, ch 5, sl in 3d and 4th picots of inside of 1st med, ch 5, sl inside of p, ch 5 for p, ch 3, 3 dt in ring; repeat until center is complete.

INSIDE ROUNDS. *1st round*—Fasten thread to 3d and 4th p of 1st med, ch 7, dt to 5th and 6th picots, make 7 more meshes of "ch 4, dt," joining at each 2 picots of med and over the cord of braid, without ch make dt in 3d and 4th p of 2d med and repeat around, sl to 3d ch st of 7-ch, sl over ch and into 2d mesh. *2d round* — Ch 4, 3 dt over 1st mesh, 4 dt over each of next 5

meshes, \* miss last mesh of figure and 1st mesh of next figure, (4 dt overnext mesh) 6 times; repeat from \*, join with sl, and sl to 2d st of 1st group. 3d round - Ch 3, t in 3d st of group, (ch 3, 2 t on 2d and 3d t of next group) 5 times, \* (2 t on 2d and 3d t of next group, ch 3) 5 times, 2 t in 2d and 3d t of next group; repeat from \*. 4th round-One t in every t of last round (ch 1, 1 t, ch 1), over every space.




Fig. 16. Centerpiece of Crochet and Novelty Braid See Fig. 14 and page 14




Fig. 17. Doily. See page 15

Figure 18. Centerpiece. MATERIALS. — Two balls No. 30 crochet cotton, fine crochet-hook for roll st, and linen 61/4 inches in diameter.

Roll a hem over a heavy cord (No. 1 crochet cotton). *1st round* — Cover the hem with double crochet, about 10 sts to an inch or 192 d altogether. *2d round*—Ch 6, 1 roll st (over 15 times) in every d, sl to 6-ch. *3d round*—\* Ch 5, miss 2 roll sts, sl between next two roll sts; repeat from \*. There

should be 96 loops. 4th round-S1 st to middle of 5-ch, \* ch 5, sl in 5-ch; repeat from \*. 5th round-Sl st to middle of 5-ch, \* ch 10, miss 1 loop of 5 ch, sl in next; repeat from \*. There should be 48 loops of 10-ch. 6th round-4 sl sts on first 10-ch, ch 6, 2 roll sts (over 12 times) on ch, ch 2, 2 roll sts in same loop, \* ch 5, miss I loop of 10-ch, 12 roll sts (over 16 times), in next loop of 10-ch, ch 5, 2 roll sts (over 12), ch 2, 2 roll sts over second loop; repeat from \*, sl to 6-ch; end each round to 18th in the same way. (Two roll sts, over 12 times, ch 2, 2 roll sts) will be called a shell, 7th round — S1 over 2 rolls to 2-ch, ch 6, shell over 2-ch, ch 6, sl between first 2 rolls of group of .12, \* ch 5, sl between the next 2 rolls; repeat from \* until there are 10 loops of 5-ch, ch 6, shell over 2-ch; repeat from \*. 8th round—SI st to 2-ch, ch 6, shell over 2-ch, \* ch 7, 9 loops of 5




Fig. 18. Centerpiece in Roll Stitch. See page 16




Fig. 19. Centerpiece. See page 17

Chain 56, turn. 1st row—One d in each st of ch to the end, turn, and make I d in each st of opposite side of ch. 2d row-Ch 5, 1 t, \* ch 2, I t; repeat from \* around, placing the trebles in every st around the ends, and missing 2 d along the sides. 3d and 4th rows -D in each st all around, widening around the ends to keep the work flat. Repeat the 2d, 3d, and 4th rows until there are 7 rows of open meshes. This will finish the 20th row. 21st row-D in each st, widening at ends as necessary. 22d row-\* 17 d on 17 sts, ch 5; repeat from \* around, miss 4 sts on the sides and 3 sts around the ends. 23d row—Miss 1 d, 15 d over 15 d, ch 5, d in 5-ch mesh, ch 5; repeat from first of row. In each row hereafter, miss I d, make 2 less d than in previous row, and make one more 5-ch mesh. Continue until there is but one d at the top of triangle.




Fig. 20. Oyai Doily
